APPROACH TO SPENCER GULF AND INVESTIGATOR STRAIT.

Neptune Island Lighthouse.

Referring to Notice to Mariners, No. 11 of 1901, Mariners are hereby informed that the proposed light on the South Neptune Island will probably be exhibited about 1st November, 1901. The structure will be made of braced wrought iron, painted red, and situated on the highest point of the most Southern Island, in lat. 35° 20' 10" S., long. 136° 6' 45" E. (approx.). The light is to be of the second order, revolving once in fifty (50) seconds, and showing all round the horizon a group of three (3) white flashes at intervals of ten (10) seconds and an eclipse of thirty (30) seconds; that is to say, the first two flashes and eclipses will occupy ten (10) seconds each, and the third flash and eclipse thirty (30) seconds. Its focal plane will be one hundred and seventy-nine (179) feet above high-water mark, and it will be visible from a vessel's deck for a distance of about twenty (20) miles in clear weather. The cottages and stores, which will be built on the north side of the island, are to be composed of granite with roofs of red tiles, and will not be visible from the southern side.

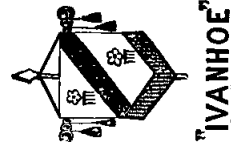

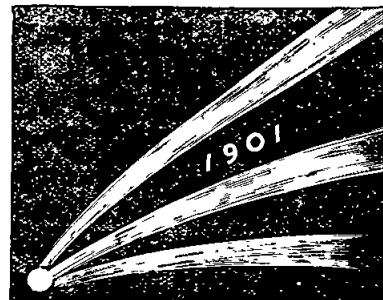

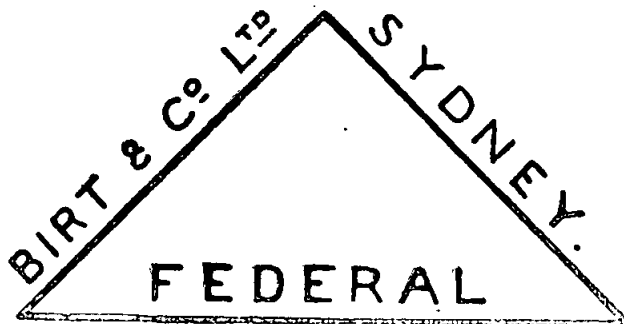

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1901.

THE number of births registered during the month of May in all the Bendigo Districts was 153; of these 81 were of males and 77 of females; included were 11 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 126, viz.:—62 of males and 74 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 70, viz.:—42 of males and 28 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 83. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 102; in the month of May, 1900, they numbered 69; in the month of May, 1899, they numbered 98; in the month of May, 1898, they numbered 104; in the month of May, 1897, they numbered 75; in the month of May, 1896, they numbered 67; in the month of May, 1895, they numbered 83; in the month of May, 1893, they numbered 80; in the month of May, 1892, they numbered 79; and in the month of May, 1891, they numbered 89.

Of the registered births 111 occurred within the city of Bendigo, and 47 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 61 took place within and 9 without the city.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1901.

THE births of 71 boys and 56 girls, or in all of 127 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of May. Of these 49 occurred in Ballarat East, 66 in Ballarat West, 9 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 9 illegitimate births and 2 cases of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 111, viz.: 56 of boys and 55 of girls.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE PARISH OF JIRNKEE.

WE, Thomas James Brown, George Henry Brown, and John Hickey, the duly-appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Jirnkee, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
 2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
 3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
 5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any bath or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence, and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall on conviction forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

VACCINATION DISTRICTS CONSTITUTED.*

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* (54 Vict., No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide Victoria into districts for the purpose of affording facilities for vaccination, and may, from time to time, vary or revoke such proclamation, and establish other districts for the purpose aforesaid: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation, divide Victoria into seven Vaccination Districts, as respectively described hereunder, namely:—

THE METROPOLITAN VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Boroondara, Braybrook, Brighton, Broadmeadows, Brunswick, Bulla, Caulfield, Coburg, Collingwood, Dandenong, Doncaster, Kitham, Epping, Essendon, Fern Tree Gully, Fitzroy, Flemington and Kensington, Footscray, Hawthorn, Heidelberg, Keilor, Kew, Lilydale, Malvern, Melbourne, Merriang, Moorabbin, Mulgrave, Northcote, North Melbourne, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Port Melbourne, Prahran, Preston, Richmond, St. Kilda, South Melbourne, Templestowe, Upper Yarra, Whittlesea, Williamstown, and Wyndham.

THE MIDLAND VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Alexandra, Bacchus Marsh, Ballan, Broadford, Castlemaine, Chewton, Daylesford, Gisborne, Glenlyon, Goulburn, Howqua, Kilmore, Kyneton, Lancefield, Maldon, Malmesbury, Mansfield, Melton, Metcalfe, Mount Alexander, Mount Franklin, McIvor, Newham United, Newstead, Pymlyng, Romsey, Seymour, Springfield, and Yea.

THE NORTHERN VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Bendigo, Deakin, Eaglehawk, East Loddon, Echuca (borough), Echuca (shire), Huntly, Marong, Numurkah, Raywood, Rodney, Shepparton, Strathfieldsaye, Tungamah, Waranga, and Yarrowonga.

THE NORTH-EASTERN VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Beechwerth, Benalla, Bright, Chiltern, Euroa, North Ovens, Omeo, Oxley, Rutherglen (borough), Rutherglen (shire), Towong, Violet Town, Wangaratta, Wodonga, and Yackandandah.

