PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Sydenham Clarke, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Fellow of the Royal Society; Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

NOTICE UNDER VOTING BY POST ACT 1900.

ELECTORAL DISTRICT OF TOORAK.

AN Election of a Member of the Legislative Assembly is about to be held in the above-mentioned Electoral District, and any Elector thereof who appears from the rolls to reside in such District, and who resides at least five miles from the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or who has reason to believe that on the polling day he will not be within five miles of the nearest polling booth at which he is entitled to vote, or that on account of ill-health or infirmity he will be prevented from voting personally thereat, who desires to vote through the post office at such Election may, on posting an application to the Returning Officer, obtain a Postal Ballot-paper enabling him to vote through the post at such Election.

Such application shall be as nearly as possible in the following form:—

Printed forms of application may be obtained at any post office, or the application may be in writing.

If applicant is the holder of an elector's right, such right must be attached to application.

Any Elector who intends to vote through the post must apply at once, as no Postal Ballot-paper will be supplied unless the Returning Officer receives application therefor sufficiently early to admit of Postal Ballot-paper being sent to and returned by such Elector so as to reach the Returning Officer before closing of Poll.

Caution.—Any person wilfully making a false statement in an application is liable on conviction to two years' imprisonment.

BENALLA AND SHEPPARTON SHIRES.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1890* (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a petition in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz. :—

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the rate-payers in the portion of the Shire of Benalla described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said Shire of Benalla, and annexed to the Shire of Shepparton as a separate riding.

Area described in petition is as follows :—Commencing on the Broken River where the east boundary of the parish of Pine Lodge abuts thereon; thence north by the said boundary to the south-west angle of the parish of Yabba Yabba; thence east by part of the south boundary of that parish to the western boundary of the tramway from Dookie to Katamatite; thence following said western boundary southerly through part of allotments 212a, 211, 268, 205, 204, and A1 parish of Dookie, to the commencing point of said tramway near the northern boundary of allotment 237 near the terminus of the Shepparton to Dookie railway; thence southerly by a line at right angles to the last line for a distance of 1 chain to the eastern boundary of said tramway; thence northerly by the said eastern boundary through the allotments before mentioned to its intersection with the south boundary of the parish of Yabba Yabba aforesaid; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Yabba Yabba and Waggarandall to a point where allotment 173c abuts on a road 1 chain wide running south; thence on the east by the said road running 2 miles or thereabouts due south; and thence by a reserved road one chain wide, running 8 miles or thereabouts, with a bearing of 9° 27' south-westerly to a point on the Broken River where the west boundary of the parish of Stewarton abuts thereon; thence on the south by the Broken River to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that the area proposed to be severed is too far from Benalla, the seat of government of the Benalla Shire, and, in consequence, are unable to get a resident to represent them; that the area is connected with Shepparton by railway, and that they are more closely connected with that town both geographically and commercially.

The petitioners further state that they have not had a fair proportion of their rates expended on the roads within the area sought to be severed, &c., &c.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the Shire of Benalla above described, and annex same to the Shire of Shepparton as a separate riding.

By-Law No. 19.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under Part VII., Division 2, and Part XXIII. of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered Nineteen for regulating the City Market and the buildings, stalls, and standings therein, for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein or on the immediate approaches thereto, for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held, for regulating the use of the weighing machines provided by the Council, and for preventing the use of false or defective weights, scales, or measures, and for preventing the sale or exposure for sale of unwholesome provisions in the market.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

