PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

Stock Diseases Act 1890.

QUARANTINE DISTRICT ABOLISHED.

IN pursuance of the provisions of clause 64 in Part II. of the Regulations made under Part I. of the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and bearing date the 11th November, 1890, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by Order made on the 26th day of March, 1901, abolished the Quarantine District hereunder described, viz.:—

Land in the parishes of Yering and Warrandyte respectively, being allotment B, section 21, parish of Yering, county of Evelyn: Commencing at the north-west angle of the allotment, thence east seventy-nine chains; thence south along a one-chain road twenty chains; thence west by allotment C seventy-nine chains, and thence north by the parish boundary twenty chains to point of commencement. Also part of allotment 8, parish of Warrandyte, county of Evelyn: Commencing at the north-east angle of the allotment, thence south eighty chains along the parish boundary to the south-east angle of the allotment; thence west along allotment 10 about thirty-nine chains to Brushy creek; thence by that creek northerly about eighty-five chains to the north boundary of the allotment; and thence by that boundary east about fifty-seven chains to the point of commencement.

CAPTAIN BOLLONS, of the New Zealand Government steamer *Hinemoa*, reports having examined the position of the Wolverine Rock, situated in West Bay, Sunday Island, and marked "P.D." on the chart.

The rock has an area of about 50 square feet, with 9 feet of water on it at low water spring tides, and lies $8\frac{1}{2}$ cables off the beach.

There are depths of from 6 to 8 fathoms all round, at a distance of half a cable's length from the rock.

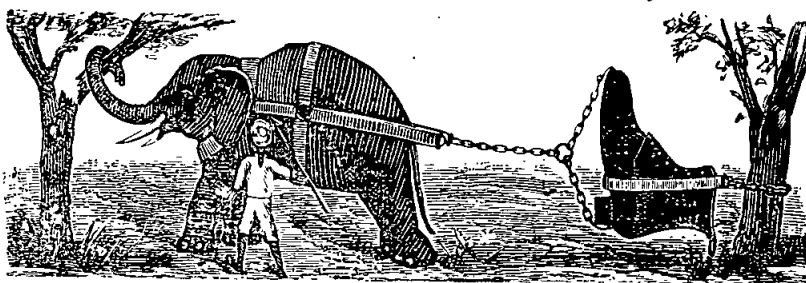

Explosives Act 1890.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARRIAGE OF EXPLOSIVES IN MIXED TRAINS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of March, 1901.

WHEREAS by Division 3 of Part I. of the *Explosives Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1090) it is amongst other things enacted that no explosive shall be carried in or on or by means of any cart, dray, waggon, or carriage, or any railway truck unless the explosive is carried in such manner and under such conditions as may be prescribed by any regulation under the said Act, and that the Governor in Council may at any time make, alter, and repeal regulations generally for regulating the carriage of explosives: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order make the following regulations, viz:—

CONVEYANCE OF EXPLOSIVES IN MIXED (PASSENGER AND GOODS) TRAINS.

Regulations.

1. Explosives to be carried in approved cylinders.—Gunpowder or Nitrate mixtures belonging to Classes 1 and 2, or any explosive included in the 2nd and 3rd Divisions of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, and of the 7th (Fireworks) Class, as classified by Order in Council No. 1 of 13th December, 1890, if packed in metallic cylinders of a pattern approved of by the Commissioner of Railways, may be conveyed together with ordinary goods in a truck or trucks containing any article or substance liable to cause or communicate fire or explosion.

2. Certain explosives not to be carried together in the same truck.—No explosive of the 6th (Ammunition) Class containing its own means of ignition, or any explosive of the 7th (Fireworks) Class shall be conveyed in the same truck with any explosive not of the class and division to which it belongs.

3. Maximum of explosives to be carried.—Not more than 1,000 lbs. of explosives (other than Detonators), and not a greater number than 30,000 Detonators, shall be carried on any one train.

