*Fisheries Act 1890.***NOTICE OF PROCLAMATION UNDER THE FISHERIES ACT 1890 TO BE REVOKED, AND PROCLAMATION TO BE MADE UNDER THE SAID ACT RELATING TO NETTING IN PORTLAND BAY.**

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make and publish in the *Government Gazette* a Proclamation, under the *Fisheries Act 1890*, revoking the Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and one, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of September, One thousand nine hundred and one, relating to netting in Portland Bay, and in lieu thereof to make and publish in the *Government Gazette* a Proclamation under sections 37 and 38 of the said Act, prohibiting netting in Portland Bay within the area of waters around the two piers and breakwater, bounded by imaginary lines parallel with and 160 feet distant from the sides and ends of the two piers and breakwater.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:-

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the Shire of Woorayl described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Woorayl and annexed to the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Woorayl above described, and annex same to the Korumburra Riding of the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1895*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE COLOSSEUM, DRESSMAKING DEPARTMENT, CHAPEL-STREET, PRAHRAN,
for a period of eight weeks from the 24th March, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty-five females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty-five females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

SHIRE OF MELTON.

BY-LAW No. 20.

As to Dairies, Dairy Cattle, and Milk.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Melton, by virtue of the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* and the *Health Act 1900*, and every other power enabling them in this behalf, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 20 of the Council of the said Shire, that is to say:—

1. All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Melton.

4. *Registration of cow-keepers, dairymen, and purveyors of milk.*—Every person carrying on the trade of a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the first day of January, 1903, and on or before the first day of January in subsequent years, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the shire an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of the following amount, namely, if the person to be registered keeps cows, and the number of such cows is:—

1. Not more than five cows, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
 2. More than five, but not more than ten, a fee of Five shillings.
 3. More than ten, but not more than twenty, a fee of Seven shillings and sixpence.
 4. More than twenty, but not more than thirty, a fee of Ten shillings.
 5. More than thirty, but not more than forty, a fee of Twelve shillings and sixpence.
 6. More than forty, but not more than fifty, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
 7. Over fifty cows, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
- If the person to be registered does not keep cows, a fee of Ten shillings.

I desire to be registered in accordance with the particulars in the schedule hereunder:—

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the shire shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the chairman or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures or any one of them are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid, the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk-stores, milk-shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper, or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean; and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor, if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this By-law words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. Every person guilty of any breach of this By-law or of any of its provisions shall be liable, in the discretion of the convicting justices, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or in the like discretion to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

1. Not more than five, a fee of One shilling.
2. More than five but not more than twenty, a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.
3. More than twenty but not more than fifty, a fee of Five shillings.
4. More than fifty but not more than one hundred, a fee of Ten shillings.
5. More than one hundred but not more than one hundred and fifty, a fee of Fifteen shillings.
6. More than one hundred and fifty, a fee of Twenty shillings.

If the person to be registered does not keep cows, or is the occupier of a creamery, the fee shall be Ten shillings.

