IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. GEELONG WATER SUPPLY.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS.

THE Board of Land and Works, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, doth hereby repeal No. 17 of By-laws approved on 14th day of February, 1896, and substitute in lieu thereof the following By-law:—

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board; each meter shall be capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons. The Board will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, affix and let for hire water meters, the rent for which, if inferential, shall be at the rate per annum of—

- For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, seven shillings.
For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, eight shillings.

And if positive meters—

- For $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch meter, eleven shillings.
For $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch meter, thirteen shillings and sixpence.
For $\frac{1}{2}$ inch meter, seventeen shillings.

For any meter of larger size than $\frac{3}{4}$ inch the rent per annum shall be at the rate of 10 per centum upon the cost of such meter fixed complete; such rents shall be exclusive of, and in addition to, the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid quarterly, in advance, on the first day of the months of January, April, July, and October, in every year; the first payment to date and be made as from the commencement of the current quarter; such meter shall be kept in repair at the cost of the Board, except in the case of receiving external injury, in which case the hirer must bear the cost of repair.

In the event of the hirer being dissatisfied with the registering of such meter, he may, by notice in writing, require the Board to cause such meter to be removed and tested, and, together with such notice, shall forward a sum of ten shillings, which, if the meter be found to register correctly, shall be applied in paying the cost of removing, testing, and replacing such meter, and the balance, if any, shall be returned to him; but, if such meter be found to fail to register, or be found to register incorrectly, such meter shall be repaired and replaced, or another meter shall be placed instead of it, at cost of the Board, and the amount deposited by the hirer shall be returned to him. Any person so hiring a meter from the Board who shall leave the premises on which meter shall be fixed without having previously given, in writing, at least six days' notice to the Board of his intention to leave the premises, shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds.

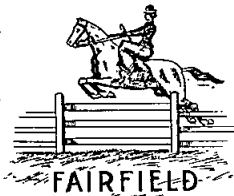

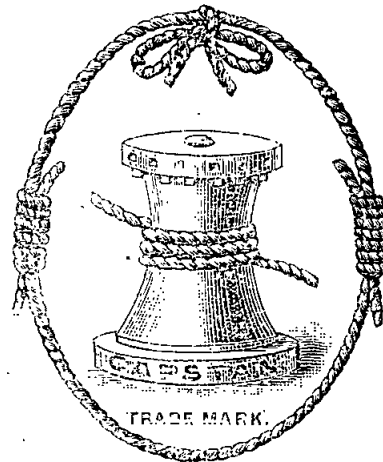

Marine Act 1890.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

THE Marine Board of Victoria, under the powers conferred upon it by the *Marine Act 1890* to make, alter, or repeal rules or regulations for the granting of licences to competent persons to act as pilots, and for the examination of persons as to their competency so to act, and for the management and government of such pilots, and generally for all matters relative to the efficient discharge of their duties, and for fixing the age at which pilots shall retire from service, and under all other powers, the Marine Board of Victoria in that behalf enabling doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, make the rules and regulations following (that is to say):—

INTRODUCTORY.

1. *Short Title.*—These regulations may be cited as "The Pilot Regulations 1904."

2. *Commencement and Repeal.*—These regulations shall take effect from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, on which date the regulations referred to in the first schedule hereto to the extent expressed in the second column to such schedule shall be and stand repealed.

3. *Interpretation, &c.*—When not inconsistent with the context, words importing the singular number shall be deemed and taken to include the plural.

Any medical practitioner or expert oculist hereinafter required, to be nominated or approved by the Marine Board, may be so nominated or approved, either generally or for the purpose of any particular examination.

SEA PILOTS.

4. *Vacancies.*—On a vacancy occurring for a sea pilot, the Marine Board, should it be of opinion that it is desirable to fill such vacancy, may by public advertisement invite applications for such vacancy, and after duly considering the qualifications of each applicant may, in respect of each vacancy, nominate one of the applicants to be a leadsman who, when he has passed the examination hereinafter prescribed and otherwise complied with the regulations of the Board, shall be duly licensed as a sea pilot; provided that if in the opinion of the Marine Board none, or in case of more than one vacancy not sufficient, of the applicants are suitable for the position of a sea pilot, further applications may be invited.

5. *Reporting for Duty.*—An applicant for a sea pilot's licence nominated for appointment shall report for duty to the Secretary to the Marine Board as a leadsman within twenty-one days from the date of his nomination by the Board, or within such other or further time as the Board in its discretion in his particular case may sanction or permit.

6. *Physical and Visual Examination.*—Subsequent to nomination, but before the expiration of the time hereinbefore limited, or of the other or further time sanctioned or permitted by the Board for his reporting for duty as a leadsman, the applicant shall be examined by a medical practitioner nominated by the Board and certified by him to be qualified, physically and mentally, to perform the duties of a pilot, and also by an expert oculist to be so nominated, and the fact certified (by a certificate to be visé by the medical practitioner aforesaid) that the applicant's eyesight is unimpaired and satisfies the standard prescribed in the second schedule hereto. Provided that the Board may, if it think fit, dispense with an observance of the provisions of this clause in the case of a nominee who produces and lodges with the Secretary to the

Board satisfactory certificates from the medical practitioner and the expert oculist theretofore nominated by the Board generally for the purpose of making examinations (whether before or after the coming into force of these regulations) that such nominee has been examined and passed by them as fit physically, mentally, and visually within six (6) months previous to the date of such nomination, in which case such nominee may take up his duties as leadsman forthwith after nomination.

