CASTLEMAINE AND BENDIGO WATER SUPPLY. AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, has, by an Order made on the 12th day of November, 1903, approved of the substitution for sub-sections (t.), (t1.), and (t1.) (see Guzette of 13th June, 1962, page 2331), and sub-sections (v11.) and (tx.) (see Guzette of 5th June, 1896, page 2346), of the following sub-sections (alteration to take effect from the 1st January, 1904), viz.:—

- (I.) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence and under, One pound per annum.
- (II.) - (VII.) For water supplied from the mains for mining pur-poses, including sluicing, the rate shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

 (IX.) For water supplied from the mains to gardens, nurseries, vineyards, or other lands cultivated for trade purposes, and to cricket grounds, the rate shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons. For water supplied from the channels for like purposes, the rate shall be One penny (1d.) per 1,000 gallons. All such supplies from the channels shall be continuous or regularly intermittent, and the minimum amount of water to be supplied shall be 60,000 gallons per month, to be made in one (1) delivery; and the water shall be delivered at such times, and in such manner, as the Minister of Water Supply shall from time to time direct.

NOTH ISLAND.

WITH reference to preliminary Notice No. 71 of 1903, issued by this Department on the 28th September last, it is hereby notified that on and after the 30th November, 1903, a light will be exhibited, from sunset to surrise, from the light-house which has been erected on Kahurangi Point, West Coast, South Island, in lat. 40*46*3" S. and long. 172°13'7" K., as measured from the Admiralty chart.

The light, which is a dioptric fixed white light of the second order, is about 110 feet above the level of the sea at high water, and is visible to seaward over an arc of 212 degrees of the horizon for a distance of about 16½ miles from the deck of a vessel 15 feet above the sea; with a red sector of 20 degrees, so adjusted as to show over the Stewart Breaker, distant about 1½ miles N., 28° W. will be allowed rebates to the rates as specified hereunder, plus 15s. per ton in every case in which such rates plus 15s. per ton are less than the rates prescribed in By-law No. 170, on production of certified bills of lading or a certificate or such other proof as, in the discretion of the Victorian Railways Commissioners or their designated representative or representatives, may be accepted as conclusive proof that such goods are absolutely for use in the Euston and Darling River districts, and have been duly delivered at the destination specified in the consignment note.

The mileage rates prescribed in By-law No. 143 in respect of the goods consigned viâ Echnea, Kerang, or Swan Hill, and the rates prescribed in By-law No. 170 in respect of goods consigned viâ Mildura, will be imposed in the first instance, and the rebates granted on production of the rebate sheets, accompanied by the certified bills of lading, certificate, or other proof as stipulated in the foregoing clause.

Rebates will not be granted unless the rebate sheets and vouchers are lodged within one month of the date of the consignment of the goods.






