KING'S REGULATION TO AMEND THE SOLOMONS (LABOUR) REGULATION, 1897.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO REGULATE THE RETURNING OF LABOURERS TO THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS ON THE EXPIRATION OF THE TERM OF THEIR ENGAGEMENTS.

(L.S.) H. M. JACKSON.

Application of sections 11 and 12 of 1897 Regulation. 1. The provisions of sections 11 and 12 of the Solomon's (Labour) Regulation 1897, hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulation, shall apply to vessels visiting the Protectorate for the purpose of returning labourers whose terms of engagement have expired, as well as to vessels intending to recruit labour. Such vessels shall call first at the Government Station at Tulagi and report to the Resident Commissioner, and shall carry out the landing of the returning labourers in accordance with his instructions or those of the agent appointed by him under the principal Regulation.

To form part of 1897 Regulation. 2. This Regulation shall be deemed to form part of and be read as one with the principal Regulation.

Date of coming into force. 3. This Regulation shall come into force on the first day of December, 1903, and may be cited as short title. the "Solomon's (Labour) Regulation 1903."

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE PROCLAMATION TO LIMIT SIZE OF MESH OF NETS TO BE USED FOR THE PURPOSE OF TAKING FISH.

It is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to make and publish in the *Government Gazette*, under section 38 of the *Fisheries Act 1890*, a Proclamation, prescribing that on and after the expiry of two years from the date of such Proclamation the mesh of nets used for the purpose of taking fish be not less than one and one-quarter inches from knot to knot, except at the bunt of any net, such bunt not to be longer than two and a half fathoms, and the mesh thereof to be of any size.

GULF ST. VINCENT—PORT VINCENT.

MASTERS of vessels and others are hereby informed that two pile beacons have been placed to mark the channel leading to the jetty at the above port, viz. :—

On the starboard hand entering a pile beacon with round head, painted red, has been placed on the western slope of the cutting in 5ft. 6in., L.W.S., distant 1,400 feet from the jetty, and on the port hand entering, distant 700 feet from the jetty, a pile beacon with diamond-shaped head, painted black, has been placed in 4ft. 6in. of water L.W.S.

To enter, bring the red beacon to bear S.S.W., steer for it, and passing it at a distance of 15 feet, bring the black beacon a point on the port bow, and passing it at a distance of about 20 feet, steer for the N.E. corner of the jetty until in the swinging basin at the jetty.

**SHEPPARTON URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—
RATING REGULATION FOR 1904.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, and of all powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

Regulation for determining the rates and charges which shall be made for water supplied within the boundaries of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust District and for other purposes.

1. A rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling on the municipal value of all rateable property valued at Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) and upwards, situated within the Waterworks District of the Shepparton Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1904.

2. The minimum rate for such year in respect of properties valued at less than Thirteen pounds six shillings and eightpence (£13 6s. 8d.) sterling on the municipal value shall be Twenty shillings.

3. On each unoccupied allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned, separately from any building, the annual rate of Five pounds sterling per cent. on the amount of the annual valuation of same shall be charged, provided that no allotment or piece of land shall pay less than Five shillings (5s.) per annum.

4. Water supplied by measure to be used in private domiciles or other premises for domestic use, or for the irrigation or watering of private gardens, or distribution on or about such premises, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to an amount equal to that the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any such premises, and at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used for the before-mentioned purposes beyond such an amount aforesaid.

5. For every steam boiler supplied with water by the Trust, the charge shall be the sum of Twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per annum for each horse-power (actual) of such steam boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use, where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In cases where the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measurement shall be made at the same rate as provided in clause four (4) hereof.

6. For water supplied for manufacturing purposes (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), the charge will be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than equal to One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the municipal valuation of the shire of Shepparton for the year 1904 of the property so supplied.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket-grounds, bowling-greens, show-yards, cattle-yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measurement, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) per annum.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipes or hydrants, for each load of two hundred and fifty (250) gallons or under, Sixpence (6d.) shall be charged.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of a new building, repairs, or additions, the charge shall be Twenty shillings (20s.) per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering; or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the said Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement, at the rate provided in clause four (4) hereof. All persons about to build must, if they require a supply of water for building purposes, notify the Trust, and shall not use any water for such purpose until authorized in writing by the Trust so to do.

10. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary.

11. No person shall use or permit to be used on any premises any water for other than domestic, manufacturing, or fire extinguishing purposes, between the hours of Nine p.m. and Five a.m. Any person committing or permitting a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use the same in any manner for irrigation purposes (except where the supply is by meter), shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

13. Any person not having agreed to be supplied with water by the Trust who shall, or who having so agreed shall, contrary to such agreement, use, take, or carry away, or wilfully permit to be used, taken, or carried away, water from any drinking tap, water-trough, or private or public service pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

14. No person shall use any water for the purpose of irrigating or watering any garden, plantation, or vegetation.

wherever growing; by means of any pipe, hose, or other conduit at any time other than between the hours of Five a.m. and Nine p.m., or unless such pipe, hose, or other conduit shall, whilst such water shall be so used, be personally attended by some adult constantly present; and any person committing a breach of this clause shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

15. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes, or wilfully permits to be done, anything in contravention of this Regulation, or fails to do anything which under this Regulation ought to be done, for the prevention of the waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water, or wilfully or negligently allows the water to run to waste, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for every day such misfeasance or nonfeasance shall continue after notice of the offence from the Waterworks Trust, and the Trust may cut off the water supply from the premises of such person or persons by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or otherwise, and may discontinue the supply so long as the cause or injury remains, or is not remedied to the satisfaction of the Trust. Provided that neither this Regulation or anything done hereunder shall in any way lessen or extinguish the rights of the Trust under section 63 (1) of Act No. 1651.

16. The officer or officers of the Trust appointed for that purpose may at all times, between the hours specified in sections 451 and 471 of the Water Act 1896, enter any house, tenement, or land to, through, or into which water is supplied by the Trust in order to inspect the meters, instruments, pipes, and apparatus for measuring, conveying, reception, or storage of water, or for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water supplied or consumed, or examining if there be any waste or misuse of such water; and if any person hinders or prevents examination he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5). The Trust may turn off the water supplied by it from such house or other premises, and cease to supply the same with water until such inspection shall have been permitted and effected.

17. Such rates are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the said year 1904. The charges for the sale of water by measure shall be payable monthly; or at such other time or period as the Trust may in any case determine.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges.

19. The word "person" in these Regulations shall include corporation.

1. The annual charges for water supplied from the works of the Trust to the owners of any private tank or dam within the Shire of Birchip Division shall be One pound for every tank or dam not exceeding in capacity 500 cubic yards.

2. For tanks or dams of a capacity exceeding 500 cubic yards the charge for filling same shall be One pound for the first 500 cubic yards, and a further sum of One pound for each additional 500 cubic yards or portion of 500 cubic yards capacity.

3. No tanks or dams shall be supplied under the foregoing clauses unless and until the charges due therefor are paid, or an approved engagement for the payment of such charges to the Trust be first given by the owner or occupier of the land on which such water storage is situated.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall

be authorized to demand, receive, sue for, and recover such charges.

An annual charge of Five shillings per head shall be made for each head of stock more than two (whether horses or cattle) kept on any premises along the line of mains, unless meters are placed on the service-pipes to such premises, in which case the provision of clause 3 of the general Regulations shall apply.

4. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1904.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

CAMPASPE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts 1890-1900 the Chairman and Commissioners of the Campaspe Irrigation and Water Supply Trust make the Regulation following, that is to say:—

REGULATION No. 2.

The Regulation made by the Trust on the 20th day of October, 1893, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 21st day of November, 1893, and numbered one (1) is hereby repealed.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for filling tanks or dams, or for irrigating, shall be paid for by measure, unless where otherwise provided for in this Regulation. All measurements will be made by the officers appointed by the Trust.

2. No person shall place any check or block in any Trust channel, nor cut or open any channel bank, nor make any outlet from the works of the Trust without its written authority or otherwise than under the supervision of and to the satisfaction of its authorized officer.

Any person who shall check or block any channel, cut the banks thereof, or make any outlet without the authority of the Trust, or in any other manner than that authorized by its officers, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for every such breach.

3. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times and in such manner as the Trust or its duly authorized officers shall direct, priority being given in all cases to applications for stock and domestic supply over those for irrigation. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the times or dates on which it will be delivered to him, and the delivery shall continue at night and on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

4. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authority of the Trust or of its engineer, or any person acting under his instructions. Any person not being duly authorized, as in the last preceding clause, who shall open any outlet or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling (£5) for every such breach.

5. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the purpose of filling dams or tanks shall be as follows:—

(a) For the filling of a tank or dam between the 1st of May and the 30th of September in each year—

6. The rate or price to be paid for water supplied from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be as follows:—

(a) For irrigation between the 1st day of May and the 30th day of September—

Cereals and fodder crops	1s. per acre
Grass and lucerne	6d. per acre
Orchards	1s. per acre

(b) For irrigation between the 1st day of October and the 30th day of April—

Cereals and fodder crops	2s. per acre
Grass and lucerne	1s. per acre
Orchards	2s. per acre

7. No person shall be supplied with a lesser quantity of water than is equal to the value of Ten shillings (10s.).

8. A watering shall be taken to mean the supply from the Trust's channels of Fifteen thousand (15,000) cubic feet per acre, being an estimated depth of Four (4) inches above the surface, or any less quantity. Any excess in quantity per acre over 15,000 cubic feet will be charged *pro rata*.

9. No person at any one time shall be allowed to irrigate more than an area of Thirty (30) acres unless at such time there be a surplus of water in the channels.

10. The rates or charges for water for dam-filling or irrigation purposes supplied to any property or land which is not

within the Trust area shall be double those mentioned in preceding clauses 6 and 7 of this Regulation.

11. The charges for water supplied shall become due and payable on demand immediately such water has been received.

12. No water will be supplied to any person who is owing money to the Trust for water previously supplied.

13. All persons, before agreeing to take water from the Trust's channels, are to construct proper drains or channels to convey it to their tanks or dams or to the area which they propose to irrigate, and in the event of any waste of water occurring on the route of such drains and channels the same shall be charged to and be paid by such persons wasting the water, the same as if they had received it on their properties.

The Trust or its officers may in any case refuse to supply water to any person until a proper drain or channel is made and provided.

14. No person shall interfere with any sluice, check, outlet, or other arrangement for regulating the supply of water in or from the Trust's channels or works, or shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, under a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for any such breach of this Regulation.

15. In the event of the Trust being unable, from failure of the works or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price paid or agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust will not be answerable for any damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

This Regulation shall take effect on and after the date of its approval by the Governor in Council.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE BAIRNSDALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Bairnsdale Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.
2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
3. All charges must be paid to the secretary when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
4. By the 23rd section of the *Cemeteries Act 1890* any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to maintain and keep up a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or representatives for ever.
5. Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying on payment of the charges set forth in Schedule A.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced satisfactory to the trustees that the relatives or friends of such persons are unable to pay the cost and charges.
7. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery on the day previous to the interment.
8. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick vaults or other graves will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees.
9. That between every grave site there shall be a space of not less than 1 foot, and between every family vault site or between every grave site and family vault site, a space of not less than 2 feet.
10. When giving the order for interment a form of application for burial, containing the name, age, and late place of residence of the deceased, which will be provided, and must be filled up, when practicable, and entered in the interment book.
11. The time fixed for the funeral to be at the cemetery must be strictly adhered to.
12. The hours fixed for interments will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m., in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months.
13. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
14. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
15. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who may withhold permission, and prevent the erection of any monument, stone, tomb, pedestal,

epitaph, or inscription which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming, and shall determine and fix the position of such stone, tomb, monument, or pedestal which may be proposed to be erected according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

16. Any fence, if not kept in proper repair, may be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.

17. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

18. The ground will be open to the public daily from sunrise to sunset.

19. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected by any person during business hours.

20. The trustees reserve the right to add to and make any alterations from time to time in the regulations.

21. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

22. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

23. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

24. All graves to be a depth of 6 feet, but if it is anticipated to put another adult body in the same grave, the grave in the first instance should be 7 feet.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF THE BOORHAMAN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, the Trustees of the Boorhaman Public Cemetery make the following Rules and Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted) from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given,

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burial shall be—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays throughout the year from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent in writing of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. 7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.
8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
