APPROACH TO SPENCER GULF AND INVESTIGATOR STRAIT.

Neptune Island Lighthouse.

Neptune Island Lighthouse.

Referring to Notice to Mariners, No. 11 of 1901, Mariners are hereby informed that the proposed light on the South Noptune Island will probably be exhibited about 1st November, 1901. The structure will be made of braced wrought iron, painted red, and situated on the highest point of the most Southern Island, in lat. 35° 20′ 10″ S., long. 136° 6′ 45″ E. (approx.). The light is to be of the second order, revolving once in fity (fol) seconds, and showing all round the horizon a group of three (3) white flashes at intervals of ten (10) seconds and an eclipse of thirty (30) seconds; that is to say, the first two flashes and eclipses will occupy ten (10) seconds each, and the third flash and eclipse thirty (30) seconds. Its focal plane will be one hundred and seventy-nine (179) feet above high-water mark, and it will be visible from a vessel's deck for a distance of about twenty (20) miles in clear weather. The cottages and stores, which will be built on the north side of the island, are to be composed of granite with roofs of red tiles, and will not be visible from the southern side.





THE number of births registered during the month of May in all the Bendigo Districts was 155; of these 81 were of males and 77 of females; included were 11 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 126, viz.:—52 of males and 74 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 70, viz.:—12 of males and 28 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 88. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 102; in the month of May, 1990, they numbered 62; in the month of May, 1899, they numbered 98; in the month of May, 1897, they numbered 75; in the month of May, 1896, they numbered 67; in the month of May, 1893, they numbered 83; in the month of May, 1892, they numbered 87; in the month of May, 1893, they numbered 83; in the month of May, 1892, they numbered 79; and in the month of May, 1891, they numbered 89.

Of the registered births 111 occurred within the city of Bendigo, and 47 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 61 took place within and 9 without the city.

Of the 70 deaths registered during the month 23, or 33 per cent, were of children under five years of age, and 47, or 67 per cent, were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 37 and 63 per cent.

Twenty-one deaths, or 30 per cent, of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.—Bendigo Hospital, 14; Benevolent Asylum, 7.

In the previous month the births numbered 111, viz., 56 of boys and 55 of girls.

The deaths registered in May numbered 70, viz., 38 of males and 32 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths bered 72; in May, 1898, they numbered 85; in May, 1897, by 57. REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF JIRNKEE.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or bigs.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any dag, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any bacth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any baliff of Grown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such baliff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
