THE following Draft Proclamation was this day read at the Board and approved:—

BY THE QUEEN.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS We, by the Order in Council and Proclamation specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation ordered the establishment of a branch of Our Royal Mint at or near Melbourne, in Victoria, and made regulations respecting the same, and regulated the currency of the gold coins coined thereat:

And whereas in pursuance of the *Coinage Act 1870*, as amended by the *Coinage Act 1891*, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, by an Order dated the first day of August One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and a Proclamation therein referred to, applied certain provisions of the said Act to Our Colony of Victoria:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to make further provision respecting the said Branch Mint:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act and the last-mentioned Order and Proclamation, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby by and with the advice of Our Privy Council proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. A branch of Our Mint shall continue to be established at or near Melbourne, in Our Colony of Victoria, on its present site, or on such other site as the Governor of the Colony in Council may approve.

2. Gold coins may be coined at the Melbourne Branch Mint so established, and shall be of the same denominations, designs, weights, and fineness, and subject to the allowance of the same remedy as gold coins coined at Our Mint in England.

3. The Master of Our Mint shall prepare and transmit such dies as may be required for the gold coins to be coined at the Melbourne Branch Mint.

4. The gold coins coined in pursuance of this Proclamation at the Melbourne Branch Mint shall be deemed to have been issued from Our Mint, and shall be current and a legal tender in like manner and to the like extent as if they had been coined and issued in England.

5. (i.) If any person brings to the Melbourne Branch Mint any gold bullion, the Deputy Master of that branch shall assay coin and deliver out the same to such person upon payment for every ounce troy of gold of standard fineness of a charge of One penny: Provided that—

(a) where the gold bullion so brought is such that it cannot be brought to the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout without refining the whole or some portion of it the Deputy Master shall demand for assaying and refining the same such additional charge as the Governor of Victoria in Council may from time to time fix, and until such charge is paid to him may refuse to receive, assay, or coin such bullion; and

(b) where the bullion brought to the Branch Mint for coinage is finer than the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout, there shall be delivered to the person bringing the same such additional amount of coin as is proportionate to such superior fineness;

(c) no undue preference shall be shown to any person as respects the bullion brought to the Branch Mint, and every person shall have priority according to the time at which he brought it;

(d) the Governor of Victoria in Council may make regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of this Article with respect to gold bullion, and the bringing, coining, and delivery out thereof, and in particular for regulating the time and conditions at and under which it is to be so brought, assayed, coined, and delivered out, and the minimum amount which may be so brought.

(ii.) The charges under this Article for coining, assaying, and refining shall be collected by the Deputy Master in accordance with the said regulations, either as a payment in advance, or as a deduction from the coin delivered out, or otherwise, and shall be accounted for and paid over in such manner as the Governor of Victoria in Council directs to the Colonial Treasurer of Victoria to be by him paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

6. Subject to the provisions of this Proclamation, the Branch Mint at Melbourne shall, for the purposes of coinage of gold coins, be deemed to be part of Our Mint, and accordingly

(a) the Deputy Master shall comply with all directions he may receive from the Master of Our Mint, whether as regards the returns to be made, or the delivery of coin for public use, or the transmission of specimen coins to England or otherwise; and

(b) the said specimen coins shall be subject to the trial of the pyx under section twelve of the *Coinage Act 1870*, so, however, that they shall be examined separately from the coins coined in England or at any Branch Mint other than the one regulated by this Proclamation; and

(c) the Deputy Master and other officers and persons for the purpose of carrying on the business of the Branch Mint may be appointed, promoted, suspended, and removed, and their duties assigned and salaries awarded under section fifteen of the *Coinage Act 1870*.

7. The Governor of Victoria in Council shall cause the store of gold bullion and coin at the Branch Mint at Melbourne to be inspected half-yearly, and cause the persons inspecting the same to report thereon to the Deputy Master of the Branch

Mint, stating the exact amount of bullion and coin inspected by them; and such reports shall be transmitted by the Deputy Master to the Master of Our Mint in London.

8. The Master of Our Mint shall in the execution of this Proclamation act in accordance with any regulations made or directions given by the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury.

