TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES.—COUNTY COURT JUDGES AND PROSECUTORS FOR THE KING.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria in Council has, by an Order made on the 21st day of July, 1903, approved that County Court Judges and Prosecutors for the King be allowed travelling expenses at the rate of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) and One pound (£1) respectively for each day of 24 hours, out of which they are to pay all hotel, cab, portage, and other personal expenses; a railway pass to be provided for each, and coach fares or hire of private conveyance where no train is available to be allowed; when the service includes portions of days the personal allowances to be proportionately reduced.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

NORTH-EASTERN PROVINCE.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. J. DE SAXE AND CO.,
UMBRELLA MANUFACTURERS, 277 FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,
for a period of four weeks from the 16th July, 1903, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :-

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than thirty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

They will be subjected to a strict medical examination before being finally selected, and, in addition, will have to undergo another medical examination when they are called in for appointment.

Any candidate found making a false statement to the medical officer will be struck off the list, or, if appointed to the Force prior to the discovery of such false statement, he will be immediately discharged therefrom.

Candidates must be able to read and write well, and must indispensably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Each candidate must also produce his discharge from the contingent in which he served.

Successful candidates will be enrolled on the condition that their names will be removed from the list should they attain the age of 25 years before they are required for service.

Pensions in the Police Force having been abolished, candidates must effect an insurance on their lives before they can be sworn in.

Meat Supervision Acts.

REGULATIONS FOR THE BRANDING OF CARCASSES OR MEAT IN THE MEAT AREA OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF GEELONG.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Meat Supervision Acts, and of all other powers it enabling in that behalf, the Board of Public Health of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

Carcasses or meat, whether fresh, frozen, dried, preserved, or chilled, shall be branded with a brand which, in the case of the whole of the animal having been examined prior to the branding, shall be in the form of a circle, and, in the case of only a part of the animal having been examined prior to the branding, shall be in the form of a triangle, the circle having a diameter of one inch and a half, and the triangle having sides each one inch and a quarter long, the outline of the circle and that of the triangle being broken at fifteen places evenly distributed, and enclosing Roman capital letters G. over T.C. not less than three-sixteenths of an inch in height, and arranged in two parallel lines, the first letter forming the upper line and the rest forming the lower line.

In the case of the carcass or meat being branded under direction of the Board, the letters on the brand shall be B.P.H. similarly arranged.

The branding shall leave a distinctly seared and legible mark on the carcass or meat, showing the circle or the triangle, as the case may be, the points, and the letters.

The brand shall be applied to the following parts, viz.:—

- A. In the case of beef, on the upper surface of the tongue, and on each side of the carcass—
- (1) On the outside of the buttock;
 - (2) On the flank;
 - (3) On the outside of the ribs; and
 - (4) On the inside of the ribs near the backbone.

- B. In the case of veal if the carcass has been flayed, then on each side of the carcass—
- (1) On the outside of the buttock;
 - (2) On the flank; and
 - (3) On the outside of the ribs or on the inside of the ribs near the backbone.

- C. In the case of mutton and lamb—on the shoulders and legs.

- D. In the case of pork—on each side of the carcass, on the cheek, the hand, the loin, and the leg.

- E. In the case of a non-flayed carcass—on the breast and leg.

**WATER SUPPLY TO PORTION OF THE EASTERN
MALLEE.—LONG LAKE PUMPING SCHEME.**

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Long Lake Water Supply Act 1902*, No. 1808, it is provided that for the purpose of supplying water to the area—as such area is defined by section 2 of the said Act—for stock and domestic purposes, it shall be lawful for the Board of Land and Works, out of such moneys as may be legally available for such purpose, and at such times, and in such manner, and subject to such directions as the Governor in Council may order, to construct all such works at Long Lake as may be necessary, including main distributary channels therefrom.

And whereas by section 2 of the said Act it is provided that the word "area" means so much of the mallee country and mallee border as defined in the *Land Act 1901*, containing about six hundred square miles in the county of Tatchera as can be supplied with water for stock and domestic purposes from the main distributary channels, and as may from time to time be defined by an Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct and order the Board of Land and Works, under and in pursuance of the provisions of the aforesaid Act, and for the purpose thereof, to construct the works at Long Lake and main distributary channels therefrom as hereinafter described, which said channels are hereby declared to be main distributary channels.

Works.—A channel from the Little Murray River to Lake Baker, with regulating sluices and crossing for public traffic; a sluice-gate at the inlet to Lake Baker; the conversion of Lake Baker and Long Lake into water storage basins, and a channel connecting Lake Baker with Long Lake, with regulating sluice, and a pumping plant with necessary appurtenances on the margin of Long Lake.

Main Distributary Channels—Rising Main.—Commencing at the pumping station at Long Lake, in the parish of Kunat Kunat, thence westerly 7 miles 11 chains to a point in the road between allotments 10k and 10m, parish of Koocem, near the township of Guschon.

Southern Channel.—Commencing at the end of the rising main, thence southerly 17 miles 53 chains to a point on the south boundary of allotment 47A, parish of Talgitcha.
