MEASUREMENT OF FRENCH SHIPS.

THE following Despatch and its enclosures (2), which have been received by His Excellency the Governor from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, are published for general information.

SIR,

With reference to my Circular despatch of the 18th ultimo, I have the honour to transmit to you, for the information of your Government, and for publication in the Colony, the accompanying copies of two Orders of the King in Council, revoking the Orders in Council dated 10th August, 1904, 5th May, 1873, and 29th January, 1904, 10th August, 1904, relating to the measurement of French ships in this country, and exempting from re-measurement in His Majesty's Dominions French ships having Certificates of Registry or other national papers dated on or after 1st July, 1904.

PRESENT:

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 5th day of May, 1873, after reciting that by *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862*, it was enacted that, whenever it was made to appear to Her late Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act had been adopted by the Government of any foreign country and were in force in that country, it should be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the ships of such foreign country should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, and thereupon it should no longer be necessary for such ships to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry or other papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of registry of British ships was to be deemed the tonnage of such ships, and reciting that it had been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships then in force under *The Merchant Shipping*

Act 1854 had been adopted by the President of the French Republic, and were in force in the French dominions: Her Majesty was thereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the ships of France, the certificates of French nationality and registry of which were dated on or after the first day of June, 1873, should be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in the said certificates of French nationality and registry:

And whereas *The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862* was repealed by the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, but by Section 745 of the latter Act it is, amongst other things, provided that any Order in Council made under any enactment thereby repealed should continue in force as if it had been made under the said Act of 1894:

And whereas by another Order in Council, dated the 29th day of January, 1904, after reciting that by Section 84 (3) of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, it was enacted that if it was made to appear to Her late Majesty that the tonnage of any foreign ship, as measured by the rules of the country to which she belonged, materially differed from that which would be her tonnage if measured under that Act, Her Majesty in Council might order that, notwithstanding any Order in Council for the time being in force, any of the ships of that country might be re-measured in accordance with that Act, and reciting that it had been made to appear to His present Majesty that the tonnage of French ships, as measured by the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships of France, materially differed from that which would be the tonnage of such ships if measured under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, His Majesty in Council ordered that, notwithstanding the hereinbefore recited Order in Council, dated the 5th day of May, 1873, any of the ships of France might, for all or any of the purposes of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894*, be re-measured in accordance with the said Act:

And whereas by Section 738 of the same Act it is provided that where Her late Majesty had power under that Act to make an Order in Council, Her Majesty might by Order in Council, revoke, alter, or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section 30 of the *Interpretation Act 1889* it is enacted that in that Act and in every other Act, whether passed before or after the commencement of that Act, references to the Sovereign reigning at the time of the passing of the Act or to the Crown shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as references to the Sovereign for the time being, and that Act shall be binding on the Crown:

And whereas it has been made to appear desirable to His present Majesty that the provisions of the said recited Orders in Council, dated respectively the 5th day of May, 1873, and the 29th day of January, 1904, should be revoked and a new Order in Council made and substituted in lieu thereof:

Now therefore His Majesty, in virtue of the powers vested in Him by the said recited Acts, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the said recited Orders, dated respectively the 5th day of May, 1873, and the 29th day of January, 1904, shall be and the same are hereby revoked.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 84 (1) of the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* that whenever it appeared to Her late Majesty the Queen in Council that the tonnage regulations of that Act had been adopted by any foreign country, and were in force there, Her Majesty in Council might order that the ships of that country should without being re-measured in Her Majesty's dominions be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship, was deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas by Section 30 of the *Interpretation Act 1889* it is enacted that in that Act and in every other Act, whether passed before or after the commencement of that Act, references to the Sovereign reigning at the time of the passing of the Act, or to the Crown, shall, unless the contrary intention appears, be construed as references to the Sovereign for the time being, and that Act shall be binding on the Crown:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage of merchant ships now in force under the *Merchant Shipping Act 1894* have been adopted by the President of the French Republic, and are in force in the French dominions, having come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1904:

