THE PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS ACT 1900 TO APPLY TO THE HOLIDAY OF 21st APRIL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia. Australia.

WHEREAS by the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900 (64 Vict. No. 1661) it is amongst other things enacted that whenever pursuant to any Act any holiday to which the said Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900 applies would fall on any day other than a Monday, then the following Monday shall be observed as such public holiday and bank holiday instead of such day, and that the provisions of any Acts relating to public holidays or bank holidays shall be deemed and taken to apply to such Monday. And whereas it is by the said Act further enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Governor diagette, proclaim that there shall be added to the holidays to which the said Act applies the 26th day of January and the 21st day of April, or either of them, and that thereafter, subject to the said Act, the said day or days shall in each and every year be observed as a public holiday and bank holiday: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim that the 21st day of April shall be added to the holidays to which the said Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900 applies.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria (64 Vict. No. 1669), entitled the *Census Act 1901, it is enacted that an account shall be taken of the Population and of the Laud and Live Stock in the State: And whereas Sunday, the 31st day of March, 1901, has been fixed by the said Act as that on which such account shall be taken: It is hereby notified that, for the purpose of such account, printed forms will be left at each dwelling on or before the 30th day of March, 1901, and will be called for on the 1st day of April, 1901, or as soon after as practicable. All occupiers or persons in charge of dwellings are required to enter the particulars sought for in such forms to the best of their knowledge, information, or belief; and if any person shall refuse or wilfully neglect to fill up such forms, or to sign and deliver the same; or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to answer, or untruly answer, any inquiry made by a Sub-enumerator for any of the purposes of this Act; or shall wilfully make, sign, or deliver, or cause to be made, signed, or delivered, any false return or statement of any particular in such forms; or shall obstruct any person in the performance of his duty under the said Act, the person so offending will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS under section 16 of the Dentists Act 1898 the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations prescribing the mode in which elections of members of the Dental Board by dentists shall be conducted, and generally for carrying the Dentists Act 1898 and the Principal Act (viz., the Medical Act 1890, Part II.), into effect: Now, therefore, the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the approval of the Lieutenaut-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, make the following regulations relating to such elections, viz.:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Appointment of returning officer.—The Board shall from time to time appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person, who is registered under the Medical Act 1890, Part II., or under the Dentists Act 1898, and not being a member of the Board, to be the returning officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.
- 2. Expense of elections.—The Board shall pay to the returning officer for his own use, out of the moneys accruing under the Medical Act 1890, Part II., or under the Dentists Act 1898, a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such returning officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.
- 3. Election of members.—In the month of February in every year in which the vacancies on the Board are filled by election by the dentists, the returning officer shall proceed to the election of as many persons who are eligible to be members of the Board as there are vacancies to be filled by election (not being extraordinary vacancies) created in each such year.
- 4. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.—If any member die of the persons who have been elected by the dentists to be members of the Board or by notice under his hand delivered to the President or Registrar resign his office as member, or become incapable of being a member, or be declared ousted of such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of such member shall become vacant, and such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy, and notified to the returning officer by the Board, and the returning officer shall, upon receiving such notification, proceed to the election of a person eligible under the Act to fill such extraordinary vacancy.
- 5. Returning officer to give notice of day of election, and day of nomination, time and place when and where nominations will be received.—At every election for members to serve on the Board the returning officer shall give 21 days' notice, by advertisement in such paper or papers as may be approved of by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.
- 6. Who may nominate, and how.—Any person registered under the Medical Act 1890, Part II., or under the Dentists Act 1898, desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such Schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and the person therein named as a candidate shall signify his acceptance of such nomination by notification in writing to the Registrar of the Board. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the day fixed for nominations.
- 7. How candidate may retire.—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election, and three of the persons having signed the paper nominating him shall be desirous that he retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature; such candidate and the persons aforesaid, not later than eight clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice in the form of the Third Schedule hereto stating that such candidate so retires, and the returning officer on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.
- 8. When returning officer may declare members elected without a poll; when a poll shall be taken.—The returning officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken, and he shall cause voting papers to be printed in the form given in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign each of such papers, and cause one to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened, with the name and address of the returning officer printed thereon, and one of such voting papers and printed envelopes shall be sent by post under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered dentist. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in the addressed envelope, and shall post the same so that it shall be received by the returning officer in course of post before the day fixed for holding such election.

9. Voting paper may become invalid; voting paper to be posted to address of returning officer.—If any voter shall suffer to remain not struck out upon any voting paper a greater number of names than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the returning officer.

10. Appointment of scrutineers.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer, to be present when the returning officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day

of holding the election.

11. Returning officer to ascertain number of voters for each candidate, in presence of registrar and scrutineers; candidates declared duly elected; casting vote of returning officer.—The returning officer shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed, in the presence of the registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate, to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the returning officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Dental Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting

- 2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of all fodder crops such as maize, amber cane, lucerne, &c., shall be Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Twopence (2d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.
- 3. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of grass land shall be Threepence halfpenny (3½d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Threepence halfpenny (3½d.) per inch per acre for cach subsequent watering.
- 4. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of fallow land shall be Fourpence per inch per acre for the first watering, and Fourpence per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.
- 5. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of gardens shall be £1 (one pound) per acre for the first acre, and Ten shillings per acre for each additional or fractional part of an acre for a period of twelve months.
- 6. The minimum quantity of water to be supplied for the purposes specified in clauses Nos. 1, 2, and 4 shall be 3 inches per acre, and the minimum quantity of water to be supplied for the purpose specified in clause 3 (three) shall be two (2) inches per acre, and the minimum amount to be charged for any watering shall be Ten shillings (10s.) In all cases one (1) inch per acre shall be deemed to be a supply of 3,630 cubic feet of water.
- 7. The rate or price to be charged for filling tanks shall be £1 (one pound) for any tank not exceeding 2,000 cubic yards, and Ten shillings for every additional 1,000 cubic yards.
- 8. All water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be paid for when supplied.

