By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates named hereunder special days to be observed as Bank Holidays or Bank Half-Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, that is to say:—

WEDNESDAY, THE 7TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Geelong and Rupanyup;

THURSDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, at Birchip;

WEDNESDAY, THE 14TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Widdunga;

FRIDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Rupanyup;

WEDNESDAY, THE 21ST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Brighton;

WEDNESDAY, THE 5TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1904, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at St. Arnaud.

ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of the said State, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Thirty-two thousand four hundred and two pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and three and One thousand nine hundred and four.”

Land Surveyors Act 1895.

EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS.

THE Surveyors Board appointed under the *Land Surveyors Act 1895* hereby gives notice that the next examination will commence on Tuesday, 20th September, 1904.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A.B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C.D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisional, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.

(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks. (Including practical tests.)

Use of instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, telemeter, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.

(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(g) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

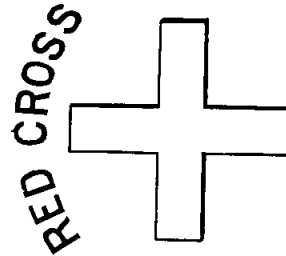

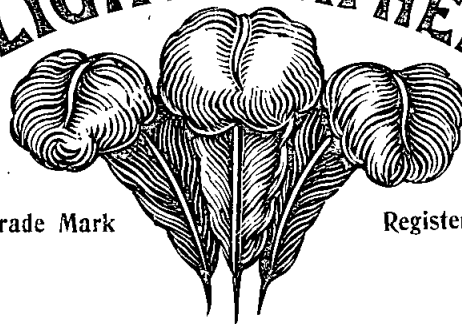

COHUNA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY
TRUST.—REGULATION NO. 31.

THE Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the provisions of the Water Acts, do make the following regulation:—

