Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE BREWERS BOARD.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Special Board appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt, has made the following Determination, namely :—

1. (a) That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to the following classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt shall be :—

Rackers, or corks, or loaders, or sounders	35s. per week of 48 hours.
Packers	32s. 6d. " "
Headers up	30s. " "
Syphoners	25s. " "
Wipers	20s. " "
Tinfoilers or labellers	15s. " "
Handers up, or capsulera, or wipers	12s. 6d. " "

(b) That the lowest price or rate of payment payable to all other persons (being adult males) employed in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt, shall be 44s. per week of 48 hours.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

Number.

2. That the number of apprentices or improvers who may be employed within any factory or work-room or shop or place shall be four apprentices or improvers to every hundred men or fraction thereof engaged in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt.

APPRENTICES OR IMPROVERS.

Wages.

3. That the lowest prices or rates of payment payable to apprentices or improvers employed in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt shall be the following :—

Over 13 years of age, but not over 16 years of age	...	10s. per week of 48 hours.
16 " " " "	...	15s. " "
17 " " " "	...	17s. 6d. " "
18 " " " "	...	20s. " "
19 " " " "	...	25s. " "

OVERTIME.

4. That any male employé over the age of 16 years engaged in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt who works for any time in excess of 48 hours per week shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

HOLIDAYS—SPECIAL RATE FOR.

5. That the price or rate of payment payable to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of a brewer, or in the process, trade, or business of a bottler of fermented liquors made from malt or a substitute for malt, for all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and Eight Hours Day, shall be one and a half times the minimum price or rate fixed by this Determination for such person or persons or classes of persons.

PIECE-WORK.

6. (a) That the lowest piece-work price or rate to be paid for washing bottles shall be 1s. 6d. per gross.

(b) That the lowest piece-work price or rate to be paid for bottling and corking with a Wickham rack shall be 10d. per gross.

7. That this Determination shall come into force on and after the 7th day of April, 1902.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

MONDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Foster, Omeo, and Warrnambool;

TUESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Wycheproof;

WEDNESDAY, THE 19TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Kilmore;

THURSDAY, THE 20TH DAY OF MARCH, 1902, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bairnsdale.
