Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. SANDS AND McDOUGALL LTD., PRINTERS, SPENCER-STREET, MELBOURNE, for a period of one week from the 31st October, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty-four females or more than two boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty-four females and two boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than sixty-one hours in any one week, nor for more than six hours beyond the ordinary working hours, in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continuously posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF THE C. M. READ CO., DRESSMAKERS, CHAPEL-STREET, FRAHMAN, for a period of two weeks from the 19th October, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say :—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

SHIRE OF TAMBO.

By-LAW No. 6, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power therewith enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and the Rate-payers of the Shire of Tambo, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

Pans and Cesspits.

1. The ordinary system of pans for nightsoil shall be abolished.

Double Pan Service.

2. In lieu of such system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service.

Removal of Nightsoil.

3. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of nightsoil, or permit, or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the Council of the said Shire; and such pan or pans shall be emptied and removed alternately as the said Council shall direct.

Use of Disinfectants.

4. Every householder shall use or cause to be placed for use, in and in connexion with every closet a suitable disinfectant or deodorant.

Charge for Removal.

5. For the removal of such nightsoil every householder or occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the said Council for such double pan service such sum per annum, payable quarterly in advance, as such Council shall deem fit.

Extent of Application of By-law.

6. This by-law, numbered 6, shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Moss-face, Parish of Tambo, County of Dargo, and allotments 51A3, 51A2, 51A1, A2, 51B, 51A4, 3B, 1B, 2B, 1A, and 1D, Parish of Tambo, County of Dargo.

Penalties.

7. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds, or less than Five shillings, for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

The foregoing by-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Tambo on the 20th day of April, 1904, and confirmed on the 27th day of May, 1904.

THE Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has repealed, in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts, the Regulations providing for the granting of Certificates to, and the examination of, persons desirous of obtaining Certificates as Engineers of Water Supply, Victoria, made on the 10th day of October, 1892, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th October, 1892, and has approved of the substituted Regulations, made and substituted in lieu of the Regulations of the 10th October, 1892, aforesaid.

REGULATIONS.—CERTIFICATES AS ENGINEERS OF WATER SUPPLY, VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS.

AN intending candidate must give notice, in writing, of his intention to present himself for examination, and must forward to the Board of Examiners for Engineers of Water Supply documentary evidence that he is eligible under one of the following preliminary conditions. Upon his application being approved by the Board, he shall pay the prescribed fee of Three pounds three shillings sterling (£3 3s.) into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into a Receipt and Pay Office, and forward the receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

1. A candidate must be a member or an associate member of the Institute of Civil Engineers of London; or must hold the degree or certificate of engineer, or master of engineering, of one of the Universities of the Australian States or New Zealand, or of one of the Universities of Great Britain and Ireland, or of some university whose degrees are recognised by the University of Melbourne, and whose graduates are admitted by it *ad eundem gradum*.

2. Or he must produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has been properly educated and trained for the profession of a civil engineer, and that he has been engaged for not less than two years, exclusive of any period of training or pupillage, in the active practice of the profession, and that one year at least of such practice has been in connexion with hydraulic works demanding the exercise of technical knowledge and skill.

QUALIFICATIONS.

I. Candidates whose applications have been approved under preliminary condition 1 will be required to show, to the satisfaction of the Board, that they have been employed for not less than five years in some responsible professional capacity in the design, construction, and supervision of hydraulic works, and that the works carried out by them have been of a successful and satisfactory character.

II. Candidates whose applications have been approved under preliminary condition 2 shall be required to pass an examination in the following subjects:—

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

I.—Surveying.

Topographical surveying.
Engineering trial surveys.
Permanent engineering surveys, including the setting out of work.
Quantities surveying.

Note.—Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Board of Examiners for Land Surveyors, or of the Board of Examiners for Mining Surveyors in Victoria, or who have taken the degree of Master of Civil Engineering (M.C.E.) in the University of Melbourne, will be exempt from the examination in surveying.

II.—General Principles of Civil Engineering.

