PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend the *Trading Stamps Act 1901*."

"An Act to reduce for One Year the Municipal Endowment."

"An Act Relating to the Mallee Land Account."

"An Act to provide for the Reduction until the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and three, of the Reimbursement of Expenses payable to Members of the Legislative Assembly and the Salaries or Pay of certain Public Officers."

SHIRE OF McIVOR.

BY-LAW No. 5, AS TO DAIRIES, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MILK.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of McIvor, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following by-law, being By-Law No. 5 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of McIvor.
4. Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, for the year 1902, within fourteen days after the publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say:—By signing and forwarding to the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keep cows, and the number of such cows is:—
 - (1) Not more than 5, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
 - (2) More than 5, but not more than 10, a fee of Five shillings.
 - (3) More than 10, but not more than 20, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.
 - (4) More than 20, but not more than 30, a fee of Ten shillings.
 - (5) More than 30, but not more than 40, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.
 - (6) More than 40, but not more than 50, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
 - (7) More than 50, but not more than 60, a fee of Twenty shillings.
 - (8) More than 60, a fee of Twenty-five shillings.
 - (9) If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the Inspector of Dairies for the Shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.
6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid, and any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person shall be attacked by typhoid fever or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business, nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN.

BY-LAW No. 3, UNDER THE HEALTH ACTS.

A By-law made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and numbered Three, for the registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, purveyors of milk, and persons who occupy any house or land in or upon which butter or cheese or dairy produce is manufactured for sale or barter.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Acts, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Violet Town, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, that is to say:—

Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person being the occupier of any house or land in or upon which butter or cheese or dairy produce is manufactured for sale or barter shall, between the 10th day of August, 1902, and the 28th day of February, 1903, and between the same days in succeeding years, annually register himself with the said council, and shall thereupon pay

to the said council a fee according to the number of cows kept by him, as hereinafter appointed, that is to say:—

For 10 cows or less	One shilling
More than 10, but not more than 20	Two shillings
More than 20, but not more than 30	Three shillings
More than 30, but not more than 40	Four shillings
More than 40, but not more than 50	Five shillings
More than 50	Seven shillings and sixpence

A purveyor of milk not keeping cows Five shillings.
Any persons occupying any house or land in or upon which butter or cheese or dairy produce is manufactured for sale or barter shall pay a fixed annual registration fee of Five shillings. The foregoing by-law was adopted and passed by special order at a special meeting of the Council of the Shire of Violet Town, held at the Council Chambers, Violet Town, on the 2nd day of June, 1902, and confirmed by the said Council on the 7th day of July, 1902.

VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1902.

THE births of 61 boys and 65 girls, or in all of 126 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. Of these, 62 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, 7 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts. Included were 10 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 107, viz., 60 of boys and 47 of girls.

The deaths registered in October numbered 57, viz., 38 of males and 19 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 69. In September the recorded deaths numbered 66; in October, 1901, they numbered 52; in October, 1900, they numbered 60; in October, 1899, they numbered 112; in October, 1898, they numbered 74; in October, 1897, they numbered 46; in October, 1896, they numbered 58; in October, 1895, they numbered 56; in October, 1894, they numbered 80; in October, 1893, they numbered 63; and in October, 1892, they numbered 64.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF WARRNAMBOOL GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Warrnambool General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th day of January, 1855, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

1. That all fees and charges payable to the trustees shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground in the cemetery for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, or tombstone, or for any other purpose, shall apply to the trustees therefor. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a grant in the form specified in Schedule A.
3. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under direction of the sexton, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

4. That any person desiring to add to, alter, or amend a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to add to or amend a monument or tombstone, or to erect a cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other construction or erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit in writing a statement, plan, design, or drawing of the same, with full particulars, and shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work. And a drawing of every pedestal or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription, shall be submitted to the trustees for approval before permission for the erection or placing thereof shall be given.

5. That all applications for interment shall be made at the cemetery at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

6. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B, shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased thereon.

8. That every grave shall be at least 7 feet deep.

9. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in the cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

10. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follow:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year, from Two to Five p.m.

11. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of the trustees.

12. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

13. That every funeral shall enter the cemetery by the principal entrance. No vehicle, except hearses and mourning coaches, shall be permitted to enter or stand opposite the entrance gates, save for the purpose of with all due despatch driving away after loading or unloading. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

14. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed from the cemetery at once, by and at the expense of the person causing the same. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone work.

15. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.

16. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

17. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

18. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for reinterment in this or any other cemetery.

19. That before any such exceptional case be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and, in the event of such application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, or any amendment or substitution thereof, in addition to the permission of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

20. That any workman or other employé, whether employed by the trustees or by any other person, shall at all times while in the cemetery be subject to the supervision, directions, and control of the sexton, and shall obey all such directions, and shall be removable from the cemetery upon any breach of the Regulations, or any refusal or neglect to comply with or obey any such directions.

21. That any person taking any part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules, viz.:—First.—That no rubbish, clay, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately after the completion of the work. Second.—That no loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave. Third.—That no grave shall be dressed in wet weather, except by special permission of the sexton, nor shall any materials be wheeled or carted along any path or road while the surface is soft from rain or otherwise. Work in all cases is to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

22. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Six a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. during the other months of the year.

23. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

24. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor shall any fireworks be discharged therein.

25. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

26. That no person in the cemetery or its approaches shall commit any nuisance or trespass, or be guilty of any breach of decorum, or cut, pluck, gather, or take out of any breach of any flower, plant, shrub, or tree, or any part thereof, or do any injury whatsoever thereto, or to any grass plot, border railing, fence, or any other erection or road therein, or remove or interfere in any way with anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place.

27. That no person shall promote, or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery or its approaches any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

28. That "the sexton," as referred to in these Rules, means the person for the time being in charge of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the directions of the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these Rules, and, subject to the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, the direction of such person shall in all such matters, and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.

29. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

30. That any person employed under the trustees accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

31. That any person committing any breach of any of these Rules or Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws, lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to cemeteries, shall be thereupon forthwith removable from the cemetery by the trustees or the sexton, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly in addition to any other proceedings or penalties to which such person may be subject.

32. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, shall be kept at the office of the trustees, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the Schedule, and registers of all grants will be kept by the secretary.

REGULATION NO. 26.—COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—EXTRA RATE FOR 1902.

WHEREAS the moneys received in the year 1902 by the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, on account of the water supplied and distributed by the said Trust, are not sufficient to provide for the payment of the lawful expenses incurred by the said Trust in the control and management of the district of the said Trust (except costs, the payment of which is otherwise specially provided for).

The Commissioners of the said Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust therefore do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, and in order to provide sufficient funds in so far as the same are insufficient for discharging such current expenses and maintaining the works of such Trust in an efficient state, make and levy a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the said Trust, according to the valuation for the year 1902, of the various rateable properties in the said district for the municipal rates of the Shire of Korang, to meet the estimated expenditure and liabilities of this current year of the said Trust.

The said rate is made for the year 1902, and shall be payable on the 1st day of December, 1902, and is in addition to any other rate made by the said Trust.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

No. 1374), it is amongst other things enacted that if any matter or thing prescribed by or under the said Act to be made or done at or within a fixed time cannot be or is not so made or done, the Governor in Council may by Order from time to time appoint a further or other time for making or doing the same, whether the time or any such further or other time within which the same ought to have been done has or has not elapsed or expired: And whereas the assessments of incomes for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, for the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth, seventh, and eighth periods for which assessments were prescribed to be made or done, were not made or done on or before the 17th day of May, 1902, the 30th day of May, 1902, the 13th day of June, 1902, the 11th day of July, 1902, the 8th day of August, 1902, the 13th day of September, 1902, the 11th day of October, 1902, and the 15th day of November, 1902, as prescribed by the Regulations made pursuant to the said Act, and dated the 3rd day of December, 1901, and by Orders in Council dated the 15th day of May, 1902, the 10th day of June, 1902, the 24th day of June, 1902, the 8th day of July, 1902, the 8th day of August, 1902, the 16th day of September, 1902, and the 21st day of October, 1902: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby appoint that all assessments of incomes for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, which were not made on or before the 15th day of November, 1902, shall be made on or before the 13th day of December, 1902, and that the tax payable on such assessments shall be payable on or before the 29th day of December, 1902.