1. Appointments as Commissioned Officers in the Victoria Regiment, Royal Australian Artillery, and Permanent Section, Victorian Engineers, will be granted to members of the Military Forces of Victoria, subject to the following regulations:—

2. Applications for appointment must be forwarded to the Commandant through Commanding Officers. If possible three months' notice of vacancy will be given.

3. An applicant for any appointment, in the opinion of his Commanding Officer, must be in all respects a fit and proper person for appointment, and have, at the date of his application, served at least twelve months in the Military Forces and attended one training.

A certificate from his Commanding Officer to this effect

must be attached to his application.

4. No applicant may present himself for any examination for any appointment unless he was under the age of 22 years on the last day appointed for receiving applications for such appointment. But applications from Officers who were eligible under the Regulations made on the 30th day of December, 1892, will be received—if such Officers do not exceed the age as therein specified.

5. Approved applicants may present themselves at a qualifying literary examination, and on qualifying thereat shall be enrolled as candidates. Such examination shall be in the following subjects, and the maximum number of marks for each subject shall be that shown opposite each of them respectively:—

At least 10 questions will be set in (a), (b),

and (c).

(2) French, German, or some other modern language, the examination being limited to two translations from the language and five grammatical ques-

tions ... 100

Writing English correctly and in a good legible hand, from dictation. English composition tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or precis. 1100

(4) The elements of geometrical drawing, including the constructions of scales and the use of simple mathematical instruments ... 100

Ten questions will be set in this subject.

To qualify, an applicant must obtain at least one-half of the maximum number of marks in each of the subjects (1), (2), (3), and (4), and three-fifths of the aggregate maximum number of marks for the whole of such subjects.

6. Candidates who, subsequently to notice of a competitive examination, are certified by the Principal Medical Officer as physically qualified in all respects for appointment and are approved by the Commandant as fit and proper persons for appointment, may present themselves at such examination. Every such examination shall be in the following subjects, and the maximum number of marks for each subject shall be that shown opposite each of them respectively:—

(a) Plane trigonometry up to and including the solution of triangles ... 100
(b) Mensuration 100
(c) Elementary bydrostatics and mechanics 100

Ten questions will be set in each paper.

To qualify, a candidate must obtain at least one-half of the maximum number of marks in each of the subjects (a), (b), (c), and three-fifths of the aggregate maximum number of marks for the whole of such subjects.

The following will be the syllabus of subjects for examination of candidates, and text-books to be used:

(a) Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles—Text books, Todhunter's Trigonometry for beginners, Chapters I. to XI. inclusive, or Pinkerton's Trigonometry.

(b) Mensuration.—Of no greater difficulty than is contained in Blackie's "Elementary Mensuration," by James Martin.

(c) Hydrostatics and Mechanics.—Not more than is treated of in Blackie's "Elementary Mechanics."

At any competitive examination the candidate who qualifying thereat obtains the highest aggregate number of marks, or, if there be only one candidate, if he qualifies thereat, will be appointed on probation for six months. - 4. Candidates will be required to undergo an inspection by the Principal Medical Officer and be certified to by this Officer to be physically qualified in all respects for an appointment in the Permanent Forces.
- 5. Intending candidates must forward their applications to the Assistant Adjutant-General, through their Commanding Officers, and be recommended by their Commanding Officers as fit and proper persons in every respect for appointment in the Permanent Forces.
- Candidates will be required to pass a practical examination in riding.
- 7. Notice of a vacancy will be published in General Orders.

 8. The selected candidate will be appointed on probation for six months, and must at the end of that time pass the examination laid down for Officers of the Permanent Forces, vide Standing Orders, Part XII., Section II., page 132, paras. 3, 4, 4A, 5, and 6. The births of 942 children, viz., 478 boys and 464 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. The number was, it will be observed, about the same as in February, 1900, and larger than in 1899, but lower than that recorded for the month in any other of the last eleven years, and 127 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 159 below it is allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in February numbered 600, viz., 345 of males and 255 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 342, or 57 per cent., as against 91 per cent. in February, 1900, and 72 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 105 more than in February, 1900, but was the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1891, 1895, and 1897; it was also 23 below the average of February thruing the last ten years, and 42 below it is allowance be made for the increase of population.

The mean atmospheric pressure (29.9°) inches) was slightly above the average.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 6 deaths under zymotic, 7 under detic, 24 under constitutional, 71 under local diseases, and 6 under illdefined causes, whilst there was a decrease of 1 under parasitic, 3 under developmental diseases, and 5 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from distributional class, deaths from distributional class, deaths from acuser from 26 to 37. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system recession 3 to 7, and those from cancer from 26 to 37. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 26, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 20, those from diseases of the respiratory system by 8, those from diseases of the digestive system by 19, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 5, whilst those from diseases of the organs of locomotion diminished by 3.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first two moths of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be neticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DRATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1901.

THE births of 47 boys and 56 girls, or in all of 103 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of February. Of these 47 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, and 1 in Sebastopol; included were 10 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 131, viz., 72 of boys and 59 of girls.

No. 1112, section 388] it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or oxchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the municipality of the City of Prahran has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved, used, or acquired by the said Council for the purpose of making streets within the said City, be so declared a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this notice declare the lands reserved, used, or acquired for the street hereinafter named and described, and situate within the City of Prahran aforesaid, to be a Public Highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz. :—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, to exempt any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the Chinese Act 1890 aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—
