NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTIONS FOR THE GIPPSLAND, MELBOURNE, NELSON, NORTHERN, NORTH CENTRAL, NORTH-EASTERN, NORTH-WESTERN, NORTH YARRA, SOUTHERN, SOUTH-EASTERN, SOUTH-WESTERN, SOUTH YARRA, WELLINGTON, AND WESTERN PROVINCES.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in each of the above-mentioned Electoral Provinces, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. S. F. SHARP, MANTLE MANUFACTURER, 281-3A LATROBE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 19th August, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than six females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said six females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea-money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Certificate of field service and competency for presentation to the Board of Examiners—

I, A.B., a registered land surveyor of the colony of _____ hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____ in the practice of land surveying for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ and that he is fully competent to conduct surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visu voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

BY-LAW NO. 22.

THE Council of the United Shire of Beechworth, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, in pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and of every other power enabling them on that behalf, do hereby make the following amendment in By-law No. 10 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

Section 1 of the said By-law No. 10 is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following section is substituted:—

Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the United Shire of Beechworth shall, on or before the first day of October in each year, register himself with the Council of the said Shire in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies for the said Shire an application in writing, in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, forward and pay the fees following, namely:—

If the person applying to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows does not exceed 5, a fee of One shilling.

Exceeds 5, but does not exceed 10, a fee of Two shillings. And for every additional 10 or fractional part of 10 after the first 10 up to 190, an additional fee of Two shillings.

Exceeding 190, a fee of Two pounds.

If the person does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

The births of 1,086 children, viz., 544 boys and 542 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. The number was, it will be observed, the highest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1892 and 1893, and 1 above the average of July during that period, but 73 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 685, viz., 355 of males and 330 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 401, or 59 per cent., as against 33 per cent. in July, 1901, and 76 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, the highest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1893 and 1901. It was also 67 above the average of July during that period, and 42 above it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.49, and of deaths registered to 16.08 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 23.38 and 17.63, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 26.67 and 15.83, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 64.4° on the 5th, and the lowest was 31.6° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (48.4°) was three-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.9°) took place on the 2nd, and the least range (5.4°) on the 13th and 22nd. The mean daily range was 14.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.530 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.653 inches on the 30th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.123 inches) was over one-seventh of an inch above the average.

Rain fell on six days, the amount being .57 of an inch, which was .69 of an inch lower than in July, 1901, and 1.23 inches below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on five days during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was 76.9.

Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 18 per cent. to that mortality, as against 22 per cent. in July, 1901; 20 per cent. in July, 1900; 25 per cent. in July, 1899; 25 per cent. in July, 1898; 20 per cent. in July, 1897; 22 per cent. in July, 1896; 27 per cent. in July, 1895; 27 per cent. in July, 1894; 50 per cent. in July, 1893; and 29 per cent. in July, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 83, as compared with 120 in July, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was 76 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 122 in July, 1901; 73 in July, 1900; 113 in July, 1899; 100 in July, 1898; 70 in July, 1897; 82 in July, 1896; 117 in July, 1895; 100 in July, 1894; 131 in July, 1893; and 88 in July, 1892.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 121, of which 73, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 48, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 83 were under one year of age, 22 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years, numbered 561. As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, the mortality from parasitic diseases and ill-defined causes remains nearly stationary, but there was an increase of 21 deaths under local diseases; whilst there was a decrease of 27 deaths under zymotic, 7 under dietie, 19 under constitutional, 18 under developmental diseases, and 7 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 1 to 4, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 2 to 6; whilst those from influenza fell from 43 to 23, those from whooping-cough from 13 to 2, those from diphtheria from 7 to 3, and those from venereal diseases from 9 to 5. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer fell from 40 to 35, and those from phthisis from 68 to 58. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth fell from 26 to 15. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 18, those from diseases of the digestive system by 14, and those from diseases of the organs of locomotion by 3; on the other hand, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system diminished by 13, and those from diseases of parturition by 7.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1901, and in each of the first seven months of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November, and that the mortality from diphtheria during the month was below the average.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BENDIGO AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1902.

