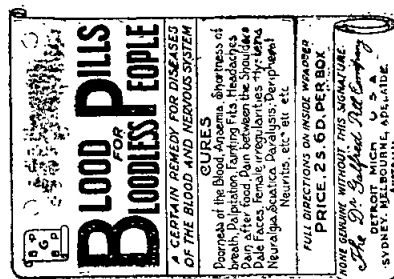

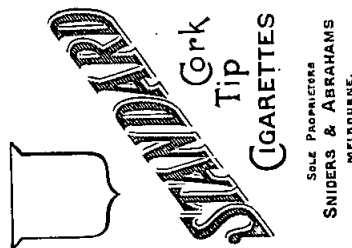

No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the Land Act 1890, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be so conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Berwick has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Gembrook, in the said shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

said Part of the said Act, and also in respect of the sheep or cattle depasturing thereon; and it is further enacted that such rate or assessment, on being proclaimed by the Governor in Council in the *Government Gazette*, shall be the rate payable by the owners, lessees, and occupiers of land within the Vermin District for the current year for the purposes of the said Part of the said Act, and shall be paid to the Minister at the same time as the rent payable by such lessees and occupiers: And whereas the local committee duly appointed for the Northern Vermin District has recommended a rate of One shilling and ninepence per square mile upon all lands within the boundaries of the said Vermin District: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby proclaim an annual rate of One shilling and ninepence per square mile to be the rate payable by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Northern Vermin District aforesaid for the current year.

## DIGGING OR REMOVING STONE, GRAVEL, SAND, ETC., FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make Orders as follow, that is to say:-

DINYARRAK.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall dig or remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth on or from the portion of Crown land in the parish of Dinyarrak, temporarily reserved, by Order of the 24th February, 1882, as a site for the use of the Department of Trade and Customs, and described in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th February, 1882, page 510.—(60. C.14046.)

SHEPPARTON.—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall, except for municipal purposes, dig or remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth on or from the Crown lands, being part of the Shepparton Sewage Farm Reserve, hereinafter described, viz.:-

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles, as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles that may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. In other cases the supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery as a rule to be of the full quantity ordered.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post-office.

6. 11.
