KING'S REGULATION.

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO AMEND AND CONSOLIDATE CERTAIN REGULATIONS AFFECTING
THE GILBERT AND ELLICE ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

INTERPRETATION.

In this Regulation unless the subject or context otherwise requires,—

"Native."—The word "native" shall mean (a) aboriginal native of any island in the Gilbert and Ellice Groups and of Ocean Island; and (b) aboriginal native of any other island in the Pacific Ocean resident in the Protectorate and not being a subject of any foreign power or an ordained minister of religion or a person employed in trade either on his own account or on behalf of another person.

"Protectorate."—The term "Protectorate" shall mean and include all islands and places at present included in the Gilbert and Ellice Groups and Ocean Island.

"Resident Commissioner."—The term "Resident Commissioner" shall mean the British Resident Commissioner for the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate, or any person duly appointed by the High Commissioner to act as such.

"Recruit."—"Recruit" shall mean a native engaged for the purpose of employment on land beyond the limits of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands, or in Ocean Island.

"Intoxicating liquor."—"Intoxicating liquor" shall include all spirituous compounds and all fermented liquors and any mixture whereof part is spirituous or which contains fermented liquors, and any drug or mixture or preparation containing any drug capable of producing intoxication.

"Articles of trade."—"Articles of trade" shall mean and include foodstuffs, ironmongery, lumber, Manchester goods, perfumery and toilet requisites, ship chandlery, tobacco, and any other article of general trade.

"Trading."—The term "to trade" shall mean to sell, buy, or barter any article or articles of trade; or to pay any article or

articles of trade as wages or in return for services rendered, goods supplied, or for value received.

PART I.

1. **Illegality of unlicensed trading.**—On and after the coming into force of this Regulation it shall be unlawful to trade in the Protectorate except under a licence or licences to be obtained in the manner hereinafter provided.

2. **Trading licence.**—For every licence to trade on shore (hereinafter called a "trading licence") a sum of twelve pounds shall be paid, and a separate licence must be obtained by every person engaged in trading on shore.

3. **Half-yearly licence.**—Any person arriving in the Protectorate after the thirtieth day of June in any year may obtain a trading licence for the remainder of the year on payment of the sum of eight pounds.

4. **Transfer of trading licence.**—Should the holder of a trading licence leave the Protectorate temporarily the Resident Commissioner may, on application, transfer such licence to some other person to be designated by such holder, and for every such transfer a fee of one pound shall be paid. Provided that a trading licence may not be transferred more than once in any year.

5. **Ship's licence.—Substituted ship's licence.**—For trading from or on board of any ship or sea-going vessel a licence (hereinafter called a "ship's licence") shall be obtained. Such ship's licence may include the whole of the Gilbert Islands or the whole of the Ellice Islands, or may refer specifically to one or more islands. For a ship's licence embracing the whole of the Gilbert Group or the whole of the Ellice Group a sum of one hundred pounds shall be paid. For any other ship's licence a sum of fifteen pounds shall be paid for every island to which such licence shall apply. Every ship's licence shall be available for the ship or vessel only in respect of which it is issued. Provided always that on proof to the satisfaction of the Resident Commissioner that any vessel duly licensed under this Regulation has been withdrawn from the Protectorate and another vessel substituted therefor the Resident Commissioner may, on surrender of the ship's licence first issued, issue a substituted ship's licence in respect of the vessel so substituted as aforesaid, and for every such substituted ship's licence a fee of one pound shall be paid. Not more than one substituted ship's licence for any licensed vessel shall be issued during any year.

6. **Boat's licence.—Exemption from boat's licence.**—For each boat or punt trading or carrying passengers within the Protectorate an annual licence shall be obtained at the rate of ten shillings for every ton of carrying capacity, such capacity to be estimated by the Resident Commissioner or by some person duly authorized by him. Provided that boats being part of the equipment of any ship or vessel holding a ship's licence, and punts or boats used exclusively for supplying water, coal, or other stores to His Majesty's ships of war, shall not be required to take out such licences.

