IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. BURRELL, WATKINSON, AND CO., MANUFACTURERS OF MANTLES, BURKITT'S BUILDINGS, FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 11th February, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than ninety-two females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said ninety-two females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

*Local Government Act 1903.***MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.—CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY AND QUALIFICATION.—REGULATIONS.**

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1903*, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, has, by an Order made on the 2nd day of February, 1904, rescinded all previous Regulations affecting the issue of Certificates of Competency and Qualification, and in lieu thereof His Excellency has by the same Order made the following Regulations relating to the issue of such Certificates by the Municipal Surveyors Board, appointed under the provisions of the said Act, viz. :—

MUNICIPAL SURVEYORS BOARD.

Regulations relating to the issue of Certificates of Competency and Qualification by the Municipal Surveyors Board.

Certificates of Competency.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates of competency will be held in Melbourne, at a place to be from time to time hereafter appointed, commencing at Ten o'clock a.m. on the last Tuesday in the months of February, May, August, and November in each year.

2. Candidates must be in attendance in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day, and in the event of any adjournment, at the hour named for such adjournment.

3. Every candidate must forward to the Secretary of the Board, fourteen (14) clear days at least before the commencing day of the examination at which he intends to present himself, notice in writing of such intention, and with satisfactory documentary evidence of having complied with one of the following conditions :—

- (a) Of having completed his articles of indenture in the office of some competent engineer or surveyor.
- (b) Of having completed a University course of instruction in civil engineering.
- (c) Of having passed the examination for land or mining surveyors or water-supply engineers, and of having had one year's practical experience of engineering work.
- (d) Of having had three years' experience in designing or executing engineering works.

4. Satisfactory evidence must be produced, if required, of the age and respectability of character of any candidate; and no candidate shall be eligible for examination under the age of twenty-three (23) years, or who has been convicted of a breach of trust.

5. Candidates who have complied with Regulations 3 and 4 will be required to pay to the Secretary the sum of £2 2s., a receipt for which will be passport to the examination.

6. Candidates must provide themselves with drawing instruments, scales, and a book of logarithms, and may also use Molesworth's and Toutwine's Engineering Pocket-book.

7. Each examination will occupy the space of three (3) days, during which six (6) sets of questions will be issued to each candidate.

The 1st, 3rd, and 5th sets of questions will be issued at Ten a.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the Secretary at or before One p.m. The 2nd, 4th, and 6th sets of questions will be issued at Two p.m. each day, and the replies thereto must be handed to the Secretary at or before Five p.m.

The answers to the questions must be written on one side only of each sheet of paper, signed by the candidate, arranged in consecutive order, with the question-sheet on the top, and pinned together.

Any candidate detected in the act of using books or notes (except those above indicated), or of giving or receiving assistance, will be dismissed from the examination room.

8. Candidates will be examined in a selection made by the Board from the following list of subjects, viz. :—

- (a) The construction, adjustment, and use of the theodolite level, clinometer, box sextant, prismatic compass.
- (b) Plotting surveys and sections.
- (c) Calculation of traverses, areas, and volumes.
- (d) Determination of gradients and waterways of bridges and culverts.
- (e) Construction of roads with metal or gravel pitched foundations for roads. Roads on loose sand and wet clay. Town streets, including footpaths of various kinds, kerbing, channelling, and wood paving. The maintenance and cleansing of roads and streets.
- (f) Bridges, culverts, and retaining walls in masonry, brickwork, and concrete, including piled foundations.
- (g) Timber bridges and culverts.
- (h) Iron and steel bridges.
- (i) Drainage and sewerage, including simple hydraulic calculations.

9. Candidates who pass the prescribed examination will be granted a certificate of competency, to be issued by the Secretary.

10. Holders of certificates of competency issued prior to the 6th August, 1903, may obtain an amended certificate of competency.

11. When making application for an amended certificate the certificate previously issued must be returned, accompanied by a fee of Half-a-guinea (10s. 6d.).

Certificates of Qualification.

12. The Board will grant certificates of qualification as follows :—

- (a) To Corporate Members of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London.
- (b) To persons who have passed the examination of the Association of Municipal and Sanitary Engineers of England and Wales.
- (c) To Masters of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne.

13. It will be necessary, in all cases, for applicants to produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that they have, for a period of not less than three (3) years, been engaged in carrying out works such as are usually supervised by municipal surveyors.

14. Each application for a certificate must be accompanied by a fee of £1 1s.

15. The presence of the applicant will not be necessary unless specially requested.

16. Every applicant, whether for certificate of competency or qualification, must legibly give his name in full and postal address in the margin of his letter of application, which should be addressed to—

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

1. Examination of candidates for certificates as surveyors will be held in Melbourne in the months of March and September of each year, and at such other times as may be deemed advisable.

