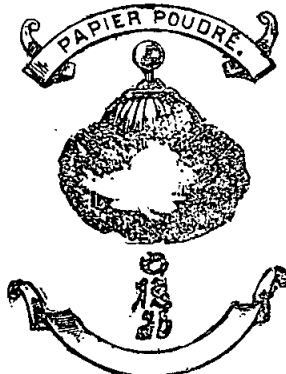



Under all Sub-schedules particular attention is drawn to Clause 1 of the Condition as to quality.

BREAD.

A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. Third quality (that issued to prisoners of the Crown) to be made of flour, fine sharps, the produce of prime, strong, thin-skinned, good-coloured wheat, to be perfectly free from coarse pollard or other offal. Bread may be baked at any Government establishment without infringing these contracts. At Beechworth and Ballarat, if required, bread must be supplied one day old, due notice to be given to the contractor of such requirement.

Under sub-schedules for Bread no subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor; the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture, preparation, or the delivery of the bread tendered for in these schedules shall not exceed 48 hours per week, and the wages paid to any such person shall be in accordance with the determination of the Bread Board, under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted in legible Roman characters in the factory or shop (and in each part of the factory or shop where several rooms are in use) in which bread is prepared or manufactured under these contracts. Any infringement of these conditions, or breach of the said determination, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

In the event of bread being made at any Government establishment in the Melbourne District, during the currency of these contracts, the flour required will be drawn under the flour and maize meal schedule. The maize meal for all the country gaols is included in the schedule for flour and maize meal, and delivery of same will be required to be made at the Victorian Railways, Spencer-street.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any direction as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the ratepayers of a portion of the Devenish Riding of the Shire of Benalla, with regard to a certain area therein described; notices of such petition having been published in the manner prescribed in the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the said petition, doth by this present Order, sever from the Devenish Riding of the Shire of Benalla the portion described in such petition, and doth annex the portion so severed from

such shire to the Shire of Shepparton as a separate Riding to be called the Dookie Riding; and with the advice aforesaid doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Benalla with its Devenish Riding as reduced, and also the Shire of Shepparton as enlarged with the said Dookie Riding thereof, as constituted, that is to say:—

**SHEPPARTON SHIRE.—ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED.**

**PORTS IN VICTORIA.—REPEAL OF CLAUSES 2 AND 4 OF THE GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND PROCLAMATION OF A NEW CLAUSE.**

**PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS** by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such rules and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby repeal Rules 2 and 4 of the General Rules for Ports in Victoria, and I do hereby direct that on and after the date of this Proclamation Rule 4 of such General Rules for the Ports in Victoria shall read as follows:—

No person, except the pilot and duly authorized officers of Government, and such reporters for the press and shipping clerks as may be authorized in writing by the Under-Secretary, shall go on board or leave any ship from other than Australasian ports carrying passengers entering or within any port until such vessel has been cleared by the Immigration Officer, which clearance shall be indicated by the blue flag being hauled down: Provided, nevertheless, that agents of ships and their authorized clerks may, by written permission from the Under-Secretary, go on board vessels consigned to them after the clearing officer has boarded, and with his concurrence, notwithstanding that the blue flag may be still flying.

## PROCLAMATION

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Vegetation Diseases Act 1896* (59 Victoria No. 1432), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the above-recited Act on the twenty-second day of July, 1902, and appearing in the *Government Gazette* of the thirtieth July, 1902. Under the powers above recited I do hereby order that on and after the date of this Proclamation no grape vines nor cuttings whatever, nor any fruit trees, vegetables, or plants shall be brought into

that portion of Victoria, consisting of twenty-five thousand acres of land comprised in and referred to in a certain indenture made the thirty-first day of May, 1887, between Her Majesty the Queen of the one part and George Chaffey and William Benjamin Chaffey of the other part, and commonly known as "Mildura," from any other part of Victoria, save and except upon written permit of some officer authorized generally or in any particular case to give permits, or a permit by the Minister of Agriculture for the time being, nor, unless such grape vines, cuttings, or fruit trees, plants, or vegetables be, subsequently to the granting of such permits or permit, fumigated upon arrival at Mildura, under the supervision of an officer appointed for that purpose by the Minister of Agriculture: Provided nevertheless in the case of fruit trees, plants, or vegetables, if the same be accompanied by a certificate, certifying that the same have been fumigated and are free from disease, then and in such case fumigation of such fruit trees, plants, or vegetables, on arrival at Mildura, shall not be necessary: And I do hereby absolutely prohibit the bringing of second-hand fruit cases into that portion of Victoria known as Mildura.