THE number of births registered during the month of July in all the Bendigo Districts was 138; of these, 77 were of males and 61 of females; included were 12 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the registered births numbered 125, viz., 60 of males and 65 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 73, viz., 40 of males and 33 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 65. In the previous month the recorded deaths numbered 69; in the month of July, 1901, they numbered 66; in the month of July, 1900, they numbered 59; in the month of July, 1899, they numbered 66; in the month of July, 1898, they numbered 78; in the month of July, 1897, they numbered 56; in the month of July, 1896, they numbered 67; in the month of July, 1895, they numbered 62; in the month of July, 1894, they numbered 52; in the month of July, 1893, they numbered 67; and in the month of July, 1892, they numbered 63.

Of the registered births 98 occurred within the city of Bendigo and 40 in the surrounding districts. Of the deaths registered 56 took place within and 17 without the city.

Of the 73 deaths registered during the month, 24, or 33 per cent., were of children under five years of age, and 49, or 67 per cent., were of persons beyond that age. In the previous month these proportions were respectively 22 and 78 per cent.

Twenty deaths, or 27 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Bendigo Hospital, 13; Benevolent Asylum, 7.

WHEREAS by the *Treasury Bonds Act 1896* (No. 1451) it is among other things provided that the sum of £35,000, to be raised by the issue of Treasury Bonds under the authority of the said Act, may be applied for the giving of bonuses for dairy produce, fruits, and honey of best quality, and in best order, exported to markets other than Australasian; for the construction of wineries in vine-growing districts, and viticultural education generally; for the sowing and planting and cultivation of seeds or plants, to be used for the manufacture of fibre, oil, &c., also for the manufacture of the same; and for the manufacture of raisins, currants, and figs, to be expended under Regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council: And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates respectively the sixth and the sixteenth of November, 1896, Regulations were made for the purposes aforesaid: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the said Regulations in the manner following (that is to say):—

GENERAL VEGETABLE PRODUCTS, £10,000.

In clause I. of the aforesaid Regulations of the 6th November, 1896, the sum of £10,000 shall read £5,000.

BONUSES FOR EXPORT OF FRUIT PULP.

In clause I. of the aforesaid Regulations of 16th November, 1896, the sum of £370 shall read £3,805 10s. 1d.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made by Orders of the 8th day of January, 1902, and the 24th day of June, 1902 (that is to say):—

Land Act 1901.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902, AND 24TH JUNE, 1902.—PART IV. SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENSES, STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Chapter IV.—Stripping of Wattle Bark.

The Regulations, together with Schedule 143, made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, and Schedule 142, made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 24th June, 1902, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are made in lieu thereof:—

From the date hereof there shall be issued permits, under royalty system, to strip and remove from any Crown lands and any land held under section 29 or 35 of the *Land Act 1890* or *1901*, at a fixed rate per ton, based on the fair market value of the bark on the land where it is stripped, and according to whether it is obtained from the golden or broad leaf, black or feather leaf, or silver variety of wattle, and such permits shall be issued subject to the following conditions, viz.:—

1. All applications to strip bark shall be made, in writing, to the nearest forest officer, and, where no such officer is stationed, to the nearest staff bailiff or police bailiff of Crown lands. The application shall state clearly the area, number of allotment, and parish on which it is desired to strip bark, the estimated quantity of mature bark available, and the royalty offered per ton. The forest officer or bailiff, after examining and assessing the value of the bark per ton, shall at once forward the applications, with his recommendation thereon, to the Forest Office, Lands Department, Melbourne, to be dealt with.

2. In every case where the wattle fit for stripping is on land held under lease from the Crown, the lessee shall have the first claim to a stripping permit, provided that he agrees to pay a fair royalty fixed after assessment.

