## AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of Six thousand pounds (£6,000), granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1900-1901.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1901, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding Twenty-five pounds each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. If the sums claimable be in excess of the sum of Five thousand nine hundred and sixty pounds (£5,960), they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. No society located within 20 miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least; neither shall the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria participate in the said vote.

## INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations, between the 1st January, 1900, and the 31st December, 1900, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a Justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

## PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the vote of Two thousand five hundred pounds (£2,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c., 1900-1901.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1900, and 31st December, 1900, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st March, 1901. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the Form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the Form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1900, and 31st December, 1900; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any

bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1900.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1900 (vide Form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kilda, or the Richmond Park, Richmond, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

## HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

**R**EGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of Three hundred pounds (£300) granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1900-1901.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1901, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. A sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away for horticultural exhibits will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole Three hundred pounds, and, if they do exceed this amount, then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1900, and the 31st December, 1900, amounts in the total to less than Fifty pounds shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

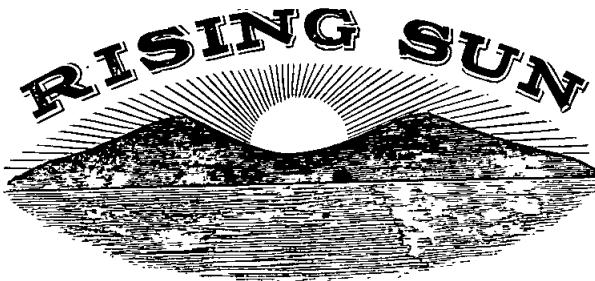

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Visd voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1901.

THE births of 72 boys and 59 girls, or in all of 131 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of January. Of these 50 occurred in Ballarat East, 68 in Ballarat West, and 13 in Sebastopol; included were 7 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 94, viz., 45 of boys and 49 of girls.

The deaths registered in January numbered 73, viz., 43 of males and 30 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 58. In December the recorded deaths numbered 64; in January, 1900, they numbered 120; in January, 1899, they numbered 92; in January, 1898, they numbered 111; in January, 1897, they numbered 86; in January, 1896, they numbered 90; in January, 1895, they numbered 107; in January, 1894, they numbered 101; in January, 1893, they numbered 69; in January, 1892, they numbered 69; and in January, 1891, they numbered 71.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

#### NORTH BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

**R**EGULATION for the making of a rate, under the provisions of the Water Acts, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

#### HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION No. 5.

**T**HE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of Part II. of the *Water Act 1890*, doth hereby make the following Regulation in respect of such Urban District:—

The rate to be paid for the several lands and tenements to be supplied otherwise than by measure with water for domestic purposes for the year ending 31st December, 1901, shall be:—

(a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement, the minimum amount to be paid to be Twenty shillings.

(b) For unoccupied land where water is not laid on, but which land fronts a street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be five per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof in all cases where such rate or such valuation shall exceed Ten shillings, and in all others of such cases the rate shall be Ten shillings.

(c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the charge per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings. And such rate shall be levied upon the persons and at the times and in manner provided for the levying of rates by the Water Acts.

(d) For water supplied for domestic and other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive in respect of the tenement for which such charge shall be made if the same had been rated under subdivision (a) hereof, and thereafter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(e) For gas engines and oil engines the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, payable yearly in advance for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and thereafter no water shall be supplied until such meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe for such engine to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.

No. 29.—MARCH 1, 1901.—2.

(f) For steam boilers the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable half-yearly in advance, for each horsepower of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and in such cases no water shall be supplied or used after such order shall have been given until the same is complied with to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.

(g) For buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or shall be fixed by special agreement. In respect of such buildings being of wood, the charge shall be one-half of the last-mentioned charge, payment in all cases under this subdivision to be made in advance.

(h) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charge as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment on account of such charge must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

(i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes shall be 10,000 gallons, and such water where not otherwise provided herein shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(j) The charge for water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, cricket grounds, and bowling greens shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter, and paid for half-yearly.