(One shilling) may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

6. No person shall post any handbill or place any notice in the park without the written permission of the Committee of Management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park nor any booth or other structure for purpose of offering for sale any article without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

8. No person, except labourers and working men employed in the park, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall discharge firearms in the park.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £3 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such Regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

**ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF FITZROY, CARLTON, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS, AND LINCOLN, ARGYLE, CURTAIN, MACARTHUR, MURCHISON, DARLING, AND UNIVERSITY SQUARES.**

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Fitzroy, Carlton, and Flagstaff Gardens, and Lincoln, Argyle, Curtain, Macarthur, Murchison, Darling, and University Squares, it is provided and declared that the lands thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a public garden or a public square, as the case may be, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the Regulation following for the care, protection, and management of the said gardens and squares, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said gardens and squares:—

**REGULATION.**

No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the trustees, shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor-car, or other vehicle in any of the said gardens or squares.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or constable, and

taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

**SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF STRATFORD.**

WE, John Mildenhall, Archibald Lloyd, William Stothers, Edward John Swan, and James Turner Mitchell, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Stratford, having framed the following Supplementary Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

**REGULATIONS.**

1. No person, except the Members of the Committee of Management, shall be permitted to enter any grand stand, pavilion, or other building, or any enclosure within the reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
2. No person shall be permitted to discharge firearms within the reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
3. No person shall be allowed to cart any material through or within the reserve, or remove any turf or other material from any part thereof, nor shall any loaded dray, cart, or waggon be driven through or within the reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
4. No person shall ride, drive, wheel, or propel any horse or carriage through or within the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other stations a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oats, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oats hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.
2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.
3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.
4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.
6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

## TENDERS FOR GRAZING LANDS.

Tenders must be sent in on proper form, which can be obtained on application to the Lands Department, Melbourne, or any of the Survey Offices in the country.

Tenders must be placed in the Crown Lands Office Tender-box not later than Twelve noon on Wednesday, 30th December, 1903.

*NOTE.—No tender will be accepted unless the fee for the period from 1st January, 1904, to 30th June, 1904, and fee of Five shillings for licence, are forwarded with the tender.*

TENDERS will be received by the Board of Land and Works up to Twelve noon on Wednesday, 30th December, 1903, for the occupation, for grazing purposes only, of the following unappropriated portions of land, subject to the Regulations approved by the Governor in Council and also the subjoined special conditions.

Every licence granted under section 187 of the *Land Act 1901* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto and to such special conditions and payment in advance of such fee as the Minister may determine, and shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized in that behalf.

## Conditions.

1. The issue of this licence shall not prevent the land comprised therein, or any part or parts thereof, being sold, leased, licensed, alienated, or dealt with under any of the provisions of the *Land Acts*, except under the 187th section of the *Land Act 1901*, or being resumed by order of the Governor or Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, for any of the purposes for which land may be reserved under section 10 of the *Land Act 1901*, or for mining purposes.
2. In case the said land, or any part thereof, should be sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation other than that which the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Land Acts* may think fit.
3. This licence is subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine thereon, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation to the licensee, his executors, administrators, or assigns, for surface or other damage.
4. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purpose for which this licence has been granted, until such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid, and thereupon all the interest of the licensee therein shall cease and be determined.
5. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this licence shall be deemed within its operation.
6. This licence shall entitle the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but shall not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or, without the permission of the Minister, fence any portion thereof, or construct a dam or tank.
- 6A. That in the event of the Minister granting permission to fence the whole or any part of this area, the licensee shall provide gates or slip panels in suitable places for the convenience of the public. No compensation will be allowed for fencing erected on boundaries of allotments alienated or in course of alienation.