7. *Lodging Certificates.*—Forthwith after such medical and visual examination the applicant not being a nominee whose case comes within the proviso to the last preceding clause shall produce and lodge, or cause to be produced and lodged, with the Secretary to the Board the certificate of the medical practitioner and the visé certificate of the expert oculist respectively, and, if the same be satisfactory, the applicant on lodgment will be permitted to take up his duties as a leadsman.

8. *Non-compliance to void Nomination.*—In the event of the applicant not being a nominee whose case comes within the proviso to the last preceding clause but one failing to obtain satisfactory certificates as to his condition and fitness—physical, mental, and visual—or omitting without reasonable excuse to cause such certificates to be deposited with the Secretary to the Board in due course, or in the case of any applicant failing to report for duty as leadsman within time, or after service as a leadsman for the prescribed time failing to pass the prescribed examination, the Board may declare his nomination void.

9. *Fresh Applications on Voiding of Nomination.*—Upon any nomination being declared void, the Board may proceed to again invite applications for the vacancy in the manner prescribed by the regulations as if no such nomination had been made.

10. *Service as Leadsman.*—Before an applicant nominated by the Board for a sea pilot's licence shall become eligible for a licence as a pilot for the sea service he shall, subsequently to being passed as fit—physically, mentally, and visually—serve for a period of not less than three calendar months as a leadsman up and down the pilot waters in ships arriving at and departing from the port or ports in connexion with which the licence applied for is available, and during such time shall make himself thoroughly acquainted with all beacons, lights, buoys, headlands, channels, soundings, shoals, tides, currents, and other marks, features, and phenomena connected with or incidental to the navigation of such port or ports, and the entrances thereto, and shall, at the expiration of such three months, pass an examination to be held by a board (consisting of three members of the Marine Board, the Examiner in Pilotage, and a senior pilot, to be selected by the Marine Board) as to his thorough acquaintance with the matters aforesaid.

11. *Examination Fee.*—At the expiration of the term of three months' service as a leadsman hereinbefore mentioned, and prior to the examination provided for in the last preceding clause, such leadsman being a candidate for such examination, shall pay to the Secretary to the Marine Board a fee of Three pounds for such examination.

12. *Issuing Licence.*—Subject to such nominee having observed the requirements and passed the examinations aforesaid, the Marine Board may thereupon grant to him a licence, to be held subject to the rules and regulations which may for the time being be in force, to act as pilot of vessels having a draft of water not exceeding 20 feet, and at the expiration of a period of not less than twelve calendar months from the date of such licence, the same being then unrevoked or unsuspended, a licence to act as pilot of any vessel without restriction.

HARBOR AND RIVER PILOTS.

13. *Vacancies.*—On a vacancy occurring for a harbor and river pilot, the Marine Board, if it is of opinion that it is advisable to fill such vacancy, may, by public advertisement, invite applications for such vacancy, and after duly considering the qualifications of each applicant, may in respect of each vacancy nominate one of the applicants for such vacancy; provided that if in the opinion of the Marine Board none, or in case of more than one vacancy not sufficient, of the applicants be considered suitable for the position of a harbor and river pilot, further applications may be invited.

14. *Reporting for Duty.*—An applicant for a harbor and river pilot's licence nominated for appointment shall report to the Secretary to the Marine Board for service with a duly licensed harbor and river pilot within twenty-one days from the date of his nomination by the Board, or within such other or further time as the Board in its discretion in his particular case may sanction or permit.

15. *Physical and Visual Examination.*—Subsequent to nomination, but before the expiration of the time hereinbefore limited, or of the other or further time sanctioned or permitted by the Board in his case, the applicant nominated shall be examined by a medical practitioner to be nominated by the Board, and certified by him to be qualified, physically and mentally, to perform the duties of a pilot, and also by an expert oculist to be so

nominated, and the fact certified (by a certificate to be vised by the medical practitioner aforesaid) by such oculist that his eyesight is unimpaired and satisfies the standard prescribed in the second schedule hereto. Provided that the Board may if it think fit dispense with an observance of the provisions of this clause in the case of a nominee who produces and lodges with the Secretary to the Board satisfactory certificates from the medical practitioner and the expert oculist theretofore nominated by the Board generally for the purpose of making examinations, whether before or after the coming into force of these regulations, that such nominee has been examined and passed by them as fit physically, mentally, and visually, within six (6) months previous to the date of such nomination, in which case such nominee may commence service with a duly licensed harbor and river pilot forthwith after nomination.

16. *Certificates to be lodged.*—Forthwith after such medical and visual examination the applicant not being a nominee whose case comes within the proviso to the last preceding clause shall lodge, or cause to be lodged, with the Secretary to the Board, the certificate of the medical practitioner and the vised certificate of the oculist respectively, and if the same be satisfactory he shall on lodgment be permitted to commence service with a duly licensed harbor and river pilot.

17. *Non-compliance to void Nomination.*—In the event of the applicant not being a nominee whose case comes within the proviso to the last preceding clause but one failing to obtain satisfactory certificates as to his condition and fitness—physical, mental, and visual—as aforesaid, or omitting or neglecting without reasonable excuse to cause to be deposited such certificates with the Secretary to the Board in due course, or in the case of any applicant failing to report for duty within time, or failing to duly serve with a licensed pilot for the prescribed time, or in the event of any applicant failing to produce satisfactory evidence of such service in due course, the Board may declare his nomination void.

18. *Fresh Applications on Voiding of Nomination.*—Upon any nomination being declared void the Board may proceed to again invite applications for the vacancy in the manner prescribed by the regulations as if no such nomination had been made.