4. Mode in which explosives to be carried.—The number of trucks (not containing explosives or inflammable material of any kind) which shall intervene between the engine or the passenger carriages and each truck containing explosives shall be as follows:—

(a) When carrying over 300 lbs. of explosives (other than Detonators) and over 10,000 Detonators, not less than three.

(b) When carrying under 300 lbs. of explosives (other than Detonators) and under 10,000 Detonators, one or more.

5. Explosive trucks to be detached at sections where goods trains run.—Immediately on the arrival of a mixed train conveying explosives at a section on which goods trains are running the trucks containing the explosives shall be detached.

CONVEYANCE OF EXPLOSIVES IN GOODS TRAINS.

1. Mode of carrying explosives in goods trains and limitation.—The regulations governing the carriage of explosives in mixed (passenger and goods) trains shall also apply to the carriage of explosives together with ordinary goods in goods trains. Provided that—

(a) The total quantity of explosives (other than Detonators) carried by any one goods train shall not exceed 2,000 lbs.

(b) The quantity of Detonators so carried on any one train shall not exceed 60,000 in number.

(c) Not less than three trucks (not containing explosives or any kind of inflammable material) shall intervene between the engine and the truck or trucks containing explosives.

2. Explosives to be packed and marked in accordance with Explosives Act.—All explosives intended for conveyance in metallic cylinders must be packed and marked in accordance with the provisions of the Explosives Act.

WHEREAS by the Land Acts power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, or rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes specified in the said Acts, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to and alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

Amendments of the Regulations made on 4th July, 1899.

PART II.—CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLEE LANDS.

CHAPTER V.—AGRICULTURAL AND GRAZING ALLOTMENTS.

Residence Licences.

Non-residence Licences (Agricultural Allotments).

From Regulations 1 and 10 the words "current at the commencement of the *Land Act 1898*" shall be omitted.

CHAPTER IX.—MISCELLANEOUS LICENCES.

(Section 99, *Land Act 1890*.)

For Regulation 10 there shall be substituted the following, namely:—

10. Every application to purchase under the provisions of section 113 of the *Land Act 1898* land held under section 99 of the *Land Act 1890* as a site for a butter factory or creamery, or as a site for a residence, garden, inn, store, smithy, or similar building not within the boundaries of a city, and of which the licensee has been in possession for at least five years, shall be made in the form prescribed in schedule 37 hereto.

In schedule 6 the words "nine hundred and sixty acres fourth class land," shall be inserted before the words "and described hereunder."

In schedule 9 the word "or" before the words "third class" shall be omitted, and after the words "third class" the words "or fourth class" shall be inserted.

In schedule 17 the words "fourth class" shall be inserted where necessary.

CHAPTER III.—AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

From Regulation 2 the words "whose licence was current at the commencement of the *Land Act 1898*" shall be omitted.

10. Should the Minister consider that any appeal has been made on frivolous grounds, he may direct that the whole or any portion of the deposit shall be forfeited, and may also direct that the appellant shall pay such further costs as may seem to him reasonable.

CHAPTER XI.—COMMONS.

Unless otherwise ordered by the Governor in Council the managers of a common shall hold office for a term of three (3) years from the date of their appointment.

CHAPTER II.—MALLEE ALLOTMENTS.

Every application by the lessee of a mallee allotment for permission to surrender his lease and obtain an agricultural lease in lieu thereof shall be in the form prescribed in schedule 99^A hereto.

CHAPTER III.—AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

Every application for permission to surrender an agricultural allotment lease and have the allotment classified shall be made in the form prescribed in schedule 84^A hereto, and the lessee shall pay a classification fee of Ten shillings and forward the receipt with his application.

Village Settlers.

Every application for permission to surrender a lease or permit under the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893* for land in the mallee country or mallee border, and have the allotment or homestead section classified, shall be in the form prescribed in schedule 84^B hereto, and the lessee or permit holder shall pay a classification fee of Ten shillings and forward the receipt with his application.

STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

There may be issued licences to enter upon such Crown lands, mallee lands, State forests, or timber reserves as may be set apart for the purpose, and to cut timber thereon for the purpose of the manufacture or production of eucalyptus oil.

Every such licence shall be subject to the conditions specified in the schedule hereto, and to the payment in advance of a fee of £1 (One pound sterling) per annum for each block so licensed. —(Corr. F.28068).

SCHEDULE.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE TO CUT TIMBER ON LAND RESERVED UNDER SECTION 149, LAND ACT 1898, FOR THE MANUFACTURE OR PRODUCTION OF EUCALYPTUS OIL.

1. The licence-fee shall be One pound sterling (£1) per block, payable in advance.
2. No person, firm, or company shall hold at one time more than 1,000 acres of mallee land in all, though he or they may hold more than one block. In marking out the block the forest officer may allow for the area not containing mallee.
3. Licences shall have a currency of twelve months from date of licence, and may be renewed from year to year, so long as the licensee pays rent and the Crown is willing.
4. The Crown reserves the right to dispose of the timber, other than mallee, on the block in any way thought desirable.
5. Blocks are to be marked out by the forest officer in charge, the licensee to erect posts 4 inches by 4 inches in thickness, and 3ft. 6in. above the ground, at the corners of his block, or at such other positions on the boundaries as may be pointed out by the forest officer, to paint such posts white, and to paint his name legibly in black on such posts.

6. One-fourth of the area to be operated upon first, and all suitable timber felled to the surface of the ground and to the satisfaction of the forest officer before the remainder is operated upon, and in like manner for the remaining three-quarters.

7. All débris to be stacked and burnt when so directed by the forest officer, and all work done to his satisfaction and in accordance with his instructions.

8. A licence may be cancelled at any time (without compensation) for any breach of these conditions, or if any portion of the area is used for any purpose other than that for which it is licensed.

PART IV.—SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

CHAPTER I.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

The Regulation made on 13th August, 1900, relative to the fee chargeable for charcoal, is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation is made in lieu thereof, namely:—

Charcoal Burning.

Charcoal burning operations shall be conducted only under permit, and in accordance with the conditions specified in schedule hereto.

The royalty charge shall be one halfpenny (½d.) per bag, but if the charcoal be made exclusively from débris lying on the ground, then the charge shall be one farthing (¼d.) per bag.

All bags to be of approved size.—(Corr. F.23528).

SCHEDULE.

1. This permit is available for a period of three months from date of same.

2. Charcoal burning shall be under the direct supervision of the officer in charge, who will locate the permit-holder in any particular portion of Crown lands, timber reserves, or State forest, which is, in his opinion, most suitable, and kilns shall be erected only on sites approved by such officer. In proceeding with the work, the permit-holder must carry out the instructions of the officer in charge.

3. During the summer months, or at any time when, in the forest officer's opinion, there is danger from fire spreading, the permit-holder shall clean up, to the satisfaction of the forest officer, a space of not less than 3 chains in width around his kiln, and during progress of burning there shall be at least one person constantly in charge at the kiln. The permit-holder shall also notify the forest officer previous to firing kiln.

4. No charcoal shall be removed from the kiln site until the number of bags is determined by the forest officer, and paid for by the permit-holder, or until satisfactory arrangements, approved by the forest officer, are made for such payment.

5. The royalty charge shall be ½d. per bag of approved size, but if made exclusively from débris lying on the ground, shall be ¼d. per bag of approved size.

6. The forest officer may instantly suspend any permit for any breach of these conditions pending the decision of the Hon. the Minister, who may absolutely cancel the permit without compensation of any kind, and during such suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.

REGULATIONS FOR OBTAINING TIMBER FROM THE AREA, PARISH OF NEEKEYA, SPECIALLY SET ASIDE FOR THAT PURPOSE UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE MINES AMENDING ACT 1897.