Now therefore His Majesty in Council doth order that the ships of France, the certificates of registry, or other national papers of which are dated on or after the 1st day of July, 1904, shall, without being re-measured in His Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry, or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Act*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Act*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MRS. SARAH BURCHFIELD, DRESS-MAKER, LIEBIG-STREET, WARRNAMBOOL,

for a period of eight weeks from the 17th October, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eight females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eight females shall not be employed for more than fifty-four hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

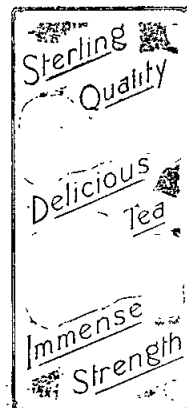

THE MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act* 1890, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following regulation:—

Regulation No. 347, made and passed by the said Commissioners on the eighth day of January, One thousand nine hundred and two, is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following regulation is enacted:—

356. No gasoline, benzine, naphtha, vitriol, petroleum, kerosene, turpentine, inflammable acids, or other goods of a dangerous nature, casks containing oil, castor oil in cases, matches, manures, green skins or hides, iron in pigs, bars, or bundles, cement, whiting, galvanized fencing wire, rags, pigs of lead, kegs or casks of white lead, casks of any kind of paint or salt in bags, shall be placed in any transit shed.

This regulation shall be incorporated with, form part of, and be construed with the regulations of the said Commissioners, made and passed on the twenty-eighth day of March, One thousand nine hundred.

THE Commissioners of the Rutherglen Waterworks Trust (the Waterworks District of the Trust having been proclaimed an Urban District under the *Water Act 1890*) do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, make the following rate for the year 1905 upon all lands and tenements within the said Urban District, that is to say:—

The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes:

On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or allotment of land by which a main passes, the sum equivalent to a rate of One shilling and eightpence in the £1 per annum, with a minimum charge of One pound sterling.

Such rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1905, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust shall appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

The charge for water by measure shall be Two shillings and sixpence per 1,000 gallons.

WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of powers conferred by the Water Acts, hereby make the following Regulation:—

No. 9.

Regulation for making a Rate for the Year 1905 on all Rateable Property within the Urban District of the Trust.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust within the said Urban District, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or houses or tenements, if not on such streets, which are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Seven pounds ten shillings per centum per annum on the annual municipal value of such property, provided that no rate be less than One pound.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situate otherwise than on a street in which the pipes for a supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based on the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1905, commencing on the first day of January and terminating on the thirty-first day of December, 1905, and shall be payable the one moiety on the first day of January and the other on the first day of July in such year. Such person

or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive such rates.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated, the minimum rate to be Twenty shillings, as fixed by the Governor in Council.

2. Water supplied by the Trust for other than domestic purposes shall be charged for by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust) at the rate of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons.

3. The above rate is for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the 1st April and on the 1st October, 1905.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Upper Macedon Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover such rates.

**LODDON UNITED WATER TRUST.—REGULATION
BY THE AUDITOR-GENERAL OF THE STATE OF
VICTORIA.**

WHIEREAS default has been made in payment by the Loddon United Water Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a redemption fund for the liquidation of such loans in accordance with the Acts of Parliament in that behalf. And the Auditor-General of Victoria having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust. And whereas notices that the district of the said Loddon United Water Trust is supplied with water have been duly given in the *Government Gazette*. And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the 27th day of September, 1904, made under the authority of the Water Acts, it was directed that the rates which should be made by the said Auditor-General under the said Acts, for the payment of such interest and the expenses incidental to the maintenance of the said works and the collection of the rates and the formation of a redemption fund, should be made in the manner prescribed in such Order and in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts for one year, that is to say, for the year 1904, and should be made differentially upon all rateable property within the several divisions into which the said district was divided for differential rating purposes by an Order in Council made on the 20th October, 1896, and the proportion in which such several divisions should be rated respectively one to another for the said year 1904 was in and by the said Order in Council of the 27th September, 1904, duly determined.

