

No person, except the pilot and duly authorized officers of Government, and such reporters for the press and shipping clerks as may be authorized in writing by the Under-Secretary, shall go on board of or leave any ship from other than Australasian ports carrying passengers entering or within any port until such vessel has been cleared by the Immigration Officer, which clearance shall be indicated by the blue flag being hauled down: Provided, nevertheless, that agents of ships and their authorized clerks may, by written permission from the Under-Secretary, go on board vessels consigned to them after the clearing officer has boarded, 'and with his concurrence, notwithstanding that the blue flag may be still flying.