WHEREAS by section 208 of the *Land Act 1901* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein prescribed: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations made by Order of the 8th day of January, 1902 (that is to say):—

Land Act 1901.

ADDITIONS TO THE REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902.—PART IV. SAW-MILL AND TIMBER LICENCES, STATE FORESTS, TIMBER RESERVES, AND OTHER CROWN LANDS.

Timber on all Crown lands, reserved and unreserved, in the counties of Tatchera, Karkaroc, Millewa, Weeah, and Lowan, and Bungalilly and Kewell West Timber Reserves, in the county of Borung, shall, from the date hereof, be sold under special permit and royalty only, at the prices hereafter stated, and subject to the conditions mentioned; but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation.

CONDITIONS.

1. Application must be made to the Conservator of Forests, through the officer in charge of the reserves, who will arrange for the work to proceed immediately upon issue of permit.
2. The officer in charge will locate the permit-holder in any portion of the areas which is, in his opinion, most suitable, and when necessary mark the trees which may be felled with the broad arrow (thus ↑). He will also give the permit-holder instructions generally how to proceed with the work, and in the event of his instructions being disregarded, or upon wilful breach of any of these conditions, may instantly suspend the permit pending the decision of the Honorable the Minister, who may cancel the permit, forfeit the deposit (if any), and seize the timber already cut as the property of the Crown. During suspension the permit shall have no force or effect.
3. A deposit of £1 must be made if the Conservator of Forests thinks such deposit necessary.
4. All forest produce cut under this Regulation must be branded by the officer in charge with the Crown brand, and paid for by the permit-holder before removal from the reserve, and should the latter remove or allow to be removed unbranded timber, unless with the written authority of the officer in charge, legal proceedings will be taken under the *Land Act 1890* or the *Crimes Act 1890*. Permits are personal, and must be produced on demand of any forest officer, Crown lands bailiff, or police constable.

The royalty rates shall be as follow:—

- Split posts, up to 6ft. 6in. x 7in. x 4in., 4s. per 100.
- Round posts and strainers, up to 7 feet in length and 12 inches in diameter, 3d. each.
- Firewood cut from green trees, 3d. per ton measurement (50 cubic feet).
- Firewood cut or split from dry timber, 2d. per ton measurement (50 cubic feet).
- Long wood (waste lop and top lying on ground), per dozen one-horse loads, 3s.
- She oak, bull oak, belar or black oak, and cypress pine, for any purpose, to be cut or removed under conditions and at royalty rates to be fixed by special arrangement only.

The Regulations made by His Excellency the Governor in Council on 8th January, 1902, for the cutting and removal of timber from Crown lands within a radius of 10 miles of the Mildura Post Office, shall, from the date hereof, apply to all Crown lands within a radius of 30 miles of the said post office, subject to the following modification only, viz.:—On all Crown lands outside a radius of 10 miles, but within a radius of 30 miles, of the Mildura Post Office, the royalty rate for deadwood (redgum and box only) shall be 2d. per cord of 128 cubic feet.

Timber, other than redgum, on the undermentioned Crown lands and State forest, shall, from the date hereof, be sold under special permit and royalty only, but licences current shall remain in force until their expiration by effluxion of time, and contracts now existing for the supply of timber shall not be affected by this Regulation:—

All Crown lands, whether reserved or unreserved, in the parishes of Glenburnie, Clonbinane, Bradford, Derril, Kerrisdale, Flowerdale, Billian, and Wallan Wallan, including the Mount Disappointment State Forest.

The conditions and rates for the cutting and removal of timber approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, for Victoria, Dandenong, and Otway Forest Reserves on the 2nd day of September, 1902, shall apply to the above Crown lands, and have full force and effect therein from the date hereof.