9. The Deputy Master, officers, and servants of the Branch Mint, holding office at the date of this Proclamation, shall be deemed to have been appointed and shall continue in office as if they had been appointed in accordance with this Proclamation, and they shall be in no worse position as respects their salaries and superannuation allowances than they would have been if this Proclamation had not been made.

10. In this Proclamation—

The expression "Mint" means Our Royal Mint in England;

The expression "Governor" includes the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony;

The expression "Deputy Master of the Branch Mint" includes any person who lawfully exercises at such Branch Mint the authority of Deputy Master.

11. The Order in Council and Proclamation specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation shall cease to have any effect: Provided that nothing in this Proclamation shall affect anything already legally done or suffered before the date of this Proclamation, and all coins coined at the Branch Mint at Melbourne before the date of this Proclamation, which are current and a legal tender in any part of Our dominions at the date of this Proclamation, shall continue to be so current and a legal tender.

12. This Proclamation may be cited as the Melbourne Mint Proclamation 1900.

13. This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of December nineteen hundred unless it is sooner promulgated, and in that case on such promulgation.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this seventeenth day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred, and in the sixty-fourth year of Our Reign.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893).

(I.S.) G. T. M. O'BRIEN.

Local application of 1. This Regulation shall apply to all the Regulation islands comprised in the Protectorate established by Her Britannic Majesty and known as the British Solomon Islands Protectorate.

Interpretation of 2. The words "waste land" in this Regulation shall mean land which is not owned, cultivated, or occupied by any native or non-native person.

Unauthorized 3. From and after the coming into force of occupation of waste land prohibited. this Regulation no person shall occupy or take possession of any waste land otherwise than under a certificate of the nature described in the next following section hereof.

Grant of Certificates 4. Certificates of occupation of waste land of Occupation. in the aforesaid Protectorate may be granted by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific on behalf of Her Majesty, on application being made therefor through the Resident Commissioner in the form of the schedule hereto appended.

Commencement of 5. This Regulation shall come into force on Regulation. the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and one, and may be cited as *The Solomon (Waste Lands) Regulation 1900.*

SCHEDULE TO THE SOLOMON (WASTE LANDS) REGULATION 1900.

BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

Application for Certificate of Occupation.

To the Resident Commissioner of the British Solomon Islands Protectorate—

I, the undersigned, of hereby apply for a certificate of occupation for a term of years by Her Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific of the land situate at on the island of bounded by known as and of an estimated area of which land, to the best of my knowledge and belief, is neither owned, cultivated, or occupied by any native or non-native person. The certificate to include a right to fish the produce of the waters marching with the coast boundary (if any) of the land.

In the event of the desired certificate being granted me, I hereby bind myself to abide by the following conditions:—

1. That I will pay a rent of per acre, the first payment to be made on the issue of the certificate, subsequent payments to be made in advance at intervals of not more than twelve months dating from the first payment; such rent to be increased or diminished proportionately on completion of the survey prescribed by clause 3, if the extent of the land be then found to be more or less than estimated above, but no claim shall exist on either part for arrears or over-payment on such account.

2. That I will expend not less than per acre before the completion of ten years from the date of the certificate in bringing the land into cultivation, or in planting and otherwise improving it.

3. That I will defray the cost of a survey of the land specified in the certificate to be made by the Government of the Protectorate within ten years of the commencement of the certificate.

4. That all rights to minerals, mineral oil, or precious stones found or discovered at any time on the land are reserved, together with the right of prospecting for the same; and that the further right is reserved by the High Commissioner to resume occupation of any portion of such land as may be deemed necessary in connexion with any mining agreement or concession which may hereafter be approved of or authorized by the High Commissioner, provided that in case of such resumption a like certificate in respect of land equivalent in extent and value to the land so resumed shall be granted in place of the present certificate or of such portion thereof as may be affected by such resumption, and that in the case of land whereon improvements have been made, compensation for the beneficial value of such improvements shall be paid.

5. The right is reserved by the High Commissioner to resume, without compensation in respect of land which has not been improved by cultivation or otherwise, such portions of the land as may at any time be required for the construction of roads, or other public purposes of whatever nature, and that a similar right is reserved to the High Commissioner in respect of land which may have been improved by cultivation or otherwise, on payment to the holder of the certificate of occupation of compensation for actual loss sustained.

6. That all paths and rights-of-way existing on or over the land shall remain free and uninterrupted unless the same be closed or altered with the consent of the High Commissioner.

