PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made under my Hand and the Seal of the said State in pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), and bearing date the 12th day of March, 1901, so far only as the same relates to the appointment of Wednesday, the 20th day of March, 1901, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Oakleigh, and in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid I do hereby appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

MONDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Horsham;

THURSDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Oakleigh, and as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Doncaster;

FRIDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF MARCH INSTANT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Towong.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE POTTERY TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of pottery-making, including the making of tiles, and of drain and glazed pipes, and the clay-digging in connexion therewith, has made the following determination:—

That the lowest prices or rates to be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of making glazed pipes, and in the clay-digging in connexion therewith, shall be as follows:—

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

Number.

That the number of Apprentices or Improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be—

One Apprentice or Improver to every two adults, or fraction thereof, receiving not less than 40s. per week;

provided that to every eight adults employed, not more than one Improver employed shall be under sixteen years of age.

Apprentices or Improvers Employed making Glazed Pipes and in the Clay-digging in connexion therewith.

Rates of Payment.

That the lowest prices or rates to be paid to any Apprentice or Improver employed in the process, trade, or business of making glazed pipes, and in the clay-digging in connexion therewith, shall be as follows:—

Under 16 years of age, 12s. per week of 48 hours.

OVERTIME.

32s.

That any employé engaged in the process, trade, or business of pottery-making, including the making of tiles, and of drain and glazed pipes, and the clay-digging in connexion therewith, who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board, shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

That the above determination shall come into force from and after the 27th day of March, 1901.
