THE PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS ACT 1900 TO  
APPLY TO THE HOLIDAY OF 21st APRIL.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight  
Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael  
and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of  
Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of  
Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900* (64  
Vict. No. 1661) it is amongst other things enacted that  
whenever pursuant to any Act any holiday to which the said  
*Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900* applies would fall on any  
day other than a Monday, then the following Monday shall be  
observed as such public holiday and bank holiday instead of such  
day, and that the provisions of any Acts relating to public holi-  
days or bank holidays shall be deemed and taken to apply to  
such Monday: And whereas it is by the said Act further  
enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation  
published in the *Government Gazette*, proclaim that there shall  
be added to the holidays to which the said Act applies the 26th  
day of January and the 21st day of April, or either of them,  
and that thereafter, subject to the said Act, the said day or days  
shall in each and every year be observed as a public holiday and  
bank holiday: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of  
the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with  
the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do  
hereby proclaim that the 21st day of April shall be added to the  
holidays to which the said *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1900*  
applies.

aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of March, in  
the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and  
one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.

## NOTICE.—CENSUS OF 1901.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria (64  
Vict. No. 1669), entitled the *Census Act 1901*, it is enacted  
that an account shall be taken of the Population and of the Land  
and Live Stock in the State: And whereas Sunday, the 31st day  
of March, 1901, has been fixed by the said Act as that on which  
such account shall be taken: It is hereby notified that, for the  
purpose of such account, printed forms will be left at each dwell-  
ing on or before the 30th day of March, 1901, and will be called for  
on the 1st day of April, 1901, or as soon after as practicable.

All occupiers or persons in charge of dwellings are required to  
enter the particulars sought for in such forms to the best of their  
knowledge, information, or belief; and if any person shall refuse  
or wilfully neglect to fill up such forms, or to sign and deliver  
the same; or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to answer, or un-  
truly answer, any inquiry made by a Sub-enumerator for any of  
the purposes of this Act; or shall wilfully make, sign, or deliver,  
or cause to be made, signed, or delivered, any false return or state-  
ment of any particular in such forms; or shall obstruct any per-  
son in the performance of his duty under the said Act, the person  
so offending will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five  
pounds.

## DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS under section 16 of the *Dentists Act* 1898 the Dental Board of Victoria may, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, make regulations prescribing the mode in which elections of members of the Dental Board by dentists shall be conducted, and generally for carrying the *Dentists Act* 1898 and the Principal Act (viz., the *Medical Act* 1890, Part II.), into effect: Now, therefore, the Dental Board of Victoria does, with the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, make the following regulations relating to such elections, viz.:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. *Appointment of returning officer.*—The Board shall from time to time appoint (and may remove) some fit and proper person, who is registered under the *Medical Act* 1890, Part II., or under the *Dentists Act* 1898, and not being a member of the Board, to be the returning officer, and to conduct the election of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf.

2. *Expense of elections.*—The Board shall pay to the returning officer for his own use, out of the moneys accruing under the *Medical Act* 1890, Part II., or under the *Dentists Act* 1898, a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such returning officer, together with a sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.

3. *Election of members.*—In the month of February in every year in which the vacancies on the Board are filled by election by the dentists, the returning officer shall proceed to the election of as many persons who are eligible to be members of the Board as there are vacancies to be filled by election (not being extraordinary vacancies) created in each such year.

4. *Extraordinary vacancies, how filled.*—If any member die of the persons who have been elected by the dentists to be members of the Board or by notice under his hand delivered to the President or Registrar resign his office as member, or become incapable of being a member, or be declared ousted of such office by the Supreme Court, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Board without leave obtained from the Board in that behalf, then in every such case the office of such member shall become vacant, and such vacancy shall be an extraordinary vacancy, and notified to the returning officer by the Board, and the returning officer shall, upon receiving such notification, proceed to the election of a person eligible under the Act to fill such extraordinary vacancy.

5. *Returning officer to give notice of day of election, and day of nomination, time and place when and where nominations will be received.*—At every election for members to serve on the Board the returning officer shall give 21 days' notice, by advertisement in such paper or papers as may be approved of by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of fit and proper persons to serve as members on such Board; and he shall also in such advertisement name a day, being not less than twelve days nor more than fifteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and affix the date it is given thereto.

6. *Who may nominate, and how.*—Any person registered under the *Medical Act* 1890, Part II., or under the *Dentists Act* 1898, desirous of nominating any other person as a candidate, shall fill up a nomination paper in the form of the First Schedule hereto, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such Schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and the person therein named as a candidate shall signify his acceptance of such nomination by notification in writing to the Registrar of the Board. Such nomination paper must be lodged or delivered by post before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the day fixed for nominations.