7. In the event of the breach by me of any of the foregoing conditions, or of the payment of the rent of the land being at any time more than six months in arrear from the date of any instalment falling due, the High Commissioner shall have the power to cancel this certificate, and all my interests in and title to the land, with all improvements (if any) thereon, shall on such cancellation forthwith cease and determine without any claim on my part to compensation.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government and for such publication as may be thought desirable, copies of a circular issued by the Board of Trade to Consular and Colonial Officers with regard to the arrangements made for introducing a system of continuous discharge certificates for seamen, which will in future, in certain cases, take the place of the present form of certificate of discharge.

I have to add that it has been decided to adopt this course in pursuance of the recommendations made by a Departmental Committee appointed by the Board of Trade to consider the question.

INSTRUCTIONS TO CONSULS AND OFFICERS IN BRITISH POSSESSIONS ABROAD.

CERTIFICATES OF DISCHARGE.—NEW FORM.

Particulars of the new form of certificate of discharge which will be introduced on the 1st October, 1900, will be found in the annexed copy of instructions issued for the guidance of Superintendents of Mercantile Marine Offices in the United Kingdom. In the case of seamen already possessing books it is requested that the procedure therein indicated may be followed as closely as circumstances will admit by Consular and Colonial Officers.

In the case of seamen who have not been engaged in the United Kingdom, and who do not possess books, it will only be necessary for Consular and Colonial Officers to issue the usual Dis. 1 when seamen are discharged before them.

Except at the ports of Hamburg, Rotterdam, Antwerp, Dunkirk, and Havre, it is not intended that the continuous certificate of discharge should be issued by Consuls or Colonial Officers to seamen who do not possess them until further notice, the Dis. 1 continuing in force for all such cases.

INSTRUCTIONS TO SUPERINTENDENTS.

CERTIFICATES OF DISCHARGE.—NEW FORM.

1. *New certificate.*—The Board of Trade have decided to replace the present form of discharge (Dis. 1) by a continuous certificate of discharge (Dis. A).

2. *Date of introduction.*—On and after the 1st October, 1900, all deckhands* discharged before a superintendent are to receive their discharge on the new form. From the same date books are to be issued for all deckhands engaged before the superintendent, and from time to time the Board of Trade will authorize the issue in like manner of books to the other ratings.

3. *Requisition and estimate.*—A copy of the new form is enclosed, and superintendents are requested to forward without delay to the Registrar-General of Seamen a requisition for the number of books they will require for deckhands during the first four weeks of October for their own port, and for each of the creeks in their district.

* Deckhands include boatswains, carpenters, sailmakers, quartermasters, lamp-trimmers, other petty officers, A.B.'s, O.S.'s, and boys.

They will also forward an estimate of the clerical assistance, by overtime or by temporary increase of staff, they will require for the work.

In framing these estimates the superintendents will of course bear in mind that after a very short period many of the men who are engaged before them will be in possession of books received on discharge.

4. *Main points of difference from present discharge.*—The principal points in which the new certificate differs from the present form are, that it is in book form; that it contains a description of the seaman; that certain entries have to be made in it at the time of engagement; and that the report of character is not on the same page as the record of service.

5. *Issuing new books.*—(1) In issuing new books, whether on discharge or engagement, great care should be taken that each man's name and description are correctly entered on the spaces provided, and that the man should sign his name in the book in the superintendent's presence. If there are no means in the office for measuring height, the superintendent should at once take steps to have the necessary scales marked on one of the walls. The height of a seaman under 18 years of age should not be taken, and seamen should invariably be measured in their boots.

(2) It is perhaps well to point out that at the initial stage it will assist in the rapid transacting of the work if, when a superintendent knows that a master is about to engage or discharge a crew, he prepares in anticipation as much of the book as he can.

6. *Objections to take books.*—Should a seaman object to having a book, he should be informed that he cannot have a certificate of discharge on any other form.

7. *Entries on engagement.*—When seamen are engaged before the superintendent, the name of the ship and the date and place of engagement are to be entered on each man's continuous certificate. At the outset new books will have to be issued for this purpose; but when men have books they should always be produced at the time of engagement. When the necessary entries have been made the books should be handed to the master, and he should be advised to retain them during the voyage.

