By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I**N pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Half-Holidays, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon on each day, at the places respectively mentioned, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 6TH DAY OF MAY, 1903, at Casterton;  
WEDNESDAY, THE 13TH DAY OF MAY, 1903, at Rochester;

## NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

### BENALLA AND YARRAWONGA ELECTORAL DISTRICT.

**A**N Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

The application is to be addressed as follows:—

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

**Caution.**—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

The births of 1,049 children, viz., 519 of boys and 530 of girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of March. The number was, it will be observed, the lowest recorded for the month during the previous ten years, except 1902, and 116 below the average of March during that period, and 192 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in March numbered 597, viz., 320 of males and 277 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 452, or 76 per cent., as against 65 per cent. in 1902, and 84 per cent. according to the average. The number was, it will be noticed, the highest recorded for the month since 1899. It was, however, 37 below the average of March during that period, and 79 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 24.57, and of deaths registered to 13.99 per annum, as compared respectively with averages of the same month in 1902 of 22.82 and 13.80, with averages of the month during the last ten years of 28.64 and 15.70, and with averages of the year 1902 of 24.85 and 14.93.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 99.3° on the 2nd, and the lowest was 43.2° on the 24th. The mean temperature of the month (64.3°) was 1.7° above the average. The greatest range of the

thermometer in any one day (42.5°) took place on the 1st, and the least range (8°) on the 12th. The mean daily range was 21.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.253 inches on the 25th, and the lowest was 29.442 inches on the 8th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.873 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on nine days, the amount being 2.03 inches, which was much higher than the quantity recorded for the month during the first six, but less than that in the last four years of the past decade, and was over half-an-inch above the average.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

The mean humidity of the month was 700.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 32 per cent. to that mortality, as against 31 per cent. in March, 1902; 33 per cent. in March, 1901; 26 per cent. in March, 1900; 40 per cent. in March, 1899; 43 per cent. in March, 1898; 33 per cent. in March, 1897; 38 per cent. in March, 1896; 37 per cent. in March, 1895; 42 per cent. in March, 1894; and 48 per cent. in March, 1893.

The deaths of infants under twelve months numbered 153, as compared with 144 in March, 1902. The rate of infantile mortality was 151 per 1,000 births registered in the month under review, as compared with 148 in March, 1902; 126 in March, 1901; 116 in March, 1900; 165 in March, 1899; 174 in March, 1898; 124 in March, 1897; 143 in March, 1896; 137 in March, 1895; 149 in March, 1894; and 186 in March, 1893.

Sixty-three persons—as against 70 in March, 1902—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a stonemason, aged 75, died of paralysis; a female, aged 75, of pericarditis; a gentleman, aged 75, of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 75, of cancer; a female, aged 76, of cholera; an ex-school teacher and a watchman, each aged 76, of heart disease; a storekeeper, aged 76, of asthma; two females, each aged 76, of bronchitis and hepatitis respectively; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy; an agent, aged 77, of dilatation of the heart; a traveller, aged 77, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 77, of Bright's disease; a labourer, aged 78, of atheroma; two females, each aged 79, of paralysis and syncope respectively; a gentleman and a female, each aged 80, of cancer; a master mariner, aged 80, of paralysis; a grazier, aged 80, of pleurisy; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of Bright's disease; a farmer, aged 81, of pneumonia; a female, aged 81, of gastritis; two females, each aged 82, of heart disease and enteritis respectively; a mason, aged 82, of Bright's disease; a station manager, aged 83, of paralysis; a cutter, aged 83, of syncope; three females, each aged 83, of syncope, bronchitis, and gastritis respectively; a female, aged 83, of hemiplegia; a male of no occupation, aged 85, of inflammation of the lungs; a female, aged 85, of enteritis; a female, aged 86, and a gentleman, aged 87, of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 88, of cystitis; a male of no occupation, aged 89, of thrombosis; a gentleman, aged 89, of atheroma; a female, aged 90, of hernia; another, aged 95, of syncope; a groom and a labourer, each aged 75, a carpenter and a female, each aged 78, a mason and a labourer, each aged 79, a confectioner and an engineer, each aged 80, a shipwright, aged 82, a carter and two females, each aged 83, a journalist and a female, each aged 84, a carrier, aged 85, and two females, each aged 87, of old age.

