## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1891*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF GEORGE AND GEORGE LTD.,  
DRESSMAKERS AND TAILORS, 168 COLLINS-STREET, MELBOURNE.

for a period of eight weeks from the 7th April, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than eight shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Three-pence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

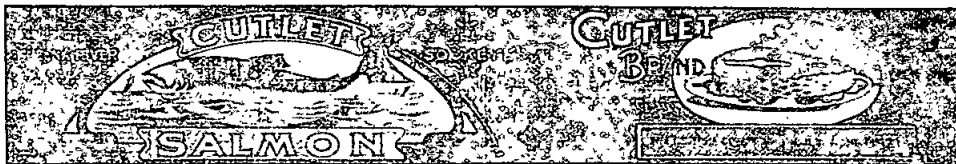

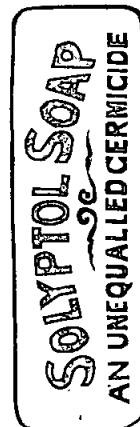
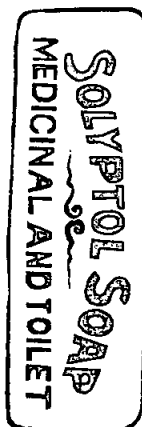

**W**E, Martin Cussen, William Morrison Brown, Thomas Darcy, James William Florance, Alexander Melsaac, Thomas McCormack, and Donald Munro McLennan, the duly appointed Trustees of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council of 25th September, 1903, as a site for a Race-course and other purposes of Public Recreation in the parish of Mooroopna, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance-fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 199 of the *Land Act 1901* :—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is parcelled out into the following divisions, shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided :—1st. The Lawn, Saddling Paddock, or Grand Stand. 2nd. The remainder of the reserve.

2. No person shall damage, remove, or cut any of the trees, shrubs, flowers, flower beds, tree guards, seats, buildings, or other property in the reserve; nor carry firearms nor disturb wild fowl or game therein.

3. No person shall break open or damage any doors or gates, or climb over any fences, doors, gates, or buildings, or enter the reserve in any way whatever except through the doors and gates provided for the purpose.

4. No person shall remain in the reserve who offends against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

5. No person shall camp in the reserve or light fires therein, or allow any horses, cattle, or other animals to wander therein, without the consent in writing of the Trustees first had and obtained.

6. No person shall post any bills on the fences or buildings or cause any tumult or breach of the peace in the reserve.

7. No person shall erect any tent, dwelling, booth, or other structure in the reserve without the consent in writing of the Trustees.

8. No person shall conduct any race meeting or carry on any business or game in the reserve without the consent in writing of the Trustees first obtained.

9. The scale of fees which may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve on such days (not exceeding thirty in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for races, cricket or football matches, sports, or holiday amusements, shall be as follows :—For the admission of every adult to the 1st division of the reserve, such a sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding Five shillings; for the admission of every adult to the 2nd division of the reserve, such a sum as the Trustees may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

10. All moneys derived by the Trustees from the reserve shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement thereof.

11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the occasion of any races, cricket or football matches, sports, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10), which the Trustees may determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures, and the Trustees may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Trustees in reference to the reserve, stand, buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with Section 199 of the *Land Act 1901*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence. And every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any

bailliff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