1. For the purpose of identification, the two main channels in the district of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be known as the Right and Left Channels, the right channel being from the bifurcation along the Gunbower Creek to Thomas Blaims, Murrabit West; the left channel, from the bifurcation along the west side of Barr Creek, to the end of S. W. Taylor's selection, in Murrabit West; in its course, passing the residence of William Craig, Koroop.
2. The best and earliest possible notice that the water will be available for irrigation and other purposes on an approximate date will be given to occupiers of land by the officer in charge of the distribution of the water.
3. All applications must be made on forms to be obtained from the Trust office or officers, and must be signed by the persons requiring the water.
4. Payment for the supply of water to any person must be made to the manager, or water-bailiff in charge, immediately after being supplied, and in no case will any more water be turned on or supplied till payment for previous supply has been made.
5. The manager or bailiff in charge for the time being shall be judge of the quantity of water necessary to be supplied to irrigate a given area of land to a given depth.
6. Irrigation will commence from the head works end of the district, and will continue down to the ends of the main channels. Branch and distributory channels will be taken in their rotation of position until the holdings commanded by such branch and distributory channels have been supplied.
7. During the gravitation supply period, water will be run through the channels from end to end, and during the pumping season as often as or when deemed necessary or desirable by the Trust.
8. In the event of any occupiers missing their turn of supply of water after due notice shall have been given they must await the next supply in the channel, as in no case will the water be delayed or turned back to satisfy the requirements of any person or persons not ready or willing to take it when available. This provision is absolute, in the interest of irrigators in the district generally.
9. For garden and fodder supplies (as provided by separate regulation) occupiers will be allowed to open their occupation sluices, but in no case to touch or interfere with channel stops.
10. Only those gardens and fodder crops that have been paid for (in accordance with annual regulation) shall be watered, and occupiers will be held responsible for seeing that only the area paid for is irrigated.
11. On water being first supplied to gardens or for fodder crops, the water bailiff will take notice of the area for which permission to irrigate is applied for, and should it be found that the privilege of taking water for gardens, vineyards, orchards, or fodder crops is in any case being abused, the person so offending will be promptly served with notice to discontinue opening his sluice; and, if such notice be ignored, such person will be held liable for interference with Trust property, and will be prosecuted as provided for by the Water Acts.
12. All applications for garden irrigation rights, or for fodder irrigation rights, for the first time, must be made on the printed forms to be obtained from the Trust officer or officers, and must be signed by the person requiring the water, such form to contain the accurate date of application and the area applied for.
13. Private channels and banks must be approved as to capacity and strength by the manager, or, in the absence of a manager, the water bailiff in charge; and in the event of private channels or banks being insufficient in capacity or strength in the opinion of the manager, or, in the absence of a manager, the water bailiff, the supply in any such case will be cut off until the necessary alterations or additions shall have been made.
14. Special private channels for the supply of gardens, orchards, vineyards, or fodder crops under fodder crop right, shall be under the supervision of the manager or bailiff, as the case may be, and should he deem such channel of inordinate size or capacity for the purpose, he shall report to the Trust, which will decide as to the extra payment to be made therefor. This clause is intended to provide against private channels being used as reservoirs or tanks, and to prevent waste of water.
15. Tanks or dams are in every case to be filled at a time when a supply is available for irrigation by gravitation, and only under exceptional circumstances will tanks or dams be filled when water is being pumped.
16. During the pumping season water will not be turned into swamps or creeks, but will, as far as possible, be confined to the Trust channels.
17. Should any public or private roads be flooded through irrigation operations the manager or bailiff may direct that sufficient check-banks be turned up to keep the water within bounds, and he may shut the sluice till such is done. If, on this account, any occupier should lose his turn of the water, he must await the next regular supply.
18. Applications for pumped water will not be entertained by the Trust until, in its discretion, sufficient time has elapsed to prove that all possible use has been made of the gravitation water; and it shall not lie as a duty or charge on the Trust to start the pumps, or continue them, or re-start them, if it considers that any occupiers applying have neglected to take the opportunity of utilizing to the fullest extent possible the gravitation water when available.
19. The Trust will not be held liable for inability to supply water when required. All possible precaution will be taken to insure each occupier a regular supply of water, both for irrigation and stock and domestic requirements; but in the event of the supply falling short, or works breaking away, or if from any other cause the Trust is unable to make water available, it declines absolutely to accept any personal or corporate responsibility or liability.
20. The price or charge for water by gravitation or by pumping for irrigation, gardens, stock, and domestic supply and other purposes, will be fixed by the Trust, from time to time, by special regulation, but nothing in such special regulation shall be taken to nullify or amend any of the provisions of this regulation unless the same be particularly specified.
21. The outlets or occupation sluices for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authorized officers of the Trust, and no person other than such officers, except by the written sanction of the manager or bailiff, and except authorized occupiers of garden rights or fodder rights, shall open any such outlets or occupation sluices, or otherwise do any act that may permit the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.
22. No person shall trespass along the works of the Trust, or upon its lands, to the hindrance of its servants, annoyance to adjacent land-owners, damage to works on adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.
23. In all cases when water is being supplied, the delivery will be continued on Sundays as well as ordinary working days.
24. Any person, not being a duly authorized officer of the Trust, who shall open any irrigation outlets, junction sluices, or stops, or do any act that may cause the escape of water from the Trust channels or works, excepting as herein provided, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.
25. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein, and any person found damaging such works or wasting or defiling the water, as above stated, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this regulation.
26. Any person desirous of erecting a fence across any channel, belonging to the Trust, shall make application for permission to do so to the Trust; and permission may be given, but only on the condition that the applicant provide and erect, at his own cost, suitable gates, where directed by the Trust. The fence shall be also approved of by the Trust; and both it and the gates shall be erected under the direction of the officer in charge.
27. Any person being supplied, or to be supplied, with water out of any irrigation outlet or sluice, such outlet or sluice being at the channel, or open track near the channel, along which the Trust officers may travel, shall build a crossing or bridge to be approved of by the Trust, over any channel or excavation that may have been or may be made to convey water from such outlet or sluice to the boundary of the land being supplied, or to be supplied, with water; and in the event of this not being done when ordered by the officer in charge or by his authority the supply of water may be summarily cut off.
28. Any land-owner or occupier having received permission to open his occupation sluice for irrigation purposes, must prior to closing such sluice give not less than twenty-four hours' notice of his intention of doing so to the officer in charge of the distribution of water in the district in which the land irrigated, or to be irrigated, is situated; failing such notice being given, the land-owner or occupier shall be liable for any damage that may be caused by his neglect to give such notice.

