PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE SYDENHAM CLARKE, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS certain persons have by combining and acting together endeavoured to intimidate certain other of His Majesty's subjects, and to unlawfully restrain them from serving the State in carrying on the Railway Service: And whereas divers persons acting together as aforesaid have intimidated and assaulted and encouraged others in intimidating and assaulting persons rendering loyal service to the State: And whereas such persons so acting together have committed various offences against the law, and have committed various injuries to the property of the State.

Now therefore be it known to all such persons that they are liable to prosecution for so offending, and that after the making of this Proclamation all persons illegally assembling together and committing a breach of the peace or otherwise violating the law will be rigorously prosecuted; and it is hereby notified that the civil authorities have strict orders to maintain and secure the public peace and to apprehend any persons offending herein that they may be dealt with according to law.

And all persons are strictly cautioned to avoid assembling in the streets or at or in the neighbourhood of railway stations, yards, bridges, or any places of access to such stations, yards, or bridges, but are called upon to protect and assist in protecting people pursuing their lawful callings from outrage and molestation and to help in maintaining law and order.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and three, and in the third year of His Majesty's reign.