Twenty-nine of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 23 in March, 1902—were from external causes, of which 18 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 9 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—Two labourers, aged 22 and 68 respectively, were passed over by railway trains; a carter, aged 35, a dairyman, aged 39, and a female, aged 27, died of injuries, consequent on falls, from a dray, cart, and buggy respectively; a bootmaker, aged 69, of fracture of the skull, and a female, aged 40, of extravasation of blood on the brain, caused in each case by falling down stairs; a lamp trimmer, aged 54, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from the gangway of a ship; a labourer, aged 60, of injuries, caused by a fall into a ship's hold; a salesman, aged 29, of fracture of the skull, and a labourer, aged 55, of extravasation of blood on the brain, consequent on falls; a boy, aged 7, of compression of the brain; a male of no occupation, aged 16, and a female, aged 9, of traumatic tetanus; a female, aged 10, of burns; a labourer, aged 23, was drowned in Hobson's Bay; a male of occupation unknown, aged 40, was found drowned in the River Yarra; and a male of no occupation, aged 53, was suffocated by food. The homicidal deaths were those of a male child, aged six weeks, who died of fracture of the skull; and a new-born female infant, who was suffocated. The suicidal deaths were those of a medical practitioner, aged 35, and a blacksmith, aged 30, who shot themselves; a bootmaker, aged 63, and two labourers, aged 50 and 84 respectively, who cut their throats; a fruiterer, aged 68, who poisoned himself with strychnine; an engine-driver, aged 32, a boot finisher, aged 55, and a miner, aged 68, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirteen deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 190, of which 91, or 48 per cent., were of males, and 99, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 153 were under one year of age, 26 were between one and two, 2 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 407. Of these 229, or 56 per cent., were males, and 178, or 44 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 14 were between ten and fifteen, 15 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 25 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 27 were between thirty-five and forty, 33 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 21 were between fifty and fifty-five, 23 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 35 were between sixty-five and seventy, 47 were between seventy and seventy-five, 27 were between seventy-five and eighty, 23 were between eighty and eighty-five, 11 were between eighty-five and ninety, 1 at the age of ninety, and 1 at the age of ninety-five.

There was but little variation in the causes of death as compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year. Under the head of zymotic diseases, the only noticeable difference was that the epidemic of whooping-cough prevalent in March, 1902, had practically died out—the deaths having fallen from 12 to 1, and this was accompanied by a decrease in the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases from 16 to 11, as against which an increase from 6 to 10 occurred under the head of typhoid fever. Under the constitutional class, deaths from other forms of tuberculosis rose from 5 to 10, whilst those from tubercular meningitis fell from the circulatory system diminished by 20, and those from diseases of the respiratory system increased by 28; whilst those from diseases of the respiratory system diminished by 20, and those from diseases of the respiratory system by 5.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria, typhoid fever, and tubercular diseases in each month of the years 1897 to 1902, and the first three months of 1903, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods from July to November.

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.

REGULATION for the Sale of Water for the Year commencing 1st January, 1903, and ending 31st December, 1903.

REGULATION No. 28.

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lands shall be paid for by measure. The forms of measurement shall be and are hereunder determined by the Trust. The price or rate to be charged for water delivered from the River Murray, Gunbower Creek, Deep Creek, or the Barr Creek through the Trust channels or otherwise, shall be as follows:—

2. For water delivered by gravitation or by pumps, when the River Murray is from three (3) feet to ten (10) feet above summer level, for cereals, amber cane, lucerne, and fallow, the charge shall be Eightpence (8d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering; for indigenous grasses when the River Murray is from three (3) to ten (10) feet above summer level, the charge shall be Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre; 3 inches to be considered a watering.

3. For water supplied by pumps or by gravitation for all kinds of crops, fallow, and grass, when the River Murray is less than 3 feet above summer level, the charge shall be Tenpence (10d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering.

Gravitation Water.

4. That when the River Murray is more than ten (10) feet above summer level, the charge for cereals, lucerne, amber cane, and fallow shall be Fourpence (4d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering.

That when the River Murray is more than ten (10) feet above summer level, the charge for indigenous grasses shall be Twopence (2d.) per inch per acre, 3 inches to be considered a watering.

**Tanks.**

For filling tanks inside of Trust area.—No charge shall be made.

For filling tanks outside of Trust area.—When the River Murray is less than ten (10) feet above summer level, a charge of Two pounds (£2) for each tank shall be made; and when the River Murray is ten (10) feet and more above summer level, a charge of One pound (£1) for each tank shall be made.

**Garden Rights.**

5. The rate or price for the irrigation of orchards or gardens shall be One pound (£1) per acre per annum, commencing 1st January, 1903, and ending 31st December, 1903.

Such right gives the owner the privilege of irrigating in a reasonable manner, not involving waste, the orchard or garden as often as the water is available. The Trust will use all reasonable efforts to make water available during the months of January, February, March, and December.

6. Persons taking out a garden right for the purpose of watering any lands other than orchards or gardens will be charged One pound (£1) per acre per annum, and shall be limited to 20 acres.

Such right carries the same privileges as orchards or vegetable gardens rights.

