By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz. :—

REGULATIONS.—PROMOTION TO HIGHER CLASSES OF THE CLERICAL DIVISION.

CHAPTER III. (A).

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby makes the following regulations and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

1. Candidates for promotion to the higher classes of the Clerical Division (Section 53, Act No. 1133) will be examined in the following subjects:—

Section "A."	Full marks.
(a) Precise writing, letter drafting, preparing regulations and Orders in Council, expressing in simple language the meanings of sections of Acts of Parliament ...	200
(b) The Acts and Regulations administered by or the law a knowledge of which is necessary in the Department to which the officer belongs, routine of office work, method of dealing with correspondence and the public ...	200

Section "B."

(a) Outlines of the History of the British Empire during the nineteenth century, with such a knowledge of that of other nations and of political and commercial geography as is necessary for understanding such history ...	200
(b) Outlines of the History of Australia and a more detailed History of Victoria ...	100

Or in lieu of (a) and (b).

French—

(a) Translation at sight of passages from a French newspaper or journal, writing a letter in French ...	200
(b) French reading and conversation ...	100

Or

German—

(extent of examination the same as in French)

Or

Accounts and auditing ...	300
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Section "C."

The Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia and that of Victoria; Local Government in Victoria ...	150
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2. In order to pass the examination the officer must obtain at least three-fifths of the full marks in Section "A," and one-half of the full marks in Sections "B" and "C." Where a subject consists of two parts (a) and (b) the required percentage of full marks must be obtained in each part of the subject.

3. The full marks for each question shall be shown on the examination papers for the information of candidates.

4. (I.) Where the Acts and Regulations administered by a Department are very numerous, the Commissioner may prescribe alternative groups of such Acts and Regulations in which officers may be examined.

(II.) Where the work of an officer does not require him to be acquainted with the Acts and Regulations administered by or with the law a knowledge of which is necessary in the working of the Department to which he belongs, he may, with the approval of the Commissioner, select for his examination the Acts and Regulations administered by any Department or any group of such Acts and Regulations prescribed by the Commissioner as provided in the preceding clause.

(III.) Where an officer has within three years of the examination held an office in a Department other than that to which he belongs at the time of the examination, he may at his option be examined either in the Acts and Regulations administered by his former Department, or in those administered by his present Department.

5. An examination will be held at times to be fixed by the Commissioner, of which due notice will be given.

6. Any officer in the Fourth Class of the Clerical Division desirous of being examined must forward a request in writing to that effect to the Commissioner on or before a date to be fixed by him and published in the *Government Gazette*, and such officer must specify the Department and Branch in which he is employed, and, in the case of optional subjects, the subjects in which he desires to be examined.

7. Candidates shall observe any printed directions or any oral directions of the officer in charge of the examination.

8. Examiners and officers in charge will observe any general directions which may be issued by the Commissioner for the preparation, transmission, and marking of examination papers.

9. Each examiner shall, as soon as practicable after any examination forward to the Commissioner a return showing the names of all candidates examined by him, the marks gained by each, and the names of those candidates who have passed.

10. The Commissioner will from such returns prepare a list of officers who have passed the examination, and such list shall be published in the *Government Gazette*.

EXAMINATION FOR PROMOTION TO HIGHER CLASSES.

IN connexion with the Examination for Promotion to the Higher Classes the following suggestions and recommendations are made for the guidance of officers who may desire to present themselves for examination:—

REGULATIONS, CHAPTER III. (A).

Section "B."

History.

(a) This history should be studied with the special object of understanding the present social, industrial, and political condition of the Empire, and its relation with other States. To understand the latter, the growth during the century of the European States and of the United States and the changes in their boundaries and forms of government should be known in outline. To understand the former, candidates should be informed not only of the wars of the Empire and of the extension of its colonial and foreign possessions, but also of its industrial and social progress and the changes in its political arrangements.

A concise account of most of the matters that should be known will be found in *The 19th Century*, by R. Mackenzie, 14th edition (Thomas Nelson and Sons). McCarthy's *A Short History of Our Own Times* (Chatto and Windus) gives a fuller account of the political history of the United Kingdom from 1837 to 1880. Excellent summaries of British history during the century are given in *The English People in the Nineteenth Century*, by H. de B. Gibbins (Adam and Charles Black), and in *England in the Nineteenth Century*, by C. W. Oman (Edward Arnold).

A good general outline of the history of the British Colonies during the nineteenth century and before will be found in *The Story of the Empire*, by E. Salmon (George Newnes Ltd.); in *History of the British Colonial Empire*, Historical Reader No. 4, Public School Series (Whitcombe and Tombs Ltd., Christchurch, New Zealand); and in *Jose's The Growth of the Empire* (Angus and Robertson). A good compendium of facts and statistics will be found in *The Building of the British Empire*, by A. T. Flux (Alfred M. Holden).