2. A candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for the examination, due notice of which will be given in the *Government Gazette*.

(b) An examination fee of £2 2s., which must be paid on or before the date of examination.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

3. A candidate shall satisfy the Board that he will be of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination, but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have attained the age of 21 years.

4. A candidate shall produce satisfactory evidence as to character.

5. (a) A candidate shall have served under articles, or other similar agreement, with some qualified surveyor or surveyors, for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field; and shall produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(b) Or he shall have passed at any University recognised by an Australasian University the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(c) Or shall have taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

6. In addition to evidence of service, a candidate shall produce in the following form, or to like effect, a certificate from a qualified surveyor or surveyors, with whom he has served, that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Form of Certificate for presentation to the Board of Examiners.

I, A. B., a qualified land surveyor, hereby certify that C. D. has been professionally and continuously employed with me as _____, in the practice of land surveying, for the period of _____, viz., from _____ to _____ (or has served under articles or other similar agreement for a period of four years, three of which have been in the field), and that he is fully competent to undertake surveys.

NOTE.—For this purpose a "qualified surveyor" shall mean any person entitled to practise as a land surveyor in any part of the British Empire, or the United States of America, where the standard of examination is, in the opinion of the Board, equivalent to that prescribed by these Rules.

7. A candidate shall produce his original field notes and plan plotted by him therefrom of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road, and of an area having buildings thereon in illustration of a town survey.

The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the candidate to be entirely his own work.

8. Each candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan-drawing, except paper.

9. If the foregoing preliminary conditions are complied with to the satisfaction of the Board, the candidate will be admitted to examination.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

10. A candidate shall undergo an examination which shall embrace the following subjects:—

Mathematics.

(a) Trigonometry, plane and spherical; geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

(b) Reduction of traverses, computation connected with triangulation and the setting out of roads and curves; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practices of Surveying.

(c) Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical, trigonometrical, subdivisive, and other surveys, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out of roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes and from co-ordinates, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurement of heights, surveying under Transfer of Land Acts, writing descriptions of boundaries.
(Candidates may be required to make actual surveys.)

Engineering Surveys.

(d) Levelling; grading; measurement of earthworks.
(Including practical tests.)

Use of Instruments.

(e) Principles of construction, adjustment and use of the following instruments:—Theodolite, plane-table, sextant, tachometer, level, compass, clinometer, barometer, thermometer, tachometer, and steel band.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places; elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians; declination of the magnetic needle.
(With practical tests.)

Drawing.

(f) General plan-drawing, compilation of plans, drawing of sections and contours, projection of maps and charts.

Miscellaneous.

(h) Physics and geology (elementary); names and description of Australasian timbers of economic value (*vide voce*).

11. Candidates producing satisfactory evidence of having matriculated, or of having passed the senior examination at a University, or the Senior Civil Service examination of New Zealand, may be exempted from working out papers in elementary geometry, trigonometry, and algebra, and will be credited with 66 per centum of the maximum marks allotted those papers.

Candidates producing evidence of having taken a degree in Civil Engineering at any University recognised by an Australasian University may be further exempted from working out papers in physics and geology.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY.

12. A candidate passing the examination held under these Rules shall be entitled to a certificate of competency.

13. Any surveyor qualified in Victoria prior to 1st January, 1896, or any surveyor licensed prior to 1st January, 1896, in any other Australasian State or Colony who, by reason of his absence from that State or Colony, is prevented from obtaining the certificate of competency from the Board of that State or Colony, may make application to this Board, and on his satisfying the Board that he is competent, either without examination or on such examination as the Board may require, shall be entitled to a certificate of competency; such application shall be accompanied by the fee (£2 2s.).

LICENCES TO SURVEY.

14. The Board may issue a licence to any person to whom it has issued a certificate of competency, or who holds a certificate of competency issued by any reciprocating Board of Examiners for land surveyors in Australasia subsequent to 1st January, 1896, and who is still entitled to practise as a land surveyor in the State or Colony where he obtained his certificate, or to any surveyor holding a certificate of competency issued by the Department of Land and Survey prior to 1st January, 1896, or who holds a licence to practise as surveyor under the Transfer of Land Act issued by the Surveyor-General prior to 1st January, 1896. Each application shall be accompanied by the fee (£1 1s.), the declaration as prescribed by the *Land Surveyors Act 1895*, and satisfactory evidence as to character.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, the Chairman and Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulations:—

MANAGEMENT AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

1. The ordinary meetings of the Trust shall be held every first Wednesday in the month, at Eight p.m.

2. Business of the Trust at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors.

3. The first business of all meetings of the Trust shall be the reading and confirmation of the minutes of the preceding meeting. And no discussion shall take place thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. After confirmation such minutes shall be signed by the Chairman.