19. *Probationary Service.*—Before an applicant nominated by the Board shall become eligible for a licence as a harbor and river pilot such applicant, subsequently to being passed as physically, mentally, and visually fit, shall serve under and regularly proceed with a duly licensed harbor and river pilot in the performance of the latter's daily duty for a period of not less than two calendar months.

20. *Issuing Licence.*—Subject to such nominee having observed the requirements aforesaid and producing and lodging in due course with the Secretary to the Marine Board certificates from the masters of the vessels or duly licensed pilots under whom he claims to have served of the facts in support of such service, the Marine Board may grant to such nominee a licence to be held subject to the rules and regulations which for the time being may be in force, to act as a harbor and river pilot within the limits of the port in which the vacancy for a pilot exists.

GENERAL.

21. *Periodical Physical, &c., Examination.*—Every pilot, whether licensed before or after the coming into force of these regulations until he attains the full age of 50 years, shall be examined and passed by a medical practitioner to be approved by the Marine Board, as physically and mentally fit to continue to perform his duties as a pilot at intervals of not more than 24 calendar months, and after having attained that age until he attains the full age of 60 years, at intervals of not more than twelve calendar months, and in the case of a pilot who, under the regulations does not necessarily retire at the age of 60 years, after such pilot attains the age of 60 years at intervals of not more than six calendar months.

22. *Periodical Visual Examination.*—Every pilot until he arrives at the full age of 60 years, whether licensed before or after the coming into force of these regulations, shall at intervals of not more than twelve calendar months, and in the case of a pilot who under the regulations does not necessarily retire at the age of 60 years, after he attains that age at intervals of not more than six calendar months, shall have his eyes examined and vision tested and passed as satisfying the prescribed standard by an expert oculist to be approved by the Marine Board.

23. *Examination at Lesser Intervals.*—If, on the occasion of any examination or testing of a pilot or of his eyesight or vision (whether biennial, annual, sixth, monthly, or casual), any physical, mental, or visual defect is discovered which in the opinion of the medical examiner or expert oculist, as the case may be, does not immediately, but may within a variable time, render the pilot unfit for service, such pilot shall submit himself for re-examination within such lesser intervals than those hereinbefore prescribed as the examiner or oculist, as the case may be, may certify to be necessary, any longer interval hereinbefore limited to the contrary notwithstanding.

24. *Re-Examination in Case of Casualty, &c.*—In the event of any casualty or accident occurring to or in connexion with any vessel or incidental to the navigation thereof, which in the opinion of the Marine Board may be due to or of which in its opinion one of the contributing causes may have been some defect in health or vision of the pilot in charge, such pilot shall if required by the Board forthwith submit himself and be examined by a medical practitioner or expert oculist to be nominated by the Board, or by both, as the Board may direct, and until such practitioner or oculist, or both, as the case may be, shall certify that such pilot is fit physically and mentally or visually, and such certificate be lodged with the Secretary to the Board, such pilot shall not follow his calling.

25. *Examination after Absence from Duty.*—If any pilot be absent from duty on account of illness, and such absence shall extend beyond 28 days, or in case of illness of any duration if the Marine Board think it advisable, or when from any other cause any pilot has been absent from duty, and such absence shall have extended for six calendar months or upwards, such pilot shall not return to duty unless and until as regards his condition, physical and mental, a medical practitioner, and as regards his vision and eyesight, an expert oculist, to be in both cases nominated by the Marine Board, have respectively certified to the Board that such pilot is in a fit condition physically, mentally, and visually, to perform his duties as a pilot.

26. *Retirement at Sixty Years.*—Every person to whom may be granted, after the coming into operation of these regulations, a licence to act as a pilot, shall retire from service upon attaining the full age of 60 years, and upon the holder of any such licence attaining that age the licence issued to him shall thenceforth be utterly void and of no further effect.

27. *Retirement between Sixty and Sixty-five Years.*—In the case of a pilot who has not yet attained the age of sixty-five (65) years, the sufficiency of any licence held by him after he attains the full age of 60 years whether before or after the coming into operation of these regulations is conditional upon his presenting himself from time to time before the Marine Board if and when required at such times (until he attain the full age of 65 years if his licence so long remain effective), as it may appoint, and in such event (after a consideration of his case and of his health and vision as suggested by his appearance or replies to questions by the Board or evidenced by any records of any past absence from duty through ill-health, or by any certificate or report of a medical practitioner or expert oculist or otherwise), being permitted by the Marine Board to continue on service. Such permission shall not relieve the pilot from satisfying the requirements of these regulations as regards examination at the prescribed intervals, or as he may, by the Marine Board, be required by a medical practitioner, to be nominated by the Board, and certified by such practitioner to be physically and mentally fit to continue to perform his duties as a pilot, and by an expert oculist to be so nominated, and the fact certified by such oculist that the pilot's eyesight satisfies the prescribed standard.

28. *Voiding of Licence.*—In the event of the Marine Board as in the last preceding clause provided deciding on view and after a consideration of the pilot's record that such pilot is not fit to continue on service, the Board shall declare his licence to be no longer of any force or effect, and thereupon the same shall become utterly void, or when the Board is in doubt as to the pilot's fitness, it may suspend such licence until the pilot has been examined and passed by the medical practitioner or oculist nominated by the Board, when in the event of the medical practitioner or expert oculist, as the case may be, not certifying in due course that such pilot is physically, mentally, and visually fit, such licence so granted (unless on appeal the majority of the members of the Special Board hereinafter provided for shall report in due course that such pilot is still physically, mentally, and visually fit), shall be declared by the Marine Board to be no longer of any force or effect, and the same shall thereupon become utterly void.