**Minimuns.**

7. For irrigation inside of Trust area.—For cereals, amber cane, fallow, and grass, the minimum charge shall be Ten shillings.

For irrigation outside of Trust area, the minimum charge shall be One pound (£1).

8. For garden rights inside of Trust area, One pound (£1) shall be the minimum charge; and outside of Trust area, the minimum charge shall be Two pounds (£2).

The gauging of the River Murray to be taken at the Head-works of the Trust.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by provision of the Water Acts, this 12th day of February, 1903.

**DEVIATION OF A ROAD IN THE PARISH OF BEENAK.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of April, 1903.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1891* (55 Vict. No. 1243) it is amongst other things enacted that if the council of any municipality prove to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable that any road should be deviated, and that such deviation can be conveniently made through Crown land or land held by licensees or pastoral lessees under the *Land Act 1890*, the Minister may cause such road to be deviated accordingly at the cost of the municipality; and that upon the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order of the Governor in Council declaring the new road a public highway, any portion of the old road mentioned in that behalf in such Order shall cease to be a public highway, but shall remain subject to the right of way and passage to and from any premises which cannot be as conveniently approached from the new road; and that, subject as aforesaid, such old road, or so much thereof as adjoins the allotments or areas of the licensees or lessees (if any) through whose allotments or areas the new road has been carried, shall be added to their allotments or areas in proportion to the amount of land taken from each, and shall be accepted by them as full compensation for any loss or damage suffered through the deviation of the road, and that the Minister shall make the distribution accordingly: And whereas it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it is desirable to deviate a certain road in the parish of Beenak: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby declare the road defined in the following description to be a public highway (that is to say):—

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE,  
PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE  
KANIVA RECREATION RESERVE.

WE, William James Powell, Thomas Robert Crouch, Robert Eglinton, David Harris, and Edward Laxton, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the parish of Kaniva, having framed the following Supplementary Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall be permitted to ride a bicycle in the reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 (Five pounds) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 (Ten pounds).

REGULATION No. 10.

A Regulation of the Borough of St. Arnaud made under the 1st section of Part 5 of the Thirteenth schedule to the *Local Government Act 1890*, in force in the said borough by virtue of a by-law of the above-named borough, numbered 52. For repealing Regulation No. 8 of the said Borough, and for prohibiting and restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs or chimneys, flues, smoke vents or stove pipes hereinafter called in common "chimneys."

IN pursuance of the *Local Government Act 1890*, the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the Borough of St. Arnaud, make the Regulation following:—

1. *Materials to be used in building.*—The external and party walls of all buildings hereafter erected must be built of brick or stone, or of such bricks and stones together laid in with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work.

2. *Materials to be used in rebuilding.*—If any external walls now erected be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by this regulation directed for external walls must be taken down and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and of such materials for and in all respects as by this regulation directed for external walls hereafter to be built.

3. *Construction and materials of chimneys.*—Every chimney hereafter built, raised, or repaired, must be carried up from the foundation to the top thereof in brick or stone work laid in good mortar or cement all round to a height of not less than three feet above the highest part of such portion of the roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction.

4. *Materials for roof coverings.*—The external parts of any roof, flat, or gutter of any building or of any projection therefrom, and of any turret, dormer, lantern light, verandah, or portico or other erection on the roof or flat of any building hereafter built or rebuilt, stripped, ripped, or uncovered (except the door frames and doors, window frames and sashes of such turrets, dormers, lantern lights, or other erections), must be covered with slates, tiles, lead, galvanized, corrugated iron, glass, artificial stone or cement, and such excepted parts may be made of such wood as shall be necessary.

5. *Notice of intention to build.*—No person shall commence any building or any addition or alteration to any building without delivering at the borough surveyor's office a written notice

thereof two days before commencing, and producing, if required by the surveyor, plans and specifications of such building, addition, or alteration.

6. *Application of Regulation.*—This regulation shall apply to that part of the above mentioned borough comprised within the following boundaries, parish of St. Arnaud, county of Kara Kara: Commencing at the east angle of section L; thence by the north-west boundary of Inkerman street, bearing north forty-nine degrees thirteen minutes west one chain; thence west forty-nine degrees thirteen minutes north twenty-four chains sixty-four links (more or less) to the boundary line between allotments 3 and 4 of section S; thence west thirty degrees nineteen minutes north three chains five links (more or less) to the south-east boundary of Mill-street; thence by that boundary bearing north forty-nine degrees thirteen minutes east four chains; thence east forty-nine degrees thirteen minutes south twenty-seven chains thirty-five links (more or less) to the north-west boundary of Inkerman-street; thence by that boundary bearing south forty-nine degrees thirteen minutes west two chains to the point of commencement.