4. At the ordinary meeting of the Trust, after the confirmation of the minutes, the following shall be the order of business, viz.:-

- (1) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
- (2) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (3) Reception and reading of petitions.
- (4) Reading and ordering on reports.
- (5) Orders of the day arising out of former minutes, and any business the Chairman may bring before the meeting.
- (6) Examining and passing of accounts.
- (7) Ordinary business.
- (8) Extraordinary business, new rules, and regulations.
- (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (10) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

5. No motion shall be proceeded with unless the Commissioner who gave notice thereof, or some other Commissioner duly authorized by him, in writing, be present when called upon to proceed with the same. Notices of motion not so proceeded with shall be considered as having lapsed.

6. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for that occasion be a member of such committee.

7. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed until it has been seconded, and one amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, any other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

8. No person not being a Commissioner shall be permitted to address the Trust without the consent of the majority of the Trust then present.

9. Every Commissioner, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust, and each Commissioner shall address his remarks to the Chairman.

10. The ruling of the Chairman shall be final on all points of order or practice, and shall be given without comment or argument.

11. Any Commissioner may require the Secretary to take down the particular words used by a Commissioner on the same being uttered, also record in the minute-book the names of Commissioners voting for and against a motion.

12. No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, except in reply or personal explanation.

13. Any Commissioner who shall refuse to obey when called to order by the Chairman, or shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other Commissioner, and shall refuse to withdraw such when required to do so by the Chairman, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered before any two justices of the peace.

14. The voting in every case shall be by show of hands for and against the motion or amendment.

15. No motion, the effect of which shall be to rescind a former resolution of the Trust, shall be entertained, unless notice thereof, in writing, be given at a preceding meeting, and a call of the Trust made for the purpose.

16. It shall be competent for the majority of the Trust to suspend at any meeting one or more of the Regulations for the management and conduct of business, except the purport of such suspension be the rescinding of any motion previously adopted.

17. The Secretary shall have the custody of the common seal of the Trust.

18. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until fourteen clear days' notice shall have been given in some newspaper or newspapers circulating in the Trust area, inviting applications from qualified persons for the same.

RULES, REGULATIONS, AND SCALE OF FEES OF RAINBOW PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

THESE rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right, which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of the ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any public grave may, on the approval of the trustees, be converted into a private grave on payment of the fees or balance of fees, as per scale of charges.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing, with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. Wooden picket fences are allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed, by order of the trustees, without further notice to the owner.

7. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased stated, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the sexton.

8. Order for interment shall be given to the sexton the day previous to interment.

9. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground, unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below the level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the coffin previously buried in the same grave.

10. The hours of burial shall be—September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

11. The procession must arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.

12. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted, unless there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

13. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave, and requiring a brick grave or vault, shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron securely cemented.

14. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

15. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the office of the sexton.

16. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment, or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

17. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

18. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

19. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a certain Proclamation as hereunder set forth, made in pursuance of the provisions of the *Settlement on Lands Act 1893*, certain lands described in such Proclamation were set apart and appropriated for occupation by the members of associations or societies under the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to revoke in part such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in Division 2 of Part III. of the *Land Act 1901* (1 Edw. VII. No. 1749), do hereby order as follows, viz.:—

Settlement on Lands Act 1893.

REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING THE MANNER OF PAYING STAMP DUTY ON INSTRUMENTS AND MATERIAL TO BE DENOTED BY IMPRESSED STAMPS AND THE CREATION OF ADHESIVE STAMPS, ETC.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of February, 1904.

WHEREAS it is amongst other things provided by section 118 of the *Stamps Act* 1890 (No. 1140) that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, add to, alter, amend, or repeal regulations for carrying out any of the provisions of the Stamps Acts, and all such other regulations as he (the Governor in Council) may deem expedient in reference to the several matters and things within the intention of the Stamps Acts, and for the better securing of the revenue of the Crown as it may be affected by the Stamps Acts. Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. All previous regulations made under the Stamps Acts, in so far as they may be affected by or are incompatible with these Regulations, are hereby repealed.
2. These Regulations shall come into force on the first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and four.

IMPRESSED DUTY STAMPS.

3. (a) Duty stamps shall be impressed at the Chief Office for Stamp Duties, 267 Queen-street, Melbourne, hereinafter referred to as the "Chief Office" only in accordance with requisitions by persons requiring them.

