## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I** THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Two hundred and forty-seven thousand three hundred and eighty-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and one and One thousand nine hundred and two.”

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Seven hundred and sixty thousand four hundred and seventy-seven pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and two and One thousand nine hundred and three.”

“An Act for enabling Bodies Corporate to hold Property in Joint Tenancy.”

“An Act to further amend the *Instruments Act 1890*.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this eighth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two, and in the second year of His Majesty's reign.

## Marine Act 1890.

## AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Marine Acts, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in Council, doth hereby repeal the regulations numbered 80 and 85 of the regulations known as "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage," made by the Board on the 10th day of August, 1894, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of August, 1894, and in lieu thereof respectively doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of these Regulations for regulations numbered 80 and 85 of "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage" there shall be substituted the following Regulations respectively, namely:—

## (A) SEA PILOTS.

80. *Nominee to report for duty after medical examination within given time.*—Every applicant nominated for appointment shall report for duty as a leadsman within twenty-one (21) days from the date of his nomination by the Board. Provided nevertheless that the Board may, if it think fit in any particular case, from time to time extend the time for reporting for duty, or it may on grounds sufficient in its opinion permit the applicant to report for duty after the time hereinbefore limited, or any extension thereof, and in any such case the applicant reporting in accordance with any such extension, or within the time limited in such permission shall, subject to his having produced and deposited satisfactory certificates as hereinafter provided, be permitted to take up his duties as a leadsman.

Before the expiration of the time for reporting for duty as a leadsman limited by this regulation, or by any extension thereof, or in any permission as aforesaid, the applicant nominated shall produce and deposit with the Secretary satisfactory certificates from a medical practitioner to be approved by the Board that the applicant is physically qualified to perform the duties of a pilot.

In the event of the applicant failing to produce and deposit satisfactory certificates as to his physical qualifications, or to report for duty within the time limited by this regulation, or by any extension thereof, or in any permission as aforesaid, the Board may declare his nomination void.

Upon any nomination being declared void, the Board may proceed to again invite applications for the vacancy as hereinbefore provided as if no such nomination had been made.

## (B) HARBOR AND RIVER PILOTS.

85. *Nominee to report for duty after medical examination within given time.*—Every applicant nominated for appointment shall report for service as prescribed in the last preceding regulation within twenty-one (21) days from the date of his nomination by the Board. Provided nevertheless that the Board may, if it think fit in any particular case, from time to time extend the time for reporting for service, or it may on grounds sufficient in its opinion permit the applicant to report for service after the time hereinbefore limited, or any extension thereof, and in any such case the applicant reporting in accordance with any such extension or within the time limited in such permission shall, subject to his having produced and deposited satisfactory certificates as hereinafter provided, be permitted to enter upon his duties.

Before the expiration of the time for reporting for service limited by this regulation, or by any extension thereof, or in any permission as aforesaid, the applicant nominated shall produce and deposit with the Secretary satisfactory certificates from a medical practitioner to be approved by the Board that the applicant is physically qualified to perform the duties of a pilot.

In the event of the applicant failing to produce and deposit satisfactory certificates as to his physical qualifications, or to report for service within the time limited by this regulation, or by any extension thereof, or in any permission as aforesaid, the Board may declare his nomination void.

Upon any nomination being declared void, the Board may proceed to again invite applications for the vacancy as hereinbefore provided, as if no such nomination had been made.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the first day of September, 1902.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this 25th day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and two.

## VITAL STATISTICS OF BALLARAT AND SUBURBS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JULY, 1902.

THE births of 47 boys and 53 girls, or in all of 100 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of July. Of these, 42 occurred in Ballarat East, 47 in Ballarat West, and 11 in Sebastopol. Included were 7 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 119, viz., 64 of boys and 55 of girls.

The deaths registered in July numbered 80, viz., 44 of males and 36 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 20. In June the recorded deaths numbered 85; in July, 1901, they numbered 61; in July, 1900, they numbered 54; in July, 1899, they numbered 68; in July, 1898, they numbered 73; in July, 1897, they numbered 55; in July, 1896, they numbered 70; in July, 1895, they numbered 73; in July, 1894, they numbered 67; in July, 1893, they numbered 67; and in July, 1892, they numbered 72.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Thirteen deaths, or 16 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 7; Benevolent Asylum, 5; Lunatic Asylum, 1.