7. **Determination of licences.**—Every trading licence, ship's licence, and boat's licence shall determine on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such licence shall have come into force; and a substituted ship's licence shall be available only for the remainder of the year in respect of which the original licence was issued. Such licences shall apply only to the island or group of islands in respect of which they have been issued, but for the purposes of such licences all islands situated in the same lagoon shall be deemed to constitute one island.

8. Capitation tax.—Broken periods.—Estimation of age.—Definition of residence.—A capitation tax of five pounds shall be paid on the first day of January in every year by every male non-native person except an ordained minister of religion resident in the Protectorate, or a person of less than sixteen or more than sixty years of age or a person taking out a trading licence; and a like tax shall, after a residence of two months, be paid by every male non-native person except as aforesaid who shall arrive in the Protectorate between the said first day of January and the thirtieth day of June in any year, after which date the sum of three pounds shall be paid. In the absence of proof of the age of any non-native person in the Protectorate the age of such person may be estimated by the Resident Commissioner, and the age so estimated shall, for the purposes of this Regulation, be held to be the age of such person. Residence for a period of one year or more on a vessel trading within the Protectorate shall be held to be residence within the Protectorate.

9. Issue of licences.—Receivers of taxes.—Trading licences, ships' licences, and boats' licences, available for any island or group of islands in the Protectorate shall be obtained from the Resident Commissioner, and the High Commissioner or the Resident Commissioner may appoint persons to receive the taxes provided for in this Regulation and to issue trading licences and ships' licences available only in the islands in respect of which such persons may have been appointed. Every such person receiving taxes or licence fees shall at the earliest opportunity forward the amount received to the Resident Commissioner unless duly directed to remit the same to the High Commissioner in Fiji.

10. Penalty for unlicensed trading.—Any person trading on shore or employing another person to trade on shore without the necessary licence having been first obtained shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

11. Penalty for not taking out ship's licence.—The master or owner of any ship, vessel, punt, or boat who shall without having taken out a ship's licence make use of such ship, vessel, punt, or boat within the Protectorate for purposes of trade shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding six months.

12. Penalty for unlicensed trading.—Any person trading from or on board of any ship or sea-going vessel in the Protectorate without the necessary licence having previously been obtained, and the owner and the master of any such vessel, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds.

13. Penalty for trading with unlicensed vessel.—Any person who shall accept delivery of goods from or deliver produce to any such unlicensed ship or vessel shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds or imprisonment not exceeding three months.

14. Penalty for default of payment of capitation tax.—Every person liable to the capitation tax hereinafore provided who shall make default in payment of such tax for one month after the same shall have become due shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding three months.

15. Declaration of produce exported.—The master or supercargo of every vessel exporting copra or other produce from the Protectorate shall furnish to the Resident Commissioner a declaration in the form of Schedule A hereto of the quantity and value of such copra or other produce, and any master or supercargo knowingly furnishing a false declaration of such quantity or value shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months.

PART II.

TO RESTRICT THE SALE OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

16. Sale of intoxicating liquors unlawful.—The sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises shall be unlawful throughout the Protectorate. Any person offending against this section, whether such person be buyer or seller, shall for each offence be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding one month.

PART III.

TO PREVENT THE SALE OF NATIVE LANDS.

17. Rules for leasing land.—The sale of land owned by natives to non-native persons shall be unlawful.

18. Procedure on leasing land.—Registration of leases.—Fee for registration of leases.—If any non-native person enter into a lease of land owned by a native he shall forthwith submit such lease to the Resident Commissioner, who shall at a convenient opportunity make inquiry of the native lessor and of the native authorities of the island in which the land sought to be leased shall be situated. If it shall appear that the lease is for a period of more than twenty-one years, or that the land sought to be leased is not the property of the proposed lessor, or that the lease has been unfairly obtained, or that the terms are manifestly to the disadvantage of the native lessor, or that there will not be left sufficient land to support the family of the lessor, or if the lease is otherwise contrary to sound public policy, the Resident Commissioner shall refuse to confirm such lease; otherwise the Resident Commissioner shall cause a copy of such lease to be entered in a book to be kept for the purpose and shall make an indorsement on the lease to the effect that the lease has been confirmed and registered, and shall make a charge of one pound for every such registration of lease. The registration of the lease shall not be conclusive evidence of title as against a person not claiming through the lessor.