8. *Entries on discharge.*—When seamen are discharged before the superintendent, he should see that the particulars of service and discharge are entered in the spaces provided.

9. *Entry of character.*—A copy of the report of character cannot be entered if the seaman states that he does not wish to have it. Under section 129 of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* the seaman may have a copy of the report of his character indorsed on his discharge certificate, and spaces are provided on the discharge certificate for this purpose; or he may have a copy of the report given him on a separate sheet, and a special form (Dis. B.) has been provided for this purpose; or he may refuse to have any copy of the report of his character.

It is to the interest of seamen to have the report of character indorsed on the discharge certificate; but if a seaman objects to this, he should be told that the character spaces on the discharge certificate will not be left blank, but will be filled up with a statement that the indorsement is not required, and that the separate report of character will be of no value for the purpose of procuring employment.

10. *Stamps for character.*—When a copy of the report of character is given, either on the discharge or on the separate sheet, it should be an exact copy of the character entered in the official log. Four stamps, which fit the spaces in the book, are provided for the purpose of making the copies, viz., Very Good, Good, Decline to Report, and Indorsement not required. The last stamp is always to be used when the character is not entered on the discharge certificate. The character spaces on the discharge certificate are never to be left blank.

11. *Character given by masters.*—As the success of the continuous certificates depends largely on the manner in which the report of character is given by the master, superintendents should use their influence, when necessary, to see that the character is justly given, and in accordance with the seaman's deserts. Superintendents should resist any attempts to give men bad characters when they are not deserved, or to give good characters to men who have been logged for serious offences, unless the log bears an entry condoning the offence.

12. *Books of deserters.*—When the crew are discharged at the end of a voyage, the books of the deserters should be obtained from the master, and be at once forwarded to the Registrar-General of Seamen.

When "desertion" or "failure to join" takes place at the commencement of a voyage from the United Kingdom, the master will return the books of the defaulters with the Eng. 2 to the superintendent, who will retain them for a fortnight in case the seamen to whom they were issued should appear to claim them; at the expiration of a fortnight the superintendent will forward those unclaimed to the Registrar-General of Seamen.

In all cases of "desertion" or "failure to join" the superintendent should write across the blanks relating to service and the blanks relating to character the words "voyage not completed." These entries should be initialed and stamped.

13. *Duplicate books.*—If a seaman loses his book, another book may be issued on payment of one shilling. The man's previous service cannot, however, be entered in the new book. If he wishes to have a certificate of his previous service, he must apply for it to the Registrar-General of Seamen in the usual way.

14. *Notice to masters.*—A notice to masters relating to continuous discharge certificates has been prepared in the form of a handbill. Copies should be distributed as widely as possible.

15. *Weekly return.*—The superintendent will forward to the Registrar-General of Seamen a weekly return on Dis. C. of the books issued by him.

Channel, should steer from the fairway between Points Lonsdale and Nepean, to pass between the Royal George No. 1 gas buoy and the gas beacon on the Pope's Eye annulus at the southern entrance to the channel, and thence between the channel buoys, taking care to avoid the shoal patch of 17 feet lying south $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the Pile light-house.

By night.—Those in charge of vessels from seaward, and bound through the West Channel at night, should on losing the Point Lonsdale red light leave the line of leading lights, and steer N.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to pass to the north-westward of the white occultating light on the Pope's Eye annulus at the southern entrance to the channel, thence steer to pass a cable to the eastward of the fixed red light of the Royal George No. 2 gas buoy at the north-eastern end of the Royal George bank. After passing the Royal George No. 2 fixed red light steer N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. until abreast of the white fixed light of No. 12 gas buoy, then steer as desired to the northward or southward of the 17 feet patch lying south $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables from the West Channel Pile light-house.

Directions outwards.—*By day.*—Those in charge of vessels leaving for sea, and bound through the West Channel, should after passing No. 3 black can buoy keep the channel westward of the Royal George shoal, passing the Royal George No. 2 buoy 2 cables off on the port side of the vessel, and thence midway between No. 1 black can buoy and Royal George No. 1 gas buoy for the fairway between Port Phillip Heads.

