BY-LAW NO. 6, UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

N pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act Propursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890, and every other power therewith enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and the Rate-payers of the Shire of Tambo, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following by-law, that is to say:—

Pans and Cesspits.

1. The ordinary system of pans for nightsoil shall be abolished.

Double Pan Service.

2. In lieu of such system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double pan service.

Kemoval of Nightsoil.

No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of nightsoil, or permit, or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the Council of the said Shire; and such pan or pans shall be emptied and removed alternately as the said Council shall direct.

Use of Disinfectants.

4. Every householder shall use or cause to be placed for fectant or deodorant.

Charge for Removal.

For the removal of such nightsoil every householder or occupier as aforesaid shall pay to the said Council for such-double pan service such sum per annum, payable quarterly in advance, as such Council shall deem fit.

Extent of Application of By-law.

6. This by-law, numbered 6, shall apply to and have operation within the boundaries of the township of Mossiface, Parish of Tambo, County of Dargo, and allotments 51A3, 51A4, 51A4, 51A5, 51A4, 51A4, 51A4, 51A4, 51A5, 51A4, 51A5, 51A5,

Penalties.

7. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds, or less than Five shillings, for each day such offence is continued after any conviction. The foregoing by-law was passed by the Council of the Shire of Tambo on the 20th day of April, 1904, and confirmed on the 27th day of May, 1904.