19. Unconfirmed leases.—In the event of the refusal of the Resident Commissioner to confirm a lease it shall be unlawful for the intended lessee or any person claiming under him to deal or attempt to deal with the land intended to be leased otherwise than as a tenant at will.

PART IV.

WITH REGARD TO EMIGRATION.

20. Penalty for unauthorized recruiting.—Any person engaged in or assisting in recruiting natives otherwise than in accordance with this Regulation shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One hundred pounds or to imprisonment not exceeding six months or both.

21. Recruiting for service in British possessions.—Subject to the provisions of this Regulation, and provided that a licence for the purpose has been duly granted by the Government of such British possession, it shall be lawful to recruit natives from the Protectorate for service in any place within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of any British possession.

22. Recruiting for non-British territory.—Natives may be recruited for places not being within the jurisdiction of the Legislature of a British possession provided that a licence has been obtained from the High Commissioner, or from any person authorized by the High Commissioner to issue such licences. Every such licence shall state the name of the vessel in which such natives are to be carried, the name of the master, the number that may be recruited, the islands at which recruits may be engaged, the places whereat such recruits are to serve, and the conditions regarding accommodation, water and food supply, and the stock of medicines and medical appliances to be kept on board as set forth in Schedule B hereto. The licence will be accompanied by a form of contract as in Schedule C hereto.

23. Registration of contracts.—Fee for registration of contract.—Every engagement entered into under this Regulation shall be registered in the office of the Resident Commissioner, and a fee of Two shillings and sixpence shall be payable for such registration.

24. Breaches of Regulation.—Any failure to comply with the conditions of the licence, and the making of any agreement not in accordance with the terms of the form of agreement provided for above, shall be deemed to be a breach of this Regulation, and shall be punishable by a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

25. Persons not to be recruited.—It shall be unlawful to recruit any native apparently under the age of sixteen years without the consent of the parents or guardians of such native, or to recruit any married woman whose husband is not also recruited at the same time and for the same place.

26. Power of Resident Commissioner to inspect vessel, &c.—The Resident Commissioner may at any time inspect any vessel engaged in recruiting natives, and may examine the stores, provisions, and water supply on board, and the labourers recruited. The Resident Commissioner may, if he think fit, order any labourer recruited to be put on shore and the contract to be cancelled. The Resident Commissioner may also order the vessel to take its final departure from the Protectorate from an island or anchorage to be named by him.

27. Government agent.—The Resident Commissioner may, if he think fit, appoint an agent to remain on board any recruiting vessel during the time such vessel is engaged in recruiting within the Protectorate. Such agent shall be berthed and boarded at the ship's expense, and shall receive such remuneration, to be paid by the charterer of such vessel or his agent, as the Resident Commissioner may direct.

28. Prohibition of recruiting.—The Resident Commissioner may, in the event of the absence of an undue proportion of the adult males, or for any other reason which to him seems good prohibit, either for a specified time or until further notice, recruiting natives at any island or islands in the Protectorate. Such prohibition shall be reported forthwith to the High Commissioner, who may vary or rescind the same, and who will take such steps as may appear advisable to make such prohibition public. No person who, but for the provisions of this section, would be legally recruiting natives shall be liable to punishment for recruiting at an island at which recruiting is prohibited unless it is shown that such person had special notice of such prohibition. But any labourer so recruited shall, if still within the waters of the Protectorate, be landed as soon as the prohibition becomes known.

PART V.

WITH REGARD TO CURRENCY.

29. Currency.—All taxes, fees, and fines shall be payable in coin of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

30. Definition of "dollar".—In all cases of contract or of debt coming before the Court, in which the cause of action shall have arisen in the Protectorate, the word "dollar" shall be deemed to mean "silver Mexican dollar" unless it shall be proved to the satisfaction of the Court that another meaning was attached to it at the time that the contract was entered into or the debt incurred.

31. Value of dollar.—In the case of a contract by which dollars are expressed to be payable in English money, a dollar shall be deemed to be the equivalent of four English shillings.

