Sir,

Proclamation. It is with much pleasure that I have the honour 4th Nov., 1901. to transmit to you, for publication in the colony under your Government, a copy of the Royal Proclamation prescribing the addition to be made, in recognition of His Majesty's Dominions beyond the Seas, to the Style and Titles appertaining to the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies.

It will be observed that this addition to the Royal Titles is to be used henceforth so far as conveniently may be on all occasions and in all instruments wherein the Royal Style and Title are used.

A copy of the *Royal Titles Act 1901*, under the provisions of which the Proclamation has been made, is also enclosed.

▲ PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD R. I.

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to enable His Most Gracious Majesty to make an Addition to the Royal Style and Titles in recognition of His Majesty's Dominions beyond the Seas," which Act enacts that it shall be lawful for Us, with a view to such recognition as aforesaid of Our Dominions beyond the Seas, by our Royal Proclamation under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom issued within six months after the passing of the said Act, to make such addition to the Style and Titles at present appertaining to the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies as to Us may seem fit: And whereas Our present Style and Titles are in the *Latin* tongue, "*Edwardus VII. Dei Gratia Britanniarum Rex, Fidei Defensor, Indiarum Imperator*," and in the *English* tongue, "*Edward VII., by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India*": We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to appoint and declare, and We do hereby, by and with the said advice, appoint and declare that henceforth, so far as conveniently may be, on all occasions and in all instruments wherein Our Style and Titles are used, the following addition shall be made to the Style and Titles at present appertaining to the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom and its Dependencies; that is to say, in the *Latin* tongue, after the word

"*Britanniarum*," these words "at terrarum transmarinarum quae in ditioe sunt *Britanniae*;" and in the *English* tongue, after the words "of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland," these words, "and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas."

And Our will and pleasure further is, that all gold, silver, and bronze moneys, now current and lawful moneys of the United Kingdom, and all gold, silver, and bronze moneys which shall, on or after this day, be coined by Our authority with the like impressions, shall, notwithstanding such addition to Our Style and Titles, be deemed and taken to be current and lawful moneys of the said United Kingdom; and further, that all moneys coined for and issued in any of the Dependencies of the said United Kingdom, and declared by Our Proclamation to be current and lawful money of such Dependencies, respectively bearing Our Style or Titles, or any part or parts thereof, and all moneys which shall hereafter be coined and issued according to such Proclamation, shall, notwithstanding such addition, continue to be lawful and current money of such Dependencies respectively, until Our pleasure shall be further declared thereupon.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, this fourth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and one, in the first year of Our Reign.

Royal Titles Act 1901.

[CH. 15.]

CHAPTER 15.

A.D. 1901. An Act to enable His most gracious Majesty to make an Addition to the Royal Style and Titles in recognition of His Majesty's dominions beyond the seas.

[17th August, 1901.]

Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

Power to make addition to style and title of Crown. 1. It shall be lawful for His most gracious Majesty, with a view to the recognition of His Majesty's dominions beyond the seas, by His Royal Proclamation under the great seal of the United Kingdom issued within six months after the passing of this Act, to make such addition to the style and titles at present appertaining to the Imperial Crown of the United Kingdom and its dependencies as to His Majesty may seem fit.

Short title. 2. This Act may be cited as the *Royal Titles Act 1901*.

IMPORTATION OF MAIZE INTO ITALY.

It is hereby notified for general information that the Acting Consul General for Italy in Australasia has intimated that the Royal Italian Government require that Maize imported into Italy from the Commonwealth of Australia shall be accompanied by a sanitary consular certificate to the effect that it is in good condition.

PROCLAMATION

FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Tuesday, the 18th day of February, 1902, and it is expedient further to prorogue

the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Tuesday, the 18th day of February, 1902, until Tuesday, the 8th day of April, 1902.

REGULATIONS.

THE Public Service Commissioner, pursuant to the provisions of the Public Service Acts, hereby makes the following Regulation:—

CHAPTER IXA.

Boards of Inquiry.