7. *How candidate may retire.*—If any person who shall duly have become a candidate for such election, and three of the persons having signed the paper nominating him shall be desirous that he retire before the day of holding such election from such candidature; such candidate and the persons aforesaid, not later than eight clear days before the day of holding such election, may sign and deliver a notice in the form of the Third Schedule hereto stating that such candidate so retires, and the returning officer on receipt of such notice shall omit the name of such person so retiring from the voting paper, and if the number of candidates shall by such retirement be reduced to the number of members to be elected, the returning officer shall declare the remaining members duly elected.

8. *When returning officer may declare members elected without a poll; when a poll shall be taken.*—The returning officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of persons nominated than are required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Registrar of the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected member or members of the Board; but if the number of persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken, and he shall cause voting papers to be printed in the form given in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall sign each of such papers, and cause one to be enclosed in an envelope not fastened, with the name and address of the returning officer printed thereon, and one of such voting papers and printed envelopes shall be sent by post under a fastened cover to the address of each and every registered dentist. The voter shall enclose such voting paper in the addressed envelope, and shall post the same so that it shall be received by the returning officer in course of post before the day fixed for holding such election.

9. *Voting paper may become invalid; voting paper to be posted to address of returning officer.*—If any voter shall suffer to remain not struck out upon any voting paper a greater number of names than the number of members to be elected, or shall fail to attach his signature thereto, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the returning officer.

10. *Appointment of scrutineers.*—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint in writing one scrutineer, to be present when the returning officer shall open the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of holding the election.

11. *Returning officer to ascertain number of voters for each candidate, in presence of registrar and scrutineers; candidates declared duly elected; casting vote of returning officer.*—The returning officer shall, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, proceed, in the presence of the registrar and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidate, to open the envelopes with his printed address thereon, and which have been returned to him, and to take out the voting papers therein contained, and if he is satisfied that each vote is properly given, he shall proceed to ascertain the number of such votes for each candidate; and as soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the returning officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of votes given to each candidate, and shall declare the candidates, not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up, who have received the greatest number of votes to be duly elected as members of the Dental Board of Victoria, and if two or more candidates shall have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote.

All previous regulations relating to the elections of members of the Board are hereby cancelled.

**GUNBOWER WEST IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER.****REGULATION No. 3.**

**T**HE Commissioners of the Gunbower West Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, do hereby make the following regulation for the sale of water during the year 1901 :—

1. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of all cereal crops, such as wheat, oats, barley, &c., shall be Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of all fodder crops such as maize, amber cane, lucerne, &c., shall be Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Twopence (2d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

3. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of grass land shall be Threepence halfpenny (3½d.) per inch per acre for the first watering, and Threepence halfpenny (3½d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

4. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of fallow land shall be Fourpence per inch per acre for the first watering, and Fourpence per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

5. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of gardens shall be £1 (one pound) per acre for the first acre, and Ten shillings per acre for each additional or fractional part of an acre for a period of twelve months.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be supplied for the purposes specified in clauses Nos. 1, 2, and 4 shall be 3 inches per acre, and the minimum quantity of water to be supplied for the purpose specified in clause 3 (three) shall be two (2) inches per acre, and the minimum amount to be charged for any watering shall be Ten shillings (10s.). In all cases one (1) inch per acre shall be deemed to be a supply of 3,630 cubic feet of water.

7. The rate or price to be charged for filling tanks shall be £1 (one pound) for any tank not exceeding 2,000 cubic yards, and Ten shillings for every additional 1,000 cubic yards.

8. All water supplied from the works of the Trust shall be paid for when supplied.

**UNITED ECHUCA AND WARANGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, the Chairman and Commissioners of the United Echuca and Waranga Waterworks Trust make the Regulation following (that is to say):—

**REGULATION No. 20.**

The whole of the Trust's water channels throughout the Waterworks District of the Trust shall be kept free from contamination or pollution for domestic water supply.

If any person suffers or permits any pigs, geese, or ducks to enter any water channel, reservoir, or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

If any person shall convey or permit the drainage from any manure heap or cesspit, or from any stable, or from any horse,

cattle, pig, or fowl yard to enter any water channel or other waterworks belonging to the Trust, or shall do any act whereby the water in such channel or waterworks is fouled, he shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and a further sum of Twenty shillings for each day that such offence continues.