PART VI.

32. Regulations repealed.—Reservation.—On the coming into force of this Regulation the "Gilbert Regulation 1893," the "Gilberts (Amendment) Regulation 1894," the "Gilberts (Revenue) Regulation 1894," the "Ellice Regulation 1894," and the "Gilberts (Revenue) Regulation Amendment Regulation 1897" shall be repealed. Provided always that all taxes and licence fees payable thereunder may be recovered, and all penalties for non-payment thereof may be enforced, as though the Regulations aforesaid were still in force.

33. Short title.—Date of coming into force.—This Regulation may be cited as the "Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate Regulation, 1903," and shall come into force on the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and four.

SCHEDULE B.

Accommodation.

Area of passenger deck, or decks:—

Upper deck: Not less than six superficial feet clear for each labourer.

Lower deck: Not less than twelve superficial feet clear for each labourer.

Height between decks to be not less than six feet six inches.

Arrangement of sleeping places: Open berths or sleeping places in not more than two tiers, the lower tier to be raised six inches at least from the lower deck. The interval between two tiers shall be not less than two feet six inches. All labourers shall be berthed between decks or in deck-houses.

MEMORANDUM of Agreement made this day of One thousand nine hundred and between of hereinafter called the employer of the one part, and

native (or natives) of the island of in the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate, recruited in the and hereinafter called the employé of the other part.

The conditions of this agreement are that the said employé engage to serve the said employer at for the term of and during that period to obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the said employer, his manager, overseer, and authorized agent.

In consideration of which the said employer doth hereby agree (1) to provide the said employé with free conveyance from the place of engagement to that at which to be employed; (2) to pay wages at the rate of per calendar month; (3) to provide with rations of the description and quantity specified on the margin hereof, or on

Daily Ration.

Fresh water, two quarts in addition to any that may be required for cooking purposes.

Beef or mutton, 1 lb.

Biscuit, 1 lb. (or 1½ lb. of Bread or Flour).

Potatoes, 3 lbs. (or 1 lb. of Rice).

Salt, per week, 2 oz.

Soap, per week, 4 oz.

such other scale as the Resident Commissioner may direct; and (4) also with proper lodging accommodation and bedding. And the said employer does also agree to provide the said employé as soon as possible after the completion of the term of this agreement with free conveyance back to the place at which engaged. Provided that should such means of conveyance be not immediately available after the expiry of this agreement, said employé shall continue to work for the said employer on the foregoing conditions for such period not exceeding three months as may elapse between the date of the completion of the employé term of service and the arrival of the vessel chartered for such return conveyance, and that should a period of more than three months so elapse said employé shall have the option of continuing to work after the completion of the said period of three months on the conditions of this agreement until the date of the arrival of the vessel aforesaid. Should, however, such employé not so elect, the employer shall continue to provide with rations, lodging, and bedding as stipulated in conditions (3) and (4) hereof, until the date of the return of such employé.

The employer reserves to himself the right to return at his own cost all or any of the employé parties to this agreement before the expiration of the term of service agreed upon should such employé not perform duties to the satisfaction of the said employer, his manager, overseer, or representative; and all employés so returned shall be paid wages, and be provided with rations, lodging, and bedding up to the date of such return.

In the event of any of the employé parties to this agreement being incapacitated from work by reason of illness, the employer shall provide with rations, lodging, and bedding only during the period that they are so incapacitated. Provided that if such incapacity is due to accident occurring or injury sustained in the discharge of such duties wages for the period of such incapacity, but not exceeding the terms of this agreement, shall also be paid by the said employer to the said employé.

INSTRUCTIONS TO HIS MAJESTY'S HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR THE WESTERN PACIFIC.

Under and by virtue of the provisions of Articles 4 and 6 of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893, I, the Right Honourable Aretas Akers-Douglas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby direct that jurisdiction under the said Order shall henceforth be exercisable in relation to the Pacific Ocean and the Islands and places therein as defined in the said Article IV.