1. The Governor in Council may, for the purpose of investigation into and report on any charge made against an officer under section 124 of the *Public Service Act 1890* as amended by the *Public Service Act 1901*, appoint a Board of Inquiry, which shall consist of three officers in the Public Service recommended by the Commissioner, one of whom shall be a Police Magistrate, and such Police Magistrate shall be Chairman: Provided that if the officer charged be a Police Magistrate it shall not be necessary that a Member or the Chairman of the Board be a Police Magistrate.

2. The evidence given before every Board of Inquiry shall be taken as in open court, provided nevertheless that a Board may, in the interests of morality, sit in private to hear any evidence to which the Board considers it undesirable to give publicity.

3. Shorthand notes of the evidence given before any Board of Inquiry shall be taken down, and a transcript thereof made.

4. The Chairman of every Board of Inquiry, with the report of the Board to the Commissioner under the said section shall, if the charge be found to be proved, forward a transcript of the notes of evidence taken at the investigation.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Visd roce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

HORTICULTURAL SOCIETIES.

REGULATIONS for the distribution of the sum of £400 granted by Parliament to Horticultural Societies, 1901-2.

1. That each society claiming to participate in the grant shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st March, 1902, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. A sum equal to the amount of the prize money awarded and paid away for horticultural exhibits will be allotted to each society having a claim, and be made payable to the treasurer thereof, provided that the sums claimed do not exceed in the whole £359 10s., and if they do exceed this amount then they will be reduced *pro rata*, and the allotment made accordingly.

3. No society whose expenditure in prizes between the 1st January, 1901, and the 31st December, 1901, amounts in the total to less than Twenty-five pounds (£25) shall be entitled to participate in the vote.

INSTRUCTIONS.

1. The blank spaces in the declaration, form E, for the sums awarded and paid in prizes and raised by members' subscriptions and private donations between the 1st January, 1901, and the 31st December, 1901, must be filled up in words as well as in figures, and the declaration must be made before a justice of the peace by the treasurer of the society.

2. The account, when received, must be signed by the treasurer and be countersigned by the president or the vice-president, or by two members of the committee of management. It should then be returned to the Secretary for Agriculture.

It may expedite the payment of the money to fill in at the top of the account the name of the nearest pay office in the space left blank for the purpose. It is necessary to bear in mind that, if that space be not filled up, the account will be payable at Melbourne.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BENDIGO AND THE SURROUNDING REGISTRATION DISTRICTS DURING THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1902.

THE number of births registered during the month of January in all the Bendigo Districts was 128; of these 67 were of males and 61 of females; included were 8 illegitimate births. In the previous month the registered births numbered 123, viz., 56 of males and 67 of females.

The number of deaths registered during the month was 76, viz., 33 of males and 43 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 52. 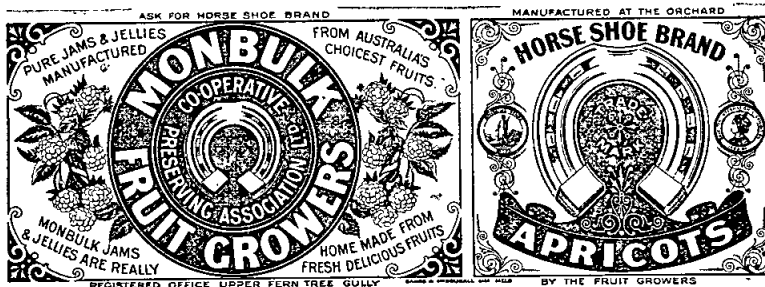

SHIRE OF RODNEY.
BY-LAW No. 17.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890* (No. 1098), the Council of the Shire of Rodney, in the name of and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, hereby make the following by-law for Regulating the Removal and Disposal of Night-soil, that is to say :—

1. All former by-laws are hereby repealed so far only as they affect the matters and things hereinafter provided for.
2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation as follows :—

In the township of Kyabram, in the Kyabram riding of the shire of Rodney, within the boundaries following, that is to say :—

In the county of Rodney, in the parish of Kyabram East: Commencing at a point on the boundary of allotment 4, bearing north no degrees four minutes west ten chains from the south-east angle of the said allotment; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively north eighty-nine degrees fifty-seven minutes east ten chains, south no degrees four minutes east forty-nine chains ninety-five links, south eighty-nine degrees fifty-four minutes west forty-one chains ninety-eight links, north no degrees two minutes forty-nine chains ninety-nine links, and north eighty-nine degrees fifty-seven minutes east thirty-one chains ninety-four links to the point of commencement.

