334. When a permit has been granted to land coal as mentioned in the last preceding regulation and in regulation No. 340 hereinafter mentioned, complete entries shall be passed by the company or person destring to land such coal within seven days after the arrival of such vessel within the Port of Melbourne.

335. All such entries must be passed within seven days after the arrival of such vessel, and be delivered to the coal officer of the Customs department of the Commonwealth at No. 9 Berth South, or at such other place as such officer may from time to time appoint, accompanied by a stevedore's certificate showing the distribution of the coal and the time and date of the final discharge of the vessel.

336. All coal put overside from such vessel into other vessels will be treated as transhipments ree of wharfage rates, but in all instances (except in the case of lighter's used for storage purposes) when coal is put into a vessel or vessels not intended to go beyond the State of Victoria, Import entries must be passed tuch as will satisfy the coal ofter aforesaid that no wharfage rates are payable. When coal is put into lighters used for storage purposes, transhipment entries shall immediately be p

discharge of such vessel shall be subject to payment of wharfage rates.

338. Receipts for all coal exported or transhipped shall be produced to the coal officer aforesaid, and such receipts shall after the entries aforesaid have been indorsed thereon by him be retained and filed by such officer at the Coal Station No. 9 Berth South, or at such other place as such officer may from time to time appoint.

339. Register books shall be kept by the coal importers at their offices on the wharf, and such register shall show the distribution of the inward cargo of each collier; that is to say the number of

tons landed, the number of tons transhipped into any vessel, and the number of tons retained for stores, and the number of tons (if any) then remaining in such vessel. Such transactions shall be entered immediately after the final discharge of a collier and must be available for signature by the coal officer of the Customs department of the Commonwealth. Such books shall be accessible at any time, and as often as he may require, to any Customs or Harbor Trust official.

340. No coal shall be landed from any lighter at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, or platform within the Port of Melbourne without an entry having been previously passed or a permit granted to land such coal by a collector or landing surveyor of the Commonwealth at Melbourne.

341. All coal landed from lighters at any wharf, dock, pier, jetty, landing stage, or platform within the Port of Melbourne, will be subject to payment of wharfage rates, and an "Import" only must be passed for such coal, the name of the lighter appearing therein as the importing vessel.

342. No coal transhipped from a lighter or lighters shall be subject to payment of wharfage rates, but a transhipnent entry must be passed for such coal by the company or person desiring to tranship, and the name of the lighter or lighters shall appear in such entry as the importing vessel or vessels.

343. 

5. A rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied on all vacant ground fronting such streets as are reticulated.

6. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic or other than domestic use shall be charged at the rate of One shilling (1s.) per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be that which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, shall be equal to the amount which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the current rating upon the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the above purposes beyond such an amount as aforesaid.

7. The charge for water supplied for manufacturing and other purposes, and to buildings, lands, and institutions not rated, to be subject to special agreement, with the Trust.

8. For water supplied to cricket or bowling clubs, subject to arrangement with the Trust.

10. For water supplied to gardens or nurseries cultivated for trade purposes, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to syphon pumps, One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Trust, in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

13. For water supplied and used solely as a motive power for hydraulic lifts, water blasts, turbines, water wheels, electric and other motors (subject to the supply being refused or discontinued at any time). One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or as may be agreed upon, in addition to the rating upon the assessment of the premises for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stone, brickwork, and plastering.

5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting.

6. Appointment by Minister.—In the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office for one year if he remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and be willing to act.

10. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last-known place of abode of each member, three clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.

11. 33. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to

explain.

34. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

36. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

37. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

38. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order:

39. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived; the subject then under consideration, or the next on the Totice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjournment order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjournment order of the day, may be resumed at the next adjournment or order of the Trust at the point at which it was so interrupted.

Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

41. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on

42: Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so

43. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committee shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of the Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

44. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

45. Petitions.—No petition shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said-petition.

46. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meet-

being 'feceived and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

47. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all neetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper managoment and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall the rot time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all nayments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

43. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

49. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of mone

50. Appointment, &c., of Officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven cléar days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one of more newspapers circulating in the Construction District; inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

51. Salaries of Officers, &c:—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall in all cases be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same; and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

52. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the fathful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

53. Common seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the cautody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

54. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended pro tem. in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

55. Ponalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable William Arthur Trenwith, His Majesty's Minister of Railways for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
