NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

NORTH-EASTERN PROVINCE.

A N Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election. Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Posla of Poll.





4. Any person roceiving water from the Trust who shall allow such water to be taken or carried away by, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not liable to be rated, and not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, who shall take or carry away water from any stand-pipe, trough, or private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. All service-pipes and fittings must be provided by the persons requiring such service, and must be of galvanized wrought iron of the best quality, and approved by the Trust. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be perintted, and the maxinum size of such pipe shall be \frac{1}{2}-in. bore, except by special consent of the Trust.

7. All service-pipe connexions with the mains of the Trust shall be made in such a manner and at such a time and place as the Trust by its officers may direct, and any person, whether licensed (as hereinafter provided) or not, who shall open any ground to uncover any pipes or mains of the Trust, or tap any main or make any connexion therewith, without permission of the Trust in writing being first obtained, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. Any person who shall unlawfully or carelessly tamper with, or break, injure, or open any look, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person who shall lay down or fix any pipe, cock, valve, or other fitting to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a size, strength, or material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, a further pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, a further pounds, or Trust of the Trust.

10. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any of the ma

11. Such licence shall be for one year only, and be renowable from time to time as the Trust may deem fit, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employés, committing any breach of these by-laws.

In cases where tenements are unoccupied, and the owner cannot be readily found, the Trust may order the supply to be cut off, or have the necessary repairs effected, and charge the cost to the owner of such tenement.

No person shall use the water supplied by the Trust by measure, rate, or otherwise for other than strictly domestic ness between the hours of Eight p. m. on Saturdays and E ght a.m. on Mandays, and between the hours of half-past Eight p.m. and Six a.m. on other days, and any person offending against this bylaw shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

18. Baths supplied from the pipes of the Trust shall not exceed 6ft. Sin. in length, 2 feet in width, and 1ft. Sin. in depth. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted.

19. Where the Trust supplies water to buildings, tanks, or other places not valued for municipal rating, the Trust may make such a charge for water so supplied as it may deem reasonable.

20. The minimum annual charge for water supplied, whether by measure, rate, or otherwise, shall be One pound.

A special charge of Three shillings and four pence per 100 square yards will be made; maximum area, 300 square yards. - 4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or gates, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 5. No person shall put into the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, or pigs, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee or Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the board of Land and Works.
- 6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure, for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the Land Act 1991, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who knowingly and willfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.