29. *Special Board of Examiners.*—If at an examination (whether biennial, annual, sixth monthly, or casual) into the physical, mental, or visual condition of any pilot, the medical practitioner or expert oculist, as the case may be, does not report such pilot as fit, if the pilot challenges the correctness of the report he may within fourteen days from the date of receiving notice from the Secretary to the Marine Board of the purport of such report by application in writing to the Board require that in respect of the matter or matters in which his condition or fitness is alleged to be unsound or defective, he should be examined or his eyesight tested, as the case may require, by a Special Board of Examiners. Such Board shall consist of three persons (none of whom shall have previously given a certificate in respect of the pilot affected), who shall be members of the medical profession, and if the alleged defect in the pilot's condition is solely in connexion with his eyesight shall also be oculists, or if one of the alleged defects be in connexion with his eyesight the third member to be appointed by the nominees of the pilot and the Board respectively or by

the Minister, as the case may be, shall be an oculist. One of such members shall be nominated by the pilot requiring the Board, either on his application or at such later time as the Marine Board may permit, and another by the Marine Board, and the two members so nominated shall appoint the third, or in case the members so nominated cannot agree such third member shall be nominated by the Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the Marine Acts.

30. *Licence—Revocation, Suspension, and Removal of Suspension.*—In the event of the medical practitioner or expert oculist, as the case may be, approved by the Marine Board at an examination (whether biennial, annual, sixth monthly, or casual) into the physical, mental or visual condition of any pilot, if there be no appeal, or in the case of an appeal to a Special Board a majority of the members of the Special Board not reporting the pilot to be physically, mentally, and visually fit to carry out the duties of a pilot, and such unfitness is likely in their opinion to be permanent, the Marine Board shall forthwith revoke such pilot's licence. If, however, such unfitness is reported to be of a character that time or treatment may remove, the Marine Board may suspend the pilot's licence until a medical practitioner or expert oculist approved as aforesaid, or both, as the case may require, shall certify to the Marine Board that the pilot is fit—physically, mentally, and visually—to resume duty, and if the pilot has not at the time reached the age when under these regulations the pilot is no longer to continue in the service, shall thereupon remove such suspension.

31. *Standards of Examination.*—The standards set out in Part I. of the second schedule hereto shall be the standards to be used and applied by the oculist, and in the case of an appeal by a pilot by the members of the Special Board, in determining whether the eyesight and vision of a candidate nominated for appointment, or of a pilot, as the case may be, is sufficient. The standard set out in Part II. of the second schedule hereto shall be the standard to be used by the medical practitioner in determining whether the health—physical and mental—of a candidate nominated for appointment is sufficient. Unless the health and eyesight or vision of a candidate or the eyesight or vision of a pilot, as the case may be, satisfies the standard applicable to his case, he shall be regarded as not qualified for appointment as a pilot, or disqualified from further performing duty as such if a pilot.

32. *Cost of Examination.*—All fees, costs, and expenses of and incidental to any examination—physical, mental, or visual—and of any certificate thereon shall be a personal charge on and payable by the examinee, who shall pay the same direct to the medical practitioner or practitioners, or expert oculist or oculists, examining him, subject to the proviso in the case of a pilot, and a reference of his case to a Special Board that if a majority of the members of the Special Board shall certify the pilot as fit the fees, costs, and expenses of and incidental to such Board shall be borne by the Marine Board, but not otherwise.

33. *Illness of Pilot.*—In case of illness necessitating a pilot's leaving a ship which he has joined for the purpose of taking to sea prior to having completed the pilotage of such ship without the written permission of the master, such pilot shall immediately report such circumstance to the officer in charge of the Pilot Office at Williamstown, and shall also furnish to the Secretary to the Marine Board a certificate from a duly qualified medical practitioner.

34. *Absence from Duty through Illness, &c.*—Any pilot prevented by accident or illness from attending to his duty shall forthwith report the same to the Secretary to the Marine Board, and when the absence exceeds 48 hours shall forthwith forward a certificate from a duly qualified medical practitioner, when the medical certificate furnished hereunder does not specify a definite period during which the pilot is likely to be incapacitated from duty, such pilot shall, if his absence continue so long, forward to the Secretary to the Marine Board at the expiration of 14 days from the time when he went off duty and at intervals of not more than 14 days thereafter further medical certificates in justification of his continued absence. Every pilot shall at any time when required by the Board submit himself for examination by a medical practitioner nominated by the Board.

35. *Conduct of Pilots.*—Every pilot shall at all times observe strict sobriety and civility in the conduct of his duties, and endeavour by every means in his power to carry out the regulations of the Board.

36. *Suspension of Pilots.*—The Marine Board may at any time when deemed in its opinion advisable suspend any pilot from duty, provided that such suspension shall not continue longer than such time as will enable the case of such pilot to be dealt with by a court or otherwise, in accordance with the Marine Acts or any Act amending the same, or with any regulations thereunder.

37. *Leave of Absence.*—The Board may at such times as may be convenient grant to a pilot leave of absence for recreation for any period or periods it may think fit, and may, in case of illness or other pressing necessity, grant extended leave for such period as it may think fit.

38. *Resignation of a Pilot.*—The Marine Board may at any time accept the resignation of any pilot whenever it is satisfied that such resignation will be of advantage to the service.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

(REGULATION 31.)

PART I.

