Public Service Act 1890, Section 123.

REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF OFFICERS OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

THE Public Service Commissioner, in pursuance of the powers vested in him, hereby substitutes the following Clause for Clause 26 of Chapter XIII. of the Regulations made under the provisions of section 123 of the *Public Service Act 1890*, and approved on the 24th December, 1902:—

Clause 26. *Officers in the Public Service not to take part in politics.*—In order that officers of all ranks may render loyal and efficient service to Government, they are expressly forbidden to take any part in political affairs otherwise than by recording their votes at elections of Members of Parliament and as stated in the next following clause.

Clause 26A. *Elections by public officers.*—In connexion with the election of Members of Parliament as their representatives, public officers may take such action as is necessary and usual to ascertain the views of candidates and to further the election of candidates whom they desire to see returned, and public officers, if candidates for election, may take all necessary and usual action to make known their views, and obtain the support and votes of the electors.

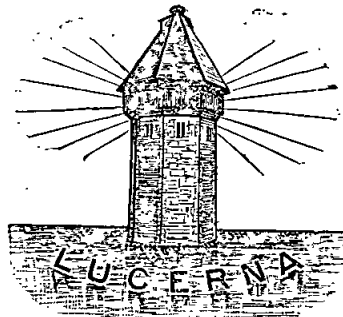

## SHIRE OF BENALLA.

## BY-LAW No. 9.

Under the *Health Act 1890*.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Benalla, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within its jurisdiction, makes the following by-law, that is to say:—

*Removal of Night-soil.*

1. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the said Council, and such pan or pans shall be emptied and removed alternately as the said Council shall direct.

*Use of Disinfectant.*

2. Every householder shall use and cause to be placed for use in and in connexion with every closet a suitable and effectual disinfectant or deodorant.

*Extent of Application of By-law.*

3. This By-law, numbered 9, shall apply to and have operation within the area comprised in Crown allotments 235, 236, 237, 238, 239A, B, and C, and 204A, parish of Dookie, county of Moira, Shire of Benalla.

*Penalties.*

4. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and a further penalty of not more than £5, or less than Five shillings, for each day such offence is continued after any conviction.

RULES MADE BY THE CHURCH ASSEMBLY OF  
THE DIOCESE OF GIPPSLAND UNDER THE PRO-  
VISIONS OF ACT 48 VICT., NO. 797, SECTION 14.

3. In pursuance of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered DCCXCVII.—

- (1) There shall be constituted within the Diocese of Gippsland a Corporate Body of Trustees for the purpose of holding property in trust for the benefit of the Church of England within the Diocese of Gippsland, and the said Corporate Body shall be and shall be known and designated as *The Church of England Trusts Corporation for the Diocese of Gippsland*.