In the township of Mooroopna, in the Mooropno riding of the shire of Rodney: Commencing at the centre of the River Goulburn at a point in a line with the southern boundary of allotment 10, parish of Toolamba; thence west to and along the said boundary of allotment 10 and a line produced in the same direction crossing a one and a half chain road to a point in allotment 25, parish of Toolamba, five hundred links at right angles to the west side of said road; thence by a line bearing north twenty-four degrees thirty-seven minutes east, passing through the said allotment 25 and parallel with the said road to the centre of a three-chain road from Corop to Shepparton; thence by a line bearing north twenty-three minutes west, passing through allotments 6 and 7A, parish of Mooropna, being five hundred links from and parallel to the eastern boundary of the said allotment 6 to its intersection with the centre line produced of a road between allotments 9, 8, and 59A of the same parish; thence by a line bearing north forty-seven degrees nine minutes east to and across a three-chain road, and along the centre line of the aforesaid road between allotments 3, 8, and 59A to a point in a line with the north-eastern boundary of said allotment 8 and a line bearing south forty-two degrees fifty-one minutes east to the centre of the River Goulburn, in the parish of Mooropna; and thence by the centre of the River Goulburn in a general direction south-westerly to a point in a line with the southern boundary of allotment 10, parish of Toolamba, to the commencing point aforesaid.

In the township of Tatura, in the Tatura riding of the shire of Rodney: Commencing at south-west angle of allotment 2, section 13, township of Tatura; thence by a line bearing south eighty-nine degrees fifty-five minutes west six chains; thence by a line bearing north sixteen minutes west twenty-nine chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing north eighty-nine degrees fifty-five minutes east sixty-six chains eighty links; thence by a line southerly to the north-east angle of the railway station reserve; thence south-westerly to the south-east angle of that reserve; thence by a line westerly to the north-east angle of the Agricultural Show-yards reserve; thence southerly and westerly by the east and south boundaries of the Agricultural Show-yards reserve to the south-west angle thereof; thence westerly along south boundary of public gardens reserve to the south-west angle thereof; thence northerly five chains along west boundary of said public gardens reserve; thence westerly to the commencing point.

4. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy or cess-pit except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and such earth-closets shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan and contents thereof.

5. Once in each week, or so much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the person contracted with by the said council shall remove the pans in use, and shall empty and thoroughly and efficiently cleanse and disinfect the same, and shall replace the pans after emptying and so cleansing and disinfecting the same.

6. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be water-tight and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

7. As to any existing privy, earth-closet, or urinal, only such as in the opinion of the council are in a perfectly sanitary condition shall be allowed to remain for more than three months abutting upon any street, lane, or thoroughfare of more than twelve feet in width.

8. No owner or occupier of any dwelling, tenement, house, school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, common or other lodging-house, mechanics' institute, or other premises of any kind whatsoever, shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of closet-pans, or their contents, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person appointed in that behalf by the said council, and such pans and their contents shall be removed by the person or his employé so appointed at such times and in such manner as the said council may from time to time direct.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any dwelling, tenement, house, school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, workroom, common or other lodging-house, mechanics' institute, or other premises of any kind whatsoever, shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, charcoal, sawdust (ashes being expressly prohibited), or other material efficient for deodorizing

night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in the pan in such earth-closet to be immediately on deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

10. All night-soil shall be removed to and buried as herein-after provided in the manure depôt appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same, and in no other place.