1. That the market, situate within the City of Footscray, being Crown allotment 44, section 15, parish of Cut-paw paw,

bounded on the west by Crown allotment 43, being a line bearing N. 0° 6' E. three hundred and forty-seven feet two inches; on the north-west by the Geelong-road, three chains wide, being a line bearing N. 48° 10' E. ninety-six feet four inches; on the north-east by Crown allotment 45, being a line bearing S. 41° 50' E. two hundred and forty-one feet one inch; on the east by Crown allotment 46, being a line bearing S. 0° 6' W. two hundred and thirty-two feet four inches; on the south by Barkly-street, one chain wide, being a line bearing N. 89° 54' W. two hundred and thirty-one feet to the commencing point, shall be open for public use on Wednesday in each week from sunrise till noon, and on Saturdays from sunrise till Eleven o'clock p.m. (save and except that the market shall not be open on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, or any other proclaimed or locally proclaimed public holiday), and on and at those days and times only, for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say:—Butchers' meat, pork, poultry, fish, rabbits, game, wild fowl, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seed, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the City Council may allow to be sold in the said market, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale in the said market any article or thing whatever, unless authorized to do so by leave granted by the said council, or by written permit issued by the Market Inspector, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale in the market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale any article or thing in the market on or at any other days or times than the days and times hereinbefore mentioned.

2. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period not exceeding one year, at such rent as they may fix thereon, any shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to re-let the same as often as the period for such letting shall expire or be otherwise determined, and for the good regulation of the said market each and every lease or permit shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for which such shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of article shall be exposed or offered for sale in or on the said shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience than is named or referred to in the said lease or permit, except with the consent in writing of the said council.

3. The said council hereby appoints and fixes the respective sums of money mentioned in Schedule "A" to this by-law as the stallages, rents, tolls, dues, and sums of money which it shall be lawful for the said council to demand, receive, and have of and from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling in such market any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said Schedule "A," or renting or using any stall or standing place in such market, or using any building, place, or machine provided by the said council for the weighing of carts. Provided nevertheless that any person who for three calendar months prior to applying for the privilege shall have been a genuine keeper of a shop situated within the city shall be entitled to a standing in the market for a cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle from or in which to sell or expose or offer for sale any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said Schedule "A" on paying to the said council the sum of One pound per annum, by quarterly instalments in advance, for each cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle, instead of the sums mentioned in the said Schedule "A," and every lease of the whole of the said market, or of the stallages, rents, and tolls payable in respect thereof shall contain a covenant by the lessee to grant to every person on application a lease conferring on such person a similar privilege, so long as such person shall pay to the said lessee the sum of One pound per annum, by quarterly instalments in advance, for each cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle, instead of the sums mentioned in the said Schedule "A."

4. - (1) Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed for opening, or after the times appointed for closing, such market, or on other days than those named for holding such market.
- (2) Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this by-law to be sold there.
- (3) Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any article or thing without having first paid to the Market Inspector the proper stallage, rent, toll, or due payable in respect thereof, or in respect of the shed, shop, site, stall, or standing from, in, or on which such article or thing shall be sold or exposed or offered for sale in the said market.
- (4) Placing any matter or thing in any part of the said market so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the Market Inspector.
- (5) Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Market Inspector.

- (6) Placing any hook, nail, or peg in any part of the market buildings, or showing or affixing any name or the title of any business on or to any shed, shop, site, stall, or standing in such market, or fitting up or enclosing any part of the market without the permission or contrary to the directions of the Market Inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings when requested to do so by the inspector, or defacing or injuring any part of the market buildings.
- (7) Sweeping or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, or passages of the said market, and allowing the same to remain therein or thereon.
- (8) Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.
- (9) In any way obstructing the Market Inspector in the discharge of his duties.
- (10) In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.
6. That the council shall appoint an officer, to be called the Market Inspector, who shall also be Inspector of Provisions, and whose duties shall be generally as follows:—

- (1) To see that the market regulations as provided for in this by-law are duly observed. To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended all persons causing a riot or disturbances, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of such market.
- (2) To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome, and cause the same to be dealt with according to law, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.
- (3) To remove from the said market, or from any place therein to any other place therein, any obstruction, cart, carriage, wheelbarrow, truck, basket, vehicle, hook, nail, peg, sign, signboard, partition, or fittings.
- (4) To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective, and cause the same to be dealt with according to law.
- (5) To collect all stallages, rents, tolls, and dues connected with the market according to the table in the said Schedule "A."