THE NORTH-WESTERN VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Arapiles, Avoca, Bet Bet, Birchip, Borung, Carisbrook, Castle Donnington, Charlton, Clunes, Dimboola, Donald, Dunnmunkle, Dunolly, Gordon, Horsham, Inglewood, Kara Kara, Karkaroc, Kerang, Korong, Lawloit, Lexton, Lowan, Majorca, Maryborough, Mildura, St. Arnaud, Stawell (borough), Stawell (shire), Talbot (borough), Talbot (shire), Tarnagulla, Tullaroop, Wimmera, and Wyche-proof.

THE SOUTH-EASTERN VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Alberton, Avon, Bairnsdale, Berwick, Bala Bala, Cranbourne, Flinders and Kangerang, Frankston and Hastings, Maffra, Mirboo, Mornington, Morwell, Narracon, Orbost, Phillip Island and Woolamai, Poowong and Jeeho, Rosedale, Sale, South Gippsland, Tainbo, Traralgon, Walhalla, Warragul, and Woorayl; and

THE SOUTH-WESTERN VACCINATION DISTRICT, which shall consist of the municipal districts of Ararat (borough), Ararat (shire), Ballarat (city), Ballarat (shire), Ballarat East, Bannockburn, Barrabool, Belfast, Bellarine, Browns and Scarsdale, Bungaree, Buninyong (borough), Buninyong (shire), Colac, Corio, Creswick (borough), Creswick (shire), Dundas, Geelong, Geelong West, Glenelg, Grenville, Hamilton, Hampden, Heytesbury, Koroit, Kowree, Leigh, Meredith, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse, Newton and Chilwell, Portland (borough), Portland (shire), Port Fairy, Queenscliff, Ripon, Sebastopol, Smythesdale, South Barwon, Wannon, Warrnambool (town), Warrnambool (shire), and Winchelsea.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla made under Sub-section 7 of Section 191, and Sections 484, 503, and 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 7, for regulating the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, for licensing yards and premises for the sale of cattle within the Municipal District, for fixing the dues to be paid for such licences, for authorizing the issue of licences to auctioneers, and for fixing the amount of annual licence fee to be paid for such licence, and for appointing tolls and dues to be demanded from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling any cattle in the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and from any person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle any licensed yards or premises within the Municipal District.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market situated in the shire of Benalla, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle.

2. The said market shall be open daily for the reception, delivery, and sale of cattle on every lawful day from sunrise to sunset. A "fortnightly market" shall be held, commencing on Thursday, the 11th day of July, 1901, and subsequently on every alternate Thursday, provided that in the event of any "fortnightly market" day falling on Christmas Day or a public holiday, or in the event of any special cause rendering it necessary or desirable the council may substitute and appoint some other day in lieu thereof for the holding of the said "fortnightly market."

3. The sales of cattle shall be commenced not earlier than 9 o'clock a.m., and shall be conducted in the order following:—

4. No sale shall be held in the yards on any day other than that specified in the by-law, except for horses, for which special days may be appointed by the president for the time being and secretary of the Shire of Benalla.

5. The council shall appoint a market inspector, whose duties will be as follows:—

1. To see that this by-law and the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* relating to markets are duly observed.

2. To demand and collect all market tolls and dues.

3. To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case may seem to such inspector to be most convenient, and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle from being roped within the market yards before five o'clock p.m. on the day of sale except with the consent of such inspector.

6. No person shall obstruct the market inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or remove any cattle from one part of the said market to any other part of the said market, without the consent of the market inspector; nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

7. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls or dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied, and if any cattle be not removed within 48 hours after the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

8. The fat and store cattle shall be offered by the auctioneers, who shall draw lots for precedence of selling, and no auctioneer shall be allowed to occupy more than six (6) minutes in offering any one pen of cattle for sale or occupy more than 1 (one) hour in disposing of all similar stock in his hands for sale. In case any auctioneer has not disposed of the whole of the cattle in his hands within the specified time the cattle in his hands not disposed of shall not again be offered by auction until all similar stock that day in the market for disposal by auction have been offered for sale.

9. All auctioneers who have horses to dispose of by auction shall offer the stock placed in their hands in turn, and no auctioneer shall be permitted to occupy more than 10 (ten) minutes in offering any horse or horses by auction while any other auctioneers, who have horses to dispose of by auction are present, except with the consent of the whole of such other auctioneers, and in no case shall more than one auctioneer be permitted to offer horses for sale by auction at the same time.

10. In case of any dispute arising as to priority of right to offer by auction the market inspector's decision shall be final.

11. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

12. The Council may license any yards or premises for the sale of cattle outside a radius of seven (7) miles from the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards, and the annual licence fee shall be two shillings and sixpence for each yard or premises so licensed.

13. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach or default of this by-law, shall on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

ISSUE OF LICENCES TO AUCTIONEERS.

1. Every auctioneer desirous of exercising his vocation within the Benalla Corporation Sale Yards and its immediate approaches shall, on obtaining the consent in writing of the council of the

shire of Benalla, be authorized to sell in the said market and approaches thereto subject, to the provisions of any by-law now or hereafter to be in force in the said shire for the regulation and government of the said market.

2. The sum of £10 (Ten pounds), payable in advance shall be the amount of the annual licence fee to be paid for the issue of a licence authorizing an auctioneer to sell in the said market and its approaches, every such licence expiring on the 31st day of December in each year.

3. No auctioneer shall exercise his vocation within the said market or its immediate approaches without such consent or otherwise than in accordance with the terms thereof.

1.