3. Before a permit to strip is issued, applicants shall pay, at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests, a deposit of from five to ten per centum of the assessed royalty payable on the estimated quantity of bark obtainable on the area allotted to them, and shall sign an undertaking for the payment of the balance of royalty when ascertained.

4. The balance of royalty shall be payable immediately the total weight of the bark stripped is ascertained. An order on

the person or firm to whom the bark is sold, duly countersigned by such person or firm, must be handed to the forest officer or bailiff before removal from the Crown land.

5. All wattle trees shall be felled prior to being stripped, unless the permit holder is otherwise directed by the officer in charge.

6. The diameter at which trees may be stripped shall be set out in the permit; and the officer in charge may mark any trees which are not to be felled or stripped, and trees which in his opinion should be stripped must be stripped.

7. The area to be stripped shall be set out by description in the permit, and where necessary the officer in charge shall point it out on the ground.

8. The whole work must be performed by the officer in charge, and to his satisfaction. He will direct where and when fires may be lighted and put out and camps fixed. He may, in writing, require the instant dismissal of any stripper or employé who disregards his instructions for the protection of Crown property, or respecting misuse of fire, and may instantly suspend any stripping permit pending the decision of the Minister of Lands, who may cancel the permit and forfeit any deposit or bark stripped to the Crown upon any serious wilful breach of these conditions.

And the Honorable Malcolm Kenneth McKenzie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality, and that, upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road, and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Brimbonga: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

County of Evelyn, parish of Brimbonga: Commencing at a point bearing N. 79° 59' W. eight chains thirty-five links and N. 5° 51' E. five links from the north-east angle of allotment 33; bounded thence by a road bearing N. 19° 46' E. four chains nineteen links; and thence by lines bearing respectively N. 12° 32' W. two chains forty-three links, N. 43° 55' W. three chains seventy-two links, S. 26° 12' W. one chain six links, S. 43° 53' E. three chains eight links, S. 12° 32' E. one chain ninety-nine links, and S. 5° 51' W. three chains ninety links to the point of commencement,

in lieu of an existing road in the same parish, defined in the following description (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c. &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time set apart and appropriate for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Part of the said Act blocks of any land not alienated from the Crown and not being auriferous lands or lands permanently reserved for any purpose whatsoever, provided that such blocks of land shall not include any mallee block or allotment except such as may have been or may hereafter be purchased by the Crown in accordance with the conditions of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid; and that, except as to so much of any block as may be occupied or leased under the said Part of the said Act, no Proclamation setting apart a block for a society shall remain in force for longer than three years or for an association for longer than six months after in each case the survey and subdivision of such block; and that at the expiration of such three years or six months (as the case may be) all land in any block which is not occupied or leased under Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid shall be deemed and taken to be unoccupied Crown land: And whereas by certain Proclamations as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893*, certain lands described in such Proclamations were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said last-mentioned Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part such Proclamations: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby order as follows, viz. :—

Settlement on Lands Act 1893.

LINTON.—The Proclamation bearing date the 27th August, 1894, by which certain lands situate in the parish of Linton, and comprising an area of one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six acres one rood thirty-seven perches, more or less, were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of homestead associations or societies, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz. :—Twenty acres, county of Evelyn, parish of Linton, being allotment 33a of section A.—(02. V. 32312.)

TARRAWARRA.—The Proclamation bearing date the 15th January, 1894, by which certain lands situate in the parish of Tarrawarra, and comprising an area of four hundred and forty acres, more or less, were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of homestead associations or societies, is hereby revoked so far only as it relates to the portion of the said lands hereinafter described, viz. :—Three hundred and eighty acres, more or less, county of Evelyn, parish of Tarrawarra: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 161; bounded thence by that allotment and allotment 97 bearing westerly sixty chains sixty-two links; thence by allotment 44 bearing southerly fifty-three chains fifty links; thence by a road easterly to the south-west angle of allotment 450; thence by that allotment northerly and north-easterly to the north-east angle thereof; and thence by a road northerly to the point of commencement.—(02.