And I hereby further direct that these instructions shall be published in the *Government Gazette* of Fiji, and in the manner specified in the 146th Article of the said Order in Council, and that all persons within the limits of the said Order in Council as hereby further defined shall govern themselves accordingly.

THURSDAY, THE 29TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1903, throughout the Shire of Maffra (Sale).

Health Act 1890.

QUARANTINE OF THE SHIP "MARGARETHA."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that, in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other circumstances of danger to the public health, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the ship or vessel *Margaretha* has arrived in Victorian waters having on board a considerable number of dead rats: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent as far as possible any danger to the public health in Victoria: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the outer anchorage off Williams-town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and do further direct that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct and under his supervision; and further, that no person shall remain unnecessarily in the vicinity of the said vessel; and further that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Chairman of the said Board or by the Health Officer.

This Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 7th September, 1903.

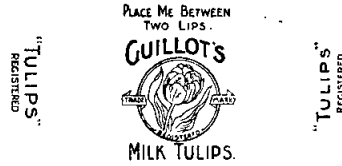

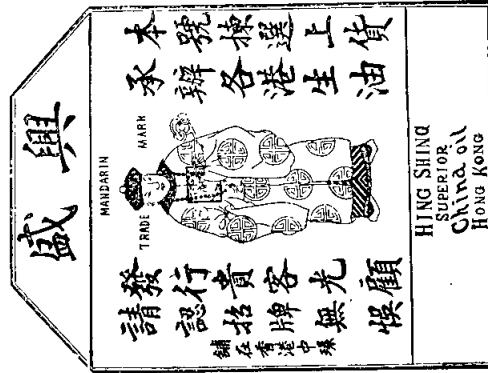

KYNETON SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 28.

A rate of one shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust liable in respect of rates levied by the said Trust, according to the valuation for the year 1904, of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such rateable property is situate, for one year commencing on the first day of January, 1904, and ending on the thirty-first day of December, 1904.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two equal portions or instalments, and the first instalment shall be due and payable on the first day of January, 1904, and the second instalment upon the first day of July in the same year. Such person as the Commissioners of the Kyneton Shire Waterworks Trust from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and recover the said rate.

RUSHWORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1904—No. 7.

THE Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1904, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of the said Trust:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every vacant piece of land, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal valuation of such allotment or piece of land, provided that in no case shall a rate less than Ten shillings be charged.

4. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe of the Trust, there shall be paid one-half of the above rates. And for all such lands and tenements being over a quarter of a mile, but within half-a-mile from such stand-pipe, one-quarter of the full rate shall be paid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust there shall be paid the sum of Five pounds sterling.

6. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of all lands and tenements, shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. All water supplied by measure by the Trust in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

7. Water supplied to the Government departments, religious denominations, and persons outside the Trust District shall be by measurement or special agreement.

8. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for water supplied by measure) shall be payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1904. Water supplied by measure shall be paid for on demand any time after it has been supplied.

9. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Rushworth Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

THE Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulation:—

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal valuation or under, the sum of Twenty shillings.

2. For every house or tenement of an annual municipal valuation exceeding Twenty pounds, a rate of One shilling in the pound.

3. For every unoccupied allotment of land, and for every allotment of land upon which no house or tenement has been erected, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling of the annual municipal value of such allotment.

4. For every water trough a charge of Ten shillings.

5. For every steam boiler a charge of Ten shillings for every horse-power of such boiler.

6. For stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of two hundred and fifty gallons or under, a charge of One shilling to be paid on delivery.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measure (other than stand-pipe or hydrant water), except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, a charge of One shilling for every thousand gallons.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by measurement (other than hydrant or stand-pipe water) shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a quantity for which the charge of One shilling per thousand gallons would be equal to the assessed rate which would be payable for the house or tenement so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If solely for other than domestic purposes, thirty thousand gallons per half-year.

9. The above-mentioned rates and charges (except for stand-pipe or hydrant water), shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January, and first day of July, 1904.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Yea Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land containing 1 acre or under, not supplied with water, the sum of Five shillings.

On every piece of vacant or unoccupied land of a greater area than 1 acre, not supplied with water, the sum of Ten shillings.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1904.