Now therefore the Auditor-General of the State of Victoria doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Acts, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of 27th September, 1904, in that behalf, make the following regulation, that is to say:—

The following rates are hereby made and shall be payable for the year 1904 upon all rateable property within the respective divisions of the Loddon United Water Trust District, according to the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district within which such lands and tenements are respectively situated, that is to say:—

That the respective ratings in the pound sterling of such valuation in the said several divisions shall be:—

The Shire of East Loddon Division ...	Two pence.
The Shire of Gordon, No. 1 East Division ...	Six pence.

**WARRNAMBOOL WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION No. 15.**

THE Warrnambool Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts (and whose Water District has, for the purposes of the said Acts, been proclaimed an Urban District), made the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1905, in respect of water supplied by the Trust (that is to say):—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, a rate of Twelvepence for each pound sterling on the amount of the annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.

- (b) Unoccupied lands where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.
- (d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelvepence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (e) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for half-yearly shall be 10,000 gallons.
- (f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons.
- (g) The rate to be charged to non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Three pence per 100 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Fifteenpence per 1,000 gallons, exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements according to their distance from such stand-pipe.
- (h) Water for gas-engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (i) For steam-boilers the rate shall be Twelve shillings and sixpence per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (j) On buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the owner or occupier of such premises shall provide and fix the water meter and all necessary fittings for same, otherwise the owners or occupiers of such premises may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay a minimum charge of Ten shillings per centum on the total cost of the work for stone buildings, or Five shillings per cent. for wooden buildings, when a meter will not be required to be provided, or they may, by special agreement with the Trust, pay the cost of the labour of laying and removing the necessary pipes, fittings, and a meter, and the hire of a meter at the rate of Ten shillings per annum, with a minimum charge of Five shillings, and for the water at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons. Payments in either case to be made in advance.
- (k) For water supplied to shipping, the charge shall be Five shillings per 1,000 gallons, with a minimum charge of Five shillings. With paid meters, the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.
- (l) Supplies of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate as the Trust shall in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be made at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (m) In the event of any dispute as to which sub-section applies to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (n) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourteenpence per 1,000 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
- (o) For water supplied to public gardens, parks, show grounds, baths, hospitals, or charitable institutions, the charge shall be Ninepence per 1,000 gallons, and the supply must be taken through a meter.

All water supplied by the Trust by measure in excess of such aforesaid quantity, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

3. For water supplied by measurement for other than domestic purposes solely, a charge of One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust); provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

4. All water supplied by the Trust outside the Trust district shall be charged at the rate of One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall not be less than Twenty shillings.

5. Such rates and charges other than charges for water supplied by measurement in excess, are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, one moiety on the first day of January, 1905, and one moiety on the first day of July, 1905.

6. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose, shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

Shire of Borung Division—Eleven pence.
Shire of Birchip Division—Thirteen pence.
Shire of Karkaroc Division—Twelve pence.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act* 1890 (No. 1156) it is amongst other things enacted that at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to, and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application, to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order, and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed;
- (d) Assign a corporate name to such Waterworks Trust; and
- (e) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with those of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted, by section 25 of the *Water Act* 1890 aforesaid, that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly, or with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons, not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application of the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta for a loan for the purpose of purchasing the existing works and constructing others for the supply of the Borough of Wangaratta with water, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The purchase of the existing Borough of Wangaratta water supply works at a cost of Four thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight pounds ten shillings and threepence (£4,888 10s. 3d.), such sum to be, in accordance with section 82 of the said Act, transferred in the books of account in the Treasury from the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta to the Waterworks Trust hereby constituted, together with interest due thereon to the 10th October, 1904, inclusive; and the construction of the said other works.
- (2) The Municipal Council of the Borough of Wangaratta for the time being, and one other Commissioner, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Nine thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight pounds ten shillings and threepence (£9,888 10s.

3d.), and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.

- (4) That the limits of the lands within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—