Strength of materials; co-efficients of strength.
Production and transmission of strains in structures.
General laws of statics.
Principles of dynamics.
Factors of safety in strength and in stability.

III.—Engineering Structures.

Principles of engineering construction.
Special structures in stone masonry, brick-work, carpentry, cast and wrought iron.
Combined structures.
Composition and use of lime and cement mortars and concretes.

Note.—Candidates who have obtained the certificate of the Municipal Surveyors' Board in Victoria, or who have taken the degree of Master of Civil Engineering (M.C.E.) in the University of Melbourne, will be exempt from the examination in General Principles of Civil Engineering, and in Engineering Structures.

IV.—Hydraulic Engineering.

PART I.—THEORETICAL HYDRAULIC SCIENCE.

- Hydrostatics.*

Each candidate for examination must provide himself with a book of logarithms, plotting scales, parallel ruler, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for drawing and computing. He will be permitted to use any ordinary manual of reference, or book of tables, which he may bring with him into the examination room, but will not be permitted to leave the room during the progress of the examination.

Any candidate who shall have proved to the satisfaction of the Board, that he is possessed of Qualification I., or who shall have successfully passed the examination prescribed for Qualification II., shall be entitled to, and shall receive, the certificate of the Board that he is duly qualified to act as an Engineer of Water Supply under the provisions of the Water Acts.

Every such certificate shall show whether it has been issued in respect of sufficient service, the grantee being also the holder of some one of the qualifications referred to in preliminary condition 1, or in virtue of his having satisfactorily passed the examination prescribed by these Regulations.

By-law No. 3, section xii.—The rate to be charged for water supplied for sluicing purposes from the main aqueduct or from any branch aqueducts which diverge therefrom shall be one-third of One penny per 1,000 gallons for water supplied during the whole 24 hours of each working day, and One half-penny per 1,000 gallons for water supplied during eight hours only of each working day; provided that the minimum charge to any consumer shall not be for less than 252,000 gallons per week. Water supplied from the aqueducts for sluicing purposes shall be delivered at such times and in such manner as the Minister of Water Supply may from time to time direct.

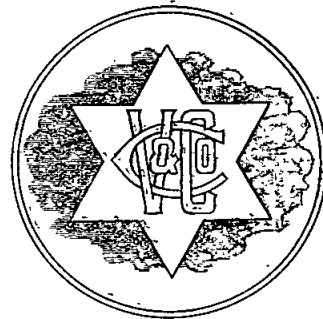

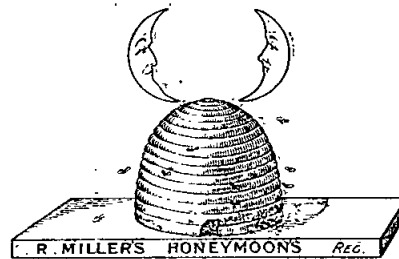

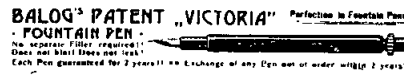

4. That clause 21 of the said Regulations shall be amended by inserting after the word "deputy," the following words, viz.:—"and poll-clerks."

MALLEE LANDS AVAILABLE FOR SELECTION AS AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS UNDER LICENCE.

THE situation of the land is at Ouyen, on the railway line from Woomelang to Mildura.

Applications (with uncancelled duty stamp of value of 5s. affixed) must be made on the usual form, addressed to the President of the Board of Land and Works, and lodged at any Crown Lands Office or Receipt and Pay Office in the State on or before Wednesday, 23rd November, 1904.

One application and duty stamp will only stand good for one allotment, but if an applicant desires to apply for more than one allotment he may do so.

No person who already holds the area of mallee land allowed by classification will be eligible to select, but holders of less than such area will be entitled to apply for the difference between the area held and that which the classification of the land entitles them to select.

Married women are eligible to select.

The applications received will be dealt with by a Local Land Board, the date and place of hearing will be hereafter notified.

For 1st class land the rent payable under agricultural allotment licence is 1s. or 6d.