THE Commissioners of the Nhill Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of all lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Nhill Waterworks Trust District, that is to say:—

1. Every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, whether occupied or otherwise, of less than Eleven pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of One pound sterling per annum.

3. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, or allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, of Eleven pounds, or more than Eleven pounds annual value, an amount equal to Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

4. For all tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, in the said district, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipe, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenements or allotments of land, whether occupied or otherwise, are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within a half mile thereof one fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water except by special agreement, a charge of Twenty shillings per each horse-power shall be made.

6. For water supplied to siphon pumps, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or as may be decided upon by the Commissioners in addition to a supply for domestic or other purposes.

7. In all cases of water supply the Trust reserves the right of putting on a meter at the consumer's expense, and supplying water by measure, and in all cases where water is supplied to drinking or other troughs, or reservoirs, the Trust may compel the use of a floating ball-tap, or other improved device, to regulate the supply to such drinking or other troughs, or reservoirs, to prevent the same overflowing.

8. Water supplied to the Government departments, charitable, and other public institutions, and religious denominations, shall be by measure, or by special agreement.

9. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or at such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners and occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

One-sixteenth of an acre or less, per annum 8,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one

eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one

quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half an

acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.

Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding 1 acre, per

annum, 40,000 gallons.

For every additional acre, and proportionately according to

the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.

That the before-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1904, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1904, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1904, and the 1st day of July, 1904.

Where water meters are fixed payment shall be made at the end of each quarter in each year, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

**BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS
TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1904.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION NUMBERED 23,

Fixing the rates and charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied within the Trust District, such rate being made for the year commencing on the 1st day of January and ending on the 31st day of December, 1904.

The rates and charges which shall be payable by the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements within the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust District, who are supplied with water by the Trust, shall be as follows:—

1. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, of the annual value of Twenty pounds or under, the sum of One pound one shilling per annum.

2. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Twenty pounds, and not exceeding the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Five pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation.

3. On every house or tenement, not being an hotel or wine shop, above the annual value of Two hundred pounds, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings per cent. on the valuation.

4. On every hotel or wine shop of the annual value of Thirty pounds and under, a minimum rate of Two pounds per annum.

5. On every hotel or wine shop above the annual value of Thirty pounds, the sum of Six pounds per cent. per annum on the valuation, provided that the charge shall not in any case be less than Two pounds.

6. On unoccupied lands, and lands on which no tenements are erected, nor water laid on, the sum of Five pounds per cent. on the annual valuation. Should water be laid on, the charge to be in accordance with the rates fixed in this by-law for tenements.

7. On livery, coach, and hotel stables, at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for the first stall, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional stall. In open sheds used for stabling, each 6 feet to be considered as one stall. For horses kept on private premises, Ten shillings per annum for the first horse kept, and Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each additional horse.

Cows to be paid for at the rate of One shilling each per annum. Water-troughs, Ten shillings each per annum.

8. Water supplied by meter to be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, except to manufactories, aerated water makers, &c., to whom the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that not less than 60,000 gallons per annum is consumed, failing which the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

9. Water supplied for irrigation of gardens, nurseries, cricket grounds, &c., to be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity charged for shall be 20,000 gallons per annum.

10. For water supplied to buildings in course of erection, the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brickwork, stonework, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be affixed, the rate shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

11. For water supplied to steam-boilers, the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per horse-power per annum.

12. The charge for water supplied for mining purposes shall be as per agreement.

13. These rates and charges shall be payable by equal half yearly instalments, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1904, except in cases where the Trust may have made a special agreement regarding the times of payment for water supplied by measure or for mining purposes.

14. Such person or persons as the Chairman and Commissioners of the Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

15. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be the quantity for which the charge, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION FOR 1904.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following regulation for the year 1904. The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of land and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such street, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes.

1. For every allotment of land, whether occupied or otherwise, where water is not being used, and of less than Ten pounds sterling annual municipal value, the sum of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation.

2. For every house or tenement of Thirteen pounds or under municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be paid.

3. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum shall be paid on the annual value of such property.

