In compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1893, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF GEORGE AND GEORGE LTD., DRESSMAKERS AND TAILORS, 168 COLLINS-STREET, MEL-BOURNE,

for a period of eight weeks from the 7th April, 1904, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

- Inflowing express conditions, that is to say:—
 That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than forty females for more than forty eight hours in any one week, and that the said forty lemales shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing strictes for trade or sale.
 That each female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings nor week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wageworker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be pid Three-pence per hour for otactime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
 That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each seening she works overtime.
 That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

- That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.