## BOROUGH OF CASTLEMAINE.

## BY-LAW NO. 80, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

A By-law of the Borough of Castlemaine, made under the provisions of sections 31, 32, 33, 251, 253, and 258 of the *Health Act 1890*, and numbered 80, for regulating the removal and disposal of night-soil, closet-pans, house and yard rubbish, for maintaining and preserving the cleanliness of public and private drains and channels, and other matters named therein.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Castlemaine make the following by-law:—

1. This by-law shall come into force on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Castlemaine.
3. The Council may exempt any premises within the municipal boundaries of the Borough of Castlemaine from the operation of this by-law on the recommendation of the Sanitary Inspector.
4. The occupier and every person having the management or control of any house or premises within the said Borough shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all rubbish from their respective houses or premises to be placed without delay in covered, non-absorbent, water-tight receptacles, into which a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be introduced when necessary, the capacity of each of such receptacles not to exceed 2½ cubic feet.
5. Every such occupier or person shall keep such receptacle in his yard so as to be easily accessible to the Borough scavengers, and shall not place them in any street or lane without the consent, in writing, of the Sanitary Inspector, and shall be responsible for the keeping of the receptacles in a sound and an inoffensive condition.
6. No such occupier or person shall deposit, place, or sweep any dust, rubbish, yard or house sweepings, or filth of any kind upon any land, street, lane, drain, water-channel, or place other than the deposits provided by the Council, or the receptacles provided by the householder, for the deposit of such dust, rubbish, yard or house sweepings, or filth.
7. Every such occupier or person shall provide and maintain on his premises a proper closet or privy building, constructed with openings or flues to supply ventilation, and the floor of such closet shall be at no point less than 3 inches above the adjoining ground, and shall be provided with requisite means for the application of dry earth, ashes, or other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be so constructed and placed as to afford easy access for the purpose of removing the pan and emptying and cleansing the same.
8. Every privy, closet, or urinal, whether already built or hereafter to be built, in the yard or area of any building, must have a door, and be properly screened and fenced from public view.
9. No privy, closet, or urinal shall be erected or remain in or in front of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 4 feet from any public highway, or from any lane of a width at any part thereof of 11 feet or upwards, or at a less distance than 6 feet from any door or window of any dwelling, or at a less distance than 4 feet from any partition fence, unless divided by an 8½-in. brick or stone wall not less than 6 feet high and 8 feet long.
10. Every such occupier or person shall furnish and provide for this respective closets a suitable galvanized-iron pan with

proper handles, and such pan may be of the following dimensions, viz., 15 inches wide and 14½ inches deep, but no pan shall in any case exceed the capacity of 2 cubic feet.

11. Every such occupier or person shall cause to be kept in every closet a plentiful supply of dry earth, ashes, lime, charcoal, or some other effective deodorant for effectively deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil deposited in the pan to be sufficiently covered with such deodorizing material to thoroughly deodorize the contents of the pan.

12. At least once in every week, or so much oftener as may be necessary, and as the Borough Council may from time to time direct, the pan shall be emptied by the night-man employed by the Borough Council.

13. No closet door or trap for removing the pan shall abut or open upon any street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width, and no pan shall be removed or emptied, and the contents conveyed through the streets of the Borough, except between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock p.m. and Five o'clock a.m., and in carts provided by the Council.

14. No such occupier or person shall employ any persons for the removal of night-soil save those authorized by the Borough Council for the purpose, and no other person shall remove any night-soil except in cases where exemption is granted.

15. No person shall place, carry, or have in any cart or vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, in such a manner that such fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, or such case or receptacle shall be in contact with, or liable to be in contact with, such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom; and no such person shall carry, or have in any cart in which manure or other offensive matter has been carried, any fruit, vegetables, milk, or other food, until such cart shall have been effectually cleansed.

16. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit a sum not exceeding Ten pounds for every breach thereof, and not exceeding Five pounds for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the justices before whom any such penalty is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the Borough Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether the Borough Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

Made and passed by the Council of the Borough of Castlemaine this seventeenth day of January, 1902.

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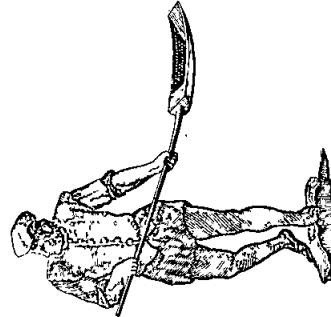

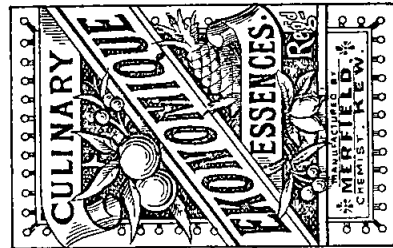

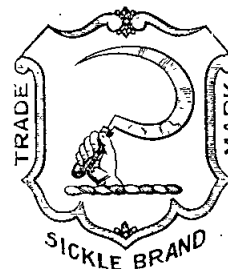

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF LONDON TAILORING DEPOT,  
TAILORS, 347 BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of two weeks from the 6th August, 1902, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-three hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

FOURTH SCHEDULE SHOPS IN THE TOWNSHIP  
OF HEALESVILLE.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for permitting shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that within the township of Healesville, in the municipal district of the shire of Healesville, a regulation be made permitting all shops (other than Fourth Schedule shops) to keep open until half-past Seven o'clock in the evening of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week during the months of May, June, July, August, September, and October in each year, and until Eight o'clock in the evening on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week during the months of January, February, March, April, November, and December in each year: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers other than those mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule

within the said part of the said municipal district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for all shops other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* within the township of Healesville, in the municipal district of the Shire of Healesville, to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week during the months of May, June, July, August, September, and October in each year from Seven o'clock until half-past Seven o'clock, and on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week during the months of January, February, March, April, November, and December in each year from Seven o'clock until Eight o'clock.

