PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend the *Legal Practitioners Reciprocity Act 1903*."

"An Act to amend the Law relating to the Railways Standing Committee."

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Public Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, provided that only those State Schools shall be closed which are within fifteen miles of the townships specified in brackets, viz.:—

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Sale,* and the Shires of Bannockburn, Bellarine, Corio, Meredith, South Barwon, and Winchelsea (Geelong);

FRIDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of Horsham and the Shire of Arapiles (Horsham);

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, throughout the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shires of Birchip and Donald (Donald), and throughout the United Shire of Beechworth and the Shires of Benalla, Chiltern, Wodonga, and Yackandandah (Albury);

MEDICAL ACT 1890, PART II, AND DENTAL BOARD OF VICTORIA.

THE Dental Board of Victoria, with the consent and approval of the Governor in Council, doth by virtue of the powers vested in it by the *Medical Act 1890*, Part II, and the *Dentists Act 1898*, hereby repeal Regulation VIII. of the Regulations made by the Board on the 18th day of December, 1903 and approved by the Lieutenant-Governor in Council on the 2nd day of February, 1904, and doth in lieu thereof make the following Regulation, viz. :—

C.—AS REGARDS THE COURSE OF PROFESSIONAL STUDY.

VIII.—Students shall pursue their studies for four years and pass four examinations before the Board. In addition to the places hereinafter specially mentioned, lectures, demonstrations, and practical work may be attended at any public educational institution as may from time to time be prescribed by Regulation for the purpose.

(a) *First Year.*

During the first year students shall attend the following courses of lectures :—

1. Chemistry, Theoretical and Practical.—The course at the University of Melbourne, Part I, or at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy, or at the School of Mines at Ballarat or Bendigo, or at the Australian College of Dentistry.
2. Junior Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.
3. Junior General Anatomy.—The course of lectures on Junior Anatomy at the University of Melbourne, or the course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.
4. Junior Dental Mechanics and Metallurgy.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.

The subjects of examination for the first year shall be—

1. Chemistry, Theoretical and Practical.
2. Junior Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative.
3. Junior General Anatomy.
4. Junior Dental Mechanics and Metallurgy.

(b) *Second Year.*

During the second year students shall attend the following courses of lectures and demonstrations :—

1. Senior Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.
2. Senior General Anatomy.—The course of lectures on Senior Anatomy at the University of Melbourne, or the course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.
3. Dissections, including Dissections of the Head and Neck.—The course at the University of Melbourne.
4. Physiology and Histology practically illustrated, with special reference to Dentistry.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.
5. Practical Metallurgy.—The course of lectures and demonstrations, with practical laboratory work, at the Australian College of Dentistry, or at the Working Men's College, Melbourne.

The subjects of examination for the second year shall be—

1. Senior Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative.
2. Senior General Anatomy.
3. Dissections, with special examination of the head and neck.
4. Physiology and Histology, with special reference to Dentistry.
5. Practical Metallurgy.

(c) *Third Year.*

During the third year students shall attend the following courses of lectures, demonstrations, &c. :—

1. General Surgery, Pathology, and Bacteriology.—The course of lectures, with specimens and exhibits, at the Australian College of Dentistry.
2. Materia Medica and Therapeutics, with special application to Dentistry.—The course of lectures at the Melbourne College of Pharmacy, or at the School of Mines at Ballarat or Bendigo, or at the Australian College of Dentistry.
3. Senior Dental Mechanics and Metallurgy.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.
4. Practical Histology and Microscopy, with special reference to Dentistry.—The course at the University of Melbourne.

Students shall further produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the dental practice of the Australian College of Dentistry, such attendance to include clinical instruction and lectures.

The subjects of examination for the third year shall be—

1. General Surgery, Pathology, and Bacteriology.
2. Materia Medica and Therapeutics, with special reference to Dentistry.
3. Senior Dental Mechanics and Metallurgy.
4. Practical Histology and Microscopy.

(d) *Fourth Year.*

During the fourth year students shall attend the following courses of lectures and practical work :—

1. Medicine.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry. They shall also produce a certificate of

having attended during nine months of the year the medical practice of a recognised general hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction.

2. Oral Surgery.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry. They shall also produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the surgical practice of a recognised general hospital, such attendance to include clinical instruction.

