THE subjoined copy of a Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia is published for general information, together with the Order in Council and the Act therein referred to.

PROCLAMATION

Australia to wit. By His Excellency the Right Honorable Henry Stafford, Baron Northcote, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of the Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by the *Extradition Act 1903*, it is enacted that that Act shall commence on the day on which the Governor-General makes known by Proclamation that the King has by Order in Council directed that that Act, or any part thereof, shall have effect in the Commonwealth as if it were part of the Imperial Act known as the *Extradition Act 1870*: And whereas the King has been pleased by Order in Council dated the 7th day of March, 1904 (a copy whereof is appended hereto), to direct that the *Extradition Act 1903* (in the Order in Council called the *Commonwealth Extradition Act 1903*) shall have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia without modification or alteration as if it were part of the *Extradition Act 1870*: Now therefore I, Henry Stafford, Baron Northcote, the Governor-General aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and make known that His Majesty the King has, by Order in Council, directed that the *Extradition Act 1903* shall have effect in the Commonwealth, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of the *Extradition Act 1870*.

Given under my hand and the seal of the Commonwealth, at Melbourne, this 25th day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and four, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by section 18 of the *Extradition Act 1870*, it is among other things enacted that, if by any law or ordinance made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession provision is made for carrying into

effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, either—

Suspend the operation within any such British Possession of the said Act, or any part thereof, so far as it relates to such foreign State, and so long as such law or ordinance continues in force there and no longer;

Or direct that such law or ordinance, or any part thereof, shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by certain Orders of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that certain Acts respectively enacted by the Legislatures of the Colonies of South Australia, Western Australia, Queensland, Tasmania, and Victoria should have effect in the said Colonies respectively, without modification or alteration, as if they were part of the *Extradition Act 1870*:

And whereas on the 1st day of January, 1901, the Commonwealth of Australia was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the sixty-third and sixty-fourth years of Her late Majesty's reign, shortly entitled *The Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act*, and each of the said Colonies is now a State forming part of the Commonwealth established as aforesaid:

And whereas the Parliament of the Commonwealth is empowered, under the provisions of the said Act, to make laws for the peace, order, and good Government of the Commonwealth with respect to (*inter alia*) the influx of criminals and external affairs:

And whereas the Commonwealth is a "British Possession" within the meaning of section 26 of the *Extradition Act 1870*:

And whereas by an Act enacted by the Parliament of the Commonwealth, the short title of which is the *Extradition Act 1903*, and the provisions of which are fully set forth in the First Schedule appended to this Order, provision has been made for carrying into effect within the Commonwealth the surrender of fugitive criminals who are therein or suspected of being therein:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that the said Act shall commence on the day on which the Governor-General makes known by Proclamation that His Majesty has by Order in Council directed that the said Act, or any part thereof, shall have effect in the Commonwealth as if it were part of the *Extradition Act 1870*:

Now therefore His Majesty, in pursuance of the *Extradition Act 1870*, and in exercise of the powers in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, direct as follows:—

1. The *Commonwealth Extradition Act 1903* shall have effect in the Commonwealth of Australia, without modification or alteration, as if it were part of the *Extradition Act 1870*.
2. The Orders of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council enumerated in the Second Schedule appended hereto are revoked as and from the commencement of the said Act.

SCHEDULE I.

The Commonwealth of Australia Extradition Act 1903.

WHEREAS by the Imperial Act known as the Extradition Act 1870, it is enacted that that Act when applied by Order in Council shall, unless it is otherwise provided by such Order, extend to every British Possession, but with the following among other modifications, namely:—No warrant of a Secretary of State shall be required, and all powers vested in or acts authorized or required to be done under that Act by the police magistrate and the Secretary of State, or either of them, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, may be done by the Governor of the British Possession alone:

And whereas by that Imperial Act it is also enacted that if, by any law made by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within that possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, that possession, the King may by Order in Council direct that such law, or any part thereof, shall have effect in that possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of that Imperial Act:

And whereas by other Imperial Acts known as the Extradition Act 1873 and the Extradition Act 1895, it is enacted that those Acts shall be construed as one with the Extradition Act 1870, and that the three Acts may be cited together as the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895:

Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, the Senate, and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Australia, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Extradition Act 1903.
2. This Act shall commence on the day on which the Governor-General makes known by Proclamation that the King has, by Order in Council, directed that this Act, or any part thereof, shall have effect in the Commonwealth as if it were part of the Extradition Act 1870.
3. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears, terms defined in the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895 have the same meaning as in those Acts.

EXTRADITION FROM THE COMMONWEALTH.

4. All powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a Secretary of State, under the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, are hereby vested in, and may in the Commonwealth be exercised and done by, the Governor-General, and may in any part of the Commonwealth be exercised and done by any deputy of the Governor-General thereto authorized.

5. All powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by a police magistrate or any justice of the peace under the Extradition Acts 1870 to 1895, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal, are hereby vested in, and may in the Commonwealth be exercised and done by, any stipendiary or police or special magistrate of the Commonwealth or of a State, or any magistrate of a State thereto specially authorized by the Governor-General.

EXTRADITION FROM FOREIGN STATES.