(b) From Coghlan and Ewing's *Progress of Australasia in the Century* (Nineteenth Century Series), the information required under (b) can be obtained. The growth and condition of the British Empire and of the colonial possessions of foreign powers during the last few years of the century is dealt with in such books as *The Statesman's Year Book and Whitaker's Almanac*.

French and German.

In respect to reading and conversation, moderate correctness in pronunciation and readiness in speech only will be required.

Accounts and Auditing.

This subject includes a general knowledge of the principles of bookkeeping, a knowledge of the Audit Acts, of the "General Regulations respecting Public Accounts," of the method of keeping the account books used in State Departments, and a general knowledge of the principles and practice of auditing accounts in such departments. *Bookkeeping for Accountant Students*, by L. R. Dicksee (Gee and Co.), and the paper on *The Audit of Banks and Mercantile Firms*, sections 1-47, in *Bookkeeping and other Papers*, by G. Van de Linde (Blades, East, and Blades), may be recommended.

Section "C."

This subject comprehends, in respect both to the Commonwealth and the State—

The Constitution and powers of Parliament; qualifications of electors and members of each House; mode of registration of electors; manner of election of members; method of legislation; summoning, prorogation, dissolution, and sessions of Parliament; responsible government; the judiciary—tenure of office; taxation—powers of each House; settlement of disagreements between the Houses.

Also in respect to the Commonwealth—Representation in Parliament of each State, jurisdiction of the High Court, the Inter-State Commission, alteration of the Constitution.

In respect to Local Government—The constitution of Municipalities; Municipal Councils; powers of administration, of legislation, and of raising revenue; qualifications of electors; qualifications and election of members of councils.

The following Acts should be studied:—

The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act (63 and 64 Vict., c. 12); the *Commonwealth Franchise Act 1902*; and the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1902*.

The Constitution Act (18 and 19 Vict., c. 55, Schedule)—the sections not repealed; the *Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890*, Parts II., III., IV., V. (details as to duties of registrars and returning officers need not be mastered); and Acts amending that Act.

The *Local Government Act 1890*, as amended by subsequent Acts, Part I.; Part II., Div. 1.; Part III., Div. 1, Div. 4 (1), Div. 5 (1) and (2); Part VII., Div. 2.; Part X., Divs. 1 and 3.; Part XI., ss. 301, 305, 306, 311; *Health Act 1890*, ss. 20, 31, 33, 131, 132, 133, 136, 218, 246.

It is proposed to hold an examination in about six months from the present time. Officers desiring to present themselves for the examination, and who consider that they belong to Departments to which Clause 4 (1.) applies, should communicate with the Commissioner, with a view to the prescribing of the particular Acts and regulations, a knowledge of which will be required in their case.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION FOR 1904.—No. 1.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Acts, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1904 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated, shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Waterworks District:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound sterling. Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. That every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of Ten shillings sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment, and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of Ten shillings sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses one, two, and three of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound sterling. Provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum, except in respect to allotments of land where no water is laid on, in which cases the rate shall not be less than Ten shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses one, two, and three of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling and eightpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made. Nevertheless, it shall be competent for the Trust to agree for a special charge, from time to time, with any ratepayer for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate of One shilling and eightpence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1904.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

**WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1904.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

- (1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.
- (2) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.
- (3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.
- (4) Any person who shall obtain water or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them, in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water shall be supplied by measurement shall be—

- (1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.
- (3) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1904, commencing from the 1st of January, 1904, as also the charges for every steam-boiler, and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable 1st July, 1904.
- (4) All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly on the 1st of January, 1904, and the 1st of July, 1904.
- (5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rate and charges.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measurement shall be the quantity for which the charge of Ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if the water were supplied otherwise than by meter.

6. The above rates and charges are made for the year ending 31st December, 1904, and the rates shall be payable, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1904.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Moorooopna Waterworks Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and receive the said rates and charges.

4. Such rates shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January, 1904, and on the 1st day of July, 1904.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

1. A rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all rateable property in the Waterworks Trust District, according to the municipal valuation of such properties. The minimum rate to be paid shall be Twenty shillings.

2. For water supplied by the Trust for domestic and other than domestic purposes by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in respect of lands and tenements within the Trust district shall be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

4. All water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust District shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

5. A charge of Ten pounds per centum shall be imposed upon all unoccupied allotments in the Waterworks Trust District, according to the municipal valuation of such allotments.