*Visual Standard.**Entrance Examination.*

(a) In respect of an applicant for a licence after the coming into operation of these regulations:—

1. Vision to be $\frac{5}{6}$ in each eye, without glasses.
2. The total error of refraction not to exceed 1 D, and, of this, astigmatism not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ D. This estimate to be made by retinoscopy with the eye under the influence of a mydriatic.
3. The pupillary reflexes to be normal, the fundus free from disease, visual fields normal, and balance of the ocular muscles to be normal. Candidate to possess binocular vision.
4. Colour vision to be normal, as tested by coloured wools and coloured discs.

Periodical &c., Examination.

(b) In respect of a person who may be granted a licence after the coming into operation of these regulations:—

1. The same as in the case of an applicant for a licence except that after admission into the service deterioration of vision will be allowed, provided that the vision is not less than $\frac{3}{4}$ fully and $\frac{1}{2}$ partly in each eye.

(c) In respect of a person already in the service:—

1. The vision must be at least $\frac{1}{2}$ fully in each eye, without glasses.
2. There must be no evidence of any morbid or other condition in either eye, which would render it probable that the vision would deteriorate before the next periodical examination.
3. Colour vision, as tested by coloured wools and coloured discs, to be normal.

PART II.

Physical Standard.

Every applicant for appointment as a pilot must be quite free from any signs of organic disease or degeneration, and be in general up to the first-class standard of health required by an Insurance Society of good standing.

The foregoing regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord, One thousand nine hundred and four.

5. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied!

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties on the 1st of January and 1st of July, 1905.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates and charges passed by the Commissioners of the Heathcote Waterworks Trust this 5th of September, 1904, and the seal of the Trust was hereunto affixed in the presence of—

BALLAN WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATIONS FOR 1905.

THE Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, make the following Regulations:—

RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1905.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Trust District shall pay for water supplied by the Trust for the year 1905:—

1. For every house or tenement of under Fifteen pounds (£15) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) per annum.

2. For every house or tenement of Fifteen pounds (£15) and under, Twenty pounds (£20) annual municipal value, the sum of One pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) per annum.

3. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds (£20) and under Twenty-five pounds (£25) annual municipal value, the sum of Two pounds (£2) per annum.

4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-five pounds (£25) and under Thirty-five pounds (£35) annual municipal value, the sum of Three pounds (£3) per annum.

5. For every house or tenement of Thirty-five pounds (£35) and under Sixty pounds (£60) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds (£4) per annum.

6. For every house or tenement of Sixty pounds (£60) and under One hundred pounds (£100) annual municipal value, the sum of Four pounds ten shillings (£4 10s.) per annum.

7. For every house or tenement of One hundred pounds (£100) and over annual municipal value, the sum of Five pounds (£5) per annum.

8. For water supplied to Government Departments, police station, court house, post office, State school, show yards, cricket ground, shire hall, and similar properties shall be charged Two pounds five shillings (£2 5s.) per annum.

9. All water supplied by the Trust by measurement shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, or at a price as shall be specially agreed upon, but in no case shall the amount to be paid be less than that which would be payable for the premises under its municipal assessment.

10. For every public water trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the sum of One shilling (1s.) per annum shall be paid.

11. All public water troughs must be fitted with approved self-acting taps to prevent overflow; such taps to be approved by the secretary for the time being of the said Trust.

12. It shall be unlawful for any person to have an overflow waste pipe from any private bath.

13. The Trust may by notice, in writing, intimate to any owner or occupier using water for other than domestic purposes solely that the water supplied is to be charged by measure, and may by such notice require such owner or occupier to provide a meter within fourteen days after the receipt of such notice; and thereupon such owner or occupier shall, within the time specified, at his own expense provide a meter.

14. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined and approved and a certificate from the Board of Works or other authorized person be produced for the inspection of the secretary of the Trust for the time being that such meter is in proper order.

15. Except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary, taps will be allowed to be fixed and hoses allowed to be used in gardens on payment of a special garden rate (in addition to the assessment rate) of Five shillings (5s.) per annum; but notwithstanding the payment of this special rate, the Trust will not allow any undue waste of water in connexion therewith, and may, if it think necessary, require the owner or occupier to substitute a meter; or it may, if such waste be continued after due notice being given, in writing, cut off the supply to such garden or gardens.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, or who shall use or allow the water to be used in an unauthorized manner, or who is in arrears with the payment of his water rate, the Trust may, after one hour's notice, cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person either by cutting the pipes by or through which the water is supplied or by any other means that are available, and may cease to supply such premises with water so long as the Trust may think fit.

17. It shall be lawful for any person appointed by the Trust for such purpose to request permission from any owner or occupier to make an inspection of the water service to ascertain if water is being allowed to run to waste, and, if such owner or occupier refuse permission for such inspection, the Trust may, if it think fit, refuse to supply such premises with water; and such refusal on their part will in no way relieve the owner or occupier from payment of any rate or rates as may be levied on such property.

18. If the person appointed for such inspection shall ascertain that any owner or occupier is allowing water to waste by reason of leaky taps or otherwise, he shall be empowered to authorize the repair of such taps or pipes and to notify such owner or occupier that the waste of water must at once cease.

19. No person shall affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust or any service pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust permission to execute such works, and such permission shall be at and during the pleasure of the Trust, who may at any time cancel such permission.

20. Any person, whether licensed or permitted as aforesaid or not, who shall require to affix any service pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or to make any repairs to pipes under the control of the Trust shall give notice to the Secretary of his intention so to do.

