THE REGISTRATION OF BRITISH SUBJECTS IN THE NEW HEBRIDES.

THE following King's Regulation (made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893), to provide for the Registration of British Subjects in the New Hebrides, is published for general information.

KING'S REGULATION

(Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893).

TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF BRITISH SUBJECTS IN
THE NEW HEBRIDES.

(L.S.) H. M. JACKSON.

In this Regulation the term

- Interpretation. "British subject" shall mean (a) any natural born subject of His Majesty the King; and (b) any alien who shall have been duly naturalized in Great Britain or in any British Possession.
- "Registration District" shall mean the islands of the New Hebrides and of the Banks Group.
- "Court" shall mean the Court of His Majesty's Resident Deputy Commissioner for the New Hebrides.

- Object of Regulation. 1. Whereas it is expedient to establish a Registration District for the New Hebrides under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council 1893, and to provide for the registration of British subjects in such District. The Groups of islands known as the New Hebrides and the Banks Group shall therefore form the Registration District of the New Hebrides.
- Registration District.
- Date of coming into force. 2. On and after the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and four the provisions of section 114, Part XIV., of the Pacific Order in Council 1893, as set forth in the Schedule hereto, shall be operative in the Registration District of the New Hebrides.
- Short title. 3. This Regulation shall be cited as "The New Hebrides (Registration) Regulation 1903."

SCHEDULE.

Pacific Order in Council 1893.—Part XIV., Registration.

114. (1) Every British subject resident in a Registration District, being of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, or being married, or a widower or widow, though under that age, must, in every January, register himself at the prescribed Court.

No. 83.—August 5, 1903.—1.

(2) Every British subject not resident in a Registration District, arriving within a Registration District, unless borne on the muster-roll of a British or foreign vessel, must, within one month after arrival, register himself at the prescribed Court.

(3) But this provision does not require any person to register himself oftener than once in a year, beginning 1st January.

(4) The registration of a man comprises the registration of his wife, if living with him; and

(5) The registration of the head, male or female, of a family comprises the registration of all females, being relatives of such head, in whatever degree, living under the same roof with him at the time of his registration.

(6) The Court shall yearly give to each person registered a certificate of registration sealed with its seal.

(7) The name of a wife, if her registration is comprised in her husband's, shall, unless in any case the Court sees reason to the contrary, be indorsed on the husband's certificate.

(8) The names and description of females whose registration is comprised in that of the head of the family shall, unless in any case the Court sees reason to the contrary, be indorsed on the certificate of the head of the family.

(9) Every person on registration shall pay a fee of 2s. 6d.

(10) The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed 5s.

(11) Every person by this provision required to register himself must, unless excused by the Court, attend personally for that purpose at the Court, on each occasion of registration.

(12) If any person fails to comply with the requirements of this Article, and does not excuse his failure to the satisfaction of the Court, he is guilty of an offence against this Order, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, and any Court or authority may, if it thinks fit, decline to recognise him as a British subject.

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

NORTH-EASTERN PROVINCE.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Council is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral Province, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such Province, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

NOTICE TO CANDIDATES FOR EMPLOYMENT IN THE VICTORIAN POLICE FORCE.

AN examination of persons who have served in any Victorian Contingent in South Africa or China, and who are desirous of being employed in the Victorian Police Force, will be held at the Police Depot, St. Kilda-road, Melbourne, at Nine o'clock a.m., on Wednesday, 12th August, 1903.

They will be subjected to a strict medical examination before being finally selected, and, in addition, will have to undergo another medical examination when they are called in for appointment.

Any candidate found making a false statement to the medical officer will be struck off the list, or, if appointed to the Force prior to the discovery of such false statement, he will be immediately discharged therefrom.

Candidates must be able to read and write well, and must indisputably produce satisfactory testimonials of character. Each candidate must also produce his discharge from the contingent in which he served.

Successful candidates will be enrolled on the condition that their names will be removed from the list should they attain the age of 25 years before they are required for service.

Pensions in the Police Force having been abolished, candidates must effect an insurance on their lives before they can be sworn in.

SMALL-POX ON THE SHIP "MARION WOODSIDE."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the ship or vessel *Marion Woodside* has arrived in Victorian waters, having on board a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person other than the passengers for Victoria, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters, shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said vessel, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer.

This Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since 21st July, 1903.

WESTERN APPROACHES TO TORRES STRAIT.

Removal of Proudfoot Shoal Lightship.

NOTICE is hereby given that on and after 31st January, 1904, the light exhibited from the Lightship at Proudfoot Shoal, western approach to Torres Strait, will be discontinued, and the Lightship will be withdrawn.

The shoal patch of 1½ fathoms marked P.D. on charts south-easterly from the Lightship is believed to be identical with the Bramble Patches. There is no evidence to the contrary, the report of its existence being extremely vague.