By night.—Those in charge of vessels leaving for sea, and bound through the West Channel, should steer to pass to the eastwards of the West Channel Pile light. Having entered the sector of red light shown from the Pile light, those in charge of vessels should not lose it until the white fixed light of the No. 12 gas buoy bears no further west than S.W. by S., then steer if necessary to avoid the 17 feet shoal lying $3\frac{1}{2}$ cables south from the Pile light, and pass the white fixed light of No. 12 gas buoy 1 cable off on the port side, thence steer S. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. until entering the sector of red light shown from the Low light-house, and keep within the same passing the fixed red light of the Royal George No. 2 gas buoy 2 cables off on the port side of the vessel, and the red occultating light of the Royal George No. 1 gas buoy a cable off on the port side of the vessel, thence steer S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. for the line of leading lights in the fairway between Port Phillip Heads.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1900.

THE births of 45 boys and 49 girls, or in all of 94 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December. Of these 41 occurred in Ballarat East, 45 in Ballarat West, 6 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 8 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 111, viz., 61 of boys and 50 of girls.

The deaths registered in December numbered 64, viz., 37 of males and 27 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 30. In November the recorded deaths numbered 73; in December, 1899, they numbered 84; in December, 1898, they numbered 96; in December, 1897, they numbered 73; in December, 1896, they numbered 64; in December, 1895, they numbered 76; in December, 1894, they numbered 69; in December, 1893, they numbered 53; in December, 1892, they numbered 53; in December, 1891, they numbered 80; and in December, 1890, they numbered 65.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 58 per cent.; females, 42 per cent.; under five years, 30 per cent.; over five years, 70 per cent. In the previous month these proportions were:—Males and females, 67 and 33 per cent.; under and over five years, 14 and 86 per cent. respectively.

Twenty-four deaths, or 38 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 14; Benevolent Asylum, 8; and Lunatic Asylum, 2.

The following table shows the causes of the deaths of persons of both sexes registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of December, separating those under from those over five years of age; also showing the proportions per cent. of deaths from each class of disease:—

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from diseases of the urinary system rose from 2 to 5. On the other hand, deaths from influenza and those from diarrhoeal diseases each fell from 4 to nil; those from diseases of the respiratory system, from 10 to 6; and those from diseases of the digestive system from 19 to 10.

In the year 1900, the births registered in Ballarat and suburbs numbered 1,420, viz., 757 of males and 663 of females, as against 1,363 in 1899. The deaths registered during the same period numbered 902, viz., 526 of males and 376 of females, as against 936 in 1899. The apparent gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was thus 518, as compared with 427 in 1899.

Explosives Act 1890.

CONDITIONS AS TO SALE OF EXPLOSIVES.

(Correction.)

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of December, 1900.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by the 24th Section of the *Explosives Act 1890*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Order prescribe the conditions to be inserted in general licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for the selling of explosives other than nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals, and in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for the selling of nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals : Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned section of the said Act, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria doth, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said colony, prescribe the conditions to be inserted in general licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for the selling of explosives other than nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals, and in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale and for the selling of nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals, that is to say :—

