IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. THURSDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF JANUARY, 1904, throughout the Shire of Frankston and Hastings and the Shire of Mornington (Frankston).

CASTLEMAINE AND BENDIGO WATER SUPPLY.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, has, by an Order made on the 12th day of November, 1903, approved of the substitution for sub-sections (i.), (ii.), and (iii.) (see *Gazette* of 13th June, 1902, page 2331), and sub-sections (vii.) and (ix.) (see *Gazette* of 5th June, 1896, page 2345), of the following sub-sections (alteration to take effect from the 1st January, 1904), viz.:—

- (i.) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence and under, One pound per annum.
- (ii.) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence, a rate of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds inclusive; Four pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds up to Seven hundred pounds; and Three pounds seven shillings and sixpence per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Seven hundred pounds.
- (iii.) On every shop not used as a domicile above the annual value of Sixteen pounds thirteen shillings and fourpence, a rate of Six pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation up to Three hundred pounds inclusive; Three pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Three hundred pounds up to Seven hundred pounds; and One pound seventeen shillings and sixpence per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of Seven hundred pounds.
- (vii.) For water supplied from the mains for mining purposes, including sluicing, the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (ix.) For water supplied from the mains to gardens, nurseries, vineyards, or other lands cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket grounds, the rate shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels for like purposes, the rate shall be One penny (id.) per 1,000 gallons. All such supplies from the channels shall be continuous or regularly intermittent, and the minimum amount of water to be supplied shall be 60,000 gallons per month, to be made in one (1) delivery; and the water shall be delivered at such times, and in such manner, as the Minister of Water Supply shall from time to time direct.

No vessel (except those plying with passengers only and certificated tug steamers) shall be unmoored or got under way on Sundays from such vessel's berth, anchorage, or moorings, unless by the express permission, in writing, of the Port Officer, and no work shall be done on, or in connexion with, any vessel in any proclaimed port on Sundays, except such as may be necessary for the cleanliness and safety of such vessel, for the comfort of the passengers and crew, or for the navigation of the passenger vessels and tug steamers aforesaid, unless by the express permission, in writing, of the Port Officer.

EXHIBITION OF LIGHT ON KAHURANGI POINT, WEST COAST, SOUTH ISLAND.

WITH reference to preliminary Notice No. 71 of 1903, issued by this Department on the 28th September last, it is hereby notified that on and after the 30th November, 1903, a light will be exhibited, from sunset to sunrise, from the light-house which has been erected on Kahurangi Point, West Coast, South Island, in lat. 40° 46' 3" S. and long. 172° 13' 7" E., as measured from the Admiralty chart.

The light, which is a dioptric fixed white light of the second order, is about 110 feet above the level of the sea at high water, and is visible to seaward over an arc of 212 degrees of the horizon for a distance of about 16½ miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above the sea; with a red sector of 20 degrees, so adjusted as to show over the Stewart Breaker, distant about 4½ miles N., 28° W. (magnetic) from the light-house site.

BY-LAW No. 170.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law in regard to the freight on certain classes of goods consigned to stations beyond Curyo, on the line to Mildura, and do hereby repeal so much of the provision in By-law No. 143 as relates to the rebate on goods forwarded by rail from Melbourne, Williamstown, Port Melbourne, and from stations of a lesser distance to Echuca, Kerang, or Swan Hill, and thence by river or teams to Mildura; and, further, do hereby repeal so much of all By-laws and practices as conflict therewith:—

Between Melbourne and the undermentioned stations on the Mildura line the rates, as specified hereunder, shall be charged in respect of the carriage of goods under classes "B," "C," "1," "2," and "3," and between intermediate stations and the undermentioned stations on the Mildura line *via* either Ballarat or Castlemaine the mileage rates prescribed under By-law No. 143 shall be imposed in all cases in which such rates are less than the rates respectively specified in this By-law, which otherwise shall be charged:—

Consignments transported from or to stations other than those governed by the preceding clause over any portion of the line between Melbourne and Mildura, *via* either Ballarat or Castlemaine, shall for such portion be given the benefit of the respective rates prescribed in this By-law in every case in which, as between the station of despatch or destination (as the case may be) and the station on the Melbourne-Mildura line beyond Curyo, the sum of the mileage rate between the station of despatch or destination (as the case may be) and the junction station with the Melbourne-Mildura line, and the rate herein specified is cheaper than the through mileage rate from the station of despatch to the station of destination.

Sugar from Melbourne to Mildura and Irymple shall be charged the rate fixed under the "A" class in By-law No. 143, with a minimum truck load of 5 tons per four-wheeled truck.

Kerosene, fencing wire, and wire netting from Melbourne to Mildura and Irymple shall be charged the rate fixed under the "B" class in this By-law.

Except as otherwise specified, the minimum truck load for the respective classes of goods shall be as prescribed under the provisions of By-law No. 143.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Acts, do hereby make the following By-law in regard to the carriage of goods consigned to places in the Euston and Darling River districts, and do hereby repeal so much of the provision prescribed in By-law No. 143 as relates to the rebate on goods forwarded by rail from Melbourne, Williamstown, Port Melbourne, and from stations of a lesser distance to Echuca, Kerang, or Swan Hill, and thence by river or team to Euston or to any destination on the River Darling; and, further, do hereby repeal so much of all By-laws and practices as conflict therewith:—

During the periods of the year in which the River Murray is open for navigation between Morgan and the junction of the rivers Murray and Darling, goods transported by rail from Melbourne, Williamstown, Port Melbourne, and stations of a lesser distance to Echuca, Kerang, or Swan Hill, and thence by river or team to—

- (a) Euston, or
(b) any destination on the River Darling,

will be allowed rebate to the rates as specified hereunder in every case in which such rates are less than the mileage rates prescribed in By-law No. 143, on production of certified bills of lading or a certificate or such other proof, as in the discretion of the Victorian Railways Commissioners or their designated representative or representatives, may be accepted as conclusive evidence that such goods are absolutely for use in the Euston and Darling River districts, and have been duly delivered at the destination specified in the consignment note.

During the period of the year in which the River Murray is open for navigation between Morgan and the junction of the rivers Murray and Darling, goods transported by rail from Melbourne, Williamstown, Port Melbourne, and stations of a lesser distance to Mildura, and thence by river or team to—

- (a) Euston, or
(b) any destination on the River Darling,

will be allowed rebates to the rates as specified hereunder, plus 15s. per ton in every case in which such rates plus 15s. per ton are less than the rates prescribed in By-law No. 170, on production of certified bills of lading or a certificate or such other proof as, in the discretion of the Victorian Railways Commissioners or their designated representative or representatives, may be accepted as conclusive proof that such goods are absolutely for use in the Euston and Darling River districts, and have been duly delivered at the destination specified in the consignment note.

The mileage rates prescribed in By-law No. 143 in respect of the goods consigned *via* Echuca, Kerang, or Swan Hill, and the rates prescribed in By-law No. 170 in respect of goods consigned *via* Mildura, will be imposed in the first instance, and the rebates granted on production of the rebate sheets, accompanied by the certified bills of lading, certificate, or other proof as stipulated in the foregoing clause.

Rebates will not be granted unless the rebate sheets and vouchers are lodged within one month of the date of the consignment of the goods.