And the Honorable Malcolm Kenneth McKenzie, His Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PENSURST CRICKET AND RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, Joseph Tiley, Harry John Olle, David Henry Styles, Richard Barnes, and Timothy Madigan, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Penshurst Cricket and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works to be made by the said Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall damage in any way the fences, trees, buildings, seats, or other property therein (including the formed cricket pitch and formed bicycle track), nor shall fires be lighted therein.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, buildings, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve, nor remove therefrom any soil or sand.
5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals or poultry without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
7. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect thereon any dwelling or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any enclosures or plots therein which may be set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall enter the Reserve on any day set apart for sports or fêtes, nor bring therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle, except on production of a ticket issued by the Committee of Management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horse, carriage, or other vehicle: but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the date printed thereon, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any building, erection, enclosure, or cultivated spot within the Reserve; and every such ticket shall be surrendered on demand to any gate-keeper or other person authorized by the Committee of Management to collect the same.

10. Any person being drunk or disorderly or assaulting any other person shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto.

11. The maximum scale of fees for admission to the Reserve on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the Reserve may be set apart for sports or fêtes shall be as follows:—

- For the admission of every adult, 1s. 6d.
- For the admission of every horse (exclusive of rider), 1s. 6d.
- For the admission of every carriage, cart, or other vehicle drawn by one or more horses, 1s. 6d.
- For the admission of every horse (exclusive of vehicle), 1s. 6d.

12. The net proceeds of all sports or fêtes, other than those for the benefit of public charitable institutions, shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence: and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The number was, it will be observed, higher than in any previous corresponding month since 1894, and was 32 above the average of the month during the previous ten years, but 41 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in October numbered 533, viz., 296 of males and 237 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 569, or 107 per cent., as against 97 per cent. in October, 1901, and 98 per cent. according to the average. The number was also 8 below the average of October during that period, and 45 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.87, and of deaths registered to 12.51 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 25.35 and 12.86, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 26.45 and 13.78, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.83 and 15.09.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 52.5° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 39.0° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (58.0°) was one and two-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.9°) took place on the 5th, and the least range (1.1°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 18.1°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.273 inches on the 4th, and the lowest was 29.556 inches on the 18th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.917 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on seven days, the amount being 0.76 of an inch, which was the lowest recorded for the month during the last ten years, except in 1895, and 1.63 inches below the average during that period.

The mean humidity of the month was .751.

Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 19 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in October, 1901; 24 per cent. in October, 1900; 19 per cent. in October, 1899; 30 per cent. in October, 1898; 19 per cent. in October, 1897; 21 per cent. in October, 1896; 21 per cent. in October, 1895; 24 per cent. in October, 1894; 28 per cent. in October, 1893; and 26 per cent. in October, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 79, as compared with 80 in October, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality was 72 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 75 in October, 1901; 91 in October, 1900; 89 in October, 1899; 133 in October, 1898; 61 in October, 1897; 63 in October, 1896; 79 in October, 1895; 64 in October, 1894; 72 in October, 1893; and 77 in October, 1892.

Eighty-two persons—as against 69 in October, 1901—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these two gentlemen, each aged 75, died of influenza and cerebral hemorrhage, respectively; four females, each aged 75, of thrombosis, heart disease, pneumonia, and cirrhosis of the liver, respectively; a watchman, aged 75, of chronic nephritis; an Imperial pensioner, aged 76, of alcoholism; a female, aged 76, of phthisis; a hawk-r, aged 76, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a sailor, aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76, of hernia; a surveyor, aged 76, of disease of the liver; a publican, aged 76, of cystitis; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a male of no occupation, aged 77, of gangrene of leg; a female, aged 78, of diabetes; three pensioners and a female, each aged 78, of apoplexy, paralysis, disease of kidneys, and heart disease respectively; an engineer, aged 79, of tumour on the brain; a miner, aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 79, of enteritis; two females, each aged 80, of cerebral hemorrhage and congestion of the lungs, respectively; a farmer, aged 80, of ascites; a gentleman, aged 81, of injuries, the result of a collision with a tram-car; a female, aged 81, of influenza; a pensioner, aged 81, of pericarditis; a female, aged 81, of bronchitis; another, aged 82, of cancer; a female, aged 82, of apoplexy; a baker, aged 82, of senile gangrene; two females and a labourer, each aged 82, of pneumonia, cirrhosis of kidneys, and disease of prostate, respectively; three females, each aged 83, of paralysis, dilatation of heart, and bronchitis, respectively; a gentleman, aged 83, of stomatitis; a female, aged 83, of uremia; another, aged 84, of softening of the brain; a male, of no occupation, aged 84, of injuries to the thigh; a gentleman, aged 85, of cancer; a male of no occupation, aged 85, of cerebral hemorrhage; a labourer, aged 85, of appendicitis; a draftsman, aged 85, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 85, of dropsy; a male of no occupation, aged 86, of pleuro-pneumonia; a female, aged 88, of cirrhosis of the kidneys; a salesman, aged 90, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 92, of indigestion; an agent, aged 75, a female, aged 76, three females, each aged 77, a carpenter, a plumber, and a female, each aged 78; a gentleman, a carpenter, and a station hand, each aged 80, a carrier, a sharabroker, and two watchmen, each aged 82, a pawnbroker, aged 83, a dealer, an ironfounder, and a painter, each aged 87, a miller and three females, each aged 88, an architect, aged 89, a grazier and a female, each aged 91, a soldier, aged 92, and a cooper, aged 99, of old age.