(k) The charge for water supplied by measure solely for railway purposes shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 1,000,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

**W**HEREAS by section 121 of the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders from time to time directing that the provisions thereinafter contained for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria, or in such parts thereof or in such places therein as in such Orders respectively may be expressed, and may in like manner, from time to time, revoke, alter, or vary any such Order, and that such Orders shall have the like effect as if the provisions therein contained were included in the said Act, provided that all such Orders shall, within one week from the making thereof, be published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas there is danger of the disease known as the "Bubonic Plague" being brought to Victoria, and it is expedient that the Board of Public Health should be enabled to enforce any regulation that may appear to be necessary for preventing the introduction and spread of the said disease: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order direct that the provisions contained in the *Health Act 1890* aforesaid for the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases be put in force in Victoria until this Order in Council shall be revoked. And His Excellency doth also by this Order revoke the Order in Council made on the 23rd day of March, 1900, respecting the prevention of epidemic, endemic, and contagious diseases in Victoria.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria aforesaid, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE NORTHCOTE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1850*, the Trustees of the Northcote Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees thereof, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the Trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days (September to April inclusive), Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.; on Sundays throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m. or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees; but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE NARRAWONG COMMON.

**I**N pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 4th day of July, 1899, the managers of the Narrawong Common having drafted the following Regulations for the management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works, and approval by the Governor in Council in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such common:—

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In the construction, and for the purposes of these Regulations the words "large cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; and the words "small cattle" shall mean sheep and goats.

2. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.

3. The scale of fees, payable quarterly in advance on the 1st day of January, the 1st day of April, the 1st day of July, and the 1st day of October in every year for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follows:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, or filly, 12s. per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, 8s. per annum.

For every head of small cattle, 2s. 8d. per annum.

Progeny under six months old of stock legally depasturing on the common, free.

4. No bulls over six months, entire horses over nine months, rams or he goats, shall be allowed to depasture on the common without the consent in writing of the managers first obtained.

5. Sheep or goats shall be depastured on such portions only of the common as the managers may from time to time set apart for that purpose.

6. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona-fide* owner.

7. Fourteen clear days before the beginning of each quarter all persons entitled to depasture stock and desirous of obtaining licences shall send in an application to the managers, who shall direct what licences shall issue for the then ensuing quarter.

8. When stock are placed on the common during the currency of a quarter the full fees for such quarter shall be paid.

9. All persons taking stock to depasture on the common shall deliver them into the charge of the herdsman together with a written statement of the number and description of such stock, and shall pay the fees thereon for the current quarter. And the managers upon receiving the fees shall give a receipt for the same in the prescribed form.

10. The managers shall not be held responsible for any straying, or loss of, or injury to stock legally depasturing on the common, but shall, by their herdsman, take every care of such stock, and, in the event of straying, loss, or injury, shall give to the owners every information and assistance.

11. All cows, oxen, heifers, and steers legally depasturing on the common shall be branded with the common brand, and the owners of such cattle shall muster them at such places as may be appointed by the managers as often as the latter may deem necessary for the purpose of branding them, notice being given by the managers or herdsman at least four clear days before such mustering. And the herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, brand such cattle in a conspicuous

place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, and shall be renewed whenever necessary, so as to be plainly legible during the whole period that such cattle may depasture on the common.

12. All such cattle found unbranded at or after the expiration of the last muster shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be forthwith impounded by the herdsman.

13. No person shall be permitted to remove any stock, whether registered on the books or not, from the common without having given notice to and obtained permission from the managers or herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt for the same. And no person other than the *bona-fide* owner of such stock shall be permitted to remove them without authority, in writing, so to do from such owner previously delivered to the herdsman.

14. All stock depasturing on the common on which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid within ten clear days after the date for renewal of licence, or which shall not be registered, shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded by the herdsman.

15. Whenever the managers believe that any animal depasturing on the common is affected with any contagious disease, the owner of such animal shall remove the same from the common on receiving 24 hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman so to do, and in the event of such owner neglecting or refusing to remove such animal the managers or herdsman may cause such animal to be removed or destroyed at the owner's expense.