21. All connexions from the Trust mains to property shall be made at the expense of the owner or occupier of the property to be supplied, and all repairs or renewals shall, when necessary, be made by the owner or occupier, and such pipes shall at all times be under the control of the Trust.

22. All connexions, pipes, and fittings shall be of the best quality, and approved by the Secretary and Chairman of the Trust.

23. The service pipes from the main being the property of the owner or occupier of the tenements supplied by such service pipes the occupier (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall, upon receiving notice that his service pipe requires repairing, immediately proceed to repair the same, and he shall be responsible for any loss of water or other damage which shall be caused by reason of such service pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, and the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises in any way it may seem fit until such repairs have been effected.

24. Fire plugs shall not be used except for the purpose of extinguishing fires unless any other use of them be allowed by the Trust, and they shall at all times be under the control of an officer of the Trust.

25. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose except under the direction of the officer of the Trust shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

26. For any breach of these Regulations a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) shall be imposed.

27. The above-mentioned rate is made for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1905, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1905, and shall be payable in two instalments: the first instalment shall be due and payable on the 1st day of May, 1905, and the second instalment on the 1st day of November, 1905. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Ballan Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rate.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS, 1905.

THE following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the Waterworks District of the Rochester Waterworks Trust shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1905:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty pounds and under, a rate of One pound sterling.

3. For each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before-mentioned separately from any building, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the amount of the annual valuation of the same.

4. A minimum rate of One pound sterling, and a maximum rate of Four pounds sterling, as the Commissioners may determine, shall be charged every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate on the annual municipal value.

5. On every horse-trough a charge shall be made of Ten shillings sterling.

6. The charge for water supplied by meter shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons up to the maximum quantity allowed by rate payable in respect of the property to which the meter is affixed, and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for all water used in excess of such quantity.

The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance on 1st day of January, 1905, and 1st day of July, 1905.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates and charges.

Wharfage and Harbors Rate Alteration Act 1904.
REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of November, 1904.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Wharfage and Harbors Rate Alteration Act 1904* (4 Edw. VII., No. 1927), His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the *Wharfage and Harbor Rates Payment Regulations 1904*.

2. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of December, 1904.

3. "Minister" in these regulations shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the *Marine Act 1890*. "Proper Officer" shall mean the person nominated by the Minister for the time being for the purposes of these regulations.

4. All rates under any proclamation made under the *Wharfage and Harbors Rate Alteration Act 1904*, shall be paid in British currency, and according to Imperial weights and measures.

5. Every person liable, under the *Marine Act 1890*, *Wharfage and Harbor Rates Act 1904*, and *Wharfage and Harbors Rate Alteration Act 1904*, to pay wharfage rates upon the landing in Victoria outside the Port of Melbourne of goods, shall, unless arrangements for the collection of the wharfage rates on such goods have been made under the provisions hereinafter contained, pay the said rates to a collector appointed to levy and collect such rates, or to the Customs officer at the port where, by agreement, provision has been made with the Federal Authorities for such officer to act as collector.

6. Every such collector or Customs officer shall, on demand, give to the person who shall pay such wharfage rates when particulars have been duly ascertained, a receipt signed by such collector or officer for the amount of the rate received by him on the goods in respect of which the same is payable.

7. For the purpose of enabling such collector or Customs officer to ascertain the amount of wharfage and harbors rates payable in respect of any goods, the consignee or other person entitled to or claiming possession of the same, shall, on demand made to him or his agent, produce to such collector or Customs officer any bill of lading, invoice, consignment note, letter, or advice, or other evidence relating to the goods in his possession or under his control.

8. Where no arrangement for the collection of the wharfage rates on any goods has been made under the provisions hereinafter contained, if the consignee or other person entitled to possession of any goods neglect or refuse to pay the wharfage and harbors rates thereon on or before the landing of the same such collector or Customs officer may, subject to any laws relating to Customs, take possession of remove and bond or otherwise warehouse and safely keep the said goods, and the same shall become subject to a lien to His Majesty for the amount unpaid. If all wharfage and harbors rates, Customs duties, and other tolls and charges (if any), and all reasonable expenses incurred in respect of such possession, removal, bonding, warehousing, and keeping be not paid within four months from the date of landing such goods may be sold by such collector or Customs officer, or by any duly authorized agent of His Majesty, for the purpose of levying and collecting such rate and reimbursing any Customs payments (if any) made and all expenses incurred as aforesaid.

9. Where no arrangement for the collection of the wharfage rates on any goods has been made under the provisions hereinafter contained if any dispute arise as to the wharfage and harbors rates payable on any goods the consignee or other person entitled to the possession of such goods, or his agent, shall deposit in the hands of the collector or Customs officer the amount of the wharfage and harbors rates demanded by such collector or Customs officer, and such deposit shall be deemed and taken to be the proper rate payable in respect of such goods, unless on appeal to the Minister, who shall have full power to inquire into and decide such appeal, he shall decide to the contrary.

10. In the case of goods shipped in a vessel regularly trading between any two or more ports in the State of Victoria, which goods are intended to be landed at some one of such ports where wharfage rates are payable on the same, the Minister may, if he thinks fit, sanction an arrangement with the owner or charterer of such vessel whereby in consideration of the collection of wharfage rates in respect of any goods or class of goods from time to time during the continuance of the arrangement carried by such vessel being deferred to a date subsequent to the goods being landed at the port of unshipment and the place of payment being fixed at some place other than the port of landing the owner or charterer undertakes to pay and discharge the wharfage rates due and payable on all goods the subject of the arrangement.

