BANK HALF-HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1531), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

THURSDAY, THE 25TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT, at Warrnambool;

FRIDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF APRIL INSTANT, at Mansfield;

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF MAY NEXT, at Casterton.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one, and in the first year of His Majesty's reign.
