- 2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 fs. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings.
- 3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allot-ment or piece of land shall pay less than Five shillings (5s.)
- 4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed

would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge with the minimum charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1904 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket. grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under,

each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpenco (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent, on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic; manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20):

for each oftence to a pennity not exceeding I wanty pounds (£20):

13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap; water-trough; or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a pennity not exceeding. Twenty pounds (£20)

14. No person shall use any water for the purpose of irrigating or watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation.

wherever growing; by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit at any time other than between the hours of Five a.m. and Nine p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit shall; whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

If any person supplied with wafer by the Trust does or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done, for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misteasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust, and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the sirphy so long as file cause or injury reinains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all times, between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the Water Act 1896, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, by the Trust in order to inspect the meters, instruments, prpes, and apparatus, for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5): The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cense to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected. permittéd and effected.

17. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the said year 1904. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly, or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts 1890-1900 the Chairman and Commissioners of the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say :-

2. No person shall place any check or block in any Trust channel, nor cut or open any channel bank, nor make any outlet from the works of the Trust without its written authority or otherwise than under the supervision of and to

the satisfaction of its authorized officer.

Any person who shall check or block any channel, cut the banks thereof, or make any outlet without the authority of the Trust, or in any other manner than that authorized by its officers, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of

its officers, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for every such breach.

3. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times and in such manner as the Trust or its duly authorized officers shall direct, priority being given in all cases to applications for stock and domestic supply over those for irrigation. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the times or dates on which it will be delivered to him, and the delivery dates on which it will be delivered to him, and the delivery shall continue at night and on Sundays as well as on ordinary

shall continue at night and on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

4. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authority of the Trust or of its engineer, or any person acting under his instructions. Any person not being duly authorized, as in the last preceding clause, who shall open any outlet or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for every such breach.

5. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the purpose of filling dams or tanks shall be as follows:—

7. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of water than is equal to the value of Ten shillings (10s.).

8. A watering shall be taken to mean the supply from the Trust's channels of Fifteen thousand (15,000) cubic feet per acre, being an estimated depth of Four (4) inches above the surface, or any less quantity. Any excess in quantity per acre over 15,000 cubic feet will be charged pro ratã.

9. No person at any one time shall be allowed to irrigate more than an area of Thirty (30) acres unless at such time there be a surplus of water in the channels.

10. The rates or charges for water for dam-filling or irrigation purposes supplied to any property or land which is not

within the Trust area shall be double those mentioned in preceding clauses 6 and 7 of this Regulation.

11. The charges for water supplied shall become due and payable on demand immediately such water has been received.

12. No water will be supplied to any person who is owing

money to the Trust for water previously supplied.

13. All persons, before agreeing to take water from the Trust's channels, are to construct proper drains or channels to convey it to their tanks or dams or to the area which they propose to irrigate, and in the event of any waste of water occurring on the route of such drains and channels the same shall be charged to and be paid by such persons wasting the

water, the same as if they had received it on their properties.

The Trust or its officers may in any case refuse to supply water to any person until a proper drain or channel is made

and provided.

14. No person shall interfere with any sluice, check, outlet, or other arrangement for regulating the supply of water in or from the Trust's channels or works, or shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, under a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for any such breach of this Regu-

lation.

15. In the event of the Trust being unable, from failure of to be even of the I rust being unable, from failure of the works or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price paid or agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust will not be answerable for any damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf. that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered

coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.