11. In connexion with any arrangement hereunder with the owner or charterer of any vessel for the payment by him of wharfage rates, provision shall be made for a correct record satisfactory to the Minister being kept by the owner or charterer of the vessel (to be accessible to the proper officer at all reasonable times), of the nature, class, character, measurement, number, and weight of all goods carried on each voyage to and landed at the port in respect of which the arrangement extends, with the name of each consignor and consignee, and the date of shipments and unshipments of the goods, and such other particulars as the Minister may from time to time prescribe, and for such owner or charterer furnishing to the proper officer returns with respect to such goods at such times, and containing such particulars as the Minister may consider necessary, the correctness of such returns to be supported if required by statutory declaration, and for the owner or charterer paying, on demand, the full wharfage rates found by the proper officer to be payable in respect of each separate consignment of goods liable to wharfage landed at the port in respect of which the arrangement extends on each and every trip of the vessel.

12. Before sanctioning any arrangement under these regulations the Minister may require the owner or charterer of the vessel or vessels to give a sufficient bond, either with or without sureties as he may require, in such sum as the Minister may consider necessary, conditional for the payment of all wharfage rates in respect of goods the subject of the arrangement and for the due observance and performance of the several provisions, stipulations, and requirements of the arrangement, and of matters incidental thereto.

13. The Minister by seven days' previous notice, in writing, may at any time determine any arrangement made with any owner or charterer of any vessel or vessels under these regulations.

And the Honorable Ewen Hugh Cameron, His Majesty's Commissioner of Public Works for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir Reginald Arthur James Talbot, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Wharfrage and Harbors Rate Alteration Act 1904* (No. 1927) it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time alter, raise, or lower, at discretion, the wharfrage and harbors rate leviable according to the scale of charges contained in the Second Schedule of the *Marine Act 1890*: Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby revoke the rates fixed by proclamation of the 8th November, 1904, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 16th November, 1904, page 3659, and do hereby make the wharfrage rates for Ports in Victoria which shall read as set forth in schedule hereunder, and which shall come into force on and after the first day of November, 1904.

RETURNED EMPTIES (not new), including casks, cases, boxes, crates, and baskets, packages of biscuit and lolly tins, bags (second-hand), to be charged at above rates.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs.
6. No person shall erect any dwelling in the Reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any articles without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
7. No person except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.
8. No person shall shoot any game or wild fowl on the lake in the Reserve, or discharge firearms of any description therein.
9. No person shall bathe in the Lake except before Eight (8) o'clock a.m. and after Seven (7) o'clock p.m. daily, at the place set apart for the purpose; and every person whilst bathing in the Lake shall wear a proper costume.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any Justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands, or any constable, does not desist from so offending may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some Justice of the Peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5. Such plants, seeds, or cuttings as are commonly purchasable at nurseries in Victoria shall not be supplied from the Reserve or the Public Park to any person unless in exchange, or for public institutions or benevolent purposes.
6. No visitor shall interrupt the gardeners or the labourers by conversation or otherwise.
7. Children under the age of ten years not being under the control of some competent person, shall be liable to be removed from the Reserve or the Public Park.
8. No person shall damage in any way the buildings, fences, flowers, shrubs, or trees in the Reserve or the Public Park; nor shall fires be lighted therein.
9. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw sticks, stones, or other missiles in the Reserve or the Public Park, or remove therefrom any soil or sand.
10. No person shall camp in the Reserve or the Public Park, or erect thereon any dwelling or booth or other structure without the authority, in writing, of the Council.
11. No person shall put in the Reserve or the Public Park any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein unless led by a chain or cord without the written permission of the Council; and any person allowing horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to trespass within the Reserve or the Public Park shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law. Provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the Reserve or the Public Park (as the case may be), and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
12. All goats; pigs; poultry, and all dogs, except as hereinbefore provided, found trespassing within the Reserve or the Public Park shall be liable to be destroyed.

The price must include delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

For police stations, excepting the depot, the successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for the sum of £5 per horse per station, and for the depot and other stations a bond based on one-quarter of the total amount of the tender accepted within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts where the sum stated in the bond is £50 and upwards, and one surety where the sum stated is under £50.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheat or oat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oat hay of the best quality. As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

2. The quantities stated in the schedule are only approximate, and the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned. Should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required at any station, the contractor will be required to supply the extra forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, and also forage for any extra horses that may be at any time stabled at the depot for police purposes, at the same rates.

4. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

5. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

6. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 4.

7. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue to either party by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, but he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 4.

8. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the State for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

10. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

11. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.

BY-LAW No. 51.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under Part VII., Division 2, and Part XXVIII. of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and numbered 51, for regulating the City Market and the Weighing Machine provided in connexion therewith.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn, and the Municipal Council of the said City, order as follows:—
That By-law Number Forty-one (41) be and the same is hereby repealed.

1. That the Market, situate within the City of Hawthorn, and being part of Crown portion 101 at Hawthorn, parish of Boroondara, county of Bourke: Commencing at a point marked by a peg on the north-eastern side of Camberwell-road, distant 230 feet or thereabouts from the south side of Harold-street; thence north-easterly 40 feet; thence south-easterly 20 feet; thence south-westerly 40 feet to the north-eastern side of Camberwell-road; thence north-westerly along Camberwell-road 20 feet to the point of commencement, shall be open for public use on Wednesday in each week from sunrise till noon, and on Saturdays from sunrise till Eleven o'clock p.m. (Christmas Day excepted), and on and at those days and times only, for the supply and sale of provisions, that is to say—

Butchers' meat, pork, poultry, fish, rabbits, game, wild fowl, cheese, eggs, vegetables, fruits, roots, shrubs, plants, bulbs, seed, hay, straw, grain, green fodder, and all garden and farm produce, with such other articles as the city council may allow to be sold in the said market, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale in the said market any article or thing whatever, unless authorized to do so by lease granted by the said council, or by written permit issued by the Market Inspector, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale in the market any other article or thing than is herein enumerated or referred to, and no person shall sell or expose or offer for sale any article or thing in the market on or at any other days or times than the days and times hereinbefore mentioned.