29. That if the manager, or water bailiff in charge for the time being, finds that persons who are using land on the share system require a supply of water, such manager or water bailiff shall demand from the owner of such land payment in advance or a guarantee that such water so supplied will be paid for; unless such parties using the land on such share system pay the money before the water is supplied, and if such manager or water bailiff supply water to such persons without such payment or guarantee, he shall be held responsible to the Trust for the loss, if any.

30. In the delivery of all water purchased from the Trust, no allowance whatever will be made, or granted, to the purchasers for any water that may be run to waste on roads or into swamps, or otherwise wasted.

31. That when the Trust has only a short supply of water available, the quantity shall be distributed between the ridings in an equitable manner by the Trust, according to applications.

32. The filling of distributary channels will require the same care as that of the main channels. The junction sluices should be raised only a few inches, and the small flow thus admitted must be gradually checked as the channel becomes filled.

33. All channels, when gravitation water is available, should be filled once a fortnight, and the officer in charge should take special care to have all channel banks well soaked, and banks and other works kept in efficient repair before irrigation commences.

34. The manager or officer in charge is required to frequently travel along the Trust channels and make himself thoroughly acquainted with the works of the Trust; also to see that the channels are sufficiently filled, and to report fully in writing to the Trust. The manager or officer in charge must also satisfy himself as to the state of the road bridges and their approaches, and any dangerous subsidence in the earthwork or damage to the decking of bridges, and see that the necessary repairs are effected without delay.

35. When a manager is in the service of the Trust, he must see that the bailiff working in No. 1 Riding takes effective steps, while water is available, to keep a continuous flow passing down the right and left branch channels, and in no case shall such bailiff prevent the proportional flow passing down to the No. 2 and No. 3 Ridings, unless specially ordered to the contrary by the Trust, or unless a breakage happens, causing interference with such flow of water. In the case of a bank bursting, or other works becoming damaged, the manager, or in the absence of a manager being in the employment of the Trust, the bailiff is expected to use all care and vigilance in protecting Trust property.

36. When the officer in charge of the distribution of water in No. 1 Riding finds an increase or diminution of the water is required either by land-owners or occupiers, in either the No. 1, No. 2, or No. 3 Ridings, he must proceed in all such cases to the bifurcation stop and turn the water on or off according to the tenor of the applications, or the supply that he may deem to be required.

37. Every officer of the Trust, and every owner or occupier of land within the Trust district, is expected to make himself acquainted with this regulation, and ignorance of such regulation will not be accepted as an excuse for any omission or offence.

38. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence or breach of this regulation shall be liable for any such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50).

39. That Regulation No. 7, made by the Commissioners of the Trust on the 26th day of July, 1893, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 26th day of September, 1893, shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

40. That amended Regulation No. 6, made by the Commissioners of the Trust on the 30th day of August, 1893, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 16th day of October, 1893, shall be, and the same is, hereby repealed.

The foregoing Regulation No. 31 was made by the Commissioners of the Cohuna Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the Water Acts, this 31st day of December, 1903.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 16th day of August, 1904, rescinded section xii. of By-law No. 3, approved on 2nd June, 1896, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th June, 1896, page 2347, and has substituted therefor the following Regulation, to take effect from the 1st August, 1904:—

By-law No. 3, section xii.—The rate to be charged for water supplied for sluicing purposes from the main aqueduct or from any branch aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be one-third of One penny per 1,000 gallons; provided that the minimum charge to any consumer shall not be less than 252,000 gallons. Water supplied from the aqueducts for sluicing purposes shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply may from time to time direct.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACTS.

At an Executive Council held at the State Government House, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of August, 1904.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor of Victoria.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council, under the above recited power, makes the Regulations following prescribing the manner in which appeals against a Determination of a Special Board shall be instituted (that is to say):—

MODE OF APPEALING TO THE COURT OF INDUSTRIAL APPEALS.

(1) Every appeal under the provisions of section 17 of the *Factories and Shops Act* 1903 (No. 1857) against the Determination of a Special Board shall be instituted by the person entitled to appeal and desiring so to do, forwarding to the Minister of Labour a notice, in writing, containing the prescribed particulars of such desire.

