At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of January, 1901.

W HEREAS by the Mines Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1120) it is amongst other things enacted that within and for every mining district there shall be a court to be called the Court of Mines; and that such court shall be a court of record, and shall be holden at such intervals and at such place or places within such district as the Governor in Council shall from time to time direct, before a judge qualified as thereinafter directed: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this present Order direct that a Special Court of Mines shall be holden at—

ABARAT, on Tuesday, the 5th day of February, 1901.

And the Honorable Agar Wynne, Her Majesty's Solicitor-General for the State of Victoria aforesaid, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