**T**HE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulation respecting fishing in the water storages of the said Trust:—

**No. 67.—FISHING IN TRUST WATER STORAGES OTHER THAN LAKE MARMA.**

1. No person shall use in any of the water storages or channels of the Trust any weir, net, implement, or device or contrivance for the purpose of taking fish.

2. No person shall angle for or remove or take from any such water storages or channels any fish without the permission, in writing, of the officer of the said Trust duly appointed on that behalf being first obtained.

3. Every person offending against this Regulation shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

## PART I.—GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR THE VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.

The whole of sub-section II. of Part I. is cancelled, and the following is substituted, viz.:—

## SUB-SECTION II.—APPOINTMENTS IN THE VICTORIA REGIMENT, ROYAL AUSTRALIAN ARTILLERY, AND PERMANENT SECTION, VICTORIAN ENGINEERS.

1. Appointments as Commissioned Officers in the Victoria Regiment, Royal Australian Artillery, and Permanent Section, Victorian Engineers, will be granted to members of the Military Forces of Victoria, subject to the following regulations:—

2. Applications for appointment must be forwarded to the Commandant through Commanding Officers. If possible three months' notice of vacancy will be given.

3. An applicant for any appointment, in the opinion of his Commanding Officer, must be in all respects a fit and proper person for appointment, and have, at the date of his application, served at least twelve months in the Military Forces and attended one training.

A certificate from his Commanding Officer to this effect must be attached to his application.

4. No applicant may present himself for any examination for any appointment unless he was under the age of 22 years on the last day appointed for receiving applications for such appointment. But applications from Officers who were eligible under the Regulations made on the 30th day of December, 1892, will be received—if such Officers do not exceed the age as therein specified.

5. Approved applicants may present themselves at a qualifying literary examination, and on qualifying thereat shall be enrolled as candidates. Such examination shall be in the following subjects, and the maximum number of marks for each subject shall be that shown opposite each of them respectively:—

	Maximum Marks.
(1) Mathematics, viz.: (a) Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, and simple interest; (b) Euclid, Books I. and II.; (c) Algebra, up to and including simple equations ... ..	300
At least 10 questions will be set in (a), (b), and (c).	
(2) French, German, or some other modern language, the examination being limited to two translations from the language and five grammatical questions ... ..	100
(3) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation. English composition tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or <i>précis</i> ... ..	100
(4) The elements of geometrical drawing, including the constructions of scales and the use of simple mathematical instruments ... ..	100
Ten questions will be set in this subject.	

To qualify, an applicant must obtain at least one-half of the maximum number of marks in each of the subjects (1),

(2), (3), and (4), and three-fifths of the aggregate maximum number of marks for the whole of such subjects.

6. Candidates who, subsequently to notice of a competitive examination, are certified by the Principal Medical Officer as physically qualified in all respects for appointment and are approved by the Commandant as fit and proper persons for appointment, may present themselves at such examination. Every such examination shall be in the following subjects, and the maximum number of marks for each subject shall be that shown opposite each of them respectively:—

	Maximum Marks.
(a) Plane trigonometry up to and including the solution of triangles ...	100
(b) Mensuration ... ..	100
(c) Elementary hydrostatics and mechanics	100

Ten questions will be set in each paper.

To qualify, a candidate must obtain at least one-half of the maximum number of marks in each of the subjects (a), (b), (c), and three-fifths of the aggregate maximum number of marks for the whole of such subjects.

The following will be the syllabus of subjects for examination of candidates, and text-books to be used:—

(a) *Trigonometry*.—Up to and including the solution of triangles—Text books, Todhunter's *Trigonometry* for beginners, Chapters I. to XI. inclusive, or Pinkerton's *Trigonometry*.

(b) *Mensuration*.—Of no greater difficulty than is contained in Blackie's "*Elementary Mensuration*," by James Martin.

(c) *Hydrostatics and Mechanics*.—Not more than is treated of in Blackie's "*Elementary Mechanics*."

7. At any competitive examination the candidate who qualifying thereat obtains the highest aggregate number of marks, or, if there be only one candidate, if he qualifies thereat, will be appointed on probation for six months. At the end of his term of probation he shall pass a qualifying examination in military subjects. The appointment of any candidate who fails to pass such examination will not be confirmed, but his term of probation may be extended on the recommendation of the Commandant for a period not exceeding six months.

The whole of sub-section III. of Part I. is cancelled, and the following is substituted, viz.:—

#### SUB-SECTION III.—APPOINTMENTS IN THE PERMANENT STAFF.

1. Appointments in other branches of the Permanent Force will be made on the recommendation of the Military Commandant, the following conditions being prescribed:—

2. Candidates will be required to have served at least four years in the Military Forces of the State, and have attended three Easter trainings. A certificate to this effect from the Commanding Officer must be attached to their papers.