1. Applications for a licence to sell explosives shall be made to a Government Inspector of Explosives.
2. Every application must state the name in full of the applicant, his occupation and full address, the kind of explosives to be sold, the maximum quantity of each kind of explosive to be kept on the premises of the applicant, and the place where explosives are to be kept.
3. The Inspector of Explosives shall submit to the Minister each application, and may recommend the issue or refusal of a licence.
4. Upon the Minister's approval a licence shall be issued upon payment of the licence fee.
5. The following conditions shall be inserted in general licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale and for the selling of explosives other than nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals and such of them as may apply in special licences for the keeping for safe custody or sale, and for selling nitro-glycerine and fulminates of metals :—
 - (a) No explosives shall be hawked, sold, or exposed for sale in or upon any highway, street, road, public thoroughfare, or public place. No explosives other than those defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), shall be exhibited or exposed upon any premises. All explosives for sale other than those defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), must be kept only in the building or receptacle provided for the storage of the same.
 - (b) No fireworks shall be sold or delivered to any child under the age of thirteen years, and no other explosive shall be sold or delivered to any one under the age of sixteen years.
 - (c) All explosives exceeding 1lb. in weight when sold shall be in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent the explosives from escaping, and (except when the same is sold to any person employed by or on the property occupied by the vendor for immediate use in the service of the vendor or on such property) the outermost receptacle containing such explosives shall have affixed in conspicuous characters, by means of a brand or securely attached label or other mark :—
 - (1) In the case of gunpowder, the word "Gunpowder," and
 - (2) In the case of explosive other than gunpowder, the name of such explosive, with the addition of the word "Explosive," and if such name is materially false, the person selling or offering for sale such explosive, and also the owner of such explosive, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these conditions.
 - (d) Every person selling any explosive other than gunpowder or explosives defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), or fireworks shall keep a record of the name and address of the person to whom, and the date on which he sells such explosive, together with the description of such explosive, and the quantity thereof sold.
 - (e) The premises shall be occupied only by the licensee, except as hereinafter directed.
 - (f) If such licensee dies or becomes insolvent, or applies to take the benefit of any Act in force for the relief of insolvent debtors, or assigns his estate for the benefit of his creditors, or becomes mentally incapable or otherwise disabled, the person carrying on the business of such licensee shall not be liable to any penalty or forfeiture under these conditions for carrying on the business, and acting under the licence during such reasonable time as may be necessary to allow him to apply for a licence to sell, so that he otherwise conform to the provisions of the *Explosives Act 1890* and the *Explosives Act 1896*, and of the Regulations and Orders made thereunder.
 - (g) The licence shall be valid only for the person to whom the same is issued.
 - (h) All buildings and places adjoining each other and occupied together shall be deemed to be the same premises, and shall accordingly be included in one licence.

- (i) No explosives except those specified in the licence shall be kept on any premises, and all explosives on the premises; except those defined in Division 1, Class 6 (Ammunition), shall be kept in one or other or all of the following modes, namely:—

Mode 1.—In a substantially constructed building detached from a dwelling house, and at a safe distance from any highway, street, public thoroughfare, or public place. Provided that such building is closed so as to prevent unauthorized persons having access thereto, and to secure it from danger from without, and exclusively appropriated to the keeping of explosives; or

Mode 2.—In a receptacle exclusively appropriated to the keeping of explosives, and placed inside a dwelling house or inside any building as is not itself qualified for the keeping of explosives in Mode 1 (the receptacle to be made of wood, iron, copper, or other suitable material). The lid or door thereof shall have copper or brass hinges and fastenings and be provided with a lock, and the word "Explosives" shall be painted conspicuously on the receptacle. The receptacle shall be placed in a safe position, away from all goods of an inflammable nature, and shall (except in cases where the amount of explosives authorized to be kept does not exceed 50lbs.) be on wheels so as to be readily removed in the event of a fire taking place; or

Mode 3.—In a building or receptacle in respect of which a certificate has been obtained from a Government Inspector of Explosives that such building or receptacle has been approved by such inspector. Such certificate may be cancelled and revoked by any Government Inspector of Explosives at any time after it is granted.

- (j) There shall not be on the premises at any one time an amount of any sort of explosive exceeding the amount prescribed by the licence, and the maximum quantities of the various explosives that may be kept on any premises shall be as follows:—

Two hundred pounds of gunpowder, or in lieu thereof, 200 lbs. of fireworks or 100 lbs. of nitro-compounds for blasting, and in addition loaded safety cartridges containing not more than 500 lbs. of explosive, 500 detonators, and percussion caps unlimited.