Miners holding miners' rights, whether working individually or in companies, may obtain timber for their own use and the use of their claims free, under the following conditions:—

1. Timber must be cut and removed by the persons actually using same, timber for domestic use to be obtained from deadwood and crooked trees only.

2. All instructions given by the forest officer are to be followed.

3. Straight sound trees are to be left standing at intervals of 15 feet, as nearly as possible.

4. All trees are to be felled at the surface of the ground, and all débris stacked in heaps ready for burning, when directed by the forest officer, or carried away for domestic purposes.

5. Areas that have been thinned under the conditions of any permit or otherwise shall thereupon cease to be available under these conditions.

6. No tree is to be felled for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom only.

7. No redgum or ironbark timber is allowed to be cut under these conditions.

Men contracting to supply miners and others with timber, or working at wages for the purpose of so doing, may obtain same on the following conditions, and at the following rates:—

Conditions.

1. No timber must be cut or removed until a permit has been obtained.

2. Applications shall be made to the officer in charge of the forest, who will arrange for the work to proceed without delay immediately on the issue of the permit by him.

3. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of the reserve which, in his opinion, is most suitable, and, when necessary, will mark with the broad arrow (thus ↗) the trees which may be felled. He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work.

4. All forest produce cut under this permit must be branded with the Crown brand by the officer in charge, and paid for before removal from the place where felled, but the forest officer may, in his discretion, arrange for branding at any dépôt or railway station.

5. Should the officer in charge deem it necessary, he may require that a sum of not less than £1 shall be deposited by permit-holders who obtain props and other timber, as a guarantee of strict compliance with the conditions of this permit.

6. Permit-holders must stack and burn off all débris when directed to do so by the officer in charge, and this must be done to his satisfaction, or that of the supervising officer. In the event of any wilful breach of this condition taking place, the Minister may cancel this permit, forfeit any deposit, and seize all timber already cut.

7. If the permit-holder remove, or allow to be removed, unbranded timber cut under this permit without special authority, in writing, from the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken against him under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or the *Crimes Act 1890*; and any person having in his possession unbranded timber cut under a permit, and without having written authority from the forest officer for the possession of the same, will also be prosecuted under the provisions of the *Land Act 1890* or the *Crimes Act 1890*.

8. This permit is personal, and must be produced when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

9. The forest officer may, in writing, summarily suspend any permit pending the decision of the Minister, and during such suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.

10. When felling trees or burning débris the utmost care shall be taken that no young timber is broken down, injured, or burnt by fire. No live tree shall be used merely for the purpose of obtaining bark therefrom.

11. No tree shall be felled so as to obstruct any path or road used for the transport of timber or stores, or by the public generally.

12. The permit-holder may cut upon the block assigned to him as late in the year as is consistent with safety from bush fires. Upon receiving fourteen days' notice the permit-holder shall at once clear up his block to the satisfaction of the officer in charge, and shall entirely cease work within the period mentioned.

13. Fires shall not be permitted within the reserve during the period from 1st December to 28th February, except special precautions be taken in lighting such fires in a bare cleared space of at least 20 feet in diameter, and in a hole dug for the purpose. Small wood only shall be used, and every fire shall be carefully extinguished by being covered with earth, or being put out by water. The burning off of débris during the period above specified is strictly prohibited. The lighting of standing trees, stumps, or fallen logs is strictly prohibited, and will be regarded as a breach of these conditions.

14. Receipt for payment of fees must be produced at any time when demanded by a forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

15. This permit may be cancelled for any breach of or non-compliance with any of the conditions hereof.

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REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND
MANAGEMENT OF PORTION OF A RESERVE FOR
PUBLIC GARDENS IN THE SHIRE OF BOROON-
DARA, AT CAMBERWELL.

 5. No person shall put in such portion of the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or any other animals except as specified in clause 6.
 6. No person shall bring into such portion of the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.
 7. No person shall erect in such portion of the reserve any building or any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent of the Committee of Management first had and obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in such portion of the Reserve which may be enclosed for the plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