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the *Income Tax Act 1895* (58 Vict. No. 1374), it is amongst other things enacted that if any matter or thing prescribed by or under the said Act to be made or done at or within a fixed time cannot be or is not so made or done, the Governor in Council may by Order from time to time appoint a further or other time for making or doing the same, whether the time or any such further or other time within which the same ought to have been done has or has not elapsed or expired: And whereas the assessments of incomes for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1902, for the first, second, third, fourth, and fifth periods for which assessments were prescribed to be made or done, were not made or done on or before the 17th day of May, 1902, the 30th day of May, 1902, the 13th day of June, 1902, the 11th day of July, 1902, and the 9th day of August, 1902, as prescribed by the Regulations made

#### AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George: Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1901* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1901*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (class 7) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding fifty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said *Land Act* as lands which may be sold by auction (class 7 aforesaid) by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in Division 6 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said Act as land which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia,

by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, and 9 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1901* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

4. The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.



## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.

3. The orders for wood will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor for wood will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

## SHIRE OF AVON.

## BY-LAW No. 2.

**I**N pursuance of the powers contained in the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Avon do hereby make the By-law following (that is to say):—

1. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the parts or in the places within the said shire as follows (that is to say):—Within the township of Stratford, bounded on the north by Raymond-street, on the east by the railway reserve, on the south by Blackburn-street, and on the west by Merrick-street.

3. If any cattle are found between sunset and sunrise upon any land not being a common, and such that there is no fence, whether upon the same land, or any other, dividing such first-mentioned land from any street or road, whether public or private, without any person having charge of such cattle, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every head of such cattle, and the proper officer of the council may seize such cattle, and place the same at some neighbouring place of safe custody, and any justice, if such owner be not known, upon proof of the issue of a summons in the usual form, addressed to such owner, as "owner" only, without otherwise naming or describing him, such cattle and the place of seizure being duly described therein, and of the publication of such summons in some newspaper commonly circulating in the neighbourhood, may, after the expiration of twenty-four hours from such publication, proceed with respect to such owner not appearing as if personal service of a summons, stating his name, had been effected, or if such owner appear then, as in other cases, and the justice may order the cattle to be sold, and the money arising from the sale, after deducting the said penalty and the costs awarded, and the reasonable expenses, to be estimated and assessed by the justice, of seizing, keeping, and selling the said cattle, shall be paid, if demanded within one month, to the owner of the cattle, and if not so demanded then to the municipal fund, and if the said money is not sufficient for all the purposes aforesaid, the amount whereby the same falls short, or if no such sale be ordered, the whole of the said amount may be recovered from the said owner if and when known in like manner as other penalties and sums adjudged or ordered to be paid by justices are to be recovered.

4. If any cattle be at any time between sunset and sunrise found in any street without any person having the charge thereof, the owner of such cattle shall forfeit for every head of such cattle a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings, and if such cattle, by reason of having been so found at large, have been impounded by the council, the amount of such penalty and costs,

if adjudged respectively before the release or sale of such cattle, shall be added to the pound fees and charges payable in respect of such cattle, and the amount thereof or such lesser amount (if any) as after the sale of the cattle may remain in the hands of the poundkeeper shall be paid over by him accordingly, and if the proceeds of any sale of such cattle are not sufficient after paying the lawful fees and charges aforesaid to satisfy such penalty and costs, or if such penalty and costs have been adjudged after the release or sale of the cattle, the same or so much thereof as remains unpaid shall and may be recovered from the owner of the cattle in like manner as other penalties and costs adjudged by justices are by law to be recovered, and if in the case of any information under this section the owner be not known, then the provisions of the last preceding section, so far as necessary to give the adjudicating justice jurisdiction, shall apply.

5. If any goat has been impounded under the provisions of either of the two last preceding sections, or under the provisions of this By-law relating to the impounding of cattle for trespass in the streets, and is not after the expiration of twenty-four hours released, and the penalty, costs, fees, and charges paid by the owner thereof, any justice may, by warrant under his hand directed to any constable, authorize the destruction of such goat, and the same may be destroyed accordingly.

6. It shall not be lawful to break in any horse or other animal in any street, whether public or private, or in any public place, save such public places as from time to time may be appointed by some regulation of the council in that behalf, which regulation the council are hereby authorized to make, or, by locking the wheels of any cart or other vehicle or otherwise, to test or try any horse or other animal so as to obstruct or injure any street or public place, and any person offending against this section shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