4. For all tenements in the said district situate otherwise than on streets in which pipes for the supply have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within one-quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the above-mentioned rate, and where such tenements are more than one-quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rate.

5. Such owners of tenements as are supplied with water by meter shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons up to the quantity they would be entitled to receive according to their assessment, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for anything over that quantity.

6. Such owners or occupiers of tenements not within the Trust area, and who have agreed with the Trust to be supplied with water by meter, shall pay at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

7. Such owners or occupiers of gardens, steam-engines, or stock who are supplied from the Trust reservoir with water, shall, if the Commissioners of the Trust think fit, pay an extra rate beyond that which they are already paying (if any) if, in the opinion of the Trust, such owners or occupiers are not paying a just proportionate rate for the water they are using. Such owners or occupiers to be notified in writing of such charge.

8. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the first day of January and the first day of July, 1904. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION No. 23.

REGULATION No. 23 of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, made under the provisions of section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of regulating and defining the conditions upon which traction engines or waggons or vehicles connected thereto impelled by steam or electricity or otherwise may proceed over the culverts and accommodation bridges across the channels, water-courses, reservoirs, conduits, or pipes belonging to and being the property of the said Trust:—

1. No person shall permit, suffer, travel, or propel any traction engine or waggon or vehicle connected thereto exceeding 5 tons in weight over any culvert or accommodation bridge belonging to or the property of the said Trust.

2. The person in charge of any traction engine shall forthwith fill up, or cause to be filled up, any hole or rut in any approach to any such culvert or accommodation bridge caused by such engine or waggons or vehicles drawn by it on or over any culvert or accommodation bridge belonging to or the property of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and shall repair any damage or injury caused to the said culvert and accommodation bridge in a proper manner, so as to render the same fit for vehicular and other traffic of an ordinary nature.

3. The owner of any traction engine shall be liable to pay for any damage caused to any culvert or accommodation bridge belonging to or the property of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, by his engine or waggons or vehicles drawn by it.

4. No person shall permit a traction engine or waggon or vehicle drawn by it to stop upon any culvert or accommodation bridge belonging to or the property of the said Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

5. In the event of any traction engine or waggon or other vehicle drawn by it breaking the decking or otherwise damaging any culvert or accommodation bridge belonging to or the property of the said Trust, the person in charge thereof shall (in addition to the filling up of any hole or rut as provided in clause 2 of this Regulation) forthwith before leaving such culvert or accommodation bridge place an obstruction to traffic or notice of such damage in a conspicuous position on or near the damaged

portion, and shall send notices immediately, in writing, to the chairman, secretary, and engineer of the said Trust. Such notices shall particularize the culvert or accommodation bridge so damaged, and the nature of such damage.

6. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the following Regulations:—

REGULATION No. 11.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1904 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound according to such value.

3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

6. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.

7. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds, and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

8. For every house or tenement, not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of the amount charged or fixed for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.

12. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the cylinder of the engine.

13. For water supplied to market gardeners for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons, the supply to be by meter only.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment to be on the 1st day of January, 1904, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1904.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE ST. KILDA GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the St. Kilda General Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations which shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded (that is to say):—

1. That the cemetery being closed to the general public on the 31st December, 1900, thereafter no rights of burial in the cemetery will be disposed of under any circumstances whatever. Only transfers and renewals of existing rights will be issued.

2. That all persons having or retaining the right of burial shall conform in all respects to the rules and regulations made by the trustees of the cemetery from time to time and duly gazetted or by the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*.

3. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

4. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply in writing to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval. Such permission will be subject to section 22 of the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, and no label, stone, or any distinctive mark is to be removed from any grave without written permission from the manager, and if so required must be again replaced under his supervision.

5. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.

6. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule B shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.

7. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; and may build such brick graves as may be required, and may erect foundations and vaults in all cases where they deem it desirable, but any person wanting a brick grave or vault may be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the surveyor or manager, on payment of the required fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron. (See Act No. 1072, clause 19, sec. 2.)