- (b) All requisitions for impressed stamps must be made in the forms in the Schedule hereto.
- (c) No stamp shall be impressed unless the value thereof shall have been paid in advance, nor shall cheques be accepted in payment.
- (d) No discount or commission will be allowed on duty stamps impressed on any instrument or form.

MATERIAL CHEQUES OR FORMS.

4. (a) All persons requiring duty stamps impressed on paper or parchment must provide the paper or parchment, and distinctly state the amount of duty they require impressed.
- (b) Books of cheques or of other forms required to be impressed with duty stamps must have marked on the cover the number of forms in each book.
- (c) Applications to impress duty must be made in duplicate on Form A as in Schedule hereto.
- (d) When a requisition is supplied, a corresponding receipt shall be given by the person to whom the requisition is supplied.

PAYMENT FOR IMPRESSED DUTY STAMPS AND ACCOUNTING FOR SAME.

5. (a) Any person about to pay duty to the Comptroller or Collector (such person being hereinafter called the applicant) must fill up in duplicate a requisition in the form in the Schedule hereto applicable to his requirements, by inserting therein the particulars of the matter on which he requires to pay duty, and the amount thereof, and shall sign his name on each duplicate.
- (b) After the duty has been paid to the officer appointed to receive the same, and that officer has stamped on the butt and duplicate requisition a receipt for such duty, the applicant must take the duplicate receipt with the instrument or matter referred to therein to the officer in charge of impressing duty, who shall cause the instrument or matter to be impressed with an impressed duty stamp or stamps in accordance with the amount stamped on the duplicate receipt, and shall retain such duplicate.
- (c) The officer in charge of impressing duty stamps shall enter the particulars shown on the duplicate receipt in a book to be kept for that purpose, and, on delivering the instrument or material to the applicant, shall take a receipt for the same. On taking delivery, the applicant must sign such last-mentioned receipt.

PART II.

ADHESIVE DUTY STAMPS, ETC.

1. All fees payable to the Crown or into any public Department required by law to be paid by stamps shall be paid by adhesive duty stamps.
2. (a) By arrangement with the Commonwealth Government, adhesive duty stamps or forms of promissory notes and drafts impressed with duty up to Two pounds in value may be purchased as heretofore at the General Post Office, Melbourne, and at every post office throughout the State of Victoria.
- (b) When a supply of adhesive duty stamps is required at any post office, a requisition in duplicate in Form B in the Schedule hereto must be made to the Comptroller at the chief office, and must be accompanied by a remittance for the value of the stamps required.
- (c) When a supply of forms of promissory notes or drafts impressed with duty is required at any post office, a requisition in duplicate in Form C in the Schedule hereto must be made to the Comptroller, at the chief office, and must be accompanied by a remittance for the value of the stamps required.
3. (a) Adhesive duty stamps may be purchased from all persons duly licensed to deal in duty stamps in Victoria.
- (b) Licensed dealers in duty stamps must purchase or procure for the purpose of sale or exchange any adhesive duty stamps they may require at the chief office.
- (c) When requiring a supply, they must fill up in duplicate a requisition in Form D in the Schedule hereto.

SPOILED OR MISUSED DUTY STAMPS.

4. All claims for allowance in respect of spoiled duty stamps must be made at the chief office, within six months from the time they become spoiled, by an application in the Form E in the Schedule hereto, setting forth the grounds on which allowance is claimed, verified by statutory declaration.



ADDITIONAL REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF FITZROY, CARLTON, AND FLAGSTAFF GARDENS, AND LINCOLN, ARGYLE, CURTAIN, MACARTHUR, MURCHISON, DARLING, AND UNIVERSITY SQUARES.

WHEREAS by the Crown grants issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Melbourne and their successors in respect of Fitzroy, Carlton, and Flagstaff Gardens, and Lincoln, Argyle, Curtain, Macarthur, Murchison, Darling, and University Squares, it is provided and declared that the lands thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a Public Garden or a Public Square, as the case may be, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or other officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Victoria, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such Regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Board of Land and Works and the Mayor, Aldermen, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Melbourne and for no other purpose whatsoever: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the Council of the City of Melbourne do hereby make the Regulation following for the care, protection, and management of the said gardens and squares, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, in addition to the existing Regulations in respect of the said gardens and squares:—

REGULATION.

No person, except those in the employ of or authorized by the trustees, shall ride or drive any bicycle, tricycle, motor-car, or other vehicle in any of the said gardens or squares.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 200 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or by any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by the curator or other authorized officer or servant of the trustees, or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
