### OLD SCHEME.

#### ENTRY AND EXAMINATION OF OFFICERS IN THE ROYAL NAVY.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS (OLD SCHEME).  
(THE LAST EXAMINATION UNDER THIS SCHEME WILL TAKE PLACE IN NOVEMBER, 1905.)

##### For the information of Candidates.

1. Applications for Colonial Cadetships in His Majesty's Naval Forces will be receivable by the Governor-General or the Governor of the State in which an applicant may reside. All applications must be made upon the prescribed forms, copies of which will be obtainable on application, from the Governor-General or the Governors of States. Application should be lodged before the first of November of the year preceding that for which the nomination is desired.

2. Candidates must be of pure European descent, and the sons either of natural-born British subjects, or of parents naturalized in the United Kingdom.

If any doubt arises upon this question, the burden of clear proof that he is qualified will rest upon the candidate himself.

3. Arrangements for the educational examination of all candidates will be made by the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner.

The examinations will be held in March, July, and November, about six weeks before the commencement of each term, and the appointments will date from the 15th May, 15th September, 15th January, following, respectively, and the terms will commence as shown in Regulation 15.

#### 4. Candidates for examination in—

March must be not less than 14½ or more than 15½ years of age on the following ... ..	15 May

5. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in

proportion to his age. Before being examined he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the Navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the Navy.

6. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (*a Certificate of Baptism will not be accepted*); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the Clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

### NEW SCHEME.

#### \*NEW SCHEME OF ENTRY OF NAVAL CADETS WHO ARE CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS AS EXECUTIVE AND ENGINEER OFFICERS OF THE NAVY AND OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL MARINES.

##### FOR THE INFORMATION OF CANDIDATES.

1. Applications for Colonial Cadetships in His Majesty's Naval Forces will be receivable by the Governor-General or the Governor of the State in which an applicant may reside. All applications must be made upon the prescribed forms, copies of which will be obtainable on application, from the Governor-General or the Governors of States. Application should be lodged before the first of November of the year preceding that for which a nomination is desired.

2. All officers for the Executive and Engineer Branches of the Royal Navy or for the Royal Marines will enter the Service in future as Naval Cadets under identical conditions between the ages of 12 and 13, and will be educated and trained together until passing as Sub-Lieutenants.

3. Appointments to Naval Cadetships will be made by nomination subject to the nominees passing a qualifying examination. Candidates who fail to pass will not be allowed a second trial.

No nomination will be given to boys whose parents or guardians do not declare for them that they are prepared to enter any one of the three branches of the Service at the termination of their probationary period of service afloat.

As far as possible each officer will be allowed to choose which Branch or service he will join, but this must be subject to the proviso that all alike are satisfactorily fitted.

Candidates must be of pure European descent, and the sons either of natural-born British subjects, or of parents naturalized in the United Kingdom. If any doubt arises upon this question, the burden of clear proof that he is qualified will rest upon the candidate.

In the case of boys who have received nominations being prevented by illness from taking the qualifying examination, their nominations may be postponed till the next

examination if their age permits. Should they not be able to present themselves for examination within the limits so prescribed, they will be finally excluded from entering the Naval College.

4. The qualifying Examinations will be held in March, July, and December, and the appointments will date from the 15th May, 15th September, 15th January, following, respectively.

Arrangements for these examinations will be made by the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner.

5. Candidates for examination in—

March must be not less than 12 and 4 months or more than 13 years of age on the following	...	15 May

6. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before undergoing the literary examination he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must be found physically fit for the Navy.

7. The following certificates will be required:—(1) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (a certificate of baptism will not be accepted); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

CASTLEMAINE AND BENDIGO WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon him by the Water Acts, doth hereby repeal Clause 18 of the By-laws relating to the Castlemaine and Bendigo District, dated 2nd June, 1896, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th June, 1896, and in lieu

thereof doth order that, as from the date hereof, the following shall be deemed to be Clause 18 of the said By-laws:—

18. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter shall be capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The Board will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which, if inferential, shall be at the rate per annum of:—

- For  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch meter, seven shillings;
- For  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch meter, eight shillings;

and if positive meters—

- For  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch meter, eleven shillings;
- For  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch meter, thirteen shillings and sixpence;
- For  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch meter, seventeen shillings;
- For any meter of larger size than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year; the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter. Such meter shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Board, except in the case of receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

In event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Board, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

S., long. 136 deg. 7 min. 30 sec. E., and in which position 10 fathoms is shown on the chart.

It consists of isolated, bare, jagged granite rocks, with from 3 feet to 6 feet on them at L.W.S., on which the sea has not been seen to break. Its extent is about 200 yards, east and west, and 50 yards north and south, and the water gradually deepens to seven fathoms at a quarter of a mile all round.