Thirty-nine of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 19 in October, 1901—were from external causes, of which 27 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, 7 to suicide, and 1 to execution. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway guard, aged 39, was passed over by a train; a gentleman, aged 80, died of injuries, the result of a collision with a tram-car; a labourer, aged 27, of injuries, consequent on a fall from a horse; a butcher, aged 54, of injuries to the spine, caused by a fall from a buggy; a carpenter, aged 68, of injuries, the result of a fall through a skylight; a labourer, aged 66, and a female, aged 73, of injuries, consequent in each case on a fall; a boy, aged 7, of internal injuries; a blindmaker, aged 52, of rupture of the stomach; a housekeeper, aged 33, of extravasation of blood on the brain; a male, of no occupation, aged 84, of injuries to the thigh; a boy, aged 6, of traumatic tetanus; two male children, each aged 2, of burns; a boy, aged 10, a salesman, and a female, each aged 17, a labourer, aged 35, and a driver, aged 38, were drowned in the River Yarra; a boy, aged 6, in the Saltwater River; a boy, aged 7, and a labourer, aged 21, in Hobson's Bay; three persons were found drowned, viz.—a grainer, aged 40, in the River Yarra; and two labourers, aged 42 and 48 respectively, in Hobson's Bay; a female child, aged 6 months, and a dairyman, aged 39, were suffocated by food. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born female infant, who died of burns, a new-born male infant, who was suffocated, a constable, aged 36, who was shot, and a farmer aged 38, who died of fracture of the skull, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the three former cases, and of manslaughter in the latter. The suicidal deaths were those of a bootmaker, aged 53, who shot himself; a hairdresser, aged 22, a boxmaker, aged 27, a billiard-marker, aged 40, and a carpenter, aged 42, who cut their throats; a caterer, aged 26, and a servant (female), aged 17, who poisoned themselves. The execution was that of a labourer, aged 26, who was hanged in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 102, of which 56, or 55 per cent., were of males, and 46, or 45 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 79 were under one year of age, 16 were between one and two, 4 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 1 was between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 431. Of these 240, or 56 per cent., were males, and 191, or 44 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 18 were between ten and fifteen, 12 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 19 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 37 were between sixty-five and seventy, 43 were between seventy and seventy-five, 33 were between seventy-five and eighty, 28 were between eighty and eighty-five, 15 were between eighty-five and ninety, 5 were between ninety and ninety-five, and one at ninety-nine.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 10 deaths under developmental diseases, 20 under the head of violence, and 6 under ill-defined causes; whilst there was a decrease of 10 under zymotic and 34 under constitutional diseases. Under the zymotic class, deaths from diphtheria rose from 3 to 5, and those from diarrhoeal diseases from 2 to 6; whilst those from influenza fell from 10 to 5, and those from whooping-cough from 17 to 1. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer fell from 50 to 24, and those from diabetes from 7 to 1. Under the developmental class, deaths from old age rose from 19 to 37, whilst those from premature birth fell from 31 to 14. In the local class, deaths from diseases of the nervous system increased by 15, those from diseases of the digestive system by 7, and those from diseases of the organs of locomotion by 3; on the other hand, deaths from diseases of the circulatory system diminished by 10, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 20.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1901, and in each of the first ten months of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.