6. Where the Extradition Act 1870 applies in the case of any foreign State, a requisition for the surrender of a person, accused or convicted of an extradition crime in the Commonwealth, who is or is suspected to be in that foreign State, may be made by the Attorney-General to a Consular Officer of that State in the Commonwealth, or to any Minister of that State through the Diplomatic Representative of His Majesty in that State, or in such other mode as is settled by arrangement.

7. Any person accused or convicted of an extradition crime who is surrendered by a foreign State may, under the warrant for his surrender issued in the foreign State, be brought into the Commonwealth and delivered to the proper authorities to be dealt with according to law.

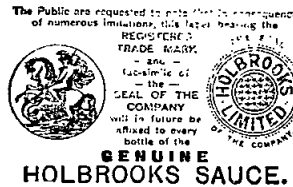

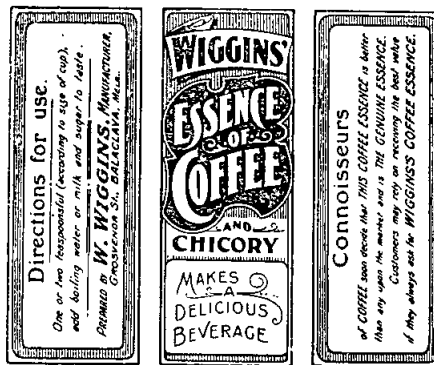

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-sixth day of July, 1904.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Stock Diseases Act 1890*, and under every other power enabling him, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order as follows (that is to say):—

1. The Seventh Schedule of the Amended Regulations of 16th January, 1903, is hereby repealed, and the following Schedule substituted therefor:—

SEVENTH SCHEDULE.

To A.B., Master of (state the name of the vessel) now lying at (state where vessel is lying).

Take notice that the stock hereinafter mentioned (*i.e.*) (set out particulars of the stock) now on board the above-named vessel (and consigned to C.D.), were on the day of examined by me, the undersigned, an inspector of stock and by a veterinary surgeon approved by the Governor in Council, and found free from infection: And take further notice that within days after the receipt by you of this notice a sum of money amounting to £5 for every head of horses up to ten head, the property of one owner, and £1 for every head of horses after ten head the property of one owner, and to £10 for every head of cattle up to the first ten head, the property of one owner, and £5 for every head of cattle after ten head the property of one owner,

and to £5 for one or the first head of sheep, and £2 for every head of sheep after the first head up to ten head, the property of one owner, and £1 for every head of sheep after the first ten head up to 100 head, the property of one owner, and 10s. for every head of sheep after the first 100 head, the property of one owner; and to £5 for one or the first head of pigs, and £2 for every head of pigs after the first head of pigs up to ten head, the property of one owner, and £1 for every head of pigs after the first ten head up to 100 head, the property of one owner, must be deposited with me to cover the expenses of, and connected with the quarantine of such horses, cattle, sheep, or pigs respectively, such sum to be applied in manner provided for by the Regulations in force in that behalf, and a bond in the form provided by such Regulations must be executed by the owner or consignee or some person to be approved by me on his behalf with one sufficient surety (and arrangements must be made to my satisfaction for the transhipment of the said cattle, sheep, and pigs to the quarantine ground, and that, failing the deposit of such sum, and the execution of such bond, and the making of such arrangements within the time aforesaid, or such further time as an inspector of stock may from time to time by writing under his hand allow, you are required forthwith, after the expiration of such time, either to slaughter such cattle, sheep, and pigs on board such vessel, or to remove and keep removed the said vessel with the said cattle, sheep, and pigs on board, a distance exceeding 100 yards from the shore or any pier or wharf, or to remove the said cattle, sheep, and pigs to a vessel, lighter, or barge, approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock for that purpose, to be moored and kept moored a distance exceeding 100 yards from the shore or any pier or wharf; or to remove the said stock from Victoria and Victorian waters). (To be omitted unless the stock comprises cattle, sheep, or pigs).

And the Honorable John Murray, His Majesty's Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The following clause shall be added to clause 28 of the Regulations of the eleventh day of November, 1890, hereinbefore referred to:—

28A. The charges for dressing sheep as aforesaid, two immersions, shall be on the following scale:—

No. 1098) it is amongst other things enacted that if the Governor in Council shall by proclamation notify that any place beyond the seas is infected with the cholera or other infectious or contagious disease, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria, immediately after such notification all vessels, boats, passengers, persons, and things indicated under the provisions of section 160 of the said Act shall be liable to quarantine within the meaning of Division 4 of Part VIII. of the said Act and shall, upon their arrival at any place in Victoria, be obliged to perform quarantine in the manner provided for by section 161 of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation notify that

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

is infected with Small-pox, and that it is probable that such disease may be brought from such place to Victoria.

WHEREAS by Part II. of the *Marine Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1165) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of ports in Victoria, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and that any such rules and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby make an amendment in clause 24 of the Rules and Regulations for Ports in Victoria, which shall read as set forth hereunder, and which shall come into force on and after the date of this Proclamation, that is to say:—

24. No lighter or boat shall anchor at a less distance than 100 fathoms from any wharf, except for the purpose of immediately hauling alongside, unless permission therefor be obtained from the Port Officer.