3. Candidates must not exceed the age of 35 years.

4. Candidates will be required to undergo an inspection by the Principal Medical Officer and be certified to by this Officer to be physically qualified in all respects for an appointment in the Permanent Forces.

5. Intending candidates must forward their applications to the Assistant Adjutant-General, through their Commanding Officers, and be recommended by their Commanding Officers as fit and proper persons in every respect for appointment in the Permanent Forces.

6. Candidates will be required to pass a practical examination in riding.

7. Notice of a vacancy will be published in General Orders.

8. The selected candidate will be appointed on probation for six months, and must at the end of that time pass the examination laid down for Officers of the Permanent Forces, *vide* Standing Orders, Part XII., Section II., page 132, paras. 3, 4, 4A, 5, and 6. The appointment of any candidate who fails to pass such examination will not be confirmed, but his term of probation may be extended on the recommendation of the Military Commandant for a further period not exceeding six months.

to be the Chairman of the said Woollen Trade Board.

The births of 942 children, viz., 478 boys and 464 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. The number was, it will be observed, about the same as in February, 1900, and larger than in 1899, but lower than that recorded for the month in any other of the last eleven years, and 127 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 159 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in February numbered 600, viz., 345 of males and 255 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 342, or 37 per cent., as against 91 per cent. in February, 1900, and 72 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 105 more than in February, 1900, but was the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1891, 1895, and 1897; it was also 23 below the average of February during the last ten years, and 42 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.70, and of deaths registered to 16.37 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1900 of 25.72 and 13.51 respectively, and during the last ten years of 29.66 and 17.38 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 31.27 and 16.80.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 109.5° on the 7th, and the lowest was 49.1° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (67.4°) was one-fifth of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (48.9°) took place on the 7th, and the least range (7.5°) on the 20th. The mean daily range was 23.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.202 inches on the 26th, and the lowest was 29.462 inches on the 12th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.919 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on 3 days, the amount being .64 of an inch, which was lower than in the corresponding month during any of the previous ten years except 1891, 1892, 1893, 1894, and 1900, and half-an-inch below the average.

The mean humidity of the month was .645.

Males contributed 68 per cent. and females 42 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 33 per cent. to that mortality, as against 30 per cent. in February, 1900; 37 per cent. in February, 1899; 44 per cent. in February, 1898; 34 per cent. in February, 1897; 42 per cent. in February, 1896; and 40 per cent. in February, 1895.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 147, as compared with 120 in February, 1900. The rate of infantile mortality per 1,000 births registered was as low as 156 in the month under review, as compared with 127 in February, 1900; 176 in February, 1899; 238 in February, 1898; 134 in February, 1897; 203 in February, 1896; 171 in February, 1895; 156 in February, 1894; 220 in February, 1893; 181 in February, 1892; and 227 in February, 1891.

Sixty-four persons—as against 40 in February, 1900—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a nurseryman, aged 75, died of cancer; a civil servant, aged 75, of locomotor ataxy; a painter, aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; a male, of unstated occupation, aged 75, of syncope; a coachman, aged 75, of heart disease (undefined); two females, each aged 75, of enteritis; a gentleman, aged 75, of natural causes; a manager, aged 76, of rheumatism; a female, aged 76, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 76, of hemiplegia; a female, aged 76, of insanity; a labourer, aged 76, of brain disease; a solicitor, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of asthma; a currier and a female, each aged 76, of bronchitis; a carpenter, aged 76, of pneumonia; a blacksmith, aged 76, of dyspepsia; a female aged 76, of chronic nephritis; another, aged 77, of phthisis; two gentlemen and a female, each aged 77, of cerebral hæmorrhage, hemiplegia, and endocarditis respectively; a plumber, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 79, of thrombosis; a pensioner and a gardener, each aged 79, of heart disease; a boots, aged 79, of bronchitis; a blacksmith and an engineer, each aged 80, of softening of the brain; a draper, aged 80, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 80, of enteritis; a female, aged 80, of injuries from causes not stated; a male, of no occupation, aged 80, of drowning; a gentleman, aged 81, of diarrhoea; a herdsman, aged 81, of anthritis; a female, aged 81, of syncope; a farmer, aged 81, of obstruction of the intestines; a carpenter and a female, each aged 82, of cancer; two females, each aged 82, of cerebral hæmorrhage and thrombosis respectively; a gentleman, aged 83, of congestion of the brain; a male, of no occupation, aged 83, of syncope; a female, aged 84, of hepatitis; a draper, aged 85, of apoplexy; a female, aged 86, of syncope; another, aged 87, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 88, of mitral disease; two females, each aged 88, of heart disease; a plasterer and a female, each aged 75, a pensioner aged 77, a bricklayer and a female, each aged 78, a veterinary surgeon aged 80, a gentleman, a bricklayer, and a pattern-maker, each aged 81, a labourer aged 84, a female aged 85, and a miner aged 93, of old age.