(2) The notice of appeal shall state the character in which the appellant claims to appear as such, and when the appeal is by a single employer or group of employers employing not less than 25 per centum of the total number of workers shall set out particulars of the number of workers employed by each appellant. The notice shall be written in legible characters, and shall clearly and distinctly set forth or otherwise identify separately the item or items in the Determination against which appellant is appealing, and his grounds of objection to such item or items.

(3) The notice of appeal shall be signed in a legible manner by each appellant, and the full address and occupation of each appellant shall be given opposite each signature.

(4) Such notice shall name some address for service, not more than 5 miles from the General Post Office, where notices, orders, summonses, documents, and written communications may be left for the appellant or appellants, and all notices, orders, summonses, documents, and written communications served or left at such address shall constitute effective service on the appellant or appellants, if there be more than one.

(5) Two copies of the notice of appeal shall be forwarded with the original, but in such copies it shall not be necessary to give more than five of the appellants' names and addresses.

(6) The Chief Inspector of Factories, Work-rooms, and Shops, and the Registrar of the Court of Industrial Appeals may allow any employer or employé in the trade affected by a Determination against which an appeal has been lodged to make a copy of the notice of appeal for the purpose of entering an appearance against such appeal.

(7) Any employer or employé in the trade affected by the Determination which is the subject of an appeal who desires to be heard by the Court against such appeal, shall, seven days at least before the hearing, notify the Registrar of the Court of Industrial Appeals of such desire, and shall give his full name, his occupation, and address in such notification.

(8) The Chief Inspector of Factories, Work-rooms, and Shops shall attach to such notice of appeal a list containing the names and addresses of the Members of the Special Board the Determination of which is the subject of appeal, and also, when necessary, a certificate giving the number of persons employed in the trade affected by such employer or group of employers, and also the total number of persons employed in such trade as indicated in Appendix A of the Chief Inspector's last Annual Report issued prior to such appeal, or in the case of appeal by the workers in any trade, a certificate giving the number of persons employed in such trade as indicated in Appendix A of the Chief Inspector's last Annual Report.

(9) Non-compliance with these Regulations shall not prevent the hearing of an appeal or of opposition thereto unless the Court so orders.

And the Honorable Sir Samuel Gillott, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ADDITION TO, AND AMENDMENT OF, REGULATIONS MADE ON 8TH JANUARY, 1902.—PART II.—CROWN LANDS OTHER THAN MALLEE LANDS.

LICENCES WHICH DO NOT CONFER THE EXCLUSIVE RIGHT TO ENTER ON CROWN LANDS.

On and after 1st January, 1904, the fee for a permit for the removal of sand from the unappropriated Crown lands within Sandridge Bend shall be One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per load.—(Corr.S.11430.)

The following shall be added to the conditions of permit for removal of sand from unappropriated Crown lands within Sandridge Bend:—

10. Any person convicted of illegally procuring sand from Crown lands shall be excluded from the Sand Ground for the periods set forth hereunder, as the case may require:—

MANSFIELD PUBLIC HOSPITAL.

By-Laws.

THAT the object of the Institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, colour, or creed, and for accidents; but no person able to pay for the same shall meet with further than temporary assistance. It is provided also that, if there be room, patients capable of paying may be admitted at £2 per week, or such other amount as may be mutually agreed upon by the Committee and patient or relatives.

2. The Institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, two Auditors, Governors and Subscribers.

3. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of Governors and Subscribers:—£25, collected by any person during the preceding twelve months, Life Governor; £25 in one sum, Life Governor; £15 in one sum, Life Subscriber; £25, corporate body, Life Governor; £20, corporate body, Life Subscriber; £25, first executor under a will, Governor for one year; £15, minister collecting in one year, Governor for one year; £15, layman or corporate body collecting in one year, Governor for one year; £2, yearly subscription, Governor; £1, yearly subscription, Subscriber; with power to recommend patients as follows:—Life Governor, one in-patient and three out-patients always on the books; Life Subscriber, one in-patient and one out-patient always on the books; Governor for one year, three in-patients and four out-patients for that year; Governor, two in-patients and two out-patients annually; Subscriber, one in-patient and two out-patients annually.