11. No person shall place, deposit, spread or bury, or cause or suffer to be placed or deposited, or spread or buried, or assist in placing, depositing, spreading or burying in any place except the manure depôt, to be from time to time appointed by the said council, any night-soil, whether by way of manure or otherwise.

12. The council will, from time to time, and as occasion may require, appoint a person or persons to carry out the duties of night-man or night-men in the night service of the three aforesaid townships.

13. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law, or of any of its provisions, shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, nor less than five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, nor less than five shillings, for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the council (being the Municipal Council) in and for the Shire of Rodney this sixteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and one.

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Broadford.

4. *Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, for the year 1902, within fourteen days after the publication of this by-law in the *Government Gazette*, and thereafter on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the inspector of dairies for the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the inspector of dairies for the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council; and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in case of an unregistered person, served personally, or left at his dwelling place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which, from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, but not so registered, be employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family, or any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this by-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

SHIRE OF BROADFORD.

By-Law No. 4.

THE Council of the Shire of Broadford, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, by virtue of the power conferred by the *Health Act 1890* and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 4 of the said Council, that is to say:—

1. This By-law No. 4 shall apply to and have operation in that portion of the shire of Broadford as described hereunder, that is to say, within a radius of 60 chains from the Golden Dyko Mine, Sunday Creek, Clonbinane; within a radius of 60 chains from the Comet Saw-mill, Comet Creek; within a radius of 60 chains from the Planet Saw-mill, Sunday Creek.

2. The occupier or every occupier or the person in charge of any house, hut, tent, or building in the encampments or gold-fields aforesaid shall cause such house, hut, tent, or building to be provided with a closet or closets which shall contain a pan or pans sufficient in number for the use of the occupants of such house, hut, tent, or building, and each such pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, be watertight, having a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and be provided with a lid or closely-fitting cover, he shall also keep such closet or closets, or cause the same to be kept supplied with some efficient deodorant, and shall remove or cause to be removed the contents of every pan therein as soon as the pan is full or within seven days of the previous removal of its contents, whichever shall first happen, and shall bury or cause to be buried the said contents in ground not less than 300 yards from any river, creek, lagoon, or water-course, and shall cover them immediately on deposit with a layer of earth at least 6 inches in thickness, or cause them to be so covered.

3. No act of defecation or micturition by any person living in such encampment or gold-fields shall take place within 300 yards from the banks of any river, creek, lagoon, or water-course near such encampments or gold-fields unless in the pans provided in accordance with the next preceding clause, nor shall any such act take place, or any night-soil be deposited; or any urine, manure, offal, sawdust, sludge from mines, offensive matter, or refuse of any kind whatever be emptied, deposited, laid, placed, or discharged in such a way or in such a manner that it may be likely to find its way into any such river, creek, lagoon, or water-course, or so that such river, creek, lagoon, or water-course be in any manner polluted or contaminated.

4. The person in charge of any house, hut, tent, or building in the encampments or gold-fields aforesaid in which any other person may be ill from typhoid fever or the attendant on such patient shall destroy or cause to be destroyed all faecal discharges from the said patient, by fire, with as little delay as possible, and in no case whatever shall any such faecal discharges be put, placed, or deposited (whether with the intention of burning or otherwise) on any ground or in such a manner that it may or be likely to find its way into any such river, creek, lagoon, or water-course.

5. The occupier or every occupier or the person in charge of any house, hut, tent, or building in the encampments or gold-fields aforesaid shall destroy by fire, or cause to be destroyed, all garbage, refuse, or deleterious matter taken from such house, hut, tent, or building within 24 hours of its being so taken.

6. Penalties.—Every person guilty of any breach of this by-law or any of its provisions shall be liable in the discretion of the convicting justices to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

If the person to be registered keeps cows and the number of such cows is:—

1. Not more than five, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence;
2. More than five but not more than ten, a fee of five shillings;
3. More than ten but not more than twenty, a fee of ten shillings;
4. More than twenty but not more than thirty, a fee of Fifteen shillings;
5. Over thirty cows, a fee of Twenty shillings.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF WATER FOR THE YEAR 1902.—REGULATION No. 24.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The forms of measurement shall be and are hereunder determined by the Trust.