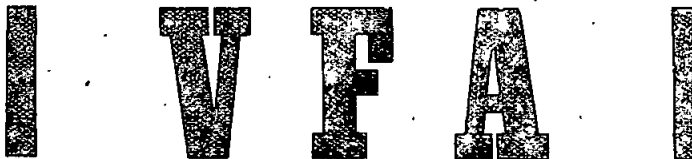

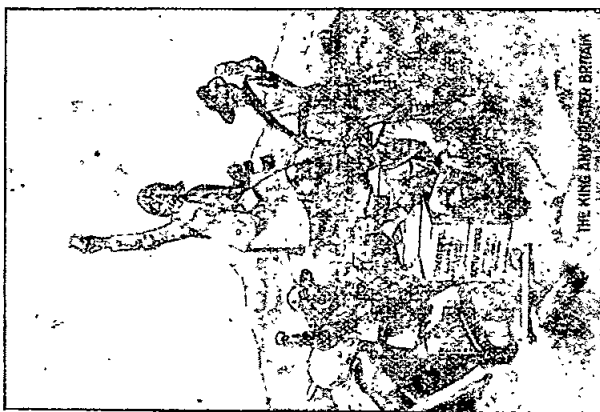

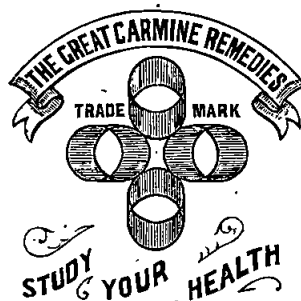

The births of 971 children, viz., 493 boys and 476 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of February. The number was, it will be observed, higher than in any previous corresponding month since 1894, except 1898, but was 66 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 139 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths recorded in February numbered 533, viz., 270 of males and 263 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 436, or 81 per cent., as against 57 per cent. in February, 1901, and 79 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, 65 less than in February, 1901, and the third lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years. It was also 75 below the average of February during the previous ten years, or 118 below it allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 25.23, and of deaths registered to 13.91 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1901 of 25.70 and 16.37, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 27.62 and 16.43, and with averages of the year 1901 of 24.85 and 15.03.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 95.3° on the 9th, and the lowest was 47.3° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (62.8°) was 4.7° below the average, and the lowest recorded for the month during the last 43 years, except in 1864, when the temperature was the same, and in 1886, when it was 62.7°. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (41.4°) took place on the 9th; and the least range (4°) on the 12th. The mean daily range was 19.8°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.102 inches on the 27th, and the lowest was 29.426 inches on the 21th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.852 inches) was one-twentieth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on eight days, the amount being .95 of an inch, which was a fifth of an inch below the average.

The mean humidity of the month was .655.

Males and females contributed in equal proportions to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 39 per cent. to that mortality, as against 33 per cent. in February, 1901; 30 per cent. in February, 1900; 37 per cent. in February, 1899; 44 per cent. in February, 1898; 54 per cent. in February, 1897; 42 per cent. in February, 1896; 40 per cent. in February, 1895; 40 per cent. in February, 1894; 49 per cent. in February, 1893; and 49 per cent. in February, 1892.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 164, as compared with 147 in February, 1901. The rate of infantile mortality per 1,000 births registered was 169 in the month under review, as compared with 156 in February, 1901; 127 in February, 1900; 176 in February, 1899; 238 in February, 1898; 134 in February, 1897; 203 in February, 1896; 171 in February, 1895; 166 in February, 1894; 220 in February, 1893; and 184 in February, 1892.

Forty-eight persons—as against 61 in February, 1901—whose deaths were recorded during the month, had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a male of no occupation, aged 75, died of erysipelas; three females, each aged 75, of paralysis, enteritis, and Bright's disease respectively; a female, aged 76, of cancer; a carter, aged 76, of aortic disease of the heart; a female, aged 76, of syncope; an engineer, aged 76, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 76, of bronchitis; a blacksmith, aged 77, of cancer; a builder, aged 77, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 77, of bronchitis; a female, aged 77, of inflammation of the stomach; a dealer, aged 77, of disease of the prostate; a bricklayer and a miner, each aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a pensioner, aged 79, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 79, of asthma; a carpenter, aged 80, of dilatation of the heart; a male of no occupation and a female, each aged 80, of heart disease; two females, each aged 80, of enteritis and chronic nephritis respectively; a female, aged 81, of insanity; a painter, aged 81, of embolism; a farmer, aged 81, of thrombosis; a farmer, aged 83, of cirrhosis of the liver; a female, aged 84, of diarrhoea; two females, each aged 85, of cerebral effusion and bronchitis respectively; an excise officer, aged 86, of dysentery; a female, aged 86, of tumour on the brain; another, aged 87, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 88, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 90, of enteritis; another, aged 92, of insanity; a female, aged 76, two builders, each aged 77, two females, aged 78 and 79 respectively, a lithographer and a farrier, each aged 81, and five females, aged 83, 90, 90, 90, and 92 respectively of old age.