3. Dental Surgery and Pathology, with practical illustrations.—The course of lectures at the Australian College of Dentistry.

4. Practical Bacteriology, with special reference to Dentistry.—The course at the University of Melbourne.

5. Dental Mechanics.—The course of practical laboratory work at the Australian College of Dentistry.

Students shall further produce a certificate of having attended during nine months of the year the dental practice of the Australian College of Dentistry, such attendance to include clinical instruction and lectures.

The subjects of examination at the fourth year shall be—

1. Medicine.
2. Oral Surgery.
3. Dental Surgery and Pathology.
4. Practical Bacteriology.
5. Dental Mechanics.

Candidates who have passed all the foregoing examinations and fulfilled all the prescribed conditions shall be entitled to the Diploma of Licentiate of Dental Surgery of Victoria, and to registration as dentists.

CONSEQUENTIAL ALTERATIONS.

Students who have, prior to the 1st day of March, 1904 completed their second year need not, on proceeding to their third year, attend lectures and pass in *Materia Medica and Therapeutics*, but will be required to attend lectures and pass the examination in *Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative* as now prescribed for the second year.

Such students on proceeding to their fourth year will be required, in addition to the course prescribed, for that year to attend and pass in the course of *Practical Metallurgy* as now prescribed for the second year.

Students who have, prior to the 1st day of March, 1904 completed their third year will not be required to attend lectures and pass in *Medicine*, but will be required to attend lectures and pass both in *Dental Anatomy, Human and Comparative*, and in *Practical Metallurgy* as now prescribed for the second year.

This Regulation, other than that part relating as above to consequential alterations, shall not extend to any student in regard to the particular year of the curriculum which he may be now fulfilling under the Regulation hereby repealed.

This Regulation was made and passed at a meeting of the Dental Board of Victoria, held on the twenty-second day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and four.

3. He must also show that he has served for not less than three months under some competent mining surveyor in the conduct of surveys in mines, and for three months under some experienced mining manager in actual mining operations.

4. A candidate whose application has been approved as having complied with the foregoing will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

5. The degree of Master of Engineering of an Australian University may, if the Board think fit, be accepted in lieu of the examination required by sub-clauses (c) and (d) of the foregoing Regulation 4.



AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

INTRODUCTION OF GOATSKINS INTO VICTORIA FROM JAVA.

At an Executive Council held at the State Government House, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of August, 1904.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the Health Act 1890, among other things the Governor in Council is empowered from time to time to make, alter, and repeal Regulations for the purpose therein mentioned: And whereas by Order in Council dated 28th day of July, 1897, Regulations were made in respect to the introduction of sheep, cattle, skins, &c., into Victoria by any vessels which call at any port in Java: And whereas it is now desirable to amend the same: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above in part recited Act, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, order as follows, that is to say:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Order in Council above referred to, and dated the 28th day of July, 1897, the introduction of goatskins into Victoria from Java or by vessels calling at any port in Java may be permitted, provided that such goatskins arrive in Victoria in bales covered with sacking, and on being landed are forthwith carted under supervision of an officer appointed by the Chief Inspector of Stock direct from the ship to a tannery, and are at once placed in soak in pits; or in some secure building which shall then be locked and sealed by the officer who escorts the skins to such tannery, and no person other than an officer appointed by the Chief Inspector of Stock shall break such seal, and the owner of such tannery requiring the building to be opened shall give due notice to the Chief Inspector of Stock. And provided also that the cart by which such goatskins are conveyed to the tannery shall immediately after the delivery of such goatskins be disinfected to the satisfaction of the officer under whose supervision they have been conveyed to the tannery.
2. The owner of the tannery to which goatskins are conveyed in accordance with these Regulations, shall be required to enter into a bond of £100 as a guarantee that such goatskins shall not leave his tannery until the same have been tanned.
3. The owner of any goatskins which may be introduced under these Regulations will be required to pay a fee of Ten shillings per day for each day, or portion thereof, during which an Inspector may be engaged in supervising the conveyance of skins to a tannery, or the disinfection of the vehicle by which same may have been conveyed to a tannery.