16. All carcasses found on the common which the owner or owners may refuse or neglect to remove after receiving 24 hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman so to do, may be removed, buried, or destroyed, by burning or otherwise, at the expense of such owner or owners.

Any person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, from the date hereof, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

## VERMIN DISTRICTS.—ANNUAL RATES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**WHEREAS** by Part II. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that the local committee for the destruction of vermin of any Vermin District shall, within thirty days from its appointment, and thereafter in the month of January in each and every year, recommend to the Governor an annual rate or assessment, specifying the amount thereof to be paid by the owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within its Vermin District, in respect of each square mile of land owned, held under lease, or occupied under the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committees duly appointed for the Vermin Districts named hereunder have recommended for the current year certain rates per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin Districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim the rates specified hereunder to be the annual rates per square mile payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of lands within the Vermin Districts respectively named in conjunction therewith, that is to say:—

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Eastern Vermin District shall be Five shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Eastern Vermin District shall be Three shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District shall be One shilling per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Warracknabeal Vermin District shall be Two shillings and sixpence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Three shillings and sixpence per square mile.

## AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by the Land Acts it is amongst other things enacted that, subject to the provisions of the *Land Act 1898*, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 9, of the said *Land Act 1898*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6) shall not be increased: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 6 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Acts it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the First Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 9 of the *Land Act 1898* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

The births of 1,023 children, viz., 529 boys and 499 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of January. The number was, it will be observed, slightly higher than in January, 1900, and much higher than the exceptionally low numbers registered in the corresponding months of the years 1897 to 1899, although lower than in any other of the previous years shown, and 98 below the average of the month during the last ten years, or 132 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in January numbered 742, viz., 390 of males and 352 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 286, or 39 per cent., as against 40 per cent. in January, 1900, and 57 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 17 more than in January, 1900, and the highest recorded for the month since 1892, excepting 1896 (when it was equal) and 1898; it was also 27 above the average of January during the last ten years, and 5 above it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.33, and of deaths registered to 18.29 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 25.36 and 18.17 respectively, and during the last ten years of 23.46 and 18.11 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.2° on the 19th, and the lowest was 46.6° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (62.9°) was 3.1° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (45.0°) took place on the 10th, and the least range (7.4°) on the 21st. The mean daily range was 21.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.149 inches on the 23rd, and the lowest was 29.442 inches on the 1st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.811 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 12 days, the amount being 3.01 inches, which was higher than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1897, 1899, and 1900.

The mean humidity of the month was .661.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 38 per cent. to that mortality, as against 39 per cent. in January, 1900; 39 per cent. in January, 1890; 39 per cent. in January, 1898; 30 per cent. in January, 1897; 43 per cent. in January, 1896; and 43 per cent. in January, 1895.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 220, as compared with 235 in January, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality was 214 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 232 in January, 1900; 183 in January, 1899; 218 in January, 1898; 143 in January, 1897; 224 in January, 1896; 178 in January, 1895; 224 in January, 1894; 222 in January, 1893; 225 in January, 1892; and 274 in January, 1891.