GRAVITATION WATER.

2. The price or rate to be charge for water delivered from the River Murray, Gunbower Creek, or the Barr Creek, through the Trust channels, or otherwise, shall be—For cereal crops, wheat, oats, barley, &c., at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per inch per acre for the first watering; and One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre for a second or subsequent watering; for each of such waterings a minimum charge of Ten shillings (10s.) shall be made.

3. For the irrigation of fodder crops, such as lucerne and amber cane, the charge shall be Ninepence (9d.) per inch per acre; minimum charge shall be Seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.).

4. For the irrigation of grass, the charge shall be at the rate of Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre, with the exception of the months of February, March, and April, for which months a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made, the minimum charge to be Five shillings (5s.).

5. For the supply of surplus water outside the Trust area (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council), the following charges shall be made:—For the months of August, September, and October, for cereals, oats, wheat, barley, &c., at the rate of Two shillings (2s.) per inch per acre; lucerne and amber cane, One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre; grass, Eightpence (8d.) per inch per acre; for the other nine months of the year the charge shall be twice the rate charged inside the Trust area.

FILLING TANKS.

6. For filling tanks inside the Trust area no charge shall be made; outside the Trust area (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council), a charge of One pound (£1) per tank shall be made.

FALLOW LAND.

7. For the irrigation of fallow land a charge of One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre shall be made.

GARDEN RIGHTS.

8. The rate or price for the right to irrigate gardens or orchards shall be at the rate of Ten shillings (10s.) per acre or fractional part of an acre, for the year commencing 1st January, 1902, and ending 31st December, 1902, but in all cases for water supplied by virtue of a garden right, a minimum charge of One pound (£1) shall be made.

9. That parties have the option of being supplied with water at the ordinary charges per acre or taking out a garden right, if they prefer doing so.

10. A garden right shall be taken to mean an area not exceeding 20 acres.

PUMP WATER.

11. The charge for pump water used for all kinds of crops or grasses shall be at the rate of Eightpence (8d.) per inch per acre, 8 inches to be considered a watering, and in all cases Two shillings per acre, or part of an acre, shall be the minimum charge.

FILLING TANKS.

12. Inside the Trust area no charge for filling tanks shall be made, but for filling tanks outside the Trust area by pumped water (subject to the approval of the Governor in Council), a charge of Two pounds (£2) for each tank shall be made.

13. Such person or persons as the aforesaid Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall appoint from time to time, for the purpose of collecting water rates, shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates and charges.

ALEXANDRA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE YEAR 1902.

THE Chairman and the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Acts, and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of land and tenements within the Urban District of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust, where such lands and tenements front streets wherein the pipes of the Trust have been laid, shall pay for water supplied by the said Trust:—

For every house, tenement, or allotment of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence or over, according to the municipal valuation, an amount equal to Seven and a half pounds per centum per annum, or One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such valuation.

For every house, tenement, or allotment under Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence sterling annual value, according to the municipal valuation, an amount of One pound sterling per annum.

For all tenements in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half a mile thereof, one-fourth of the above-mentioned rates.

The charge for water supplied from and after the 1st day of January, 1902, shall be as follows:—

For street water-troughs, Twenty shillings per year. All water-troughs to be fitted with approved self-acting ball-taps to prevent overflow.

For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Fifteen shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler.

For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—

1. If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling per 1,000 gallons which would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

2. If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

For water supplied to the Government departments, police station, churches, court house, post office, State school, show-yards, cricket-ground, bowling-green, shire hall, and similar properties, shall be charged by measurement, or special agreement.

For water supplied to livery and carriers' stables by the Trust, the charge shall be Five shillings per annum for each stall or loose box. In open sheds used for stabling, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

The before-mentioned rates and charges are made for the year 1902.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Alexandra Waterworks Trust may appoint from time to time for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by sub-section 2 of section 8 of the *Melbourne Sailors' Home Act 1901* (No. 1772) it is enacted that regulations may be made by the Governor in Council providing for the time and mode of electing members of the committee, the powers, authorities, and duties of the committee, the manner of resignation of members thereof, and all matters relating to the office of the members of the committee and their relation to the trustees: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

COMMITTEE OF SAILORS' HOME.—REGULATIONS.