4. Every person claiming the benefit of the Hospital, whether as in-door or out-door patients, must produce a recommendation, which shall be subject to the approval of the Committee or Sub-Committee. Accidents, however, and such cases of decided emergency as, in the opinion of the medical officer, admit of no delay, may be attended to, and, if necessary, admitted at any time, whether recommended or not.

5. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who, in the opinion of the Medical Staff, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient within the walls of the Hospital under any circumstances.

6. The Members of the Committee, Honorary and Medical Officers, shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the Committee or Sub-Committee.

7. Visitors will be admitted between the hours of 2 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock p.m. daily, subject to the approval of the Medical Officer or Matron, and at other times by his or her special permission.

8. That the Medical Officer or Matron be required to enter in a book kept for that purpose the date of each occasion on which, in accordance with the By-law No. 7, he or she excludes visitors, as also the reasons for so doing.

9. Any patient guilty of gross misconduct may be summarily dismissed by any three of the Committee, upon its being substantiated.

10. The Committee or House Committee shall have power to discharge any patient who is not, in their opinion, a proper person to receive the benefits of the Institution.

11. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privileges until the subscription is paid.

12. The Subscribers to the Mansfield Public Hospital shall be entitled to vote in proportion to their subscriptions, according to the following scale, viz., £1 and less than £3, one vote; £3 and less than £5, two votes; £5 and upwards, three votes.

13. The Committee of Management shall consist of twelve members (including the President, two Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer), a number of which shall retire each year, in accordance with the provisions of the Hospital and Charitable Institutions Statute, Vict. 27, No. 220, clauses 11 and 12, and are eligible for re-election.

14. The Committee of Management shall elect the office-bearers out of their own body each year at the first meeting taking place after the Annual Meeting of Contributors, providing that the Honorary Treasurer shall continue in office, notwithstanding the operation of any rules for retiring by rotation, and remain an *ex officio* member of Committee until he die, resign, or be removed by a majority of the Committee of Management, at a special meeting called for that purpose, and the vacant office shall be filled up by the General Committee, until the next annual election of officers.

15. The General Committee shall direct the affairs of the Institution, frame by-laws for its internal regulation (the same not to be contrary to the general rules), and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the Institution. They shall meet in every month on such days as they may appoint, four to form a quorum, and shall have the power to admit the patients. In the event of there being no quorum within half-an-hour of the time specified for a meeting of the Committee, those members present shall record their attendance in the minute book, and adjourn the meeting for a period of not more than seven days, to be notified to the Committee by the Secretary.

16. The President shall be a member, *ex officio*, of all Committees.

17. Any member of Committee absenting himself from four consecutive ordinary monthly meetings of the Committee, his office shall be vacant; and the same rule shall apply to the President and Vice-Presidents. Any such vacancy occurring shall be filled up by the General Committee.

18. Three members of the General Committee shall constitute a House Committee, who shall take up their duties in alphabetical order, one to retire at each monthly meeting of the General Committee, the next in rotation to take his place. They shall meet at the Hospital at least once a month, two to form a quorum, and shall attend to the medical and domestic arrangements, have power to audit all accounts, examine the patients' account book and take action thereon, to engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal arrangements of the Institution.

19. That the whole of the General Committee, exclusive of those members whose election may be in dispute, be a Committee for determining disputed elections.

20. The General Committee shall every year present at the annual meeting of contributors a report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with a balance-sheet duly audited to the end of the month of June.

21. All moneys received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer, and deposited in such bank as the Committee may determine.

22. The officers of the Institution shall consist of a duly qualified Medical Practitioner, Collector, Dispenser, Secretary, and Nurses.

23. That the Ministers of all the Religious Denominations be allowed access at all hours, under certain regulations to be made by the General Committee.

24. It shall be competent for three members of the Committee, by a written requisition, to call upon the President, or, in his absence, a Vice-President, to convene a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers. The object of such meeting to be stated in the requisition, and the same to be advertised at least seven clear days, and no other business than that set forth in the requisition shall be entertained.