A joint By-law of the City of Bendigo and the Borough of Eaglehawk, made under the provisions of the Tramways Act and Second Schedule, Clause 14, and in conformity with Part 7 of the *Local Government Act 1903*.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903* and the *Tramways Act 1890* and Second Schedule thereto, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Bendigo, and the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk jointly order as follows:—

That By-law No. 16 of the City of Bendigo and Borough of Eaglehawk be and is hereby repealed.

1. This By-law shall extend and apply to all tramcars and other vehicles of the Electric Supply Company of Victoria Limited, or used in connexion with the tramways, and to all tracks, poles, wires, fixtures, or other appurtenances used in operating the tramways, and all plant, buildings, waiting rooms and generally, and to all premises with respect to which the said councils have power to make by-laws.

2. No person shall smoke in or upon any tramcar or platform thereof except on such portions as are from time to time set apart for that purpose.

3. No passenger or other person, while riding in or upon any car, shall solicit alms, play or perform upon any musical instrument, distribute handbills or advertisements, or, without having first obtained the permission of the conductor, in writing, offer for sale any article.

4. No person who, in the opinion of the conductor, is in a state of intoxication shall be allowed to enter or mount upon any car; and if found in or upon any car, shall, at the request of the conductor, leave the car, upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned; and, if he does not at once leave the car, he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in such case he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this by-law.

5. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger; and any person who, in the opinion of the conductor, shall have committed a breach of this by-law shall leave the car on the request of the conductor to do so, upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned; and, if he does not leave the car at once, he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and he shall also be liable to the penalty fixed by this by-law.

6. No person shall in any way obstruct, impede, interfere with, or hinder any officer or servant of the company in the execution of his duty.

7. No person shall in any way soil or damage any motor or car, or remove or interfere with any fastening or any motor or car, or remove, affix, or deface any number, plate, printed notice, or advertisement, or writing on any part of, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any motor or car. Any person acting in contravention shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by this by-law, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the dress or clothing of any passengers, or who for any other reason might be offensive to passengers, shall be entitled to enter or remain in or upon any car, nor shall he enter any car after being requested not to do so by the conductor, and any such person may be prevented from entering any car, and if found on any such car, he shall, on the request of the conductor, leave the car, upon the fare (if previously paid) being returned; and, if he does not at once leave the car, he may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor, and in such case he shall also be liable to the penalty provided by this by-law.

9. No person shall, without lawful excuse (the proof whereof shall lie on him), wilfully do any of the following things, namely:—Persist in riding or driving any horse, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock on the tramway line in front of any motor or car after the bell on such motor or car shall have been rung as a warning that the motor or car is coming behind, or overtaking such horse, cart, carriage, or vehicle, sheep, cattle, pigs, or other stock.

12. Any person who shall travel by and leave any car without first having delivered his ticket or paid his fare

to the conductor shall be guilty of a breach of this by-law, and liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

13. Each passenger, on paying his fare upon lines where the cash fare system is in operation, will be furnished with a ticket, which he will show on demand to the conductor at any time during the journey for which such ticket was issued.

14. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of workmen) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the platform, and not in the interior, or on the roof of any car.

15. Every passenger who shall take upon a car any article or articles which shall exceed altogether the weight of twenty-eight (28) pounds, or whose size exceeds eighteen (18) inches square, shall pay to the conductor, on demand, the sum of Threepence (3d.) for every such article or for each package of luggage so in excess.

16. Where luggage, light goods, or parcels are sent in charge of the conductor, the like fare as for a passenger for each article or package so sent.

17. No person, not being a servant of the company, shall enter or mount any motor, or stand on the platform of any car, or travel on the steps of any car.

18. No person shall enter or attempt to enter, or leave or attempt to leave, any car while such car is in motion.

19. No person, except a passenger or intended passenger, shall enter or mount any car, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of the car or motor.

20. When any tramcar contains the full number of passengers which it is computed to carry, no additional person shall enter or remain in or upon any such tramcar when warned by the conductor not to do so, and any person having so entered who shall refuse to leave at the request of the conductor may be removed by the conductor, and shall also be liable to the penalty provided for a breach of this by-law.

21. No person shall travel in or upon any car with loaded firearms, paints, oils, glass, live-stock, poultry, or anything which the conductor may consider dangerous or offensive, or anything which shall project beyond the car, or which may, in the opinion of the conductor, be liable to damage the car or the person or property of any person.

22. No person shall be entitled to have any dog or other animal in or on any car.