8. The trustees will cause all graves and enclosures to be kept in order, painted, relettered, &c., according to and shall be entitled to receive therefor the fees and charges provided in Schedule A hereto annexed, and no person other than the owner shall be permitted to attend to or to interfere in any way whatever with any grave or enclosure without the written authority of the manager so to do.

9. The trustees may order the removal or alteration of any vault, monument, tomb, tablet, gravestone, monumental inscription, kerbing, railing, or any other erection which shall have

been erected or placed in either of the said divisions of the said cemetery, which may be contrary to these by-laws, or any of them, or which may have been erected or placed there without the authority of the manager or officer in charge.

10. The trustees will, upon due notice and payment of the costs and charges, undertake the removal and replacement of head and foot stones, kerbing, slabs, monuments, &c., when graves or brick vaults are required to be opened; but if due notice is not given, and the costs and charges are not paid as aforesaid, the trustees will not undertake the re-opening of such grave or brick vault.

11. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate, with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.

12. That every grave shall be sunk at least nine (9) feet deep, and no coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contain the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level, and except in the case of a vault or brick grave a layer of earth of at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the uppermost coffin previously buried in the grave.

13. Masons and other workmen shall clear away all refuse made by them, and shall repair and make good all damage caused by or through them or their servants, to the satisfaction of the manager or officer in charge.

14. Masons and other workmen shall, before commencing any work in the ground, deposit with the manager or officer in charge the sum of Ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if Rule 13 is not complied with.

15. No slab shall be placed over any grave where there has not been an interment, nor shall any person circulate any business cards within the said cemetery.

16. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault without the production of the certificate of right of burial or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.

17. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.

18. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered at the lodge before the funeral enters the cemetery.

19. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—On week days—September to April inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Five p.m.; May to August inclusive, from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. Sunday funerals will be permitted only between the hours of Two and Five p.m., and then only on a special order given by a medical man or a Justice of the Peace.

20. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of Seven p.m. and Seven a.m., except by special permission of a quorum of the trustees.

21. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and if not punctually observed, the person responsible shall be liable to a fine of Ten shillings and sixpence.

22. That every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance of the cemetery, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter or to stand opposite the entrance gates. Breaking out of the procession after passing the gates is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

23. No person shall ride or drive any animal or vehicle over the roads or paths of the cemetery, nor shall any person work near a grave during the performance of the burial service.

24. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition and in accordance with these regulations by or at the expense of the owner.

25. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

26. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees or contrary to the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the Cemeteries Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

27. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once by or at the expense of the owner. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stonework.

28. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the Cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4 inches broad shall be permitted to enter.

29. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

30. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment, either in said or any other cemetery.

31. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted, the permission of the Minister administering the *Coroners Act 1890*, and any amendment or amendments or statutory modification thereof, in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and airtight coffin prior to removal.

32. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the manager, who shall have power to regulate his hours of labour, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

33. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Seven a.m. to Five p.m. during the other months of the year.

34. That no child under ten years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

35. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

36. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found there may be destroyed.

37. No person shall violate the rules of propriety or decorum, or commit any nuisance or trespass, or refuse to leave the cemetery when directed so to do by the secretary or manager, or injure any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or otherwise infringe the Cemeteries Act, or any Rule, Regulation, or By-law made and published in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act.

38. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery without the permission of the manager.

39. That the manager shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

40. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

41. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

42. Any person desiring to have a tomb, monument, or place of burial kept in order in perpetuity may do so by depositing in the hands of the trustees, for the general purposes of the said cemetery, any sufficient sum of money, and the said trustees or the trustees for the time being shall cause to be expended on the said tomb, monument, or burial place, at their discretion, the net income on such sum upon and under such conditions as are embodied in an agreement prepared by the said trustees in the form or to the effect mentioned in Schedule C hereto.

43. That a plan of the cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial, shall be kept at the office, and the same shall be open for inspection during business hours, upon payment of a fee of Two shillings and sixpence for each inspection.

44. Should any person who is entitled to receive a certificate of right of burial neglect or have neglected for five years to obtain such certificate from the trustees, an additional fee of Ten shillings and sixpence shall in such case be paid for the issue of such certificate.

45. Any person guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing rules and regulations shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.