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS UNDER LICENCE.

THE situation of the land is at Ouyen, on the railway line from Woomelang to Mildura.

**SHIRE OF COLAC.**

**BY-LAW No. 59.**

**T**HE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 59 of the said Shire:—

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating the construction of crossings over footways and channels.

2. By-law No. 33 of the Shire of Colac is hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the Colac riding and of the township of Beac.

4. Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides, drives, or leads any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, upon, along, in, or across any footway, or any water channel or gutter by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon or by and at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the Council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

5. If any land fronts to, adjoins, or abuts upon the footway of any street or road, and if access with horses and

vehicles from such street or road to such land, or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto, cannot be had without riding, driving, leading, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway, or the street channel, the owner of such land shall under the supervision and to the approval of the Shire Engineer, construct a crossing over such footway or channel in the manner hereinafter provided.

6. The crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as leaves a free passage for the water underneath the same, and may be constructed of sawn timber or iron. If constructed of timber, the dimensions of same shall not be less than the following:—Bed-plates, 4 x 3; joists, 4 x 4, at not more than 2 feet 6 inches centres; decking, 2 inch hardwood. The length longitudinally to channel shall not be less than 10 nor more than 14 feet, and the breadth measured transversely to channel shall not be less than 5 feet. The three centre pieces of decking to be ledged and made portable to facilitate cleansing of channel. If of iron, the bridge shall be of not less strength than the foregoing and of a form approved by the Engineer. The details of construction shall be in accordance with a drawing which is open for inspection at the office of the Shire Engineer, and shall be to the approval of the Engineer.

7. The crossing over the footway shall be metalled for the full width of the footpath, following the slope of and being flush on top with the proper surface of the footpath. The width of the crossing measured longitudinally with the street shall not be less than 10 feet, and shall be the full width of any gateway to which it may form an approach. The metal shall be bluestone, broken to a 2½ inch ring gauge, not less than 9 inches deep, and covered with gravel or metal screenings not less than 2 inches thick. All to be so made good and maintained by the owner of the land to which the crossing leads that the traffic by animals or vehicles over the same may not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing may be perfectly sound for the passage of persons using the footway.

8. All crossings constructed by private owners for foot traffic across street channels shall be constructed in the manner provided for by section 6.

9. If any owner fails to comply with the provisions of section 5 within seven days, after receiving notice from the Council to do so, such owner shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every day during which he or she makes default.

10. If any crossing has been made in any respect contrary to the provisions of this By-law it shall be lawful for the Council, if they see fit, to cause the same to be altered, and to recover in manner in the *Local Government Act 1903*, provided the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing leads.

11. If any private street, road, or right-of-way meets at an angle the footway of any public street or road, and there is no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street or road to such public street or road, it shall be lawful for the Council, if they see fit, to make a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the properties abutting on such private street, road, or right-of-way, such portion of the expenses of such making as the rateable value of such property bears to the whole rateable value of all the properties so abutting.

24. If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street, road, or right-of-way has been made before the coming into operation of this By-law, but is in any respect not in accord with the provisions of the By-law, the Council may, if they think fit, cause the same to be altered to conform to such By-law, and may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

25. If any crossing be out of repair and the person liable hereunder to maintain or repair the same, for seven days after notice from the Council to that effect, neglects properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing remains unrepaired a sum of Twenty shillings, and the Council may, if they see fit, effect such repair, and recover the same from such person before any Justice.

1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating the construction of Spouts and Drains from Houses, &c., and for the Discharge of Surface Water from Land.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operations within the boundaries of the Colac Riding, and of the Township of Beac.

3. The owner or occupier of every house or building in adjoining or near to any street or road, within seven days next after service of a notice by the Council for that purpose, shall put up a spout or trough of the whole length of such house or building, shall connect the same to a proper downpipe, and shall lay to conduct the discharge from same to the street channel an earthenware or iron pipe laid under the level of the surface of the footway and to the approval of the Shire Engineer, and shall thereafter keep same in good condition; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid, or with the provisions of this section, such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding twenty shillings for every day that he so makes default.

4. Every owner or occupier of land in adjoining or near to any street or road, if such land is so situated that surface or storm water from or upon the same overflows or tends naturally, if not otherwise discharged, to overflow any footway of such street or road, shall within seven days next after the service of notice by the Council for that purpose construct and lay from such points upon such lands being near the footway as is specified in such notice by plan appended or otherwise and higher in level than the bottom of the channel at the outer edge of the footway, to the said channel, and through under and transversely to the footpath, and keep in good condition such covered drain or pipe as may be mentioned in such notice and to the approval of the Shire Engineer; and in default of compliance with any such notice within the period aforesaid or with the provisions of this section such owner or occupier shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Twenty shillings for every day during which he makes default.