Twenty-one of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 25 in February, 1901—were from external causes, of which 14 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 53, was passed over by a cab; a retired lighthouse-keeper, aged 71, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a cart; a slaughterman, aged 20, of injury to the spine, caused by a fall from a horse; a fireman, aged 40, of injuries, consequent on a fall down the hold of a ship; a cab driver, aged 50, of injuries, the result of a fall from a ladder; a driver, aged 49, and a carpenter, aged 50, of injuries to the brain, and a boy, aged 14, of fracture of the skull, caused in each case by a fall; a tailor, aged 36, of traumatic tetanus; a female, aged 9, of burns; a painter, aged 48, of lead poisoning; three persons were found drowned, viz.:—A labourer, aged 68, and a male, of no occupation, aged 40, in the River Yarra; and a male, of no occupation, aged 41, in the Saltwater River. The homicidal deaths were those of a male child, aged 4 months, who was suffocated, and a female, aged 40, who was shot; a stone cutter, aged 63, who died of fracture of the skull, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the first two cases, and of manslaughter in the last; and a new-born male infant, who was suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a miner, aged 30, and a butcher, aged 43, who cut their throats; and a horse trainer, aged 36, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and eighteen deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—49 in the Melbourne, 8 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 3 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 9 in the Homœopathic, and 11 in the Austin Hospitals; 5 in the Metropolitan, and 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 8 in the Immigrants' Home; 10 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 1 in the Protestant Refuge; and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 236, of which 106, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 100, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 161 were under one year of age, 27 were between one and two, 10 were between two and three, 1 at the age of three, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 323. Of these 164, or 50 per cent., were males, and 165, or 50 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 7 were between fifteen and twenty, 20 were between twenty and twenty-five, 24 were between twenty-five and thirty, 25 were between thirty and thirty-five, 23 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 13 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 20 were between fifty-five and sixty, 29 were between sixty and sixty-five, 20 were between sixty-five and seventy, 36 were between seventy and seventy-five, 23 were between seventy-five and eighty, 13 were between eighty and eighty-five, 6 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 6 were between ninety and ninety-five.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, there was an increase of 6 deaths under zymotic, 13 under developmental diseases, and 6 under ill-defined causes, whilst there was a decrease of 6 under dietetic, 24 under constitutional, 55 under local diseases, and 4 under the head of violence. Under the zymotic class, deaths from whooping-cough rose from 1 to 8. Under the constitutional class, deaths from rheumatism fell from 7 to 2, those from cancer from 37 to 26, and those from other forms of tuberculosis, &c., from 8 to 4. Under the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 13 to 21. Under the local class, deaths from diseases of parturition increased by 5; whilst those from diseases of the nervous system diminished by 26, those from diseases of the circulatory system by 17, and those from diseases of the urinary system by 13.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1892 to 1901, and the first two months of 1902, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from both causes during the month was below the average.

Schedules as above, giving an estimate of the articles required, printed forms of tender, and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary to the Tender Board, by whom also the samples will be shown, and any information or explanation afforded to persons tendering.

Any single line in any schedule can be tendered for, and may be accepted or rejected separately.

The total amount of tender must be stated in words as well as in figures.

Tenders having alterations or erasures therein will not be entertained.

Tenders must be accompanied by the preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

Security will be required, either in Victorian Government debentures, Savings Bank Deposit Book, or Bank Deposit. Receipt in favour of the Secretary to the Tender Board, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

The security must be completed and contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender.

Tenders, enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words "Tender for —" (as the case may be) written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender-box at the Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. The supplies are to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality is equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the departments requiring the goods. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne and Williamstown districts are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne district will include a radius of six miles from the General Post Office; and Williamstown district will include the town of Williamstown, Hobson's Bay, and the River Yarra.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the officers ordering the goods.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form at the time of the delivery of the goods, and the account shall be accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

10. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor or contractors by whom consigned.

11. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail for any department except the Defence Department, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate of the form as an authority for the carrier to act as agent for and charge the freight to the Stores and Transport Department. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be retained by himself. (In the case of the Defence Department, however, the consignment note only which accompanies the order must be used.) Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 14 of these conditions.

12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 7.

13. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 7.

14. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

15. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

16.
