### DETERMINATION OF THE POTTERY TRADE BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of Pottery-making, including the making of Tiles, and of Drain and Glazed Pipes, and the Clay-digging in connexion therewith, has made the following Determination :—

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of Pottery-making, including the making of Tiles and of Drain and Glazed Pipes, and the Clay-digging in connexion therewith, shall be as follow :—

**APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.**

*Number.*

That the number of male apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory, or work-room, or shop, or place, shall be one such apprentice or improver to every two adults or fraction thereof, receiving not less than 40s. per week, provided that to every eight adults employed not more than one improver employed shall be under sixteen years of age.

*Wage.*

That the lowest prices or rates to be paid to any apprentice or improver employed in the process, trade, or business of Pottery-making, including the making of Tiles, and the Clay-digging in connexion therewith, shall be as follows :—

**FEMALES.**

The lowest prices or rates which may be paid to females employed in the process, trade, or business of Pottery-making, including the making of Tiles, shall be as follows:—

Females over twenty years of age employed in the making of Tiles, 17s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

Females over eighteen years of age employed in the making of General Pottery, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

**APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.***Number.*

That the number of female apprentices or improvers under twenty years of age employed in any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be one such female apprentice or improver to every female receiving not less than 17s. 6d. per week.

*Wage.*

That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to any female apprentice or improver under twenty years of age employed in the making of Tiles in any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be:—

For 1st year of experience	...	...	7s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

**OVERTIME:**

That any male employé over the age of sixteen years engaged in the process, trade, or business of Pottery-making, including the making of Tiles and of Drain and Glazed Pipes and the Clay-digging in connexion therewith, who works for any time in excess of the maximum number of hours fixed by the Board shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a quarter.

That the Determination of this Board published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th March, 1901, shall be cancelled and annulled from and after the date upon which this present Determination comes into force and is operative.

That this Determination shall come into force and be operative from and after 5th August, 1901.
