## PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:-

FRIDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF JUNE, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Avoca;

WEDNESDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF JUNE, 1902, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Lillydale;

THURSDAY, THE 26TH DAY OF JUNE, 1902, as a Bank Holiday throughout Victoria.

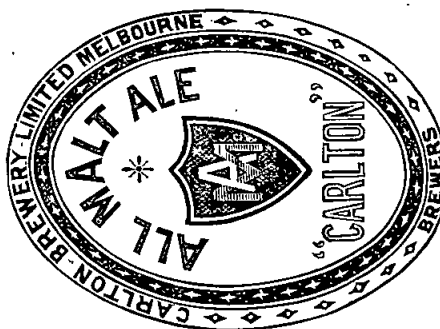

## PARISH OF KOO-WEE-RUP.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

#### BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

BY-LAW NO. 26.

A By-law of the Borough of Hamilton, made under section 510 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 26, for regulating the market place and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or on the immediate approaches thereto, and for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Hamilton order as follows:—

1. The market shall be known as "The Hamilton Corporation Cattle Market," and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purposes of such market, situated on the Coleraine-road, 1 mile from the post office, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle, as defined by section 3 of the *Local Government Act 1890*.

2. The said market shall be open for the sale of cattle on every Friday and Saturday, the Tuesday preceeding and the Friday following the Hamilton Show from sunrise to sunset, and no cattle shall be received at the said market after the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, except horses and pigs, which must be in not later than half-past Two in the afternoon, provided nevertheless that should any cattle arrive in Hamilton by train on a sale day such cattle may be admitted after Twelve o'clock noon if notice in writing of such intended arrival shall have been previously given to the Inspector. No person shall sell or offer for sale any cattle in the said market before the opening or after the closing of the said market.

3. On every market day the sales of sheep and lambs shall be commenced not later than Twelve o'clock noon, and shall cease at Three o'clock in the afternoon. The sales of cattle shall commence not later than Three o'clock in the afternoon. The sales of horses and pigs shall follow, and all such sales shall be conducted in the order following:—

First	...	Fat sheep
Second	...	Fat lambs
Third	...	Store sheep and lambs
Fourth	...	Fat cattle
Fifth	...	Store cattle
Sixth	...	Horses
Seventh	...	Pigs.

4. On every market day when sales are to be held in the said market, all auctioneers, salesmen, or their deputies, shall draw lots for priority of order of selling—first sheep, second cattle, third horses, and fourth pigs, and the auctioneer or salesman first entitled to sell shall sell or otherwise dispose of fat sheep and lambs for a period of not longer than three (3) minutes for each pen, and he shall not exceed fifteen minutes from the time when he shall be entitled to start such sale before finishing the same, at the expiration of such fifteen minutes or earlier if the salesman first in order shall have earlier concluded his sale of such fat sheep or fat lambs, the salesman next in order of priority shall proceed to sell upon the like conditions as those hereinbefore mentioned with regard to the salesman first entitled to sell, and so on until all the salesmen entitled to sell shall, according to their right of priority, have disposed of the fat sheep or fat lambs which they may respectively have for sale. The first salesman shall be entitled to summon his customers five minutes before the time appointed for commencing the sale, each succeeding salesman shall commence to sell as soon as the salesman immediately preceding him shall have concluded his sale, or if such preceding salesman shall not have concluded his sale at the expiration of fifteen minutes from the time at which he was entitled to commence such sale, then at the expiration of such fifteen minutes. In all cases the time shall be taken from a clock, to be provided by the Council, and placed in some conspicuous position in the said market, or, in the absence of such clock, or if the same shall not be in proper going order, then by the watch of the Inspector.

5. After the time limited for the disposal of fat sheep or fat lambs by the auctioneer or salesman last entitled to sell shall have expired, the sale of store sheep and other cattle shall be proceeded with in the order named in clause 3 upon the like conditions as are hereinbefore prescribed with regard to the sale of fat sheep or lambs, except that the limit of time to be allowed to each auctioneer or salesman in selling or disposing of the various cattle shall be as follows:—

- Store sheep not to exceed three minutes per pen, or a total of twenty-five minutes in all.
- Fat cattle not to exceed ten minutes in all.
- Store cattle not to exceed three minutes per pen, or twenty minutes in all.
- Horses not to exceed fifteen minutes in all.
- Pigs and sundries not to exceed fifteen minutes in all.

Any auctioneer or salesman who shall have sold his lots before the expiration of the time limit shall at once give place to the person next entitled to sell, who shall forthwith proceed to offer his lots.

6. No person shall obstruct the Inspector of the said market in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market or from one part of the said market to any other part thereof without the consent of the Inspector, nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, nor cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent or gross conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto. Any person so offending shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

7. At any special sale other than on the ordinary market days, the auctioneers and salesmen interested shall arrange amongst themselves as to the order and time of selling. Should they fail to do so, the provisions of clause 4 shall apply.

8. That no cattle which have been placed in any auctioneer's hands for sale shall be permitted to leave the market without the production of a pass from the auctioneer in whose hands they were placed for sale.

9. That horses and fat and dairy cattle for sale by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring in front of the rostrum, unless in exceptional cases by permission of the Inspector.

10. All cattle not removed from the said market by the hour of Nine o'clock on the morning next after any sale shall have been held in the said market shall be removed by the Inspector at the expense and risk of the owner of any such cattle.

11. Every auctioneer or firm of auctioneers paying a yearly rent of Twenty pounds shall be entitled to the use of an office at the said market, such rent to be paid half-yearly in advance.

12. Every person placing stock in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls, dues, and charges accruing thereon, and in no case shall any stock be taken out of the market until all tolls, dues, and charges payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied.

13. All cattle brought to the market for sale shall be placed in pens, and no person shall be permitted to remove cattle from one pen to another except with the consent of the Inspector. In case of any dispute arising as to overcrowding of pens or as to priority of occupancy, the Inspector shall alone be competent to decide, and the disputants shall be bound by his decision. The Inspector shall have authority to remove, or order to be removed, cattle from one pen to another, and any orders he may give in that respect shall be promptly carried out.

14. Any person who shall sell or offer for sale by auction in the market any cattle before the opening or after the closing of the market shall be liable to a penalty of Forty shillings for every such offence.

15. Any auctioneer or salesman not ceasing to sell at expiry of time allowed as provided by this regulation, or continuing to offer stock when the time for so doing has expired as notified by the Inspector by the ringing of a bell, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings for every such offence.
