LIABILITY TO QUARANTINE OF VESSELS FROM
SAN FRANCISCO ON ACCOUNT OF ORIENTAL
PLAGUE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels whatever arriving from or having touched at any such place and all vessels and boats receiving any person or thing whatsoever from or out of any vessel so coming from or having touched at any such infected place as aforesaid (whether such person or thing shall have come or been brought in such vessel or such person shall have gone or have been put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessel at any place in Victoria and whether such vessel was or was not bound to any place in Victoria), and all persons and things whatsoever on board of any vessel so coming from or having touched at such infected place as aforesaid or on board of any such receiving vessels or boats as aforesaid shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and of any Order made by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation concerning quarantine and the prevention of infection from the time of departure of such vessels from such infected place as aforesaid or from the time such persons or things shall have been received on board respectively: And whereas it is enacted that all such vessels and boats as aforesaid and all persons (as well pilots as others), and all things whether coming or brought in such vessels or boats from such infected place as aforesaid or going or being put on board the same either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats in any place in Victoria, and all persons and things as aforesaid on board such receiving vessel or boat as aforesaid shall upon their arrival at any place in Victoria be obliged to perform quarantine in such places for such time and in such manner as shall be from time to

time directed by the Governor in Council and notified by proclamation as aforesaid: And whereas it is further enacted that until such vessels and boats persons and things as aforesaid shall have respectively performed and shall be duly discharged from quarantine no such persons or things shall either before or after the arrival of such vessels or boats at any place in Victoria come or be brought on shore or go or be put on board any other vessel or boat in order to come or be brought on shore in any such place (unless in such manner and in such cases and by such licence as shall be directed or permitted by any such Order as aforesaid): Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation notify that—

SAN FRANCISCO, IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA is infected with Oriental Plague, and that it is probable such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

SMALL-POX ON BOARD THE S.S. "ORMUZ."

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of May, 1901.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria.
Mr. McCulloch | Mr. Burton.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steamship or vessel *Ormuz* arrived in Victorian waters on 23rd May, 1901, having on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and doth further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said steamship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steamship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steamship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical

Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said steamship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steamship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

And His Excellency, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby direct that this Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 23rd day of May, 1901.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Adulteration of Wine Act 1900.

REGULATION UNDER THE ADULTERATION OF WINE ACT 1900.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twentieth day of May, 1901.

WHEREAS by the *Adulteration of Wine Act 1900* (64 Vict. No. 1692) it is amongst other things enacted that the person acting as analyst for the purposes of section 11 of the said Act in any given case, shall furnish a certificate as may be provided for by Regulation of the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the Board of Public Health and published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order, on the recommendation of the Board of Public Health, make the following Regulation (that is to say):—

Form of Certificate.—The certificate to be furnished by the person acting as analyst for the purpose of section 11 of the *Wine Adulteration Act 1900* (64 Vict. No. 1692) shall be in the form set forth hereunder (that is to say):—