1. Annual elections of members of the committee of the Sailors' Home shall be held during the month of February in each year.

2. Elections to fill any vacancy occasioned by death, resignation, removal, or any cause other than retirement of a member through effluxion of time, shall be held within a calendar month of the date on which the report of such vacancy reaches the Chief Secretary.

3. In the election of members of the committee of the Sailors' Home by the trustees for the time being of the Sailors' Home, by the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners, by the Council of the City of Melbourne, and by the Melbourne Chamber of Commerce, the procedure followed in connexion with the election of chairman, mayor, or president of the bodies respectively named shall be followed as nearly as may be, provided that in the notice of the meeting at which such election is to be held the intention to elect a member of the committee of the Sailors' Home shall be specified.

4. In the election of two members of the committee of the Sailors' Home by the members of the society known as the Federated Seamen's Union of Victoria, the procedure followed in connexion with the election of the governing body of that society shall be followed as nearly as may be.

5. The names of the members elected shall be forthwith notified to the Chief Secretary by the Town Clerk of the City of Melbourne, or by the secretary to the elective body, as the case may be, and, in the event of such notification of election not reaching the Chief Secretary before the seventh day of March in any year, the Governor in Council shall proceed to the appointment of members of the committee of the Sailors' Home to represent such bodies as may have failed to elect members.

6. The first meeting of the committee, duly elected as aforesaid, shall be held during the month of March, 1902.

7. Notice of such meeting shall be signed by the superintendent of the Sailors' Home and posted to each member of the committee seven clear days before the date of such meeting, and each succeeding meeting shall be convened by notice to each member of the committee, signed and posted as aforesaid, seven clear days before such meeting.

The annual fencing rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District whose lands abut on the vermin-proof fence shall be Seventeen shillings and sixpence per mile of fencing.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Middle Vermin District shall be Five shillings per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the North-Western Vermin District shall be Sixpence per square mile.

The annual rate payable for the current year by all owners, lessees, or occupiers of land within the Western Vermin District shall be Three shillings per square mile.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, and 11 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Fisheries Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sections 37 and 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the Government Gazette, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation dated the 3rd day of February, 1885, and published in the Government Gazette of the 13th February, 1885, prohibiting fishing in the Daylesford Water Supply Storage Reservoir, situate on the Kangaroo Creek, parish of Bullarto, county of Talbot, and in the Kangaroo Creek from the northern boundary of the Reservoir Reserve to the point where the said creek is crossed by the Carlsruhe to Daylesford railway bridge, and in lieu thereof do direct that the taking of all fish in the Kangaroo Creek from the northern boundary of the Reservoir Reserve to the point where the said creek is crossed by the Carlsruhe to Daylesford railway bridge shall commence on the 1st day of July and cease on the 7th day of July in each year.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, made in pursuance of the Land Act 1869, and bearing date the 4th day of August, 1884, it was declared that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, should remove stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as were named in such Proclamation, or should exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the Proclamation bearing date the 4th day of August, 1884, prohibiting the digging or removal of stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth from the Crown lands comprised in the Powder magazine Reserve, at Bendigo, and the adjoining reserve, for Public purposes, so far only as it affects the digging and removal of gravel from such portions of the said lands as are situate at a greater distance than 120 yards from any magazine.—(02.C.17461.)

TOWN OF BRIGHTON.

By-Law No. 54.

A By-law of the Council of the Municipality of the Town of Brighton, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 54, for the regulation and government of drivers of motor cars and automobiles.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, and Councillors, and Burgesses of the Town of Brighton order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean any carriage, car, or other vehicle driven or impelled by steam, gas, electricity, oil, vapour, or other mechanical power.
2. No person shall drive a machine along or across any street or any other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven.