6. Such rates and charges other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess are hereby made payable half-yearly, in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1904, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1904.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

**WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION NO. 2.**

THE Commissioners of the Wodonga Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations for the year 1904:—

The following are the charges which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by this Trust within the Wodonga Waterworks District, that is to say:—

1. In all cases where a meter has to be used the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence for every 1,000 gallons, except where otherwise provided.

2. For buildings in course of erection to which water is supplied, the charge shall be One pound per centum on the amount of the contract for such building, excepting the iron and wood work.

3. That for all stand-pipes used for the purpose of watering gardens and other purposes other than purely household purposes by ratepayers, the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum per pipe. Provided that water for any garden exceeding the limits of 66 feet by 50 feet, or 3,300 square feet, must be supplied by meter, in which case the charge shall be at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons.

4. A special charge of Two pounds per annum shall be made for water supplied to St. Joseph's Convent and School in connexion therewith.

5. All Government buildings not connected with the Victorian Railway Department and supplied with water by the Trust shall be charged a fixed sum of Three pounds each per annum.

6. All steam-engines using water must be supplied through a meter.

7. Rateable consumers may at their option be supplied by meter, in which case they may have as many pipes as they may see fit, provided that all water used by each such consumer shall pass through his meter, and each such consumer shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons until a sum has been reached equal to the amount of his rates, and at the rate of One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons for all water used over and above that sum. Provided that no such consumer shall pay less than the amount of his rates, although he may not use sufficient water at One shilling and threepence per 1,000 gallons to equal the amount of his rates.

That the foregoing charges be paid in half-yearly payments on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December, 1904.

WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION.

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1904, in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelvence per each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being dwellings nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Threepence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.—

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, part of whose Waterworks District has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of Part. II. of the *Water Act 1890*, doth hereby, under the powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, make the following Regulation for the year 1904 in respect of such Urban District:—

- (a) For every house or other tenement fronting any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, and not being unoccupied land, a rate of One shilling and ninepence (1s. 9d.) in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation of such house or other tenement shall be paid, the minimum amount to be so paid to be Twenty shillings.
- (b) For unoccupied land where water is not laid on, but which land fronts any street wherein the water pipes of the Trust have been laid, the rate shall be Five per centum per annum on the amount of the municipal valuation thereof in all cases where such rate or such valuation shall exceed Ten shillings, and in all other of such cases the rate shall be Ten shillings.
- (c) For houses proved to the satisfaction of the Trust to have remained unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, the charge per house shall be two-thirds of the amount which would be payable if such house had not been so unoccupied; but in no case shall the rate be less than Twenty shillings, and such rate shall be levied upon the persons and at the times and in the manner provided for the levying of rates by the *Water Acts*.
- (d) For water supplied for domestic or for domestic and other than domestic purposes by the Trust by measure, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive in respect of the tenement for which such charge shall be made if the same had been rated under subdivision (a) hereof; and thereafter at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (d2) The occupier of two or more tenements liable to be rated, one of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled on payment of the rates on such tenements respectively to use, without further charge such a quantity of water by meter as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure the amount of such rates: Provided that the tenement or tenements not supplied by measure shall not be connected with the pipes of the Trust.
- (d3) The occupier of two or more tenements, each of which is supplied with water by measure, shall be entitled to use without further charge such a quantity of water at either or both of such tenements as shall not exceed at the current charge for water supplied for domestic purposes by measure the total amount at which such tenements if not supplied by measure would be rated.
- (e) For gas engines and oil engines the charge shall be at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, payable yearly in advance, for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and thereafter no water shall be supplied until such meter shall have been affixed to the supply pipe for such engine to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.
- (f) For steam-boilers the charge shall be Ten shillings per annum, payable half-yearly in advance, for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used, and in such cases no water shall be supplied or used after such order shall have been given until the same is complied with to the satisfaction of the engineer of the Trust. The provisions of sub-section (i) shall apply to this clause.
- (g) For buildings in course of erection, where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per centum on the contract price of the works for a brick building, or shall be fixed by special agreement. For wooden buildings with plastered walls the charge shall be One pound (£1), and all wooden buildings where no plaster is used the charge shall be Ten shillings (10s.), payment in the cases under this subdivision to be made in advance.
- (h) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein are to be paid for at such charge as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment on account of such charge must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply shall be taken or used.

- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly in each case, where water is supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes, shall be 10,000 gallons, and such water (where not otherwise provided herein) shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.
- (j) The charge for water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, cricket grounds, and bowling greens shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons; any quantity supplied in excess of the full measure of a unit of 1,000 gallons shall be charged for as 1,000 gallons. All water so supplied must be through a meter and paid for half-yearly.
- (k) The charge for water supplied by measure solely for railway purposes shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 1,000,000 gallons.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.