Twenty-five of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 30 in February, 1900—were from external causes, of which 21 were set down to accident and four to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A bootmaker, aged 67, was passed over by a railway train; a boy, aged 9, and a labourer, aged 41, by carts; a baker, aged 37, was thrown from a cart; a labourer, aged 13, died of injuries the result of being caught in a revolving shaft; a female child, aged 2, of injuries to the head; a labourer, aged 29, of fracture of the skull; a female, aged 80, of accidental injuries; a female child, aged 11 days, of heat apoplexy; a carpenter, aged 30, of toxæmia poisoning; a watchman, aged 64, of irritant poisoning; a storeman, aged 62, was poisoned through drinking beer out of a bottle which contained some kind of poison; a boy, aged 11, was drowned in the River Yarra; a boy, aged 13, at Brunswick; a printer, aged 26, in the Saltwater River. Six persons were found drowned, viz.:—An accountant, aged 37, a platelayer, aged 41, a dealer, aged 67, and a male of no occupation, aged 80, in the River Yarra; a tinsmith, aged 23, in the Saltwater River; and an accountant, aged 41, in Hobson's Bay. The suicidal deaths were those of a bootmaker, aged 33, and a carpenter, aged 65, who cut their throats; a female, aged 40, who hanged herself; and a female, aged 34, who jumped off a cliff.

One hundred and forty-three deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne, 14 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 2 in the Women's, 5 in the Children's, 9 in the Homeopathic, and 11 in the Austin Hospitals; 9 in the Metropolitan and 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 8 in the Benevolent and 3 in the Infant Asylums; 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 2 in the Protestant Refuge; and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 195, of which 108, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 87, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 147 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 405. Of these 237, or 58 per cent., were males, and 168, or 42 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 31 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 27 were between fifty-five and sixty, 32 were between sixty and sixty-five, 37 were between sixty-five and seventy, 47 were between seventy and seventy-five, 34 were between seventy-five and eighty, 22 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 at the age of ninety-three.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 6 deaths under zymotic, 7 under dietic, 24 under constitutional, 71 under local diseases, and 6 under ill-defined causes, whilst there was a decrease of 1 under parasitic, 3 under developmental diseases, and 5 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from diarrhoeal diseases rose from 14 to 26, whilst those from syphilis fell from 6 to 3. Under the constitutional class, deaths from rheumatism rose from 3 to 7, and those from cancer from 26 to 37. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 26, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 20, those from diseases of the respiratory system by 8, those from diseases of the digestive system by 19, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 5, whilst those from diseases of the organs of locomotion diminished by 3.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1900, and the first two months of 1901, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1901.

THE births of 47 boys and 56 girls, or in all of 103 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of February. Of these 47 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, and 1 in Sebastopol; included were 10 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 131, viz., 72 of boys and 59 of girls.

The deaths registered in February numbered 91, viz., 53 of males and 38 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 12. In January the recorded deaths numbered 73; in February, 1900, they numbered 83; in February, 1899, they numbered 74; in February, 1898, they numbered 96; in February, 1897, they numbered 100; in February, 1896, they numbered 81; in February, 1895, they numbered 95; in February, 1894, they numbered 86; in February, 1893, they numbered 92; in February, 1892, they numbered 89; and in February, 1891, they numbered 91.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Twenty-one deaths, or 23 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 13; Benevolent Asylum, 8.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from phthisis rose from 5 to 8; those from old age from 4 to 7; those from diseases of the digestive system from 16 to 20; those from violence from 1 to 4; and those from ill-defined causes from 4 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 2 to nil; those from diarrhoeal diseases from 7 to 2; and those from diseases of the respiratory system from 11 to 3.

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

**W**HEREAS by Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1073) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any person or class of persons from the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and to declare that such provisions shall not at any time, or for any specified period, apply to the person or class of persons mentioned in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation exempt the Chinese named in the first column of the Schedule hereto subjoined from the provisions of Part I. of the *Chinese Act 1890* aforesaid, for the periods specified opposite their respective names in the fourth column of the said Schedule, that is to say:—

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department.
