## FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by The Constitution Act it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and after the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to proregue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand proregued until Tuesday, the 26th day of March, 1901, and it is expedient further to proregue the same: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further proregue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the 26th day of March, 1901, until Tuesday, the 28th day of May, 1901.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.
