All that portion of the shire within a boundary commencing at the intersection of Riversdale-road and Boundary-road; thence north by Boundary-road to Canterbury-road; thence west by the latter road to Alexandra-avenue (sometimes called Alexandra-crescent); thence northerly by Alexandra-avenue or Alexandra-crescent to Windsor-crescent; thence north-easterly by the latter crescent to the eastern boundary of the Surrey Hills Railway Station ground; thence northerly by that boundary and by Wilson and York streets to the Cotham or White Horse road; thence east by that road to the east boundary of the parish of Boroondara; thence north by that boundary to the Koonung Koonung-Creek; thence easterly by that creek to the Middleboro-road; thence south by that road to the northern boundary of allotment 21C; thence westerly by the northern boundary of allotments 21C and 20A; and thence by Riversdale-road to the commencing point; and being the Box Hill and Surrey Hills Ridings of the Shire of Nunawading.

Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle during the hours between sunset and sunrise, shall have a lamp attached to the front thereof, and shall keep the same lighted so as to exhibit an adequate light in the direction in which such person is proceeding.

3. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any motor car, motor cycle, or bicycle along or across any footpath within the Shire save across such footpath direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

4. Every person riding, driving, or impelling any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle shall keep the same on the near or left side of the road, and whenever overtaking any waggon, cart, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, such person overtaking such waggon, cart, or other beast of burden, or any foot passenger proceeding along the road shall, within a reasonable distance from or before passing such waggon, cart, or vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding a bell or horn, give audible and sufficient warning as she or he may approach.

5. In every case where a person riding, driving, or impelling a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle meet any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the full control of the person for the time being in charge thereof, such person riding or driving such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or tricycle shall dismount as speedily as possible and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

6. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