Thirty-six of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 52 in January, 1900—were from external causes, of which 30 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A boy, aged 8, was passed over by a railway train; a pensioner, aged 73, by a lorry; a boy, aged 10, a coachbuilder, aged 48, a carter, aged 50, and a contractor, aged 66, died of injuries, the result of being thrown from carts; a miner, aged 23, of fracture of the skull, caused by jumping from a window; a female, aged 35, of injuries to the head, consequent on a fall; a butcher, aged 55, of injuries, the result of being dragged by a bolting horse; two females, aged 58 and 74, of rupture of the bowels and fracture of hip, respectively; two male children, aged 1 and 4, respectively, and three females, aged 7, 9, and 81, respectively, of burns; a gentleman, aged 60, and a female child, aged 3 months, of heat apoplexy; an apprentice, aged 17, and a messenger, aged 18, were drowned in the River Yarra, the former whilst bathing and the latter by falling out of a boat; a boy, aged 5, in the Saltwater River; a carpenter, aged 36, a commercial traveller, aged 40, a male of occupation unknown, aged 60, and a female, aged 35, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a clerk, aged 35, and two females, aged 9 and 48 respectively, were suffocated by food; a new-born male infant, at birth; and a male child, aged 8 days, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a male child, aged 2, who died of fracture of the skull; a female, aged 38, of gunshot wounds, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case; and a new-born male infant, who was found dead—the cause having been suffocation (probably murder). The suicidal deaths were those of a labourer, aged 36, who cut his throat; a male of no occupation, aged 64, who poisoned himself; and a labourer, aged 24, who suffocated himself with carbolic acid.

Seventy persons—as against 66 in January, 1900—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a labourer, aged 75, died of paralysis; a dairyman, aged 75, of insanity; a gentleman, aged 75, of aneurism; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 76, of cancer and paralysis, respectively; a schoolmaster and a bricklayer, each aged 76, of heart disease; a leather merchant and a female, each aged 76, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 76, of cirrhosis of the liver; three females, each aged 76, of hepatitis, kidney disease, and dropsy, respectively; a miner, aged 77, of stricture of the urethra; an engine-man, aged 77, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of endocarditis; a pensioner and three females, each aged 77, of heart disease; a grocer, aged 77, of pneumonia; a female, aged 77, of peritonitis; a warehouseman, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a clergyman and a gentleman, each aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 78, of pericarditis; a cooper, aged 78, of syncope; a barrister, aged 78, of hernia; a female, aged 79, of meningitis; two females, each aged 79, of heart disease; two females, each aged 80, of cancer and paralysis, respectively; a gentleman, aged 80, of Bright's disease; two gentlemen and two females, each aged 81, of syncope, heart disease, pneumonia, and burns respectively; a drover, aged 82, of cancer; a time-keeper, aged 82, of hemiplegia; a gardener, aged 82, of diarrhoea; a contractor, aged 84, of softening of the brain; a female, aged 84, of syncope; a hæmorrhage; a cook, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a carpenter, aged 82, of uræmia; a female, aged 83, of cerebral hæmorrhage; a male of no occupation, aged 83, of syncope; another, aged 89, of apoplexy; another, aged 90, of valvular disease of the heart, 87, of enteritis; another, aged 92, of cerebral hæmorrhage; three females, aged 75, 76, and 78, respectively, a tailor, aged 79, a labourer and a painter, each aged 80, a gardener, aged 81, a carpenter, aged 82, a female, aged 83, a painter, aged 84, two females, aged 85 and 86 respectively, a cook, aged 87, and a female, aged 88, of old age.

One hundred and sixth-five deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—57 in the Melbourne, 18 in the Alfred, 12 in St. Vincent's, 6 in the Women's, 14 in the Children's, 6 in the Homœopathic, and 10 in the Austin Hospitals; 7 in the Metropolitan and 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 11 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Protestant Refuge; 3 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 281, of which 149, or 53 per cent., were of males, and 132, or 47 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 220 were under one year of age, 41 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 6 was between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 461. Of these 241, or 52 per cent., were males, and 220, or 48 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 13 were between fifteen and twenty, 19 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 44 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 24 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 52 were between seventy and seventy-five, 36 were between seventy-five and eighty, 22 were between eighty and eighty-five, 10 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 2 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 1 death each under parasitic and dietetic diseases, 13 under constitutional, and 40 under local diseases, whilst there was a decrease of 11 under zymotic, 4 under developmental diseases, 16 under the head of violence, and 12 under ill-defined causes. Under the zymotic class, deaths from measles rose from nil to 5, whilst those from influenza fell from 15 to 2, and those from typhoid fever from 18 to 10. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 23, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 19, and those from diseases of the digestive system by 5, whilst those from diseases of the urinary system diminished by 8.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first month of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.
