OLD SCHEME.

ENTRY AND EXAMINATION OF OFFICERS IN THE ROYAL NAVY.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS (OLD SCHEME). (THE LAST EXAMINATION UNDER THIS SCHEME WILL TAKE PLACE IN NOVEMBER, 1905.)

For the information of Candidates.

r. Applications for Colonial Cadetships in His Majesty's Naval Forces will be receivable by the Governor-General or the Governor of the State in which an applicant may reside. All applications must be made upon the prescribed forms, copies of which will be obtainable on application, from the Governor-General or the Governors of States. Application should be lodged before the first of November of the year preceding that for which the nomination is

2. Candidates must be of pure European descent, and the sons either of natural-born British subjects, or of parents naturalized in the United Kingdom.

If any doubt arises upon this question, the burden of clear proof that he is qualified will rest upon the candidate himself.

3. Arrangements for the educational examination of all candidates will be made by the Commonwealth Public Service Commissioner.

The examinations will be held in March, July, and November, about six weeks before the commencement of each term, and the appointments will date from the 15th May, 15th September, 15th January, following, respectively, and the terms will commence as shown in Regulation 15 tion 15.

The candidate will be required to produce (i) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (a Certificate of Baptism will not be accepted); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good licalth.

\*NEW SCHEME OF ENTRY OF NAVAL CADETS WHO ARE CANDIDATES FOR COMMISSIONS AS EXECUTIVE, AND ENGINEER OFFICERS OF THE NAVY AND OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL MARINES.

For the Information of Candidates.

I OR THE INFORMATION OF CANDIDATES.

1. Applications for Colonial Cadetships in His Majesty's Naval Forces will be receivable by the Governor-General or the Governor of the State in which an applicant may reside. All applications must be made upon the prescribed forms, copies of which will be obtainable on application, from the Governor-General or the Governors of States. Application should be lodged before the first of November of the year preceding that for which a nomination is desired.

2. All officers for the Executive and Engineer Branches .2. All officers for the Executive and Engineer Branches of the Royal Navy or for the Royal Marines will enter the Service in future as Naval Cadets under identical conditions between the ages of 12 and 13, and will be educated and trained together until passing as Sub-Lieutenants.

3. Appointments to Naval Cadetships will be made by nomination subject to the nominees passing a qualifying examination. Candidates who fail to pass will not be allowed a second trial

examination: Candidates who fail to pass will not be allowed a second trial.

No nomination will be given to boys whose parents or guardians do not declare for them that they are prepared to enter any one of the three branches of the Service at the termination of their probationary period of service affont.

As far as possible each officer will be allowed to choose which Branch or service he will join, but this must be subject to the proviso that all alike are satisfactorily filled.

Candidates must be of pure European descent, and the sons either of natural-born British subjects, or of parents naturalized in the United Kingdom. If any doubt arises upon this question, the burden of clear proof that he is qualified will rest upon the candidate.

In the case of boys who have received nominations being prevented by illness from taking the qualifying examination, their nominations may be postponed till the next

Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before undergoing the literary examination he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must be found physically fit for the Navy.

The following certificates will be required:—(1) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth or a declara-Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth or a declara-tion thereof made before a magistrate (a certificate of bap-tism will not be accepted); (2) a certificate of good con-duct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the elergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

For a inch meter, thirteen shillings and sixpence;
For a inch meter, seventeen shillings;
For any meter of larger size than a inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter fixed complete.

Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the Such rents shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid quarterly in advance on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October in every year; the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the then current quarter. Such meter shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Board, except in the case of receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of

repair.

In event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested; and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of Ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Board, who shall leave the premises on which such meter shall be fixed, without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. pounds.

THE President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1903, hereby make the following By-law, being By-law No. 59 of the said Shire:—

- 1. This By-law may be cited as a By-law for regulating the construction of crossings over footways and chan-

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides, drives, or leads any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, upon, along, in, or across any footway, or any water channel or gutter by the side of any street or road, save in each such case upon or by and at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, sha'l forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and shall also pay to the Council such sum not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway or channel, as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

  5. If any land fronts to, adioins, or abuts upon the foot-
- 5. If any land fronts to, adjoins, or abuts upon the foot-way of any street or road, and if access with horses and

vehicles from such street or road to such land, or to some ventices from such street of food to such raint, or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto, cannot be had without riding, driving, leading, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway, or the street channel, the owner of such land shall under the supervision and to the approval of the Shire Engineer, construct a crossing over such footway or channel in the manner hereinafter provided

- 6. The crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as leaves a free passage for the water underneath bridge as leaves a free passage for the water underneath the same, and may be constructed of sawn timber or iron. If constructed of timber, the dimensions of same shall not be less than the following:—Bed-plates, 4 x 3; joists, 4 x 4, at not more than 2 feet 6 inches centres; decking, 2 inch hardwood. The length longitudinally to channel shall not be less than 10 nor more than 14 feet, and the breadth measured transversely to channel shall not be less than 5 feet. The three centre pieces of decking to be ledged and made portable to facilitate cleansing of channel. If of nade portable to facilitate cleansing of channel. If of iron, the bridge shall be of not less strength than the foregoing and of a form approved by the Engineer. The details of construction shall be in accordance with a drawing which is open for inspection at the office of the Shire Engineer, and shall be to the approval of the Engineer.
- 7. The crossing over the footway shall be metalled for the full width of the footpath, following the slope of and the full width of the footpath, following the slope of and being flush on top with the proper surface of the footpath. The width of the crossing measured longitudinally with the street shall not be less than 10 feet, and shall be the full width of any gateway to which it may form an approach. The metal shall be bluestone, broken to a 2½ inch ring gauge, not less than 9 inches deep, and covered with gravel or metal screenings not less than 2 inches thick. All to be so made good and maintained by the owner of the land to which the crossing leads that the traffic by animals or vehicles over the same may not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing may be perfectly sound for the passage of persons using the footway.
- 8. All crossings constructed by private owners for foot traffic across street channels shall be constructed in the manner provided for by section 6.