Masters of vessels approaching Torres Strait from the westward are recommended to get on the parallel of 10° 45' south before reaching the 20-fathom contour, and continue on that parallel until Booby Island is visible bearing north-easterly, then to steer to pass 2 miles to the north of the Island and thence continue as hitherto.

Vessels bound to the westward after passing Booby Island are recommended to steer south-west magnetic 16 miles, then to steer west half south until a safe direction can be made for their destined port.

NOTE.—Booby Island is visible a distance of 14 or 15 miles; the light (a second order) is visible 17 to 19 miles by night from an ordinary ship's bridge.

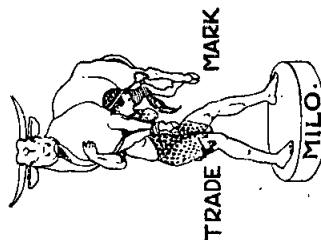

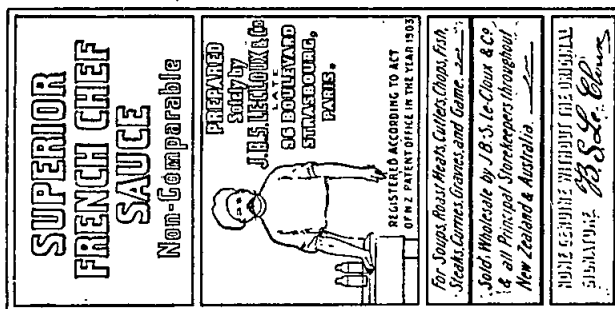

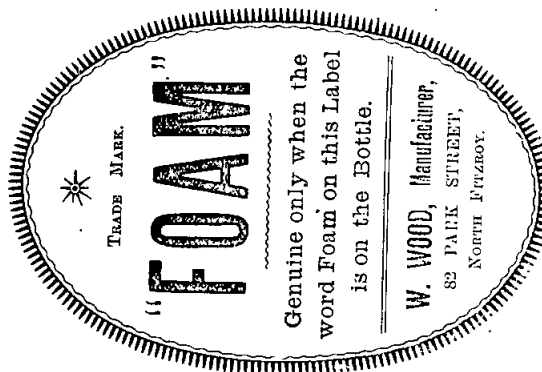

NOTE.—As only a part of the potato crop, viz., 7,787 acres, had been dug when the statistics were collected, an estimate has been made of the remainder of the yield, based on averages deduced from actual information received, in response to circulars, from the principal growers in each county. The average of the 7,787 acres dug prior to the general collection of the statistics was 3.27 tons per acre; and that of 18,816 acres, returned by principal growers after such collection, was 3.42 tons per acre, giving a general average for the whole season of 3.40 tons per acre. Hence the estimate of the total produce is based on the average yield of 26,603 acres—or, over one-half of the whole area.

MANUFACTORIES, WORKS, ETC., AND STONE QUARRIES IN VICTORIA, 1902.

THE following Statement of the Manufactories, Works, &c., and the Quarries, for the year ended 31st December, 1902, is published for general information. The following is the general definition of a factory, agreed to at the conference of statisticians held at Hobart, Tasmania, in January, 1902, on which basis the figures in these tables have been compiled:—"All establishments employing, on the average, four hands or upwards, also those with less than four hands, where machinery is worked by power other than manual, making or repairing for the trade (wholesale or retail), or for export."

Where two or more industries are carried on by one proprietor in one building, each industry is, where possible, treated as a separate establishment.

The collection was, for the first time, made by the Police under the direct supervision of this office, the information having been previously obtained through the municipal authorities; the list of manufacturers was, moreover, compared with and supplemented from that of the Chief Inspector of Factories, which was not available in former years.

Printed forms of tender, showing estimates of requirements and conditions of contract, may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at any of the above-mentioned places, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per ton of 40 cubic feet for firewood, including delivery at the offices and all charges. Prices should only be quoted for requirements where estimates are shown above.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either one or more of the above-mentioned places, and tenders for such places may be accepted or rejected separately; but if all lengths of firewood be included in one tender it may be accepted for one length only, if advisable.

Where the kind or kinds of wood is not mentioned in the tender form, tenderers must specify the kind or kinds of firewood they offer to supply.

Telegrams, or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement, will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for £10, with two approved sureties for the due performance of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Firewood at ..." as the case may be, and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.
2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender: neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet. If the firewood is obtained from a State forest timber reserve, or ordinary Crown lands, persons cutting and removing same must be provided with proper Crown licences for the particular areas concerned.
3. The orders for wood will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.
4. The contractor for wood will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.
5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.
6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.
7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.
8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.
9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

11. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.

No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in cutting or supplying the firewood tendered for in this schedule are not to exceed 48 per week, and every such person shall be paid at a minimum wage of not less than 6s. a day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of these conditions, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from any accounts which are or may be due to the contractor, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement and in all other respects.