2. That it shall be lawful for the said council to let for any period not exceeding one year, at such rent as they may fix thereon, any shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience within the market, and to re-let the same as often as the period for such letting shall expire, or be otherwise determined, and for the good regulation of the said market each and every lease or permit shall contain a clause setting forth the class of articles for which such shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience has been let, and that no other class of article shall be exposed or offered for sale in or on the said shed, shop, site, stall, standing, or other convenience than is named or referred to in the said lease or permit, except with the consent in writing of the said council.

3. The said council hereby appoints and fixes the respective sums of money mentioned in Schedule "A" to this by-law as the stallages, rents, tolls, dues, and sums of money which it shall be lawful for the said council to demand, receive, and have of and from every person exposing or offering for sale or selling in such market any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said Schedule "A," or renting or using any stall or standing place in such market, or using any building, place, or machine provided by the said council for the weighing of carts. Provided nevertheless that any person who for three calendar months prior to applying for the privilege shall have been a genuine keeper of a shop situated within the city shall be entitled to a standing in the market for a cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle from or in which to sell or expose or offer for sale any of the articles or things mentioned or referred to in the said Schedule "A," on paying to the said council the sum of One pound per annum, by quarterly instalments in advance, for each cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle, instead of the sums mentioned in the said Schedule "A," and every lease of the whole of the said market, or of the stallages, rents, and tolls payable in respect thereof shall contain a covenant by the lessee to grant to every person on application a lease conferring on such person a similar privilege, so long as such person shall pay to the said lessee the sum of One pound per annum, by quarterly instalments in advance, for each cart, wheelbarrow, or vehicle, instead of the sums mentioned in the said Schedule "A."

4. No person shall hawk any fruit, vegetables, or other green-grocers' merchandise after One o'clock p.m. on Wednesdays during the months of May, June, July, August, September, and October.

5. No person shall have his or her name, or the title of his or her business shown on or affixed to any shed, shop, site, stall, or standing in such market, nor have such shed, shop, site, stall, or standing enclosed without the permission of the Market Inspector, but with such permis-

sion the same may be done at the cost of the applicant, but under the direction and supervision of the City Engineer.

6. No person shall do any of the acts mentioned in this clause, and if any person shall do any of such acts he or she shall on conviction thereof, for every such offence, pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling, that is to say:—

1. Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any marketable commodity before the times appointed for opening, or after the times appointed for closing, such market, or on other days than those named for holding such market.
 2. Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any commodity not named in and allowed by this by-law to be sold there.
 3. Selling or exposing or offering for sale in the said market any article or things without having first paid to the Market Inspector the proper stallage, rent, toll, or due payable in respect thereof, or in respect of the shed, shop, site, stall, or standing from, in, or on which such article or thing shall be sold or exposed or offered for sale in the said market.
 4. Placing any matter or thing in any part of the said market so as to cause an obstruction, and refusing or neglecting to remove the same on being requested to do so by the Market Inspector.
 5. Placing or keeping any cart, carriage, barrow, or other vehicle in any part of the said market contrary to the direction of the Market Inspector.
 6. Placing any hook, nail, or peg in any part of the market buildings, or showing or affixing any name or the title of any business on or to any shed, shop, site, stall, or standing in such market, or fitting up or enclosing any part of the market without the permission or contrary to the directions of the Market Inspector, or refusing to remove any hook, nail, peg, or fittings when requested to do so by the Inspector, or defacing or injuring any part of the market buildings.
 7. Sweeping or causing to be swept, or placing any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the paths, gutters, roads, or passages of the said market, and allowing the same to remain therein or thereon.
 8. Being in the market in a drunken or disorderly state, or exciting any riot or disturbance, or cursing or swearing, or using gross, indecent, or abusive language, or being guilty of any gross or indecent conduct therein.
 9. In any way obstructing the Market Inspector in the discharge of his duties.
 10. In any other manner than those specified interfering with the proper regulation and good management of the market.
7. That the council shall appoint an officer, to be called the Market Inspector, who shall also be Inspector of Provisions, and whose duties shall be generally as follows:—
- To see that the market regulations as provided for in this by-law are duly observed. To preserve order and regularity in the market, and to cause to be apprehended all persons causing a riot or disturbances, or offending against decency, or in any manner or way provoking to a breach of the peace within the precincts of such market.
- To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the market, and to seize such as are bad or unwholesome, and cause the same to be dealt with according to law, and to prohibit the sale of any articles in such market which he may consider noisome or offensive.
- To remove from the said market, or from any place therein to any other place therein, any obstruction, cart, carriage, wheelbarrow, truck, basket, vehicle, hook, nail, peg, sign, signboard, partition, or fittings.
- To inspect all scales, weights, and measures used in the market, and to seize such as are found fraudulent or defective, and cause the same to be dealt with according to law.
- To collect all stallages, rents, tolls, and dues connected with the market according to the table in the said Schedule "A."