Provided that—

- (1) A maximum of 2,000 detonators and of 2,400 lbs. of explosive contained in loaded safety cartridges may be kept on the premises if the other explosives (excepting percussion caps) are reduced in the proportion of 10 lbs. of gunpowder or fireworks or of 5 lbs. of nitro-compound for blasting for every additional 100 detonators and 120 lbs. of explosive contained in loaded safety cartridges, but if the premises are licensed for the keeping of loaded safety cartridges only, such loaded safety cartridges may be kept in unlimited quantity.
 - (2) There shall not be kept on the premises in Mode 2 any detonators or more than 100 lbs. of gunpowder, or in lieu thereof 100 lbs. of fireworks or 25 lbs. of nitro-compounds for blasting.
 - (3) The maximum quantities of the various explosives to be kept in Mode 3 shall be those specified in the certificate issued in that behalf.
 - (4) Loaded safety cartridges or percussion caps and detonators shall not be kept together or in the same building or receptacle as the other explosives unless separated by an intervening partition of such substance and character, or by such intervening space as will effectually prevent explosion or fire in the one communicating with the other.
- (k) With respect to every such building or receptacle, the interior thereof, and the shelves and fittings therein, shall be so constructed or so lined or covered as to prevent the exposure of any iron or steel, or the detaching of any grit, iron, steel, or similar substance in such manner as to come into contact with the explosive, and such interior, shelves, and fittings shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be kept free from grit and otherwise clean; and in case of any explosive being kept which is liable to be dangerously affected by water, due precautions shall be taken to exclude water therefrom; but this provision, so far as relates to the exposure of iron or steel or similar substance, shall not be obligatory in the case where no explosive other than explosives of the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class are kept.
- (l) Every article of a highly inflammable nature, and every article liable to cause fire or explosion, shall be kept at a safe distance from all explosives, and from all buildings and receptacles containing the same.
- (m) All explosive exceeding 5lbs. in amount of the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) Class, or of the 2nd Division of the 7th (Firework) Class and all other explosives exceeding 1lb. in amount shall be kept in a substantial bag, canister, or case made and closed so as to prevent any explosive from escaping.
- (n) If two or more explosives are kept on the premises they must be separated from each other by an intervening partition of such substance and character, or by such intervening space, as will effectually prevent explosion or fire in the one communicating with the other, subject nevertheless to the following qualifications:—
- (1) The various explosives of Class 1, Class 2, Class 3, safety fuse belonging to the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) and such of the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) as do not contain any exposed iron or steel, may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.

- (2) The various explosives of the 1st Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
 - (3) Such of the various explosives of the 2nd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) as contain any exposed iron or steel may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
 - (4) The various explosives of the 3rd Division of Class 6 (Ammunition) may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
 - (5) The various explosives of Class 7 (Firework) may be kept with each other without any intervening partition or space.
- (o) If a room is used in connexion with the premises for the filling of small arm cartridges—
- (1) There shall not be present in such room more than 5 lbs. of explosive not made into safety cartridges.
 - (2) No work unconnected with the making of the cartridges shall be carried on in the room while such filling is being carried on.
 - (3) There shall not be in the room while such filling is being carried on any fire or any artificial light, except a light of such construction, position, or character as not to cause any danger of fire or explosion.
 - (4) The licensee shall give notice to the Government Inspector that he intends to carry on such filling as is allowed by this clause.
 - (5) The outer clothing of the work-people employed in filling cartridges shall be of woollen or other unflammable material, and made without pockets, and suitable shoes, without iron nails, shall be used by those who enter the room.
Ordinary clothing, if of wool or other unflammable material, with all pockets torn out or sewn up, will be accepted as complying with this clause.
 - (6) Before the filling of cartridges is commenced, the bench or table at which such filling is to be carried on, shall be carefully swept down, and the floor, shelves, and fittings of the room shall be kept clean and free from grit.
 - (7) No exposed iron or steel shall be on the floor of the room near the explosive or on the bench or table at which the filling of cartridges is carried on.
 - (8) No fire or matches or any substance or articles likely to be a source of danger shall be allowed in the room.
 - (9) No finished cartridges, beyond the quantity at hand in the immediate course of preparation, shall be allowed to remain on the bench or table at which they were filled, or in close proximity thereto.
 - (10) No person under the age of sixteen years shall be employed in or allowed to enter a filling room, excepting under the supervision of some grown-up person.
 - (11) Any process involving pressure shall be conducted with great care, and in such manner as to avoid jerking or concussion.
 - (12) Articles of a highly inflammable nature, or which are liable to cause fire or explosion, shall not be stored in close proximity to the room used for the filling of small-arm cartridges.
- (p) Every licensee and every person employed in and about the premises shall take all due precaution for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion in the same, and for preventing unauthorized persons having access to the premises or to the explosives therein, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion, and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of the work on such premises.
- (q) Wherever in these conditions an explosive is distinguished as belonging to a particular class or division of a class reference is made to the classification of explosives contained in an Order of the Governor in Council made in pursuance of section 49 of the *Explosives Act* 1890.
- (r) Premises shall mean any house, storehouse, warehouse, shop, cellar, yard, building, or enclosed space occupied by or under the control of the licensee.

6. All Orders issued prior to the date of this Order are hereby cancelled and revoked.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
